Dear Laird,

Recently, the Senate passed Senate Bill 240. It is my understanding the purpose of this bill is to reimburse Vincent A. Theisen, Esq. for certain legal expenses resulting from a tax payers suit instituted by a small group of civic minded individuals.

While I can endorse the civic mindedness of the citizens who instituted the action, I can see no reason why those same civic minded citizens should expect the State of Delaware to underwrite the legal costs of their action.

Since the State of Delaware was in no way re-

sponsible for the initiation of the suit, I find it questionable that the state should step into the financial gap left by these civic minded citizens when they decided not to pay the fees incurred by their attorney. And certain specific questions come to mind:

- 1. Is it not possible to interpret the drafting of this piece of legislation in the form of a majority bill as an attempt to evade the Delaware Statute requiring a 3/4 enactment to reimburse an individual?
- 2. Would this bill, if passed, establish an undesireable precedent?
- 3. According to the old newspaper accounts, the initiators of the suit formed a committee to retain an attorney and finance his efforts. Does it not then follow that the introduction of this bill is an attempt to pass the financial obligations of this small group of civic minded individuals off onto the state purse?
- 4. Will the passage of this majority bill by a simple majority express the overwhelming consent of our citizenry to assume this obligation?

I fully agree with Senator duPont that the attorney should be reimbursed. However, I believe the reimbursement should be made by the small group of civic minded individuals who retained him.

Your prompt response to my enquiry will be appreciated.

Dear Bill:

I think it appropriate to put in writing some of my

thoughts which relate to Senate Bill 240, which passed the Senate by a simple majority, and House Bill 310, both of which are now pending in the House. Both bills relate to the payment of attorney fees and out-of-pocket expenses which I incurred in the trial of the action brought by a number of citizens and residents of the State of Delaware to bring about a reapportionment of the General Assembly of the State of Delaware.

The case which generated the application for the payment of attorney fees has a long and involved history which is documented in six opinions of a special Three Judge Federal Court and a landmark decision of the Supreme Court of the United States. It began in June of 1962 and the final opinion of the Court was rendered 6-1/2 years later. It was an exceptional case and had remarkable results. By the application of the principles for which I fought "One Man-One Vote" became the basis of representation in the General Assembly of the State of Delaware.

The unusual aspect of the case and its results and the importance to the people of the State of Delaware is illustrated, I think, by the repeated observations of Chief Judge John Biggs, Jr., who, in the course of the trial, stated on three occasions that it was the most important case that he had encountered in his more than 25 years on the Federal Bench. The press, in its round-up of the most important events of the decade, which ended upon December 31, 1969, rated the Reapportionment suit among the ten most important matters that had occurred in the period 1960 to 1970.

The Order terminating the litigation provided in part as follows:

"It is Further Ordered that the jurisdiction rendered by this Court by its Decree of January 24, 1967 be and the same hereby is relinquished and jurisdiction will be retained for the sole purpose of fixing counsel fees, if any, and costs herein and in entering a judgment in respect thereto."

The Court conducted a hearing on this question on July 24, 1970, notice of which had been given to all counsel of record. At that hearing, all persons conceded that the facts which I had set forth in my affidavit in support of my application were correct. Those facts detailed the more than 4,784 hours which I and my associates had expended in bringing about the reapportionment of the General Assembly of the State. No person objected to the allowance of such a fee. The Deputy Attorney Gen-

eral, who represented the State, announced that the Department of Justice of Delaware did not oppose my application. On that occasion, the Deputy stated, "We assume that the petitioner will seek an appropriation through the Legislature...the Department of Justice does not oppose this application." In the opinion the Court said:

"We are of the opinion that the requested amount of compensation and out-of-pocket expenses are reasonable. We take judicial notice that the amount sought as compensation is in accord with fees of the members of the Bar of Delaware of a standing like unto that of Mr. Theisen....We point out that the result obtained by the petitioner and his associates was indeed excellent. The State of Delaware has been properly and lawfully reapportioned by the General Assembly in accordance with the law laid down by the Supreme Court of the United States."

