Home Grown's
Alber tops field
in Taste of Newark

Eric Alber of Main Street's Home Grown Café was named the best chef in the first ever Iron Chef-style cook-off at the Taste of Newark.

The competition, the first of its kind ever held in the six-year history of the event, drew an overflow crowd of more than 100 on Sunday afternoon to the room at the University of Delaware's Clayton Hall.

Taste of Newark was moved to the northern location, following forecasts of a soggy Sunday on the Old College Lawn that turned out to be accurate.

Judges determined that Aber topped a five-chef field that included Mark Chopko (Courtyard Café at UD), Brad Dawson (Caffe Gelato), Jason Dietteric (Stone Balloon Winehouse), and Dick Schmidt (Blue Crab Grill).

The chefs, using crab meat as a common ingredient, had 40 minutes to cook and serve three dishes for the

Council approves project at Formal Affairs site

Approval has been granted by the Newark Town Council for the construction of a 5,000 square foot residential/commercial mixed-use building at the site of Formal Affairs at 129 E. Main St. The present two-story building will be demolished to make way for a three-story facility that will have commercial space on the first floor and six, three-bedroom apartments on the second and third floors.

An amendment to the original proposal was submitted by Mayor Vance Funk for the allowance of increasing the

number of unrelated tenants from 18 to 24. Members were initially resistant to allow the change, but were convinced when representatives of the project stated that it would not be economically feasible without the additional renters.

A discussion was engaged on the subject of having enough space within each unit and on the use of "green" elements in the construction and energy maintenance of the site. Representatives from Landmark Engineering stated that each unit provides a greater number of square feet per person than is required by city ordinances. They also told Council that

UD Bookstore moving to Main Street

Newark's Main Street got some good news last week when the University of Delaware announced it has purchased the former Christina School District headquarters on Main Street.

The sale was previously reported at \$1.6 million. UD confirmed that it wants to preserve the historic building and relocate the University Bookstore from its current site at the Perkins Student Center. UD also plans university offices at the site.

The sale had been in the works for some time, after the Christina District approved the

sale. However, legal questions about a portion of the property acquired through condemnation led to the matter going to Chancery Court. The matter was later settled out of court.

University bookstores are a source of revenue for colleges and universities and a larger location on Main Street could draw more sales and customer traffic.

The relocation also reflects the expansion of UD to the north, with a large percentage of students living in other areas, including the Laird Campus to the north.

Main Street Newark would also benefit from the location,

since it would bring more students and visitors to the area. At the same time, the store would become more of a direct competitor to retailers that sell books and UD-related items. At the same time, however, Main Streets draw more traffic when shoppers can shop and compare.

Newark's Main Street has held up fairly well during the recent economic downturn. A number of vacant storefronts are, at least partly due to projects, driven by demand for student apartments. City codes require that first floors be used for retail or offices.

Gallagher to mark 50th anniversary

The Robert S. Gallagher Elementary School, 800 Brownleaf Road, will celebrate its 50th anniversary on Saturday.

The school first opened its doors in September 1959 for grades 1-6 as part of the Newark School District. Fifty years later it still remains an elementary school for students in the Newark area for Kindergarten through fifth grade. Gallagher will be celebrating its 50th Anniversary with a community fair from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. At noon, there will be a special ceremony reflecting about the past, present and future of Robert S. Gallagher Elementary School.

The event will also feature live music, food and raffles.

Outstanding test scores honored

The Christina School District Board of Education honored outstanding students in September who earned the highest honors on the spring 2009 Delaware state tests. Each spring, thousands of Delaware students participate in the Delaware Student Testing Program - the DSTP. The DSTP tests are state assessments that gauge student learning in all grades, but which have special significance in grades 3, 5, 8, and 10.

The highest score a student can achieve on the DSTP is a score of 5, designated by the Delaware Department of Education by the term "Distinguished." Very few students reach the Distinguished level and score a 5 on just one of the three tests of Reading, Writing, and Math.

Only 13 students in grades 3, 5, 8, and 10 in the Christina School District achieved the highest honor possible on the 2009 DSTP - they each scored at the Distinguished level in all three areas. The schools and grades listed below reflect the school and grade the student attended in Spring 2009.

