

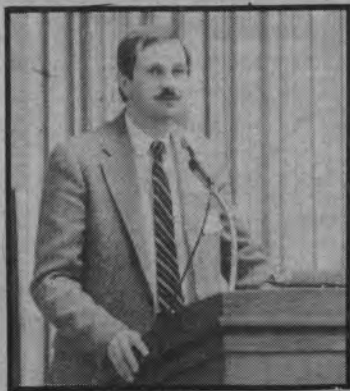
## Administration resigns; who cares?

The entire university's higher administration resigned yesterday, amidst a controversy, sparked by state Schlep Rep. Aloe Plant, that has brought the state Sexual Relations Commission to campus to investigate university relationships, student officials said.

The resignations will be effective immediately.

Steve Constantwhine, president of the Delaware Undergraduate Singles Club (DUSC), comforted fellow stu-

dents during this trying time by issuing a statement today that he will step in to administrate until the university can find replace-

ments for all the president's men.

The statement was brought by a Public Safety officer to *The Review* exclusively (and not to *The News Journal*).

Constantwhine said in a telephone interview yesterday his first priority at this time is to gather a search crew to implement an interplanetary search for new leaders.

President E.A. T-ME. He said yesterday afternoon that he was not aware of his decision to resign.

"No one told me I resigned, but I'm sure if you checked with Mr. Nowhitabouthim, he would

Ron Nowhitabouthim, assistant to the president, confirmed that, "Yes indeed the president

has resigned," but he declined comment as to his own resignation.

Senior Vice President for Lackof Administration Iver Hollowhead seems to have lead this vast administrative decision. He indicated in a statement issued by Scary Pimple in the office of Sexual Services, that he thought Aloe Plant's claims of sexual activity were unfounded. ## Hoagie declares 5 p.m. noise ordinance Chief of police also institutionalizes 9 p.m. bedtime rule

MOUNT OLYMPUS — The university board of trustees plans to build a fraternity/sorority row smack dab in the middle of the mall.

The university is considering demolishing Dupont Hall if necessary.

## Feds award \$\$\$\$ to Barstool Inst. for beer additive

WASHINGTON — The Federal Government and a major brewery have awarded the university's Barstool Research Institution a multi-million dollar contract to develop an alcohol additive that would decrease beer consumption on college campuses nationwide.

The \$12.6 million contract was awarded to the university because it has one of the largest test groups in the country, said one prominent senator who asked to remain anonymous, but is the husband of Tipper Gore. "How do you think she got her first name?" he chuckled.

"I think it is, very simply, a splendid idea," said Anne Houser-Busch, director for the Barstool Research Institution. "I'm very hammered, I mean, uh, splattered, I mean flattered that

they asked me to oversee the project. Sorry I blundered."

Spiller Brewing Company contributed \$6 million of the \$14.5 million contract, a company spokesman said. He was unconcerned about the brewery's loss of revenues from the college market.

"Well hell yeah," said Spiller President "Milwaukee" Joe Dinero. "Of course we're going to lose some big money in profit, not to mention the six mil we're shelling out for this little project. But we are dedicated to the betterment of campuses across the country."

He added that a deterrent from alcohol abuse was worth any price. University officials agreed.

"We hope it will fill an academic void at the university," said university President E.A. Vivant. "As well as decrease voiding on the lawns of Newark

# Extended housing students crammed into tents

Pup tents, cardboard boxes and sleeping bags will be used as extended housing for freshmen,

according to the Office of Housing and Residence Strife.

"I refuse to just sit around and watch the grass grow—I've got to take action," he added.

