To the Members of the Delaware State Senate and the State House of Representatives of the 136th General Assembly

On April 21, 1992, I signed into law <u>Senate Bill No 280</u> which is entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 80, TITLE 15 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS."

This legislation authorizes political subdivisions of the state to enact ordinances providing for public financing of their elections. It is important to point out that this is merely enabling legislation which permits the counties and municipalities to enact their own ordinances should they choose to provide for public financing. Therefore it will be necessary for those political subdivisions which elect to enact such legislation to carefully and thoroughly evaluate their needs and to develop ordinances which will equitably and effectively address those needs.

I support this legislation because I believe that public financing of local elections can lead to a more competitive system where challengers as well as incumbents have access to adequate resources with which to run effective campaigns. The impact which a system of public financing can have on elections to local office is particularly significant where large individual contributions can be disproportionate to the total amount of campaign contributions received by a candidate. In such elections, public financing can diminish the influence of special interest money, encourage the participation of small contributors and reduce the need for candidates to spend significant amounts of time soliciting money from large contributors.

encourage the participation of small contributors and reduce the need for candidates to spend significant amounts of time soliciting money from large contributors.

Finally, it is my hope that any local ordinance which is enacted by a political subdivision as a result of SB 280 would not attempt to pay for the costs of public financing through a tax "add-on", i.e., by asking taxpayers to contribute funds in addition to their existing tax obligations. Studies by Common Cause and other nonpartisan interest groups have established that tax add-ons are unsuccessful as a public financing mechanism in that they result in minimal taxpayer participation and insufficient funding. Rather, any political subdivision seeking to enact a public financing ordinance should ensure that it already has a reliable funding source available or, alternatively, should consider voluntary contributions such as tax check-offs in order to implement the ordinance's provisions so as not to add an additional burden on its taxpayer.

In conclusion, it is my hope that the legislation I have signed today can serve as a vehicle for establishing a more open, equitable and competitive local election process.

Senator Holloway further requested that her prepared statement be made a part of the Senate Journal and also a copy available for each Senator.

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to speak to you today. As an immigrant to this great country, I have had the opportunity to realize to the fullest the American dream and the great honor received this year as State Teacher has crowned my career and reaffirmed my belief that this is still the land of opportunity where through hard work and dedication we can aim high and succeed.

I especially wish to thank you for the support and the funding you offer every year to recognize state teachers, one of the highest honors in Delaware. Your attention and your care towards our profession brings the lustre, the prestige, and the encouragement so much needed by all teachers.

I am delighted to be the spokesperson for my profession at an exciting time of change and reforms in our educational system and glad that my diversified European background and my unique experience as an Italian teacher in an American School can be helpful to students as well as to colleagues.

Today, I would like to share with you my thoughts on education and for some brief moments ideally transport you to my classroom to give you some first-hand experiences of what it means to be a teacher in the last decade of our century.

In 1981, when I decided to resume my teaching career in Delaware, my adaptability to different educational environments as well as my teaching experience in Italy helped me respond quickly to a variety of situations unfamiliar to me. The transition was definitely surprising because I quickly realized that across all cultural, ethnic and language differences, the one constant appealing aspect of teaching is the close bonding and nurturing of young minds. From that distant 1981 student teaching experience at Laurel High School, the response of my students has consistently been enthusiastic. This is the happiest time of the year for me as a teacher. During the past few days of school, students stop by my classroom to show me their gratitude and appreciation. Since the end of school, every day, I have found thank you notes in my mail box. I said this is the happiest time, because I receive the most spontaneous and sincere proofs that I have been able to touch the minds and hearts of the young students entrusted to me.

As I look back from the vantage point of 11 years at MHS (Milford High School), to summarize my philosophy of teaching, I would say that the foundation of all my teaching approaches resides in a firm commitment to understand the emotional and intellectual needs of my students according to their different ages and backgrounds and to act as a role model. This understanding establishes in each class a subtle balance between authority and kindness, scholarship and common sense, discipline and empathy. In this atmosphere, students build a sense of trust and open up their young minds to new learning experiences while building a sense of confidence in their own abilities.

I firmly believe that this philosophy of teaching is conducive to success. I would like to illustrate to you the reasons for this success and in the final part of my speech to illustrate to you what I consider to (sic) of my most important concerns regarding our curricula.