2 from Caravel honored



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Thieves clean out closed restaurant

Newark Police are investigating the theft of several industrial kitchen appliances from the site of the long-vacant C.R. Wings business, located in the Newark Shopping Center. Betty Rose, a property manager with Finmarc Management, Inc. of Bethesda, Md., was on-hand to answer questions and to give the officers a listing of the inventory that was stolen. Items included: a stainless steel freezer, two Kenmore stand-up freezers, two steel, three-door under counter refrigerator/prep tables, a Vulcan commercial cooking stove, two microwaves, and three deep fryers. Model numbers and makes are unknown for some of the items, so the approximate value of all stolen goods is undetermined, but an Internet search lists the total between \$19,500 and \$80,000.

Witnesses stated that four males were at the site, lifting a large stove out of the front of the store and into the back of a black pick-up truck. The incident was not reported as renovations are going on at the business.

Due to the amount of grease and dust, police had a very hard time collecting fingerprint evidence. A large number of photographs were taken and entered into the NPS Veripic System for analysis.

CDs found in suspect's backpack

Last Thursday, police detained Colin Mahony, 25, of Yardley, Pa., after he was seen at Rainbow Records, located at 54 E. Main St., removing the wrapping from a DVD. Employees of the store escorted Mahony out of the store. He was detained by the same employees after he attempted to re-enter to store to retrieve his backpack. When police arrived, Mahony was questioned and his backpack was searched, revealing 10 CDs from Rainbow Records in it. Mahony confessed that he tried to leave the store with the merchandise. He was charged with Concealing Goods, Wares or Merchandise and told he would be arrested if he returned to the store.

Vehicles damaged in secured lot

An investigation is ongoing over the broken rear window a red 2007 Kia Sedona that was parked on the secured

lot of Martin Honda, at 298 E. Cleveland Ave. The incident occurred on the morning of Friday, September 25. The vehicle was found with a one foot diameter hole in the window.

A search revealed that no one entered the vehicle and that no items were taken. The damage is estimated at \$406 and will be fixed for free by Martin.

A black 2007 Honda Accord was also vandalized the night before on the same lot. Several pry bar marks were found on the car, but no items were stolen and no one entered the car. The damage, totaling \$250, was also paid by Martin Honda.

No video surveillance or fingerprints have been taken into evidence.

Temp tries make off with stereos

Newark Police are on the lookout for Donald Smith, of Porter Road, Bear, for the theft of five MyGig in-dash entertainment systems, valued at \$500 each, taken from the Chrysler Assembly Plant. The radios were presently unsecured, prior to their shipment to another Chrysler facility.

On Friday, September 25, officers with Wackenhut Security observed Smith as he was leaving the facility. Smith is a temporary worker with Commercial Contracting Corp., who is performing dismantling and demolition duties at the plant. Closed circuit television footage shows Smith carrying a large black bag and emptying the contents into the trunk of his car. Security guards confronted Smith at his car and demanded that he open the trunk. Guards found five boxes with radios in them. Smith stated that he was removing the radios because they were damaged. Security told Smith that he was not allowed to take the radios and that he go to the gatehouse to immediately surrender them to the guards. Smith was then seen driving his vehicle off of the lot and onto South College Ave. Police arrived at Smith's address and found his car in the driveway. Smith's father was questioned and he told police that his son was on his way back to the factory to return the merchandise. The father gave permission to police to search the vehicle, where the five radios were found in the trunk. A warrant has been issued for Smith's arrest.

Bookkeeper arrested for embezzlement

Middletown Police have arrested a Newark woman, who is accused of taking money from a business where she was employed as a bookkeeper.

Sonya Helwig, 38, of Newark, was employed at One OffRod&Custom in Middletown as a bookkeeper. During July and August of this year, it is alleged that she embezzled \$7,208 by writing checks to herself on the business account without the per-

mission of the company, cashing the checks and then keeping the money.

The loss was discovered by the business owner and reported to the Middletown Police Department. A forensic examination of all of the businesses bank accounts is being conducted and further charges are possible. Helwig was released on \$10,000.00 unsecured bond.