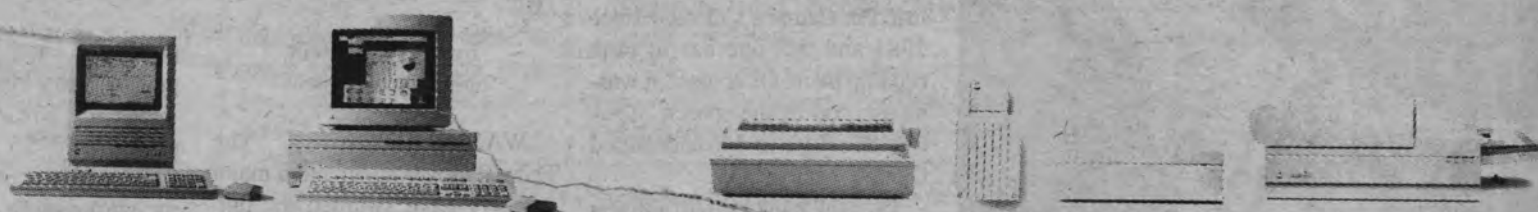
Vine's only other political experience was as vice president of the 4-H Club in high school. He was also a boy scout for five years.

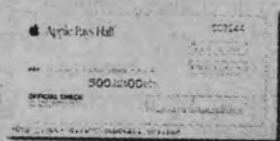

residents."

Researchers at the institute said they expect the additive to be developed in about five years.

"F—ing ay!" ejaculated Tank R. Funnel (ASS 90). "I should be long gone by then, kicking back on a Caribbean beach with a few cold ones."

Other students echoed Funnel's sentiment.

"I think the idea sucks," said Ann B. Divine (AS 92). "I mean,

like I totally don't care about myself, but, ya know, like a lot of people drink beer. I really get down on wine coolers, though. Like, wild berry flavor is the absolute best, and I'm like a totally *wild* girl, ya know?"

Federal Legislators denied that the additive would be detrimental to the lifestyle of college students.

"These kids have got to grow up sometime," said John "Black" Tower, who was recently denied appointment to the post of secre-

tary of defense. "That's what college is all about.

"Lord knows, when I'm laying on a dialysis machine a few years from now, I want to know I'm in good hands," he added.

Researchers at Barstool explained that the additive would increase a naturally-occurring enzyme that aids metabolism of alcohol. In combination with certain sugars in beer, the enzyme upsets the body's hormonal balance and produces an extremely violent diuretic effect.

"What this means," said Dr. Wolfgang Biermeister, professor of chemistry, "is that a consumer of beer would be rendered incontinent at any given moment after imbibing." He added that sexual performance would also be severely impaired, for obvious reasons.

"Oh, like totally gross," said Divine. "You mean I could, like, ya know, pee anywhere, anytime? Like, gross! What if there's no potty around?"

Experts could not say if the additive would lead to increased consumption of other forms of alcohol. However, some distil-

leries reported they are developing keg forms of "jungle juice," made from 190-proof grain alcohol and fruit punch, and other favorites such as margaritas and daquiris.

Legislators have vowed to fight such action. University officials said that if their product is successful, they will market it in the wine and "hard liquor" markets.

"The university stands to profit greatly from the successful development of this product," said Vivant. "We might be able to bail ourselves out of our current dire financial straits."

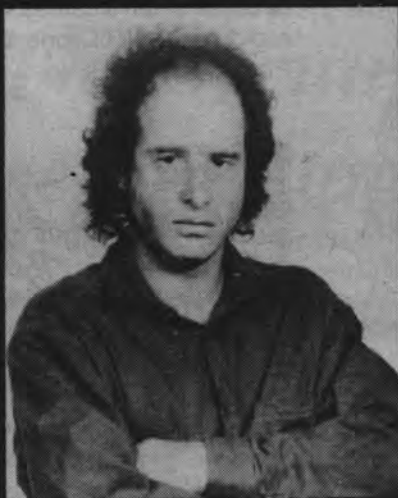
Barry Layher (BE 99) said, "He will be a definite asset to this fine institution, which I am so proud to be an integral part of."