First and foremost, my adaptability to different teaching environments and roles has enabled me to become more than simply a source of knowledge but to be actively involved in the emotional well-being of my students. It is very comforting for me when students open up to me, consider me their friends confidant and know that I can help if only as a listener and direct them to other professionals. Most definitely, to be a teacher in the nineties requires strength, stamina, and a readiness to solve all crises.

Secondly, my ability to reach students beyond all differences of language and background has allowed me to respond to the ever increasing multicultural and global needs of our classrooms. A firm understanding of the anxieties that "being different" may cause (and believe me I have experienced many) will help teachers have the perseverance needed to make minority students understand that to be different does not necessarily mean to be better or worse but simply what it means "different and unique."

Thirdly, from the academic point of view, my rigorous background in the humanities has enabled me to make stringent demands on all my students and to motivate them to develop their full intellectual potential. I firmly believe that a positive classroom atmosphere has the sole and unique purpose to enable students to learn. Once the classroom environment has been established, teachers must have the confidence and the strength to maintain rigorous academic standards and never lose focus of the fact that

the classroom must be a place which students find meaningful and challenging so that even students at risk will soon pay attention and become interested.

In my classroom, I go the extra mile to help my students perform, but I consistently dare them to do better. My students are required to write clearly and concisely. They dare them to do better. My students are required to write clearly and concisely. They are required to become familiar and to respond critically to the classics. They are required to become knowledgeable of literary tradition and to open up to the power of language and of the imagination. I firmly believe that this knowledge is essential to well rounded students. Ultimately, my vision and my goal is to enable them to achieve a clear and articulate way of thinking and communicating, of developing a love of learning. On a practical level, they need to be able to apply for a job and be qualified, or to apply to a college of their choice and be accepted.

As we approach the end of the century and introduce a breadth of innovation and new standards of excellence in our schools, I am confident that we as teachers will be able to meet the challenge of the future with the encouragement and support of all of you. And as we ask ourselves what our youth need to become responsible and competitive adults, two are the issues that I would like to bring to your attention. Number one the importance of the humanities and number two the importance of foreign languages in our curricula.

The well rounded student is first of all knowledgeable of his own culture and tradition through the study of history, literature, and the arts. The Romans had a saying "History is the teacher of life" and the old saying is still valid and; has all the wisdom of many centuries. Technology alone cannot sustain the sense of reverence and respect for our own country which are essential if we wish to be competitive. Secondly, the well rounded student is truly "multicultural", that is he is aware of other cultures through the study of other languages and has the knowledge and open mindedness needed to compete in what is now defined as the "global village", a term which is becoming increasingly familiar in the nineties. We may have the state of the arts in technology and in computer sciences, but our students need the know-how to market them in other countries in the world. market them in other countries in the world.

My vision as a teacher is that my students, in addition to their ability to communicate clearly in English, become aware of other cultures and languages and understand the need of learning how to communicate in the global village as a way to respond constructively to world events challenging the preeminent position of the U. An increased cooperation between schools and universities and business communities will enable teachers to acquire the necessary expertise and hands-on experience to introduce a global perspective in the curriculum.

Thank you for giving me the time on your very full agenda to express my appreciation of the honor as Delaware Teacher of the Year for 1991-1992.

Dear Senator Marshall:

Thank you for your response to our interest in acquiring the Bridge House property.

As we indicated to you, we wish to acquire this property and convert it into an expansion of our parking lot. Our existing lot accommodates only about 50 cars. As a result, many of our members must park at the foot of Brown Street and walk up a very steep hill. Since many of our members are elderly, this trek has become a hardship to them.

We have agreed that, should we acquire this property, we will have a deed restriction put into the contract to close off any existing entrances or exits at the Bridge House site. The only entrances and exits to the VFW will be those that we already use.

Our proposal is strongly supported by the surrounding community. Eight of our volunteers canvassed the community between June 11 and 13. They were armed with petitions and, as you can see by the returned petitions, well over 250 of our neighbors support the proposal. Significantly, not one person who we encountered expressed opposition to this proposal.

In fact, the main concern that people raised was that they did not want the streets by the Bridge House to be opened up to additional traffic. When they heard that we would have a deed restriction to close those entrances, they heartily supported our proposal.

Again, I would like to thank you and Representative Jonkiert for your support. We have been good neighbors to our friends in the community for years and we look forward to continuing that relationship.