Towed vehicle returned with missing radio

Last Friday night proved to be a trying one for a UD student that left her car in the wrong place. The student had

parked her 97 Geo Prizm at the University Courtyard on Scholar Drive and returned the next morning to find it missing. After several phone calls, she determined that the car had been towed by Horton's. When she picked up the car, she discovered that her Sony CD Player car radio had been stolen. Representatives from Horton's stated that they were unsure whether the radio was in the car when they towed it at 5 a.m. on Saturday. No signs of forced entry were apparent, but the student believes she locked the car the previous night. She is not accusing Horton's, but is inquiring if Horton employees

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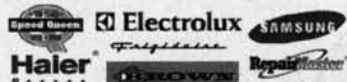

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Why we have joined the Twitter universe

Since the spring, we have been experimenting with something known as Twitter. We signed up under twitter.com/nwkpostledger, a reflection of the business and weekly newspapers that operate out of this office.

I must admit to being skeptical. Simply stated, Twitter consists of 140-character entries or "tweets" that can be filed via computer or cell phone. Once the site is set up, you gather followers, who look at your tweets. The user also has the option of following fellow Twitter users.

The 140-character messages can be gems of wisdom or self-absorbed musings that seem to attract an army of celebrities. So popular is Twitter that college and pro football teams are beginning to ban tweets by players that somehow bring a smartphone to the sidelines. Members of Congress also tweet and a couple of transmissions have

ended up on the news.

There is another wrinkle. Those long web addresses to sites of interest can be compressed through free services like tinyurl.com. That allows users to pass along interesting websites, news stories and videos.



Despite many skeptics, the popularity of Twitter has skyrocketed. News organizations quickly grasped what was happening. News and perhaps rumors spread quickly in the Twitter universe.

We saw that happen recently when a storm produced widespread power outages in New Castle County. Long before anything official was disclosed.

Twitter also showed its power during the political turmoil in Iran, operating long

after the government began to shut down dissident websites.

With that said, it is still not clear whether Twitter is a flash in the pan or something much bigger. It is known that a large percentage of those who sign up for Twitter rarely file tweets.

So far, things look promising. A couple of weeks ago, sports correspondent Jon Buzby tweeted our first University of Delaware game. The tweets offered a way to share observations. We have also tweeted a couple of City Council meetings and other public events.

Our postings are all over the map, ranging from recommendations on restaurants to links to recently filed stories. Our list of followers is headed to 200 and that includes blocking those peddling question-

able content.

In the meantime, if you are curious or want to learn more, sign up for Twitter (it's free of charge) and follow our tweets.



Police recover stolen diamond

Glenn Canady, of Casho Mill Rd., reported to police that someone had stolen his .91 carat diamond and platinum ring, valued at \$8,100, that was housed in a clamshell display in a cabinet in his home. An interview with Canady revealed that an acquaintance of one of his daughters, named Joshua Reifendifer, 21, of Wilmington, had spent the night at his house around the time the ring was found to be missing.

Reifendifer was brought in for questioning and admitted that he spent the night at Canady's, but denied taking the ring. An interview with witness Laura Canady brought police to question suspect Amber Sklowdowski, 19, of Wilmington, who admitted to selling the ring, with Reifendifer, at Lantana Gold and Diamond Centre in Hockessin.

An employee at the store talked to the couple and bought the ring for \$800. A photocopy of the receipt shows that the ring was sold to Sklowdowski, who used her ID instead of Reifendifer's because of his prior capias. Police seized the

ring as evidence and determined that the laser-etched engraving on the stone matched the number that Canady provided. Reifendifer was charged with Theft of \$1,500 or Greater and remanded to the Howard R. Young Correctional Facility in lieu of \$10,307 bail.

Unknown person steals warm-up jackets

Police are investigating the theft of two UPS-delivered boxes that were taken from The Pond, 101 John F. Campbell Road, last Wednesday. Employee Scott Bicking told officers that he had accepted delivery of 11 boxes from UPS. Bicking stated that he brought in nine of the boxes himself and had left two outside, near the front door. When he returned about 10 to 15 minutes later, Bicking discovered the boxes to be missing. A call to the UPS driver verified that the boxes had been left at the site. The stolen merchandise is 20 Bauer boy's size warm-up jackets, valued at \$31 each, and 22 Bauer boy's size warm-up pants, valued at \$26 each. The total value of all merchandise is \$1,192. Video footage taken from the adjacent Newark Toyota World lot has, so far, not been helpful, but police are still reviewing the evidence.