Others who announced their

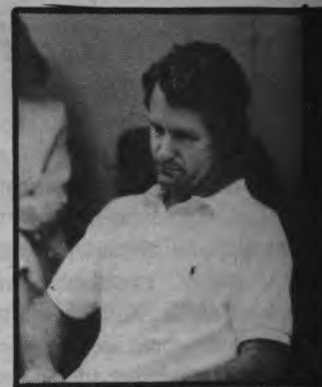

ning around with their heads up their asses."

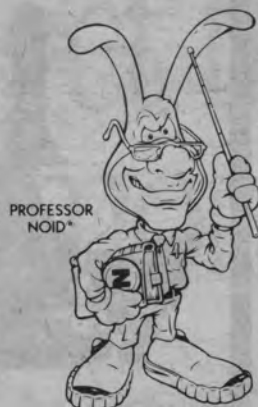
Former university President Lusty Moans also declined comment yesterday.

Some come with empty wallets and I.D. cards full of points. Others discover the restaurant when they miss regular dining hall mealtimes. But all of those who visit the Scrunge leave with that same feeling: that warm, satisfied sensation nagging in the pits of their stomach. It will stay with them for at least a half an hour.

Yes, it's true: the Scrunge has it all. It's a feast for both the mouth and the eyes. The rustic paneling, moveable walls, disposable plasticware and dim, what-am-I-eating lighting lend the restaurant a calm, and very relaxing air.

And what relaxation! While waiting on line for cold foods, admire the careful sandwich-building techniques of renowned chefs like I. M. Slow, Waitilim Goodan Redy, and Sloe Pok Rodriguez. The servers offer personable touches and words of wisdom so rarely found in dining halls, like: "Didja say ya wanta tamata?" And as your bill is tallied up, checker Lethargic Lyle kindly confirms that

the items on your tray represent the order you wanted. "That's a soda," she offers, unselfishly. "And chips? And a card," she comments, as she checks your I.D. Yet another personable touch.

The hot specialties offered at the Scrunge are no less tempting than the cold, though they take a bit longer to reach room temperature. If you remind Sloe Pok several times, she might give you French fries with Cheez Wiz, a tasty and effective anti-carcinogen.

One flaw with the cuisine, however: toasted bread is consistently unattainable at the Scrunge. (The toaster went out of commission last semester when server Lai Z. Daisy was occupied putting on her disease-preventing plastic gloves and didn't notice as the toaster smoked and charred one poor student's rye to black. Lai Z. offered him mayo.)

But my most overwhelming impression of the Scrunge is that it's so sanitary. I noticed only two pests there — just tiny eight-legged things who stopped by for a cheese steak like the rest of us.

And with fine dining like this, who could blame them?

"Like, I don't know if people would really appreciate this coming out of the comprehensive student fee," he said. "I just don't want to rock the cradle."

