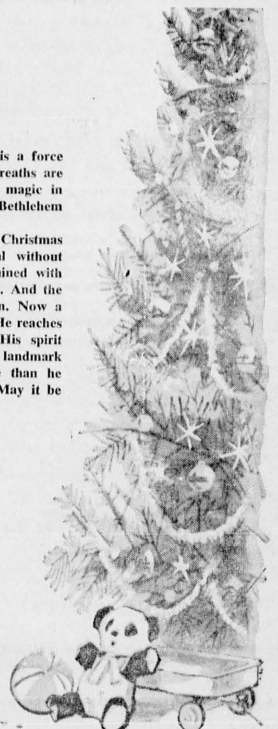

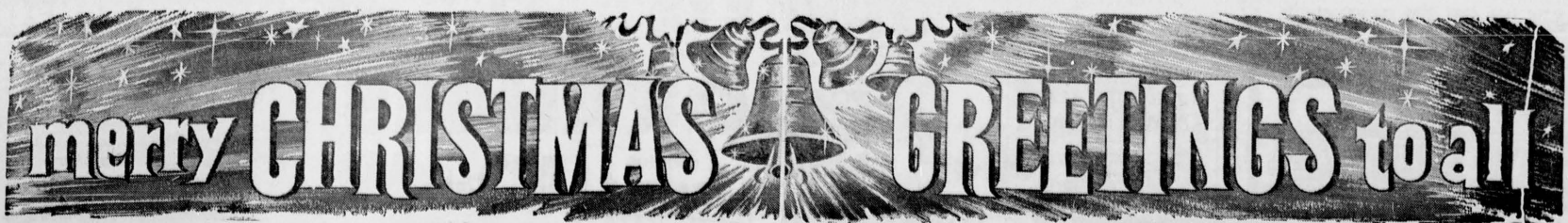

Hens 5-Game Streak Snapped At Rutgers; Peterson's Passers Face Pocono Classic

Delaware's five-game undefeated basketball season ended last Saturday night at New Brunswick, N.J., as Rutgers shot down Coach

Dan Peterson's high-flying Blue Chicks 103-84.

"I'm certain the boys will come back stronger and ready to go," Peterson said Saturday. "They've been playing their finest game of the season, built a commanding lead in the first half and Delaware was never able to catch up."

"Our defense and our rebounding broke down," said Peterson. "That's what happens when you're not sharp and playing on the road. Take nothing away from Rutgers. They played an exceptional game."

Rutgers made 41 of 85 field-goal attempts for a percentage of 48.2. Included were 17 lay-ups compared to just six for Delaware. Prior to Saturday the Blue Hens had been holding the opposition to a shooting percentage of about 34.

Delaware jumped out to a 3-2 lead, but Rutgers stormed back and scored 12 straight points to take a 14-3 lead with only 4:43 gone.

Kenn Barnett led Delaware with 20 points.

Delaware, West Chester State, C. W. Post, Muhlenberg, Kings College, Lafayette, Cortland State and host East Stroudsburg will compete in the Pocono Classic.

The Blue Hens face West Chester in the opening game at 1:30 p.m. on Dec. 28.
