## GOVERNOR RUTH ANN MINNER STATE OF THE STATE ADDRESS LEGISLATIVE HALL DOVER, DELAWARE JANUARY 22, 2004

Thank you.

Lieutenant Governor Carney, President Pro Tem Adams, Acting Speaker Oberle, members of the 142nd General Assembly, members of the Delaware judiciary, distinguished members of my Cabinet, state employees, our distinguished guests, to my family and to our fellow Delawareans...

Perhaps for the first time in four years, I can stand before you today...smiling. Members we know we have faced the worst crisis in the states history since World War II, our state was hailed as one of the best run in the country. The votes were cast over and over. Governing magazine. Standard and Poor's. USA Today. Moody's. CNN. Fitch Ratings and The Beacon Hill Institute.

Over and over, Delaware's name appeared on the lists of the best-managed states. If state government were on TV Survivor show, Delaware would definitely have won that million bucks and over the last couple of years we could've sure used it.

As with any success in government, the credit is shared. I want to thank the members of the Delaware General Assembly for working with me in the Delaware tradition – "the Delaware way" – to recognize and overcome our challenges. The bipartisan support for solving the \$300 million budget problem we faced a year ago was not only appreciated by me, but by all of the citizens of Delaware.

Perhaps the cooperation is best expressed in a comment made by House Majority Leader Wayne Smith. Representative Smith went with our finance team to one of the Wall Street bond rating meetings last year. He was asked about the ability of the Delaware General Assembly and the executive branch to work together. He told them, "In Delaware, when it comes to managing the budget, we're all patriots." Thank you Wayne for that spirit and thank each one of you for embracing that spirit as well.

You know, now that I think about it, in this building we work together almost as well as the national champion Blue Hen football team.

There are others to thank as well though, including the Lieutenant Governor John Carney for his wise counsel, my cabinet members for their considerable innovation and leadership. But I must especially thank our state employees.

Again and again, through the recession, through two hiring freezes, as the economy sank and budget cuts kept growing, they maintained the same level of service to the public. I want to

recognize them yet again for their efforts to serve the citizens of Delaware. Please join me in saluting our Delaware state employees.

As we look at Delaware's history over the past three decades, we know that in a time of economic growth will mean good things can happen in Delaware. Like the 1980s and the 1990s, the next years the early 21<sup>st</sup> century promise to be a period of possibility.

If we stay true to the principles that proved wise in the recent years, if we apply vision to the most pressing issues of today, I firmly believe that Delaware will enter a new era of opportunity; an era of opportunity where we have the chance not just to survive, but to thrive; an era of opportunity where we continue to set Delaware apart, improving the prospects for our people and writing a new chapter in the distinguished history of our state.

So let me talk a little bit today about how we will achieve the new era of opportunity, in education, in the economy, fighting cancer, and in the environment.

#### Education

For more than a decade, Delaware's been on the path of educational improvement and the results are showing.

Recently, Delaware students were among the best performers in the country on the National Assessment of Educational Progress, one of the few tests that allow state-to-state comparison per student performance.

In math, our fourth- and eighth-graders showed impressive gains and in reading they remain maintained some of the highest scores in our country. Student scores on our own Delaware Student Testing Program are showing continuous progress as well.

If we set high goals for our students, and if we consistently provide them and our schools with the tools they need, we will see improvement year after year. And Delaware students will become better and better equipped to succeed in college, in work in life.

As our state enters this new era of opportunity, I have a number of ideas to bolster our children's basic skills and to lead to even-higher levels of achievement.

First, I ask the General Assembly to complete the funding for reading resource teachers for every public elementary school. I've said it often and I'll say it again: I believe you learn to read at a very young age, and you read to learn for the rest of your life. It's critical for each one of our Delaware children that they have that most basic skill.

Currently, 50 of our elementary schools have reading resource teachers and the difference they are making is real in the lives of children.

Two years ago in my address, I introduced you to a teacher, Sylvia Stevens, a reading teacher at Fairview Elementary School right here in Dover. Two of Sylvia's students are Deven and Shawn Barr, brothers who are now in the fourth grade. Sylvia's worked with Deven and Shawn for more than a year, since their regular teachers recognized their need for extra help in reading.

Just since September, Sylvia says Deven and Shawn have improved their reading skills by an entire grade level. Sylvia worked with Deven and Shawn and yes they've improved. Now, on Sylvia's tests, they score 99 percent in word recognition — with no mistakes. Their progress in their reading abilities is clear, thanks to their work and to Sylvia's.