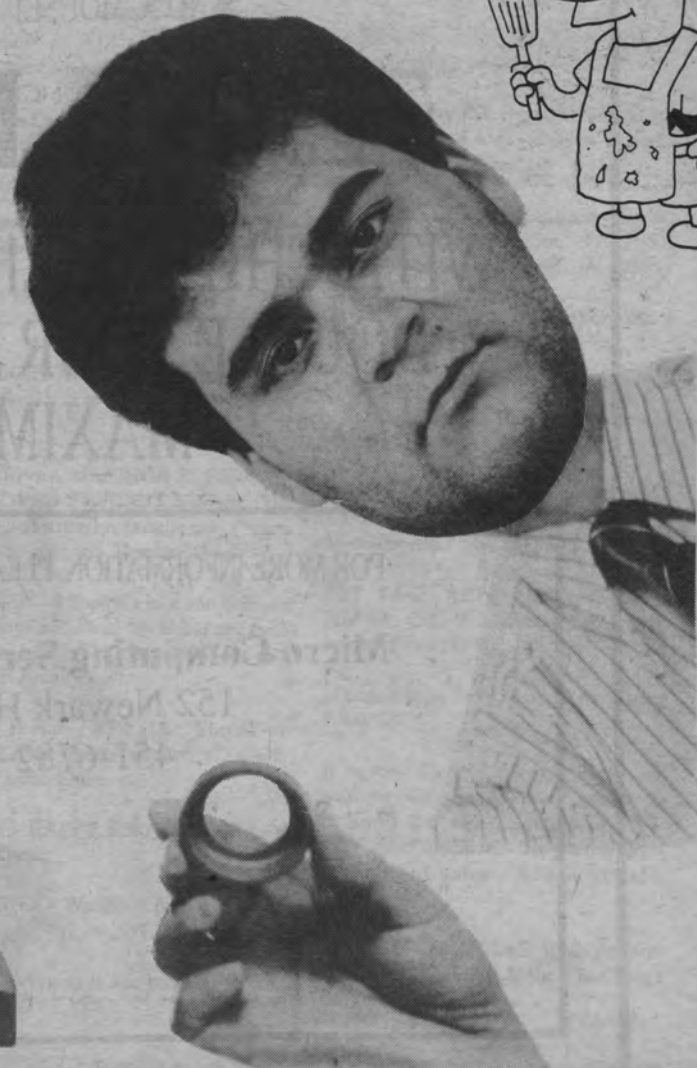
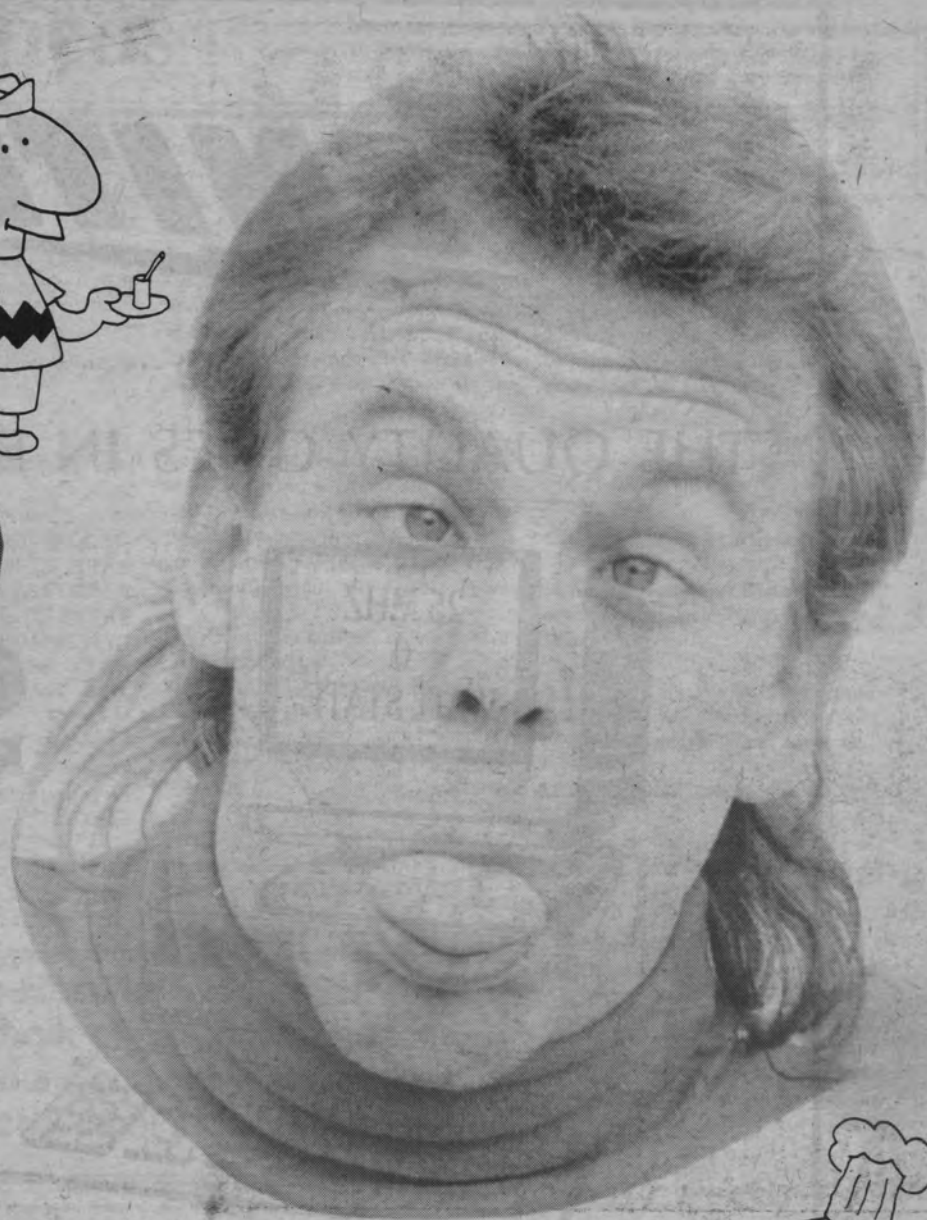