HB 565, having been defeated in the House, was inadvertedly delivered to the Senate and placed on the pre-file legislation and was therefore removed from the list after the reading.

The following veto messages, received from the Office of the Governor, were read in and made part of the record.

STATE OF DELAWARE Office of the Governor

To the Members of the Delaware State Senate of the 136th General Assembly

On July 2, 1992, I received Senate Bill No. 194, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1, entitled:

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 69, TITLE 29, OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO PUBLIC WORK CONTRACTS."

This legislation, if enacted, would represent a major revision of Delaware's prevailing wage rate statute. However, it poses significant administrative and financial burdens for several state departments and political subdivisions as well as contractors and subcontractors. Moreover, it could unintentionally result in increased costs of public work projects to the detriment of the state's taxpayers. For these reasons, I am returning Senate Bill No. 194, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1, without my signature.

While I recognize the need to provide fair and equitable wages to laborers working on state-funded public work projects, this bill places unreasonable additional duties on contractors and subcontractors, which could significantly increase the costs to the taxpayers to fund these projects. My disapproval of this legislation should not, therefore, be interpreted as reflecting a negative position on this important

labor-related issue; rather, it should be viewed in light of my concern for its impact on Delaware taxpayers and on various agencies of state government, including the Departments of Labor, Transportation and Administrative Services, and other political subdivisions.

One of the significant problems created by the legislation concerns its applicability. The original bill defined a "public body", to include the State of Delaware, its agencies, and its political subdivisions, including counties, towns and municipalities. In an attempt to exempt political subdivisions from compliance with the prevailing wage rate provisions, Senate Amendment No. I modified the definition of "public work" to include projects that exceed \$5,000 in cost and are paid in whole or in part out of "funds appropriated by the state." However, this modification only related to the funding source, not the part to the contract. Thus, at the very least, this bill creates considerable confusion as to whether a county or municipality would have to comply with the prevailing wage rate requirements if it pays for even a portion of a project with state money. Moreover, any private projects which received any State funding arguably would be required to comply with the provisions of this bill as well. This requirement would likely add unreasonably to the cost of such projects while imposing additional administrative burdens as discussed hereafter.

Another cumbersome and costly requirement of the bill is that it mandates that state agencies and other public bodies publish a certified wage determination, listing the prevailing wage rate, in every advertisement for bids on public work projects. This requirement would be cost prohibitive. The Department of Transportation alone, estimates that its current advertising costs, which run between \$150,000 - \$200,000 annually, could double if this requirement is imposed.

Still another concern is the additional requirement that all contractors and subcontractors must submit a weekly certified payroll to the appropriate public body, detailing the hourly wage paid to every employee. This requirement could overwhelm the state and political subdivisions by necessitating cumbersome and unnecessary paperwork. It would also place additional accounting, policing and reporting burdens on the public bodies, contractors, and subcontractors alike. Furthermore, the bill directs the Secretary of Labor to order any public body to withhold payment to any contractor or subcontractor which fails to submit a certified payroll. Lastly, before final payment on the project, the "Treasurer" of a public body must obtain a certified statement from the contractor and subcontractor acknowledging that the prevailing wage rate was paid.

Taken together, the various requirements in this legislation constitute burdensome and costly over-regulation. State agencies buried under stacks of paperwork would be unable to verify and effectively enforce these prevailing wage rate provisions, thereby contradicting the intent of this legislation. In attempting to comply with all of the requirements, the costs to contractors and subcontractors would inevitably increase, which, in turn, would raise the total cost of these projects to be borne by the state's taxpayers.

Finally, there is an irreconcilable legal problem in the amended bill. Senate Amendment No. 1 gives the Superior Court jurisdiction over violations of the bill's provisions; however, the Superior Court is granted appellate jurisdiction in the bill itself. Therefore, as finally passed, the Superior Court has been granted both original and appellate jurisdiction.

In conclusion, I recognize the need to ensure compliance with the existing prevailing wage law. A simple and effective method of accomplishing that objective is to heighten awareness of its provisions and the available remedies afforded for violations. Unfortunately, this legislation would not assist in this effort, and, in fact, would likely have counterproductive effects.

For the reasons stated herein, I am returning Senate Bill No 194, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1, without my signature.