Student found with BB gun, bullets

Delaware State Police have arrested a 17-year-old Christiana High School Student for carrying a BB gun. Troopers were called to the Christiana High School, Wednesday afternoon, after a student saw the 17-year-old ninth grader with bullets in his hand. The student later saw what he thought was a handgun tucked in the 17-year-old's waist. The student notified a teacher and school administrators confronted the 17-year-old. They found five .45 caliber rounds and a BB gun that resembled a .357 or .40 caliber weapon.

Troopers charged the 17-year-old with possession of a weapon in a safe school zone and carrying a concealed dangerous instrument.

No one was injured during the incident.

The school administration will be taking administrative action against the student.

Suspects wanted in car break-ins

Investigations are still ongoing in a number of vehicle break-ins that occurred last week in the Abbotsford development streets of E. Galloway Ct., E. Shetland

Ct. and King William Street. Five victims reported thefts out of several vehicles in the development. Personal items, such as phones, iPods, stereos, sunglasses, wallets, loose change, GPS systems and more, were taken. Several witnesses stated they heard more than one individual talking and opening and closing car doors in the early morning. Some witnesses disregarded the noise, as some residents keep very late hours in the neighborhood.

Police have recovered several fingerprint samples from the vehicles, but analysis will take some time due to the large amount of data.

Vehicle hits Glasgow Auto Body

One person was injured when a light truck ran into an auto body shop, off Route 40 in Glasgow, causing damage to a building and damaging vehicles parked outside. At around 9 a.m. on Monday, Delaware

State Police were called to the Glasgow Auto Body, following a report of a pickup truck crashing into a building.

A 2002 Chevrolet Tahoe (operated by Terry Vaughn, 47, of Elkton, Md.) was stopped at a red light on southbound Pleasant Valley Road in a westbound lane of Route 40. The light turned green and the Tahoe proceeded forward. As it entered the intersection, it collided with a 2009 Chevrolet Silverado (operated by Joseph Barben, 63, also of Elkton) which was traveling westbound on Route 40. After impact, the Silverado traveled in a northwesterly direction and entered the property of the Glasgow Auto Body.

The Silverado then struck a parked 2002 Chevrolet Venture. The Venture was forced into a parked 2003 Chevrolet Silverado. The vehicles were not occupied at the time of the crash. The 2009 Silverado continued in a north-westerly direction when it ran into the Glasgow Auto Body main structure causing significant damage. Although

the building was occupied at the time of the crash, no one inside was injured.

Only Barben was transported to Christiana Hospital with non-life threatening injuries. He was cited for Disregarding a Red Light.

Newark man dies in crash

New Castle County Police are currently investigating a fatal head-on collision that occurred last Wednesday morning in the 1700 block of Old Cooches Bridge Road. A 37 year old Newark man died at the scene of the crash.

When emergency personnel arrived, they found a white 2000 Chevrolet Blazer that had overturned. The driver of the Blazer, Christopher Olsen, was pronounced dead at the crash site.

The driver of the second vehicle, a 19 year old Newark man, was treated at the scene and transported to the Christiana Hospital where he has been admitted for observation in good condition.

The preliminary investigation has found Olsen was traveling northbound on Old Cooches Bridge Road when his vehicle crossed over into the southbound lanes. The Blazer then collided head on with the other vehicle (a 2009 Dodge Charger) occupied by the 19 year old driver. After the initial collision, the Blazer overturned.

Food, wine, cooking Taste of Newark highlights

four judges: chefs Matt Haley, John Ondo, and Brian Duffy and author Deborah Brenner, a 1988 graduate of UD who wrote *Women of the Vine: Inside the World of Women Who Make, Taste and Enjoy Wine*.

Aber, Chopko, Dawson, Dietteric, and Schmidt made salads, soups, appetizers and entrées with the designated ingredient, aided by plenty of butter and heavy cream as well as an assortment of other ingredients ranging from ordinary cucumbers, radishes, and tomatoes to exotic varieties of mushrooms, melons, and meats.

