## Get it fresh!

### Newarkers turn to local farmers for fresh foods

Summer is officially here, and farmers markets are popping up around Newark to give community residents the option of local, fresh produce as an alternative to larger supermarkets.

The outdoor University of The Co-op Farmers Market at

Delaware's Farmers Market opened Thursday, June 14 at Mentors' Circle near the Morris Library and features fresh fruits, vegetables, food demonstrations and baked goods from local vendors. The market will be open from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. every Thursday.

Newark Natural Foods on East Main Street opened last month for the season. It will be open from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. every Sunday until November in the parking lot of Market East Plaza with local produce, arts and crafts, and baked goods for sale every

## Is Paul dead?

### Beatles expert to speak at library this weekend

Joel Glazier of Wilmington has been a guest speaker at International Beatles Conventions in Liverpool, England and around the world. On Saturday, he will travel just down I-95 to Newark to present a program called "Is Paul McCartney Dead?" at the Newark Free Library.

"This presentation makes people think," Glazier said, warning: "Some die-hard fans get upset and have walked out."

Born and raised in Wilmington, Glazier, 60, was a freshman at the University of Delaware in 1969 when the rumor about Paul McCartney's death spread around the world.

"It was the topic at the University of Delaware, and campuses across America," Glazier said. "It was a wonderful time."

College students scoured The Beatles' album covers and song lyrics for clues about the mystery of whether or not the real Paul McCartney died in 1966 and was replaced by someone else, Glazier said.

The cover of the album "Abbey Road" started the rumor, Glazier said. People believed that other band members were pictured out-of-focus while Paul McCartney was not, for a reason. Fans even played Beatles songs backward searching for messages hinting to McCartney's death.

Marking McCartney's 70th birthday on Monday, this event is the only one in Delaware celebrating the singer's birthday, he said.

Glazier will give an hour-long PowerPoint presentation starting at 1 p.m. He said he will show the most obvious clues, and play the obvious sound-clip clues to the audience,

**SAS Cupcakes robbed**

Newark Police are investigating an armed robbery that occurred around 9:45 a.m. Saturday at SAS Cupcakes at 134 E. Main St. in Newark.

Police say a 19-year-old female store employee had just opened the store when a Hispanic male suspect entered the store, displayed a large knife and demanded cash. After receiving an undisclosed amount of cash, the suspect took the victim's cell phone and fled out the front door in an unknown direction.

The suspect is described as a Hispanic male with a large, muscular build and a buzzed haircut. He was wearing a black-and-red shirt, dark pants, black sunglasses and had tattoos on his arms and neck.

The victim was not injured.

**Woman robbed at gunpoint**

Newark Police are investigating an armed robbery that occurred around 3:45 a.m. Tuesday, June 19 in the parking lot of Dunkin Donuts on Elkton Road in Newark.

Police say a 50-year-old female victim had just left the store and entered her vehicle when two unknown black male suspects with hoods drawn over their heads approached her.

One of the suspects pointed a black handgun at her and demanded her purse. The victim surrendered her purse to the suspects, who fled the area on foot, crossing Elkton Road towards McIntire Drive.

The first suspect is described as a black male with light-colored blue jeans, a dark, hooded sweatshirt and white sneakers.

The second suspect is described as a black male with dark-colored pants, a dark, hooded sweatshirt and white sneakers.

The victim was not injured during the incident.

**Motorcyclist dies from injuries in Route 40 crash**

Robert B. Snead, who was involved in a crash on Route 40 while riding his Harley Davidson motorcycle in Glasgow Monday morning, died Monday evening as a result of

his injuries, according to Delaware State Police.

Snead was pronounced dead at Christiana Hospital around 4:30 p.m.


The incident occurred around 9:30 a.m. as Snead, 54, of Bear, was driving the motorcycle in the right-hand lane of eastbound Route 40 approaching Frenchtown Woods Drive in Glasgow.

