East Delaware Avenue building project tabled

Alternate plan to be reviewed

After an hour of contentious debate and an unusual move by a developer, Newark City Council on Monday deferred action on a plan to build a mixed-use building at 132 and 136 E. Delaware Ave.

The plan council was scheduled to vote on was for a three-story building containing 6,000 square feet of commercial space on the first floor and 14 apartments on the two floors above. However, developer Jeff Lang surprised mem-

bers by proposing another, scaled-back plan for council to consider.

That plan included slightly less commercial space, more parking and only 12 apartments, but no detailed plans were available. The property, which currently contains two old houses, sits between the Washington House Condominiums and Planned Parenthood.

Lang said he presented both options to council to get feedback on which one the members preferred.

"We knew there were still concerns about the project," Lang said. "We knew a couple were more con-

cerned about the commercial space, and some were more concerned about the parking."

Lang had already scaled back the plan in October when the planning commission balked at his proposal of 15,600 square feet of commercial space and 28 apartments.

The building will contain mostly one and two-bedroom apartments, a stark contrast to most rental units in Newark that cater to college students looking to share the apartment with four or five roommates. Lang said the design will attract graduate students

and young professionals, a demographic not currently served by downtown rentals.

However, some on the council and in the public took issue with that prediction.

"Undergrads are going to end up in this building, let's not tell each other fibs," said John Boucher, a landlord who said the boom in downtown apartment build-

ings are taking away tenants from older rental properties.

Councilman Jerry Clifton said that he would like to see more variety of businesses on Main Street, but that will not happen if more students move to downtown.

"You're not getting new businesses as long as you have nothing but student dormitories downtown," Clifton said, referring to the

apartment complexes. "It's going to be pizza places and hamburger places."

Both plans presented Monday drew tepid reaction from council, but the majority of members seemed to prefer the 12-apartment plan.

After council voted to table the discussion, Lang said he will ask the body to vote on the 12-unit proposal at a future meeting.

Amazon.com site approved by Middletown Council

At their January 9 meeting, the Mayor and Council of the Town of Middletown approved the construction of a 1.2 million square foot distribution warehouse to be built at 401 Classic Drive, in the Westtown Development near Levels Road. Though rumors abounded for months that Amazon.com was going to be the tenant, it was only official-

ly announced that Amazon will occupy the site.

Amazon.com has a distribution facility in New Castle, DE, which employs 500 workers. The

amazon.com

Seattle, WA-based company is a major online distributor of books, software, computer accessories and a host of other products. It employs over 43,200 part-time

and full-time workers worldwide.

Randy Duplechain, of Davis, Bowen & Friedel, representing Duke Realty, presented the final plan before the council, stating that the site will consist of a building with a 1 million square foot footprint, along with a 200,000 square foot mezzanine level. An offsite parking area will feature 2,500 parking spaces for full-time and seasonal employees.

According to Mayor Ken Branner, the process began over

eight months ago, with Amazon.com sending out a Request For Proposal (RFP) that went out nation-wide. The choices were narrowed down to sites in 15 states.

As part of a second RFP, five sites were ultimately chosen three months ago. In a presentation with the Governor's Office and the Delaware Economic Development Office, Middletown was selected as the final site.

Amazon.com has listed that the facility will have 849 year-round

employees, with the capacity to add up to 2,500 more, to alleviate peak demand during seasonal holidays.

Branner also stated that up to \$4 million will be available from state and federal funds to upgrade Merrimac Boulevard and Industrial Drive for the increased tractor trailer traffic that the area around U.S. Route 301 will see.

Duplechain stated that the project will break ground in mid-January, with a tentative completion date of mid-September.



350-pound bank robbery suspect strikes again in Glasgow

Delaware State Police believe the 350-pound suspect in the Sunday robbery of a supermarket branch in Middletown has struck again, after paying a visit to an Elkton supermarket bank.

Delaware State Police identified Robert G. Kelly, 49, of Townsend, Del., as the suspect in the hold-up of a Wells Fargo Branch in Glasgow, Tuesday morning.

