Revised Budget Figures Offer Vehicle Overturns Savings In Proposed Tax Rate Crushing Trucker

Finance Director Albert K. Martin Presents Revision Of 1968 Budget With 15 Instead Of 49-Cent Tax Rise; Rep. J. R. Murphy Introduces Bill For Older Citizen

Finance Director Albert K. Martin presented revisions to the proposed municipal budget for 1968 at a special meeting of Newark City Council last Monday night, with expenditures of \$4,822,730 to be financed with approval of a \$2,110,200 bond issue at a 15-cents tax rate increase—from the current bond issue at a 15-cents tax rate increase—from the current 65 to a proposed 80-cents per \$100 assessed property value.

The original budget presentation included a 49-cents tax increase for expenditures of \$4.4
684310, while Martin's revised figures with a budget increase of \$138,420, are to be financed with a proposed 15-cents tax rise.

"I think the prospects for no tax increase are very good, and I would like to commend the staff..." Councilman David H. Doehlert said of budget presentations.