As Snead attempted to make a left-hand lane change, he failed to see that a 2004 Chevrolet 2500 pickup truck, operated by John Lucatamo, 46, of North East, was slowing in front of him in the left-hand lane.

Snead, who was not wearing a helmet, applied his brakes, but struck the rear of the truck, which knocked him to the ground and caused him to strike his head on the pavement.

EMS personnel transported Snead to the Christiana Hospital Trauma Center, where he was admitted in critical condition. Lucatamo was not injured.

Delaware State Police Crash Reconstruction Unit is continuing the investigation into this crash.

**Man arrested for Bear bank robbery**

Delaware State Police Robbery Unit detectives arrested a Wilmington man Wednesday in connection with last week's robbery of the TD Bank on Songsmith Drive in Bear.

Police say Christopher Starrett, 35, entered the bank around 9:53 a.m. Thursday, June 14, and handed a note to a teller demanding money and implying he had a gun.

The 21-year-old female teller handed over an undisclosed amount of cash, and





the perpetrator ran out of the bank toward Governor's Square Shopping Center without ever displaying a weapon, police said.

Police identified Starrett as a suspect based on evidence obtained at the crime scene. Starrett turned himself in to detectives at Delaware State Police Troop 2 in Glasgow on Tuesday, June 19. He was subsequently charged with one count of first-degree robbery was arraigned at JP Court 2.

Starrett was committed to the Department of Corrections for lack of \$25,000 secured bail.

Armed man robs Brookside deli

An armed man is still at large after robbing a deli in Brookside last Thursday night.

New Castle County Police say the man entered the Country Maid Deli on Marrows Road around 9:52 p.m. brandishing a weapon. A police spokesman would not say whether it was a gun, knife or other type of weapon.

Cpl. John Weglarz said once the man entered the store, he yelled something inaudible to the clerk. As the clerk got closer in order to hear the man, the suspect

pointed the weapon at the clerk and demanded money.

The clerk complied, and the perpetrator fled with an undisclosed amount of cash.

The suspect is described as a black man with a thin build and was last scene wearing a maroon hooded sweatshirt, jeans and a bandana over his face.

Woman charged in Madison Drive stabbing

A Newark woman was arrested last Thursday in connection with a domestic stabbing.

The incident occurred around 11:30 p.m. in 100 block of Madison Drive. Newark Police say Kristine Hendrickson, 32, got into an argument with a 34-year-old man in the house the two share. As the argument escalated, Hendrickson allegedly grabbed a knife from the kitchen and stabbed the man in the torso before leaving the house.

The victim was taken to Christiana Hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

The couple's two children, ages 11 and 13, were at home during the incident but were not injured. Family members are taking care of them at this time.

Hendrickson was arrested Friday morning after returning home.

She was charged with first-degree assault, possession of a deadly weapon while committing a felony and two counts of endangering the welfare of a child. She was committed to Baylor Women's Correctional Facility in lieu of \$52,000 bond.

Bike thief strikes twice

University of Delaware Police are seeking the public's assistance in locating a suspect in the theft of bicycles from the campus on Thursday, June 14.

Around 8 p.m., a UD student reported that his bicycle was taken from a rack in front of the Carpenter Sports Building while he was inside. The stolen bike is a black and white men's GT-840 mountain bike.

UD Police checked surveillance video cameras, which showed a man riding to the area on a purple girl's bike, leaving it, removing the victim's bike and riding it eastbound on Main Street. About 10 minutes later, the same man is observed on camera returning to the area and removing another bike, again going east on Main Street, past Chapel Street and eventually out of camera view.

The suspect is described as 25 to 30 years old, 6 feet to 6-feet-2-inches tall, weighing about 175 to 190 pounds and wearing a long gray t-shirt, blue denim shorts, low-cut white sneakers and a worn gray hat with sunglasses on the top. He was carrying a black-white-and-red-checked backpack.

Police: Bank robbery suspect caught at Newark store

A man accused of robbing an Elkton, Md., bank at knifepoint last week remained behind bars on Monday after investigators tracked him down near Newark over the weekend.