The Taste of Newark is a partnership between Downtown Newark Partnership and UD, including its Department of Hotel, Restaurant and Institutional Management and the Office of Conferences. The partnership is comprised of UD, the City of Newark and downtown businesses.

The weather and a tough economy didn't affect the crowd count. "We sold 1,000 tickets," said Fred DeMicco, ARAMARK professor of Hotel, Restaurant and Institutional Management (HRIM) at UD. "It's our

best year ever." Most tickets went for \$40 each, with a handful sold at the door for \$50. The event was also held on a busy afternoon for sports fans and couch potatoes that included Philadelphia Eagles and Baltimore Ravens games, and the big race on Dover's NASCAR weekend.

A large percentage of Newark's restaurants as well as several wineries and distributors offered a wide selection of food and drink at the event, with offerings that included Asian, Italian, Latino, Irish, Middle Eastern and fare from UD's Vita Nova fine dining restaurant. For those looking for game day munchies, there were cheese steaks and chicken wings. The large number of restaurants led to some crowding in Clayton Hall, but the vast array of offerings resulted in few long lines.

Wine choices were extensive and included offerings in dark green bottles but also boxed wines as well as "whitewash" and "barn red" in paint cans, sold by Paradox Winery (just across the line in Chester County) complete with souvenir wooden stirring sticks. "It's our latest version of wine in a box," said a winery representative.

And beer drinkers had a chance to sample a couple of brews from Iron Hill, a growing chain of regional brewpub restaurants that got its start on Main Street.

Chef Haley, who owns restaurants in Sussex County and Ondo, who operates a restaurant in Charleston, S.C., wore two hats at the event, each giving a cooking demonstration before serving as a judge in the contest that included a large dose of humor.

The Delaware chef, who promotes simple dishes with four or five ingredients, told the audience that everyone should be interested in food, given that if we live to be 80, we will have spent 17 years — 24 hours a day, seven days a week — shopping for food and preparing and eating it.

Haley made a simple salad of romaine lettuce topped with a creamy blue cheese dressing. "In the restaurant business, this is a \$6 salad," he said. He then added some chopped tomatoes. "Now it's an \$8 salad," he quipped.

Ondo, who has been referred to as "the man behind the magic" at Lana Restaurant in Charleston, S.C., prepared butternut squash risotto, a dish whose lengthy cooking process left the chef plenty of time to offer his observations on everything from knives (he likes them sharp) and Emeril LaGasse's cookwear (he's not impressed).

When asked about the meaning of the expression "sweating the onions," he replied, "It's a Southern thing. We have two seasons in Charleston, hot and hotter, so we sweat a lot."

In response to a question about salt, he recommended the kosher variety, saying that sea salt is fine for those who don't mind the expense but that he prefers to spend his money on

motorcycles.

One hit was the ice cream from UDairy — in flavors from vanilla and chocolate marshmallow to Creamsicle and black raspberry — that continued to win new fans. It did not hurt that the ice cream cones came with generous servings. The creamery is a new venture that aims to give agriculture students a look into the world of business.

Students in UD's HRIM program were charged with everything from serving food and taking out the trash to tallying votes in the cook-off and making last-minute runs for napkins and bottled water for the contest judges.

In addition to local commercial vendors, MUNCHworks, a branch of the Christina School District's

Networks program, participated in the event. The program, which prepares students between the ages of 14 and 21 for careers in the food-service industry, offered attractively prepared samples from its extensive menu, including take-away truffles in tiny gift boxes.

"Our students learn everything from food preparation to billing, delivery, set-up, and break-down," said instructor Darlene Lewis. "We're a full-service caterer."

Mayor Vance Funk, a co-chair and enthusiastic supporter of Taste of Newark, still likes the outdoor option, but noted that Clayton Hall will again be ready should the heavens open up next year. The 2010 edition of Taste of Newark is slated for Oct. 3. — Doug Rainey contributed to this story.

Council approves project at Formal Affairs site

the building will be fully insulated, will be fully protected by automated fire sprinklers, will provide a high level of security,

and will be built with a variety of "green" building materials.

Along with the permission to build, the Council also granted the owners, Lang Development and C. and E. Holding Company, a

special-use parking waiver for 12 spaces, since parking will be unavailable at the site. Residents of the apartments will be allowed two spaces per unit.