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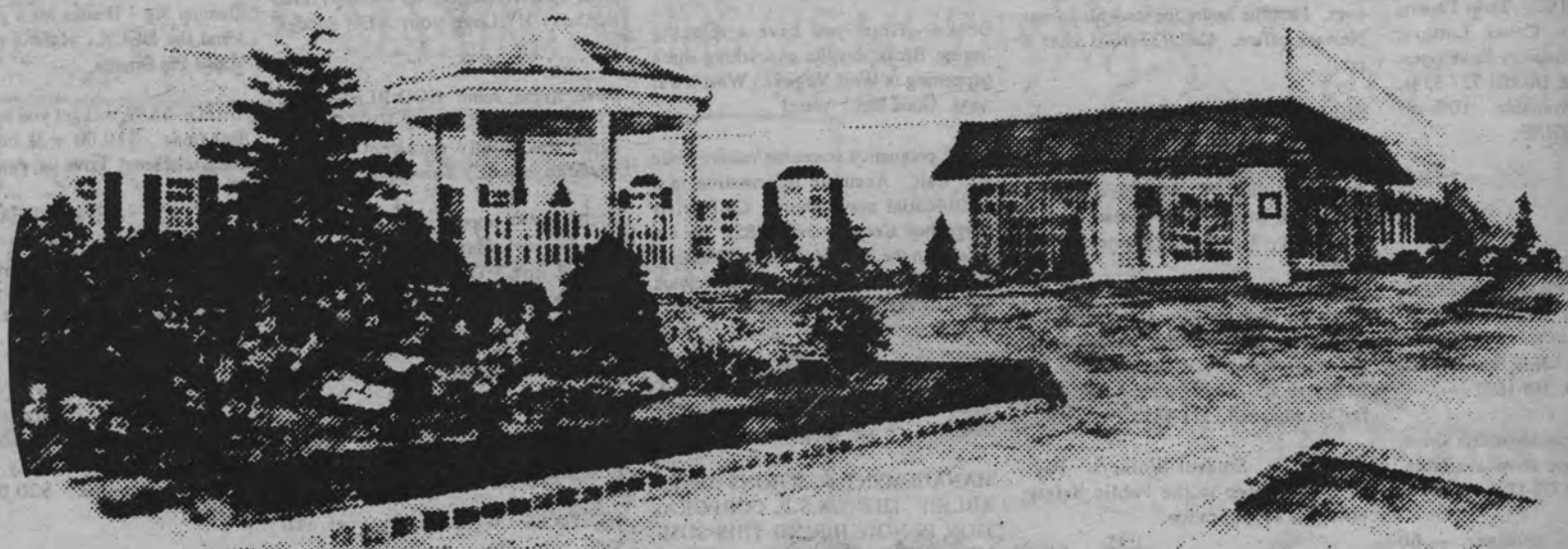
