I believe this is a good compromise and win/win for both PT and the ATC. Thank you all for your contacts to representatives, it made a huge difference in these final days, because without pressure from the house. I don't know that this would have been accomplished.

Once I have this in writing from the DATA (we've had verbal conversations while they are at conference this week) I will contact the House of Representatives to share this information.

Thank you again to Greg Rybicki, Joe Lucca, Lynn Snyder-Mackler, Laura Schmitt, Tara AManal, Glenn Brown, George Edelman, Erik VanDoorne, Stacie Larking and Julie Moyer Knowles – these people have spent untold hours behind the scenes reviewing and reworking drafts to try and find compromise.