Ladies and gentlemen, please welcome and congratulate a very outstanding teacher Mrs. Sylvia Stevens along with students Deven and Shawn Barr.

In order to provide more students with successes like Deven and Shawn's, I ask that you support my proposal for 68 new reading resource teachers, assuring one in every public elementary school in Delaware.

My support for reading teachers is my belief that children must receive a firm foundation for their early years for the learning that will go on the rest of their lives. Research has shown that the time between birth and 5 years old is critical in brain development.

In addition to reading teachers, we must expand our efforts in helping our students at that critical age. We, as leaders of our state, should make a promise to the people of Delaware to offer full-time kindergarten in every elementary school in our state by the year 2008.

It's a challenge, it's a promise that will be full of challenges, but worthy goals always are. My agenda for the next year will be to craft an implementation plan that will address the many issues concerning the transformation from half-day to full-day kindergarten. My budget proposal will also include \$1 million to begin the funding of this program for our youngest school students. I ask the General Assembly to support this initiative.

Children cannot learn without proper tools and providing those materials is our responsibility as well. Since the start of my administration I have worked to ensure that much of the new funding goes directly to the classroom.

So my budget proposal will include \$9 million to be sent straight to the classroom and used for textbooks, technology and other supplies.

Every day, we place the future of our children in the gifted hands of educators. Besides parents, teachers have the most impact on our students and we've recognized and supported them. Over the last several years, we have put more than \$3 million into upgrading their skills and knowledge and created the Professional Standards Board, giving teachers considerable responsibility in the effort to improve our schools.

We must do more to ensure that the best and brightest minds in our state continue to join the teachers profession. We need them to produce the best and brightest minds of the next generation.

I propose to you the creation of the Delaware Teacher Corps. modeled after successful programs elsewhere in the country, the Teacher Corps would bring new teachers to Delaware schools by offering to pay the cost of their education at our state institutions.

For each year of schooling that the Corps pays for, the teacher would then commit to spend one year teaching in Delaware public schools. Furthermore, in the first years of this program, I propose that we utilize the Teacher Corps to fill one of the most critical needs of our school system: The need for math and science teachers in our middle and high schools.

The budget I will present to the General Assembly next week will include funding for the Teacher Corps and will propose that most of that funding be used to recruit math and science teachers.

We cannot create an era of opportunity without devoting considerable amount of our efforts and our resources to our children. I ask that you support my proposals for reading teachers, for full-day kindergarten, for textbooks and technology and the Delaware Teacher Corps.

#### Creating Jobs

Our efforts in education are about preparing for the future. And Delaware's economic development strategies have been long forward-looking as well.

As Delaware has evolved over the years, it's diversified – from agriculture to manufacturing to chemicals to finance. Our state has a strong history of business and government working together to identify the prospects for strengthening our economy. Again and again, we have improved the quality of life of Delawareans by providing quality jobs.

Even during the recent tough years, Delaware has done well. It has taken a concerted effort by all of us – myself, members of the General Assembly, my economic development team, and especially the business leaders around the state, they talk to each other. They make a difference.

Together, we have succeeded in creating or retaining more than 11,000 jobs over the last three years. Just last week, we announced a major win – AAA bringing its headquarters, operations center and 750 new jobs to Wilmington and Newark. Successes like these have kept Delaware's unemployment rate substantially below the rest of the country during the recession. The era of opportunity we are entering presents us with another chance to diversify and fortify the Delaware's economy. In February, I will unveil the details of an economic development package.

The "New Economy Initiative" will be a comprehensive plan to put more than \$46 million in state and matching private and federal funds to work bolstering our economy.

The Newly Initiative of will include Competitiveness Fund to spur and invest in existing manufacturing facilities; seed funding for technology-based small business start-ups; venture capital funding for Delaware firms on the edge of significant expansion; programs to boost Delaware's standing in the areas of emerging technologies, clean energy and fuel cell research; and an investment aimed at improving Delaware's research and development efforts, particularly in the area of biotechnology.

Several of these ideas in the New Economy Initiative fulfill recommendations of the Governor's Strategic Economic Council.

Taken together, these programs will focus on diversification of Delaware's economy, foster a vibrant entrepreneurial culture in our state and create a new opportunities for working Delawareans.

#### Fighting Cancer

Let me turn now to the opportunity we have to combat one of the most serious health issues facing Delawareans: cancer.

