University team to study gaits of top U.S. marathoners

An eight-person team of University of Delaware researchers will travel to Olympic marathon trials in Jersey City and Pittsburgh later this month to continue their study of marathoners' gaits and the mechanics of motion.

The male and female runners, competing for a spot on the U.S. Olympic team heading for Korea this summer, will be filmed at various points as they cover the 26.2-

mile courses, according to Dr. David A. Barlow, associate professor of physical education, athletics and recreation and co-director of the University's Human Performance Laboratory.

"What are the alterations in gait mechanics of the elite versus those who don't do as well?" Barlow asked. The researchers will study how a runner's gait changes over the course of the marathon, he said.

Past research has shown that the way a runner runs undergoes subtle changes as the runner tires.

The researchers expect to build on work they performed in 1984, when they filmed and studied the gaits of 40 women runners in the first Women's Olympic Marathon Trial. That study investigated the varying rates of speed achieved by the runners at different points in the marathon, and changes in length

and rate of strides taken by the runners as they tired.

The research is co-sponsored by the University, the U.S. Olympic Committee and the Association for Advancement of Sports Potential. The Human Performance Laboratory provides research and professional consultant services in the areas of exercise physiology and biomechanics.

Results of the research will not come in time to help marathoners in

the 1988 Summer Olympics, who have been training for four years. But, Barlow said, the results will be used by those who will compete in the future.

Learning about the small differences that separate a winner from someone who finishes far back in the pack might enhance the performance of runners "still in the development stage or the future performance of current competitors," S. Barlow said.

Kravette to skate with Semanick

Ron Kravette likes a challenge, so this has been a good week for him. He drove across the continent from his home in California. He learned the fine art of makeup application. And he skated with his new ice dance partner Suzie Semanick for the first time.

Kravette replaces Scott Gregory, who has retired from amateur ice skating because of a severe back injury.

Semanick and Gregory were the 1988 national ice dance champions, and members of the U.S. Olympic Team, providing Kravette yet another stiff challenge.

"I've never skated with someone as determined as Suzie," said Kravette, in bet-

ween a spate of photo sessions and publicity appearances early this week, sessions for which he had the crash course in makeup.

"We're very enthusiastic about the partnership. I don't think either of us will have to push the other."

Kravette won the Junior National Championship in 1986, and finished seventh at the World University Games last year, both with former partner Collette Huber. He first skated when he was ten, and has been ice dancing for six years.

Born in New Jersey, he grew up in California, and graduated from the University of California at Irvine in 1986. There he studied history and Russian.

IRAS FOR EVERYONE?

Let's get the record straight — the new tax law has not taken away your right to have an Individual Retirement Account. An IRA is still available to anyone with earned income. What has changed is the deductibility of the IRA; anyone who has pension coverage — or is married to someone who does — must meet certain income guidelines.

Individuals with income below \$25,000 and couples with joint income below \$40,000 get a full deduction on their IRA contributions. Those with income over \$35,000 (over \$50,000 for couples) get none, unless they have no pension. In between, there is partial deductibility, carefully spelled out.

There are still many advantages to tax-deferred compounding. Money DOES grow faster when it's not taxed. Some people may prefer other tax-advantaged instruments that offer a little more flexibility, or a chance to get AT the money. If you make non-deductible contributions, keep careful records so you can prove what money has been taxed already.

St. Mark's Spartan track teams split with Concord

Up the hill and across the street from St. Mark's High's dirt track, Mike Murphy plies his trade in front of a few teammates and competitors, a coach or two, and some assistants to measure and record the throws.

As usual, this Monday against Concord he wins the shot put. The discus event is not even in question.

"With Murph usually throwing outside of the mainstream, you tend to forget about him," says St. Mark's coach Joe O'Neill. "By far and away he's the top guy on the team."

His throw of 171' 3" is very close to his best, and is 33 feet farther than anyone has thrown this season. If he shows up at the state meet, he will successfully defend his title.

"He's a man among boys when it comes to the discus," says assistant coach Dean Griskowitz.

"Down the line, if there's more competition, it won't hurt," says Murphy. "It's always nice to be pushed."

As of last week, Murphy, who has only thrown the shot and discus since ninth grade, was leaning towards accepting a scholarship offer from Virginia, but he had not ruled out going to Stanford.