On July 2, 1992, I received Senate Bill No. 311 entitled:

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 3, DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO DISPARAGEMENT OF AGRICULTURAL OR AQUACULTURAL PRODUCTS."

This legislation would create a new legal cause of action would allow a producer of agricultural or aquacultural products to bring suit to recover damages if another individual "disparages" or disseminates false information about any of the producer's perishable products. While I have always been supportive of farm related legislative initiative, I believe that this bill is unnecessary and would unjustifiable create a cause of action unique to this industry. As a result, I am returning Senate Bill No. 311 to the Senate without my signature.

Under existing principles of tort law, various causes of action exist which could provide relief in situations where someone falsely disparages a farmer's agricultural products or otherwise, through his or her actions, causes damage to an agricultural enterprise, Specifically, the courts already recognize causes of action including intentional or negligent misrepresentation, defamation, tortious interference with contractural relations, unlawful interference with a business or occupation, and injury to business reputation. Any of these causes of action could afford protection of a farmer depending on the facts and circumstances of a given case.

Senate Bill No. 311 would set a potentially harmful precedent by unnecessarily establishing a narrow cause of action geared to particular conduct relating to a specific business. Throughout the history of American jurisprudence, the common law has fashioned a series of broad remedies available to those who have been wronged in their persons or property by the actions of others. Since various legal remedies already provide adequate protections in the event that someone damages an agricultural producer's business by disparaging that producer's products, I am returning Senate Bill No 311 to the Senate without my signature.

On July 21, 1992, I received Senate Bill 98, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1, entitled:

"AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 59, TITLE 29 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO THE MERIT SYSTEM OF PERSONNEL ADMINISTRATION; AND PROVIDING FOR DONATED LEAVE."

This bill closely tracks legislation that I vetoed in 1989. It seeks to create a donated leave program for State officers and employees. As I stated in my previous veto message, this type of legislation is inconsistent with the rationale behind the sick leave system for State employees in Delaware. I am convinced that this type of employment practice is not in the best interests of the State or its employees and could adversely impact the operations of the State and the productivity of its workforce. Additionally, the legislation contains several technical and substantive problems which would make its effective implementation virtually impossible. As a result, I am returning Senate Bill 98, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1, to the Senate without my signature.

As was the case with the previously vetoed legislation, this bill defines a "catastrophic illness or injury" in such a manner as to permit abuse of the donated leave provision. The term is defined as "any illness or injury the treatment of which ... consumes, or can reasonably be expected to consume more leave time (including annual leave) than the total amount of leave accumulated by, or otherwise available to the employee." Thus eligibility for use of donated leave is not based upon the severity of an illness as it should be, but rather upon the amount of leave available to an

employee. As a result, an employee who has used up all of his or her leave would be eligible for donated leave, regardless the basis for requesting such leave. Moreover, among the lists of examples provided in the bill which constitute a "catastrophic illness or injury" are examinations and medical consultations which presumably could include routine visits to a physician. Thus, the definition which would authorize the use of donated leave is clearly overbroad and would subject the leave program to misuse and abuse.

Another area of concern is that while the legislation provides that the Director of State Personnel is to "carry out the mandate of this act", it provides no enforcement mechanism to assist in that effort. Likewise, the bill provides no sanctions in the event its provisions are violated.

Additional administrative difficulties would likely arise in cases where employees who are paid under various federal grants or programs seek to donate or receive sick leave from other State employees. In such cases, an issue exists as to whether the conversion of donated leave into cash value, as provided for in the legislation, could legally occur when federal money is involved. Such a transaction involving federal funds could give rise to audit exceptions when various programs are audited by their federal sponsors.

It is readily apparent that the system for sick leave currently in place in this state was never intended to operate in the fashion contemplated by this legislation. While the concept of a dedicated leave program is a reasonable one, the specific legislation before me is clearly deficient. Other areas not addressed by this bill, but which should be incorporated into any donated leave program, include a requirement that an individual receiving donated leave must also have donated leave at some point. Additionally, it is inappropriate, as this legislation would provide, to permit an employee accepting donated leave to still retain half of his or her vacation time. Donated leave should only be provided to an employee who has exhausted all of his or her

leave, whether it be vacation time, compensatory time or sick leave.

Finally, the bill provides that no employee is permitted to donate leave within the last six months prior to his or her retirement. It provides no mechanism, however, to monitor, enforce or effectively apply this requirement.