The latest robbery occurred at around 10:30 a.m. at the Wells Fargo at 2450 Glasgow Avenue. The suspect entered the bank, approached the 26-year-old female teller and presented a note. The teller complied and turned over an undisclosed amount of cash. The suspect fled the bank on foot in an unknown direction.

On Sunday, Middletown Police said the suspect entered the Acme Market branch of Citizen's Bank at 11:13 a.m. The man demanded money from the teller, who gave him an undisclosed amount of cash police said. The suspect then fled the scene.

Detectives also released surveillance photos from an M&T Bank at Big Elk Mall, where the suspect was observed just before the robbery at the Wells Fargo. No robbery was attempted.


Kelly is described as being 5 feet, 10 inches tall and 350 pounds, with gray hair and blue eyes.

Kelly is believed to be driving a 2002 gold Chevrolet Venture minivan with Delaware license plate PC 137797.

Elkton PD undercover operation nets heroin suspect from Newark

A Delaware man is facing heroin charges after investigators captured him in Elkton on Friday during an undercover operation that spurred a high-speed car chase, police said.

The suspect, Kevin Gale, 20, of Newark, allegedly tossed 84 dose bags of heroin from his car as he sped from the Wal-Mart Super Center parking lot in the 1000 block of East

Pulaski Highway to the nearby Chapel Run neighborhood, police said.

Officers took Gale into custody several minutes later after surrounding that community, police added. Investigators recovered 84 discarded bundles of heroin, which they found strewn on the pavement along Gale's escape route, according to Sgt. Scott Knauer, a spokesman for the Elkton Police Department. He was held in lieu of \$100,000 bond.

Teen assaulted during attempted robbery in Wellington Woods

New Castle County Police are currently investigating an attempted robbery and assault of an 18 year-old Newark teen. The victim was accosted at knifepoint and then assaulted by two male subjects on Monday night.

On January 9 at 8:38 p.m., County Police responded to the victim's home for a reported robbery involving a weapon. When officers arrived, the teen indicated that as he was walking from the bus stop on Wellington Drive and approaching the intersection of Hawk Drive, he observed four unknown male subjects heading in his direction. It was learned they were walking from the com-

munity of Sparrow Run.

Moments later, two of the suspects approached him and one of them displayed a knife, before they began assaulting him. During the assault, the victim was able to fight them off and they fled in an unknown direction empty handed. The teen did sustain several minor lacerations during the altercation and refused medical treatment.

A canine team responded to the scene and conducted a track, but was unsuccessful in locating the suspects. The suspects were described as four black males who were wearing all dark clothing, two of which had facial hair.

Troopers investigate armed robbery at Newark store

Delaware State Troopers are investigating the armed robbery of Country Tobacco store that occurred Monday evening in the Possum Park Mall, Newark.

The incident occurred at approximately 8:00 p.m. on January 9, as two male suspects with ski masks covering their faces and armed with handguns, entered the Country Tobacco store, located at 19 Possum Park Mall. The suspects confronted a 42 year-old female customer and forcibly removed

an undisclosed amount of money from her hand. The suspects then confronted the 52 year-old male employee and demanded money. The suspects removed an undisclosed amount of cash from the business and fled on foot in an unknown direction. There were no injuries reported as a result of this incident.

Suspect #1 is a black male, 5'07"-5'10" tall, 170-190 lbs., average build. Last seen wearing dark colored pants and jacket, dark ski mask covering face. Suspect armed with unknown type handgun.

Suspect #2 is also a black male, 5'07"-5'10" tall, 170-180 lbs., average build. Last seen wearing dark jacket, blue jeans, dark ski mask covering face. Suspect armed with unknown type handgun.

Armed robbery in Hunters Crossing apartments

New Castle County Police are investigating an armed robbery involving four victims from the Newark area and one from the city of Wilmington, who were accosted by four unknown male subjects, one of which was armed with a handgun.