"They may want me to throw the hammer, too. I've never done that before. It's not a high school sport."

"I have high expectations, but not as high as he has for himself," says O'Neill. "You could never have predicted that he'd throw as well as he has thrown the discus."

"He's bright enough and interested enough that I wouldn't be surprised whatever he gets. I can't put any limits on him. He'll definitely be a good competitor wherever he goes."

At the moment, Murphy routinely provides St. Mark's with a much needed 10 points in the dual meets. His help was not enough for the boys team, which lost to Concord 72-65.

This is to be a difficult season for the Spartans, who graduated a large group of talented seniors last spring.

"We're not expected to do anything this year," said Dan Keefer, first in the 800 (2:20.0)

and part of the successful mile and two mile relays. "I am just starting to learn and get varsity experience now."

"We're a young team this year," said Jason Green, first in the 300 hurdles (44.45), and part of the mile relay. "In two years, this is going to be a strong team. We have a lot of strong freshmen."

Also part of the mile relay (3:59.2) were Dave Prado and Ken Wat. Joe Lombardi, Clark Miller and John Ormsby completed the two mile relay team (9:27).

The girls team fared better, defeating Concord 70-67. Maila Madric and Melanie Avenarius each had four first place finishes to lead the team.

"It was close," said Hilda Kraiss, as the team needed the victory in the final event, the mile relay, to win. "I'll take it."

"Due to the 11 day layoff, we've got work to do, we've got to get in shape."

"I think this spring the girls are coming along really well," said Avenarius, who won the 100 meters (13.7), the long jump (13'7") and was part of the 400 and mile relays. "People have worked hard and it shows."

"We get along well, and can place a lot of people in different things," said Angela Miller, part of the 800 relay team.

Madric won the 100 hurdles (16.0), the shot put (34'1"), the 200 (28.63) and the

800 relay.

Julie Dombrowski won the 400 (68.23), and was part of the mile relay. Pam Leffler won the 300 hurdles and was part of the 400 and mile relays.

Helen Shields was the other member of the mile relay (4:42.3), and was part of the victorious 400 relay (55.0) with Michelle Hertzfeld.

"I have a lot of talent to work with this year," said Kraiss. "I'm hoping to finish in the top five or six this year."

Running for love

St. Mark's star Maila Madric hopes to set good example

So many things keep Maila Madric running. A full-ride track scholarship to Temple University. The love and support of her family. Defending her state titles, and maybe winning some new ones. But most of all, her niece, who turned one last Wednesday.

"She keeps me going," says the senior from St. Mark's High School. "I look at her and I see someone that's going to look up to me."

"I keep asking them to bring her to the track meets. I want her to see me and let her know that she can grow up and do the same thing. She'll have the talent."

Apparently, the talent runs in the family. Her father, Art Madric, coaches track at Howard. Her cousin Sharnette Handy, also a senior, sprints for Howard.

Her father has been important to her development as a runner both on a personal level, and as the head coach of the Wilmington Track Club.

"He's helped me a lot, but even more than the training, my mother has helped me a lot psychologically."

"I give him all the credit for the actual workouts, but I give her just as much credit, and my stepfather and my brother. My whole family is pushing me. They're very supportive."

This includes Handy, who is one of Madric's toughest competitors as well.

"In the hurdles, we're the top two, and we practice against each other consistently. It's fun, because we are cousins. I love her to death. No race could tear us apart. I encourage her, she encourages me."

"There's never a guarantee that I am going to win, or that she is going to win. I don't think it would be fun if one of us dominated all of the time."

All of which has boosted Madric to state championships in the 55 meters, 55-meter hurdles and the shot put during the 1987-88 indoor season. She won the 100 hurdles and the shot-put in last year's Division I spring track state championships, and was part of the second place 4x100 team.

She is liable to show up in the

200 meters, the 300-meter hurdles, and the other sprint relays as well, while running in the maximum of four events at every dual meet.

"I don't have any problems with it, because Mrs. Kraiss (St. Mark's coach, Hilda) is fair about it. She puts me in things I would run anyway. Four races seems hard, but after you do so much practicing, the meets are a treat."

She also takes her leadership role very seriously. "I feel that by the time you get to the 12th grade, you should be a leader anyway, no matter how you perform, and guide the freshman and sophomores."