For the reasons stated herein, I am returning Senate Bill 98, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1, to the Delaware State Senate without my signature.

On July 8, 1992, I received Senate Bill No. 361, as amended by House Amendment No. 1, entitled:

"AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 24 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO NURSES AND TO RECOGNIZE ADVANCED REGISTERED NURSE PRACTITIONERS WHO DO NOT QUALIFY FOR A NATIONAL CERTIFICATION EXAMINATION."

This bill seeks to waive Delaware's statutory requirements for licensure as an advanced registered nurse practitioner for an individual who does not comply with national certification requirements approved by the state Board of Nursing.

Because this bill conflicts with nationally-recognized certification requirements adopted by the state Board of Nursing, and would create a two-tiered standard for licensure of nurse practitioners caring for clients in State-sponsored clinics, I am returning Senate Bill No. 361, as amended by House Amendment No. 1, without my signature.

Earlier this year, the Board of Nursing denied an application for licensure as an advanced registered nurse practitioner to the individual for whom this legislation was drafted. In a hearing on June 17, 1992, regarding the application denial, the Board of Nursing explained that the applicant does not meet requirements established by the American Nurses Association which would permit her to sit for the certification examination since she does not have the requisite college bachelor of science degree.

Not only would this legislation establish an ill-advised precedent, it would be unfair to Delaware's sixty-two advanced registered nurse practitioners who have had to comply with these national requirements to obtain their certifications.

While the applicant appears to be a dedicated registered nurse practitioner with an exemplary performance record, legislation should not rewrite established national standards for one individual. Therefore, for the reasons stated herein, I am returning Senate Bill No. 361, as amended by House Amendment No. 1, without my signature.

To the Members of the Delaware State Senate of the 136th General Assembly

On June 29, 1992, I received Senate Bill No. 143, as amended by Senate Amendment

No. 1, entitled:
"AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 7, TITLE 19 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO MEAL BREAKS."

This bill requires most Delaware employers to provide unpaid meal breaks of at least thirty minutes if employees work seven-and-a-half or more consecutive hours. Because this legislation addresses important health and safety concerns, I am signing it into law. At the same time, however, I am concerned that the thirty minute unpaid break provision conflicts with federal law and may unintentionally adversely effect employers and employees alike.

Federal law already requires employers to offer either twenty minute paid breaks or thirty minute unpaid breaks for lunch or any other purpose. Under Senate Bill 143, as amended, that option is eliminated. As a result, employees may lose income and employers may lose valuable production time. For example, a business operates around the clock on consecutive eight-hour shifts with no overlap and gives employees a twenty minute paid break will now be required to provide its employees with thirty minute unpaid breaks. It is likely that such an employer will substitute the longer unpaid break for the twenty minute paid break thereby resulting in a loss of income for the employees and a loss of production time for the employer.

Therefore, while I am signing Senate Bill No. 143, as amended by Senate

Amendment No. 1, into law, I urge the members of the General Assembly to act promptly to correct the conflict created by this bill. This can be accomplished by simply changing the mandated break period to twenty minutes and eliminating the pay provision. This change will give employers more flexibility in providing breaks for their employees and ensure that Delaware employees have a reasonable break period at work.

Roll call vote on <u>HB 652</u> was taken and revealed 20 Senators voting YES and 1 (Blevins) voting NO; therefore, the Bond Bill was declared adopted by the Senate and returned to the House.

Senator Still requested that HB 343 be taken up for consideration on motion of Senator Still under suspension of rules. However, Senator Sharp objected to the suspension of rules and a roll call vote ensued to consider the bill. The roll call vote on the motion to consider the bill revealed 7 Senators (Bair, Connor, Hauge, McDowell, Neal, Still) voting YES; and 14 senators voting NO; therefore the motion to consider the bill was defeated.

On motion of Senator Marshall, the roll call vote on HB 656 was lifted and announced: 11 Senators (Blevins, Cook, Holloway, Marshall, Martin, McBride, McDowell, Minner, Torbert, Vaughn, Venables) voted YES; and 10 (Adams, Bair, Connor, Cordrey, Hauge, Knox, Neal, Sharp, Sokola, Still) voted NO. Having received the majority of votes, <u>HB 656</u> was

declared passed by the Senate and returned to the House.

On motion of Senator Bair, <u>SR 70</u> was taken up for consideration.