The Court also pointed out that the General Assembly had appropriated the total sum of \$295,000 to pay the legal fees and expenses of defendants and that the unexpended balance of such funds, if any, had reverted to the General Fund. The Court thereupon observed:

"This means that if Mr. Theisen is to be paid a fee, the necessary additional funds will have to be created by a new legislative appropriation. We conclude that Mr. Theisen's petition must be dismissed for want of jurisdiction. We reiterate, however, that he has done a fine and splendid work for the State of Delaware and its citizens. In the context of this case, however, thanks and praise cannot be deemed to be too valuable considerations. We hope that Mr. Theisen will be rewarded his just compensation by the grace of the General Assembly."

With this background, I cannot help but comment that I am astonished at the adverse publicity which has been generated because of the apparent political connotations attributed to its introduction because, by coincidence, I happen to be at this time Republican Chairman for New Castle County. When this case was started in 1962, it had one purpose only. Namely, to benefit the people of the State of Delaware. I did not ask that reapportionment be limited to benefits to any one party. I have never had such thought in mind, but recently events have made it crystal clear that perhaps I have been naive in my assumption that political

capital would not be made out of the application. It might be noted, however, that any award of a fee by the General Assembly would be shared by my partners, Aubrev B. Lank and Daniel F. Kelleher, both of whom are prominent in the Democratic party. I have discussed this matter with them and we have collectively reached the conclusion that the contributions which we all made, for they joined with me in many hours of labor in this case, and the honor and privileges we have had in bringing about this valuable contribution to the betterment of the State government, is ample reward. I personally consider it to have been a great honor and privilege to have been selected as the attorney who, in the opinion of my clients, was capable to bring about the fine and splendid result noted by the Court. The result has been that the nature and quality of representation in the General Assembly has been considerably upgraded, and that as a further result, the citizens of the State will continue to benefit from our collective labors. I have enjoyed the association with the Court. I appreciate the support which I have received both in and out of the General Assembly, but under the circumstances, I ask that if and when this legislation is considered by the House, that appropriate steps be taken to withdraw the application.

# DELAWAREANS KILLED IN THE VIETNAM CONFLICT DUE TO HOSTILE ACTION (10/3/63 to 5/25/71)

Paying Tribute at the time of Memorial Day, 1971, to the memories of Americans who died while fighting in the Armed Forces of this country, and particularly those Delawareans who lost their lives in the Southeast Asian Conflict.

WHEREAS, Americans of all races and faiths have given their lives in battle for their beloved country since it first declared its independence nearly two hundred years ago; and

WHEREAS, the American holiday known as Memorial Day honoring servicemen who died in battle was first so designated on May 30, 1868, "for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating, the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country..."; and

WHEREAS, the present conflict in Southeast Asia has claimed the lives of thousands upon thousands of America's servicemen since this country first became involved in the early years of the decade of the 60's; and

WHEREAS, the State of Delaware has had 122 of its fine young citizens succumb to the perils of the Vietnam conflict during the period spanning the years between 1963 and the present; and

WHEREAS, on this Memorial Day in 1971, the members of the 126th General Assembly wish to pay tribute to the memories of the Delawareans who gave their lives for the cause of freedom in all wars, but most especially for the 122 men listed below who have died during the hostile actions in the continuing crisis in Southeast Asia: and

WHEREAS, the members of the 126th General Assembly are grimly aware that nearly every family the State of Delaware has been touched deeply and directly in some way by the Vietnam conflict whether it be by the loss of a loved one, a friend, or a friend of a friend.

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 126th General Assembly, the Senate concurring, that all members stand for a moment of silent prayer

in remembrance of the Delawareans who have died in all wars, particularly those persons listed below, victims of the War in Southeast Asia.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the text of this resolution, including all names as listed, be included in the Journals of both the House of Representatives and the Senate of the 126th General Assembly of the State of Delaware.