Officers captured the suspect, Roland D. Baumbarger, 23, formerly of the 100 block of Ben Blvd. in Elkton, about 11:45 a.m. on Saturday in the parking lot of a 7-11 convenience store off Route 896 near Newark, police said.

They took Baumbarger into custody without incident after receiving a tip concerning his whereabouts, police said.

"When they arrived, he happened to be sitting in his car in the parking lot," said 1st Sgt. Joseph Zurolo, a spokesman for the Elkton Police Department.

Baumbarger was in the driver's seat of a silver Honda economy car that, according to Zurolo, is the same one he used to make his getaway after robbing the Columbia Bank at 975 E. Pulaski Highway in Elkton about 4 p.m. on Tuesday.

In that incident, Baumbarger allegedly brandished a utility knife and demanded money by way of a handwritten note he passed to a teller.

Baumbarger is charged with armed robbery, robbery, second-degree assault, reckless endangerment and theft of more than \$1,000 and less than \$10,000, according to Cecil County District Court records, which list Baumbarger as a Wilmington resident.

As of late Monday, he

## Newark man dies in Glasgow crash

A Newark man died in a one-vehicle crash while traveling westbound on Pencader Drive in Glasgow Tuesday.

Steven P. Grant Jr., 21, of Newark, was driving a 1995 Acura westbound on Pencader Drive in Glasgow around 12:51 p.m. Tuesday at an apparent high rate of speed when

he attempted to negotiate a curve in the roadway, lost control of his car and began to swerve. The car then struck the concrete curb on the north edge of the road before traveling across the roadway and striking the curb on the south edge. His car then left the roadway and traveled into the grass where it struck a tree. Grant was pronounced dead at the scene.

Pencader Drive was closed for approximately two hours as the crash was investigated and cleared.

The investigation by the Delaware State Police Crash Reconstruction Unit is continuing.

# Cab driver robbed at gunpoint after picking up three men near Newark

Investigators are pursuing leads in the armed robbery of a North East, Md.-based taxi cab driver near Newark last week.

Three young black men robbed a 52-year-old female cab driver for C&S Taxi at gunpoint shortly after she picked them up as a fare in Newark Wednesday, July 13, said Lt. Michael Holmes, spokesman for the Cecil

County Sheriff's Office.

Around 9:30 p.m., the taxi driver picked up the group of men in the 100 block of Maple Drive just over the border in Newark, Holmes said.

"She picked them up at the entrance of a mobile home community and they asked her to take them to the Wal-Mart in North East," Holmes said.

After turning west onto West Chestnut Hill Road and heading into Maryland, the driver approached a dead end, Holmes said.

In the 700 block of West Chestnut Hill Road, one of the suspects then put a gun to the back of the driver's head,

Holmes said.

"They instructed her to exit the car and handed them her money," he added. Holmes noted that the robbers only obtained a minimal amount of cash.

They also took her car keys and cell phone, he added. The phone had an approximate value of \$700, Holmes said.

Despite taking her car keys, the robbers did not steal her vehicle, Holmes said.

"We're not really sure why they didn't actually," he said. "We suspect they didn't want her to flee."

The robbers finally instructed the driver to lie facedown

in the road and count to 50, at which time they fled the scene on foot.

The three suspects are described as black males approximately 18 years old, wearing dark clothing, though one suspect was wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt, Holmes said.

Holmes added that the Cecil County Sheriff's office was investigating a few leads in the incident, but so far had made no arrests.

"We've had some incidents with cab passengers not wanting to pay their fares before, but a robbery of this kind is a bit unique," Holmes said.





Sunday.

Matt Talley, a store manager and member of the Board of Stewards of the Newark Natural Foods Co-op, is in his first year as the sole coordinator for the outdoor farmers market, which has been around for 13 years. He said the community response to the market has been overwhelmingly positive.

"We get a wide variety of (vendor) applicants every year," Talley said. "We've grown from having a few vendors to almost 30."