"Sometimes I felt bad when I had to travel so much this year and I was missing practices. I think they all understood what was going on."

Madric found herself a desirable commodity this spring. "I was recruited all over, but I limited it very early because I didn't want that

pressure, or to fall behind in my schoolwork. I was pretty much decided between Temple and Pitt early."

"(Temple) started recruiting me, and then they kind of laid off because I was going to go to the University of Pittsburgh. When everything didn't work out the way I wanted it to, they stepped back in."

"Academics and track. If I could find that combination, I'll be happy."

Madric seems quite pleased with her choice, and with the priorities of the school.

"The coach told me education is number one and track is second. I can deal with that. Track is not always guaranteed. Anything could happen. I would definitely go with the books."

She plans to study in the health field, perhaps sports medicine or nursing.

Her track career began half a dozen years ago when her father founded the Wilmington Track Club.

"It all started with the meets at Baynard Stadium on Wednesday nights in the summertime. We used to go over and run in those all the time."

"He saw kids trying to do something, so he just decided to start the club up."

"Most of the girls on the high school track circuit right now, like myself and my cousin Sharnette Handy, we've run with the club since we were 11 or 12 years old, so we have a sound foundation for track."

Not only has the club provided members with the fundamentals of the events, but with traveling and meet experience as well.

"It helps you in the long run. You get that train of thought, and you never lose it."

Madric finds competing harder when she's not being challenged, which is not an uncommon situation. "I look at the honor roles in the USA Today and I compare myself with that. I have to do better if I want to get up there with them."

"I'll probably be geared towards one thing (at Temple) and that will help out a lot. With a lot of attention towards my hurdles, I think I could be good. The times in the national collegiate meet weren't much better than mine. They ran a 7.9 in the 55 hurdles (Maila's best time is an 8.25, set at the winter track championships)."

"Track has opened a lot of doors for me."

UD offers applied science

"This degree could have been written for me. I wanted a sound technical base, but I didn't want to be an engineer. And I didn't want to lose the management skills I had already acquired."

That's 34-year-old Janice Haag speaking, the first University of Delaware student to complete requirements for a new bachelor of applied science degree in Engineering Technology & Technical Management.

The new degree, which approved only last March, is administered through the department of agricultural engineering in the College of Agricultural Sciences. According to Dr. Norman Collins, chair of the department, 25 students have been admitted to the degree program, 50 students are taking classes and 75 are expected to be enrolled in classes by next fall.

"It's a type of professional upgrade," Collins says.

An articulate and determined young woman, Haag points out that she grew up on a North Dakota farm in a family where higher education was not stressed.

"When we graduated from high school, we were expected to support ourselves," she says, "which I did by working at Northwestern Bell in Fargo, N.D."

While with the telephone company, Haag worked in a number of different departments from operator service to marketing. But she always believed her lack of a degree limited her career.

In 1983, when her husband accepted a job with Hercules in Delaware, Haag decided it was time to enter college. "No general technology degree was offered at the University of Delaware then, so I decided to enroll at Delaware Technical & Community College in electrical engineering and electronics technology," she says.

Haag completed her associate's degree by March of 1986 and then took time out for the birth of her daughter, Caitlyn. She still managed to fit in management courses at Goldey Beacom College.

"When I heard through the grapevine that a technology pro-

gram was being developed in the ag college, I went to Dr. Collins with my transcript in hand. I was confident that he would get this degree established, so I was enrolled in continuing education courses by Winter of 1987 for a degree that didn't exist."

Haag encountered no special problems in working toward her degree — she went flat out in completing her degree requirements. She took a full course load in two regular sessions, attended two summer and winter sessions and completed her requirements within a year. She also worked part-time at the DuPont Corporate Data Center as a computer operator.

Haag interviewed with six companies that required engineering degrees and received four offers. She accepted a job as production control leader at Gore's Barksdale Road plant. "We manufacture Gore-tex microwave test cable. All the manufacturing processes are geared to my background, and my technical management courses help me schedule production and manage inventory," she says.

Because the new degree particularly appeals to the working student, Collins says that five courses are now offered at night at the Newark campus and a sixth will be added in the fall.

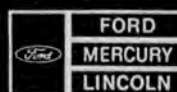