I would like to call attention to the stipulation in the Code, Title 29, Section 6337, pertaining to this subject:

The General Assembly may increase, decrease or eliminate items in the Budget Appropriation Bill in any way that is not contrary to the Constitution of the State, except as hereinafter provided; but neither House shall consider further or special appropriations, except in case of emergency, which fact shall be clearly stated in the appropriation bill therefor, until the Budget Appropriation Bill shall have been finally acted upon by both Houses. No items providing

for appropriations for payment of interest or principal due on State debt shall be decreased or eliminated. The total budget appropriation items may not be increased in the aggregate to a point where they would exceed the State revenue from all sources as estimated in the budget.

It would seem that compliance with the Code would rearrange the priorities of bills that remain before this General Assembly.

We have not been operating in this manner and it seems appropriate for us to do so.

The Members of Delaware's Congressional Delegation today asked the Army Corps of Engineers to spend \$75,000 on dredging the mouth of the Murderkill River at Bowers Beach, Del.

"Numerous recreational boaters, as well as commercial fishermen, need a seven-foot passage linking the Murderkill with Delaware Bay," the Delegation said in a letter to Lt. General F.J. Clarke, Chief of Engineers. "Dredging, particularly at the mouth of the Murderkill to remove the existing hazard to navigation, will create a significant benefit to the persons who live and boat in that area of central Delaware," the letter added.

The letter was signed by Senators J. Caleb Boggs and William V. Roth, Jr., and Congressman Pierre S. duPont. all are Republicans.

The Corps is authorized to maintain a channel 7 feet deep from deep water in Delaware Bay to a point about eight miles up the Murderkill River at Frederica. The Corps last dredged the channel in 1968. According to a Corps survey of the mouth of the Murderkill, the controlling depth is now just 3 feet. The survey was made in late May at the request of Senator Boggs.

"We understand that the District Engineer had asked to spend \$75,000 for channel dredging in the Murderkill during fiscal year 1972," the letter to General Clarks said. "The request for this \$75,000, however, was eliminated from the District Engineer's proposed 1972 budget."

"We hope that you will agree with us that an immediate and definite need to begin this dredging work exists. We urge you to allocate \$75,000 to accomplish this needed work early in fiscal year 1972."

### Dear General Clarke:

Heavy potential demand exists for navigational use of a route into Delaware Bay from the Murderkill River in Delaware. Boat traffic, however, has been hampered by the accumulation of a large sand bar at the mouth of the river since dredging was last accomplished in 1968.

Although the authorized project calls for a channel depth of seven feet from deep water to a point about eight miles up the river at Frederica, the controlling depth is now approximately three feet.

We understand that the District Engineer had asked to spend \$75,000 for channel dredging in the Murderkill during fiscal year 1972. The request for this \$75,000, however, was eliminated from the District Engineer's proposed 1972 budget.

We urge you to reinstate this \$75,000 item. Numerous recreational boaters, as well as commercial fishermen, need a seven-foot passage linking the Murderkill with Delaware Bay. Dredging, particularly at the mouth of the Murderkill to remove the existing hazard to navigation, will create a significant benefit to the persons who live and boat in that area of central Delaware. Enclosed is a copy of a resolution adopted by the Delaware Legislature supporting the need for dredging.

We hope that you will agree with us that an immediate and definite need to begin this dredging work exists. We urge you to allocate \$75,000 to accomplish this needed work early in fiscal year 1972.

required. A more permanent solution must be used; and WHEREAS, one large boat running aground can cause a hazardous situation which will put several hundred fishermen at the mercy of wind and wave when a sudden storm strikes; and

WHEREAS, at the present time there is no protection for homes and property against beach erosion; NOW THEREFORE.

BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the 126th General Assembly of the State of Delaware, the Senate joining therein, request the Army Corps of Engineers to redredge the channel from the Delaware Bay into Murderkill River at Bowers Beach, Delaware, to a safe depth and to construct protective jetties in this locale.