Recently, word about the market has spread through the community with social media and expanded access through the use of food stamps. With the help of the Delaware Department of Agriculture, vendors at the Co-op Farmers Market are able to accept food stamps as payment for their goods, enabling more families to purchase the goods of local farmers and artisans.

Talley said their market attracts a diverse group of vendors that may rotate throughout the season. The market is not strictly for farmers, he said; vendors also sell fresh baked

goods, arts, and crafts. The market also featured live music and non-profit organizations, such as Newark Bike Project and Food Bank of Delaware.

Talley said an important thing about the farmers market is that the money people spend goes directly into the local economy, which is untrue of large corporate supermarkets.

"A large purpose of our organization is to strengthen the local economy," he said. "It provides an opportunity for interaction you wouldn't otherwise get at a supermarket."

Co-op Farmers Market organizers try to attract some vendors that sell organic foods or promote sustainable growing practices, such as avoiding pesticides.

Bayberry Farm, just north of Middletown, sells naturally grown produce at the market. The Farm Stuff of Pennsylvania sells free-range meats and a selection of vegetables. Lockbriar Farm, a family-run business, features berries and other fruits and vegetables grown with environmentally friendly products.

Calvert Farm of Maryland, just west of Newark, is a certified

organic vegetable, fruit and herb farm. Alan Clay of Calvert Farm said he likes participating in the farmers market because it brings the community together and gives people an opportunity to sell local, fresh, and better quality produce.

"It works to the benefit of the small independent farmer," Clay said.

University of Delaware Dining Services has sponsored the UD farmers market for three years. Dining Services attracts local farms from Delaware and neighboring states to sell fresh fruits, vegetables, and baked goods. UDairy Creamery also features ice cream flavors at each market.

This year, the market

has a Chef's Table, which serves fresh-cooked food. The dishes are made in front of customers and the chefs have recipe cards for people to take for home cooking.

Alison De Paola, president of the Board of Stewards of the Newark Natural Foods Co-op, said much of the draw of farmers markets is the interaction between the farmer and the consumer.

"There's something about being a consumer and being able to look in the eye of the person who grew your produce," De Paola said.

# Charter school issues get a closer look

State representative Earl G. Jaques (D-Glasgow) sponsored legislation in the beginning of June to establish a new review for creating charter schools and eliminate the five-mile radius standard.

The bill was tabled during

a committee meeting June 13 because Jaques said questions were raised that could not be answered before the end of the legislative session.

Jaques said his bill addressed concerns from constituents and attendees of the House Education Committee's public hearing. Jaques said he aims to improve communica-

tion between districts and charter schools and increase student access to charter schools.

"What I heard from many residents, was that they pay school taxes and their school taxes are used to help fund Newark Charter — then their child should be allowed to participate in the lottery," Jaques said.

Jaques' bill would require charter-school applicants to directly address the school dis-

trict in which they would be located and for the two parties to meet face-to-face. The district would need to provide specific reasons for denying an application, Jaques said.

Jaques said the admissions process, transportation costs, and finances of charter schools need a more in-depth review.

The bill introduced by Jaques would not affect existing charter schools that have already gone through the pro-

cess of being approved by the district or state.

Gregory Meece, director of Newark Charter School, said a Blue Ribbon Committee is being formed within the next month to discuss charter-school issues broadly and thoughtfully. The Delaware Charter

Schools Network looks forward to sharing its input through this committee, he said.

"Ultimately, it is in all of our best interest to make sure all children have access to quality public-school options, including public charter schools," Meece said.

## Out of the Attic

First Rhodes Drugs at 168 E. Main St.

This week's Out of the Attic item is an early-1900s photograph of the house at 168 E. Main St. The pharmacist, Dr. George W. Rhodes, smiles in front of Rhodes Drug Store.

Note the intrusion of the commercial front on one side while the residential front is retained on the other.

A new building began to rise further west at the edge of the Delaware College campus at 35 E. Main St. in 1917. The building was trimmed with a white, gargoyle "Venetian Gothic" façade.