On Saturday evening, January 7 at 7:40 p.m., County Police were dis-

patched to the unit block of Fairway Road in the Hunters Crossing Apartment complex. When officers arrived, the victims indicated that while they were standing outside an apartment building, they were approached by four unknown males who demanded their property.

The investigation revealed the suspects stole property and an undisclosed amount of cash from a 17 and 18-year-old victims, both from the Newark area, prior to the suspects fleeing.

Officers canvassed the area and a canine team performed a track, but they were unsuccessful in locating the suspects.

The suspects were described as:

- a black male, 17-21 years of age, 6'02" tall, 170 lbs., who was wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt.

- a black male, 17-21 years of age, 6'00" tall, 175 lbs., who was wearing a red hooded sweatshirt.

- a black male, 17-21 years of age, 5'08" tall, 150 lbs., who was wearing a white V-neck T-shirt with red sweatpants.







Carol Houck to serve as Interim City Manager

Newark's Mayor and Council voted to appoint Assistant to the City Manager Carol Houck as Interim City Manager following the retirement of Kyle Sonnenberg in late February. The decision to appoint Houck was unanimous and came as no surprise to most as Houck has served as Acting City Manager at various points in time for the better part of 14 years, filling in and conduct-

ing City business in the City Manager's absence.

"Carol is in the best position to step into the Interim City Manager's role and hit the ground running as she is already interacting on a daily basis with our Department Directors and plays a vital role in many of our projects and initiatives" said City Manager Kyle Sonnenberg. Newark man charged in Red Mill Square robbery

Troopers have arrested Keith J. Garrett Jr., 22, of Newark, in connection with the robbery of an elderly man, which occurred Wednesday night in the parking lot of the Red Mill Square, located at 1248 Capitol Trail, in Newark.

The incident occurred on January 4 at approximately 8 p.m. as the 63 year-old male victim was walking to his car in the parking lot of the Red Mill Square Shopping

Center. The victim was opening the rear door of his car when he was approached from behind by a male suspect. The suspect pushed him to the ground and demanded money. The victim complied and turned over his wallet to the suspect. The suspect got into a maroon vehicle and fled the parking lot. The victim was able to obtain the fleeing car's description and tag number and provided it to State Police.

A short time later, a Trooper patrolling the area spotted a car matching the description of the suspect vehicle on Red Mill Road,

and conducted a vehicle stop. The driver of the vehicle was Keith J. Garrett Jr. and, through further investigation, Troopers were able to connect him to the robbery. He was taken into custody without incident. There were no injuries reported as a result of this incident.

Garrett was charged with and Robbery First Degree and committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional Institution on \$30,000 secured bond.

Two arrested for residential burglaries

The Newark Police have arrested two individuals for recent residential burglaries within the City of Newark. These two individuals are not known to each other and the

burglaries are not connected.

On January 3, Charles Hymer, 25, of Newark was arrested for a December 14 residential burglary in the unit block of Thompson Circle.

Hymer was connected to this burglary after he was stopped by Elkton Police Department on December 15 for an unrelated incident and found in possession of stolen property linking him to the Thompson Circle burglary.

He was charged with

Burglary 2nd, Theft over \$1,500, and Criminal Mischief under \$1,000. Hymer was committed to Howard R. Young Correctional in lieu of \$3,250 bail.

Also arrested on January 3 was John T. Steinbeiser, 32, of Newark. Following a lengthy investigation, Steinbeiser was connected to five residential daytime burglaries which occurred in the neighborhood of Ridgewood Glen between September and December, 2011.

Steinbeiser was charged with five counts Burglary 2nd, five counts Theft over \$1,500, and three counts Criminal Mischief under \$1,000. He was committed to Howard R. Young Correctional in lieu of \$7,800 bail.


Out of the Attic

This week's Out of the Attic item is an undated view of the Washington House Hotel on East Main Street at the center of town. Attic's guess is that it is from the late 1800s or the early 1900s based on the clothing, the horses and horse-drawn carriage, and the barn in back. Let Attic know your thoughts.