Present occupant Formal

Affairs will move its business to the new 257 E. Main St., which is finishing construction. According to Formal Affairs owner Chris Locke, 257 E. Main will host his formal attire business, a photogra-

phy studio, a bridal shop, and is next to Bing's Bakery, thus creating a one-stop shopping center for future bridal parties in Newark. Details on when the businesses will be coming to the site were unavailable.

The Council voted almost unanimously to approve the project, with only Councilman Jerry Clifton dissenting on the grounds that the project will set a dangerous precedent in that all future building projects could request parking waivers and thereby create a larger parking problem than is already present in Newark. He is also worried that the present and near-future proposals for housing projects are only geared to attracting student tenants that attend the University of Delaware and not to people who are looking to move to downtown on a permanent basis.

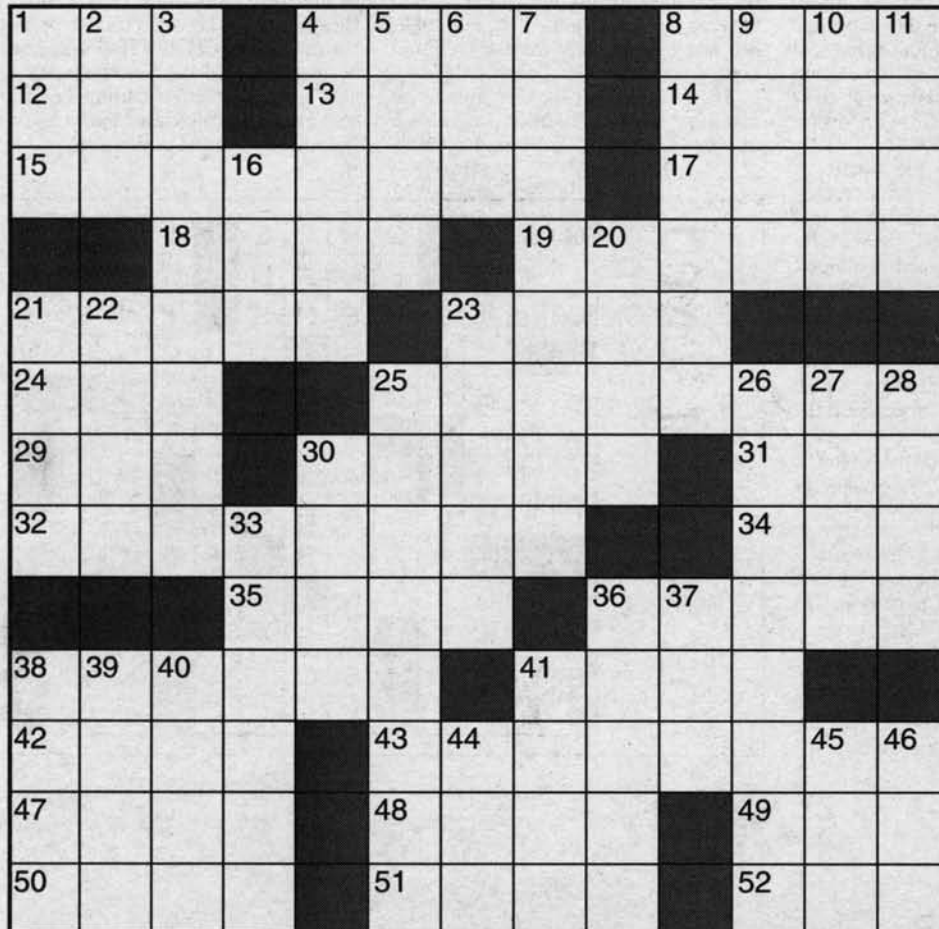
Councilman Stu Markham approved the proposal on the grounds that it would increase the tax base, thus aiding Newark's long-term financial situation. Councilman Ezra Temko also agreed, but added that projects like this would also help change the dynamic of downtown in attracting young professionals. Locke stated that the units were set up with idea that all the units have self-contained energy systems so they can be converted to condominiums for people looking for that option. He further said that the three-bedroom design is optional for young, professional couples looking to expand their family or looking to have a home office.