This new and larger Rhodes Drug Store included an ice-cream-and-soda fountain with customer stools at the counter as well as table-and-chair seating.

A prominent business leader, Rhodes was active in many aspects of community affairs. He was chosen to chair the organizing committee that led to



the founding of the Newark Lions Club in 1929.

The old property at 168 E. Main was later razed and now is the site of Cold Stone Creamery.



while keeping his opinions to himself and letting the audience members come to their own conclusions, he said.

"My opinion is really irrelevant," he said. "I've given the talk so many times, and each audience has given me so many views, I haven't made up my mind."

As a member of the Delaware Humanities Forum, which spon-

sors speakers, Glazier said he is used to giving three-hour lectures on the topic. Besides discussing the rumors of McCartney's death, Glazier also speaks on the historical impact of The Beatles, a speech he gave at Newark Free Library last fall.

Glazier began sharing his interest in Paul McCartney's "death" as an avid letter to the editor of a Beatles fan magazine called Strawberry Fields Forever. The magazine spon-

sored a convention in Boston in 1976, and asked Glazier to speak to 1,200 people on the topic.

Other convention organizers saw Glazier's speech and continually requested him to speak. They included organizers of the International Beatles Convention in Liverpool, England, who booked him three times.

"I go to Liverpool and I tell them for an hour or so that their favorite son is dead," Glazier said. "None

of them believe me but they enjoy hearing the story."

He said one time Paul McCartney's cousin, singer Kate Robbins, was in the audience and shared her views on his speech.

"She said 'I don't believe a single word, but it's very brilliant,'" Glazier said.

Glazier is a retired public-school teacher of the Colonial School District who has taught at Dickinson

High School and Gunning Bedford Middle School.

He said he has given his speech at many schools, and in May alone gave four presentations on "Is Paul McCartney Dead?" in local schools. He said the teachers love it because it teaches the students to think about song lyrics.

"If I've convinced you, then just re-think everything," Glazier said. "If I haven't convinced you, then you can be happy that your Paul is alive."




Michael Powers and Taylor Reynolds – who will play Saturday night at Delaware Stadium. The only difference is that for four of them, it won't be their last game.

# How to discuss money problems with your kids

When money becomes

scarce, the whole family, from young children to teens to parents, can feel the pinch. Though family members may have limited or no control over the causes of their financial difficulties, they can control

their responses and discuss money problems in a way that minimizes stress and anxiety in children.

No matter what the age of the child, these tips can help.

Parents can turn tough times into learning situations and help children realize that managing money in tough times requires communication, patience, and hard work. Also, help children understand that money problems do not need to rob the family of unity or happiness. Simple things that cost little or nothing can enrich family life, and sticking together is essential in getting through challenges.

Parents and other adults should model how the family can have fun together in less expensive ways. Model for children the value of fun, inexpensive ways to enjoy each other. Have a picnic in the park, make popcorn and watch a video, ride bicycles as a family, or volunteer with a service project.


Increase family communication and solidarity and help children feel some control in their lives. Take time to communicate, dis-

cuss financial concerns, and express to all family members that they are loved and appreciated.

Involve family members in decisions about money. In both tough times and good times, families tend to draw closer as they work together and communicate in making money decisions. Children develop understanding and self-worth when they contribute to the resolution of financial problems. This may involve a teen getting a part-time job or children agreeing to limit their requests for outside entertainment, such as movies.

Assist children in becoming wise consumers and discipline their spending habits. During tough times, children can learn to be wise about their spending choices and use discipline in how they spend money.

Encourage children to contribute in ways that are appropriate to their age. Children can help during tough times by saving money they earn, limiting their spending choices or requests, or contributing income from a part-time job



to help with family needs. Do not put undue burdens on children to generate economic support, but discuss options and allow them to contribute in ways that are meaningful. For more information, go to <http://www.extension.org> and type "managing money in tough times" in the search bar.