This view shows the front and west side of the structure. The hotel was built on this site in 1825 and gained many additions over the years. Vic and Mary Jane Willis bought the hotel in 1911 using his savings from his 15-year major league baseball career to finance his dream of owning a hotel. The family lived in the hotel and Vic did everything necessary to run it. This was a gathering place for friends and townspeople for more than three decades until a stroke led to Willis' death in 1947. Vic was born just over the line at Iron Hill Station in Cecil County, Maryland. While an infant, his family moved to Newark where he grew up, attended Newark Academy and Delaware College, and developed his baseball skills. A century after his professional baseball career started, Vic Willis was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York in 1995 upon election by the Veterans Committee. Willis is the only person from the Newark Area to be enshrined there. He was also inducted into the Delaware Sports Hall of Fame in 1977 and the University of Delaware Sports Hall of Fame in 2003.

Visit the Newark History Museum located at the historic 1877 passenger train station on South College Avenue beside the bridge on the town side of the tracks.

The museum is now observing winter hours through March. Individuals,



groups, clubs, or organizations are welcome to visit by appointment. Call 368-9845 for arrangements. The Newark Historical Society invites donations or loans of objects, stories, pictures, and other artifacts of places, activities, people, and life styles in the Greater Newark Area for its permanent collections and display. Andre Horne finally comes home to Newark

Born and raised early on in Bridgeville, Del., Andre Horne, 18, moved to Newark with his father when he was 8 years old because "there was more competition and more exposure," he says.

Little did he know then that his future high school basketball career would traverse four schools in three different states.

He played at Philadelphia powerhouse Roman Catholic High as a freshman, but then transferred to Hodgson Vo-Tech because the daily commute by train to the city became too expensive and cumbersome.

After an All-State sophomore season at Hodgson, Horne then transferred to Life Center Academy in Burlington, N.J.

"Me and my dad thought it would be the best place to get my grades up higher and get a better education," says Horne, who scored his

1,000th career point while at Life Center.

But home is where Horne wanted to be, and so the dynamic guard/forward came back to Newark and enrolled in his home school, Newark High.

"I thought it would be good for me to come back to my home state and play my senior year with my friends," Horne says. "I felt Newark was a good spot for me education-wise and it's right down the street from my house."

The Yellowjackets were a solid team before the 6-foot-4 senior laced up his shoes when practice began in October, but his presence has made a very good team even better.

"The seniors welcomed him with open arms," Newark coach Shannon McCants says. "They already knew him and understood that Andre could help take us to another level."

Horne says it helped that he played with some of his current teammates, includ-

ing Martel McCain and Taylor Reynolds, on AAU teams.

One of those welcoming seniors was Taylor Reynolds, who understands what it takes to get to that next level after quarterbacking the football team to with-

pionship.

"His addition has been great," Reynolds says. "He's provided energy and experience to our starting lineup, which makes us more diverse."

McCants says that Horne's

greatest strength is his ability to score — he has a lightning-quick first step — and rebound from the guard position. Add to those two things that according to his coach he's "one of the most competitive players around," and you understand why he was a first team All-State selection as a sophomore. Yet for all his talent, Horne realizes there's always room for improvement.

"I need to work on my mid-range jumper," Horne admits.

Horne's talents are catching the eyes of college coaches. He has already received scholarship offers from Iona, Quinnipiac and Morehead State, with several others showing interest, including Clemson.

Horne leads the team averaging over 20 points per game, and McCants says he could probably score over 30 a game if he was a selfish player. Instead, he's more concerned about winning.

"Andre will text me often that he just wants to win a championship his last year and will do whatever is needed for the team," McCants says. "He brings us a toughness and major star status."

Off the court, Horne is anything but tough. "I'm a really good kid to hang around," he says. "I have a good heart and I was brought up to be that way."

That good heart is evident when Horne talks about his goals for the Yellowjackets.

"I want for us to connect as a team," he says. "We need to come together as brothers, like a family. We have the talent to win a state championship and I'll do anything to help our team win."