Mayor Vance Funk made a suggestion that the Council investigate the possibility of charging two different rates for special-use parking waivers, one for residential sites and one for commercial sites, in the hopes of attracting and keeping retailers that want to build in Newark. Councilman David Athey concurred with the mayor in wanting to explore the fee structure more thoroughly.

In other news, the Council approved the request of Paragon Design to convert the present 1 1/2 story building at 18 Haines Street into a three story, 3,395 square-foot office building that will feature two lower floors with offices and a top floor 1,100 square-foot apartment. Paragon Design presently occupies 77 E. Main St.

Council voted unanimously in approving the proposal and complimented representatives from Paragon on their design choices and their decision to stay in the downtown area, instead of moving their business elsewhere.

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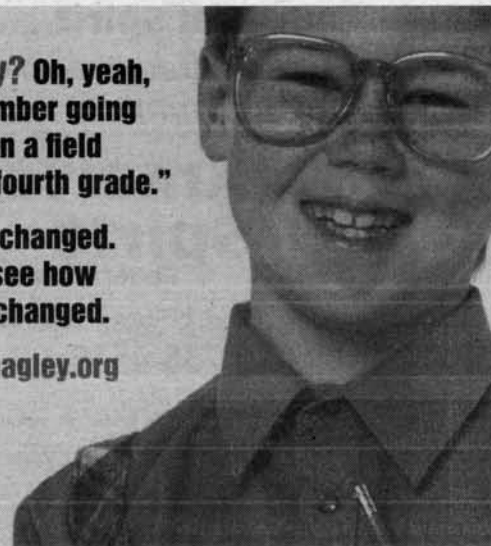

UD faces must-win game early in the season

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The University of Delaware Blue Hens could very well be Fightin' for their playoff lives when they travel to Orono to take on the Maine Black Bears on Saturday at 6.

And while it might seem early to be talking playoffs, with two losses (Richmond, William & Mary) in the CAA and its only wins (West Chester, Delaware State) coming against teams the NCAA selection committee will consider to be inferior, Delaware (2-2, 0-2 CAA) can not afford to drop another winnable conference game with nationally-ranked teams Massachusetts, James Madison and Villanova still looming on the schedule. Not to mention a trip to the U.S. Naval Academy on Nov. 14.



This week the Hens will look to get their running game on track after being held to negative yardage (-2) for just the second time in school history in last week's 30-20 loss to William & Mary, in a game which was not nearly as close as the 10-point spread might indicate.

Look for true-freshman running back Leon Jackson to get his first career start on Saturday and for coach K.C. Keeler to try and establish a running game early against the Black Bears, something the Hens were unable to do against the Tribe.

After falling behind early against William & Mary, UD was forced to throw, and throw often to try and play catch-up. Quarterback Pat Devlin completed 33 of 49 passes for 302 yards and three touchdowns. His main target was freshman wide receiver Rob Jones, whose 10 receptions established a new UD single-game record for a freshman, breaking Justin Long's nine set twice in 2002.

Maine (2-2, 1-0 CAA), which defeated Northeastern 17-7 in its lone conference game, is coming off a 41-24 loss to Big East member Syracuse.

The Black Bears actually led at halftime and eventually outgained the Orangemen in total yardage, 430-385.

Maine's sophomore QB Warren Smith threw for 305 yards, which was the first time a Maine QB has thrown for over 300 yards since Ron Whitcomb threw for 422 against New Hampshire in 2004.

Maine has won the last two games against Delaware, winning 25-15 at Orono in 2005 and 27-10 in Newark in 2007.

Game Notes: Delaware leads the series 21-6. ... The field surface at 10,000-seat Alford Stadium is FieldTurf. ... If necessary, Maine is the only CAA team yet to attempt an onside kick and is a perfect 2-for-2 recovering them. ... Saturday's weather forecast in Orono is 57-degrees with a 40-percent chance of showers. ... As of Wednesday the game was not sold out.

We will look to take our shots downfield to Willie Robinson, Jharel Johnson, and Kyle Cooke. Defensively we need to continue to get better as a group, and minimize the big play threat of the Howard offense."

Howard coach Dan Ritter: "Hodgson has one of the best running games in the state, coupled with a good passing attack. On the other side of the ball, Hodgson plays solid, consistent defense."
