Colonel Ephraim Preston Jolls, retired Army officer and former professor of military science and lactics at the University of Delaware, died of cancer last Monday morning at the Veterans Administration Hospital at the age of 72.

Colonel Jolls retired from the Army in 1946. He served in the Panama Canal Zone and Hawaii as well as Army posts in this country, and was stationed at Ft. Francis E. Warren in Cheyenne, Wyo., at the time of his retirement. While serving there he was awarded a citation for preserving reacial harmony with 1700ps under his command.