Reducing both the number of cases and the number of deaths has been a priority of the Minner-Carney Administration. The Delaware Advisory Council on Cancer Incidence and Mortality crafted a brilliant road map that cancer experts, doctors and patients told us would decrease the above-average rates of cancer in our state. Last year, you joined me in funding the first-year of the council recommendations.

The results in our state's fight against cancer are real. The latest data on cancer rates show that both the rate of getting cancer and the rate of dying from cancer have decreased again. Delaware's cancer death rates have declined almost twice as fast as the national average. Rates of breast and prostate cancer are now below the national average. We are on the right track, but we have more to do.

We now know, thanks to research completed this year, that cancer victims without health insurance receive less than 60 percent of the health care patients with health insurance get. This means that health insurance for cancer can be the difference between life and death.

No more Delawareans should die from cancer simply because they make too much money to qualify for Medicaid, and don't make enough to pay for their own health insurance. I promised when I took office that I would take bold steps in the fight against cancer. Today, I am announcing another step.

I am asking the Delaware General Assembly to make Delaware the first state in the country to guarantee health insurance for every person in the state diagnosed with cancer. Some will say, to us "no other state has done that." I say, it's about time someone did, and Delaware will lead the way.

In order to fund new cancer treatment for uninsured and to continue our present efforts against cancer, I propose to double the funding of cancer prevention, education, screening and treatment to \$10 million in the next budget year.

Please join with me to provide a new era of opportunity to Delawareans who face this deadly disease.

#### Environment

As we continue to protect the health of Delawareans, it's critical that we do more to address the issue of industrial pollution. Over the last three years, we've made great strides to protect our environment for the people.

We have enacted laws strengthening public knowledge of environmental incidents, harshly punishing repeat offenders of environmental laws, regulating aboveground storage tanks and putting a law on the books that will hold industrial company executives personally responsible and liable for environmental incidents when someone is harmed.

Last month, the Motiva oil refinery in Delaware City was put on a mandatory plan for improvements in the operations of its entire plant, with financial penalties spelled out in advance if it doesn't comply. The plan is unprecedented, it does not just address one isolated accident, it addresses and requires plant-wide changes in order to prevent future accidents.

As I said, we have accomplished much to protect our environment, and because of that work, Delaware will be cleaner and our children will be healthier. But there is still more to do.

As a result of an agreement between Delaware the EPA, and the Delaware City refinery they will soon ask for permits for pollution control equipment that will reduce sulfa dioxide emissions by more than 28,000 tons each year.

Last week, I told the CEO and the new owner of the refinery, Premcor, that I expect the pollution reduction to continue. He committed that it would, in fact said he would exceed our expectations. We must and we will follow through on what will be the largest air pollution reduction project in the history of our state.

Another major source of industrial pollution in Delaware is coal-fired commercial power plants in Edgemoor and on the Indian River. Among the pollutants emitted by those facilities is mercury, which accumulates in water and can be passed to humans through eating fish and shellfish.

Mercury is especially dangerous to young children and pregnant women because of its ability to cause permanent brain damage to young children. It is critical to reduce the amount of mercury emitted in Delaware and to protect our children from mercury's harmful effects.

That's why I have asked the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control to begin a process to reduce the emissions of sulfa dioxide, nitrogen oxide and mercury from Delaware's commercial power plants. Our goal is to define reductions in these pollutants this year, so that our children will be safer in years to come.

Of course, ensuring a Livable Delaware continue to be among the priorities of the Minner-Carney administration. One of the primary ways that we've guaranteed it is by that the green space and open lands we enjoy those today and we need to make sure they still exist for some far reaching tomorrow.

Since 2001, we have preserved more than 4,300 acres of open space and protected more than 34,000 acres of farmland from development. This is substantial progress, but we are not finished. For the next few years to be truly an era of opportunity, we must seize the chance to save one of our most precious resources – undeveloped land.

I will propose \$22 million for the new Green Infrastructure program. This program will seek opportunities to join with environmental groups and work towards preserving some of our most important natural habitats in the state. The Green Infrastructure program underscores our commitment to Livable Delaware by developing public-private partnerships to preserve our environmental heritage.

I ask you support me as we work to reduce pollution and to protect even more of our valuable land from development.

#### Legislative and Budget Preview

Before I conclude, let me mention a few items in my legislative agenda, which I will present to you in March, and my budget and bond bill, which I will present next week.

In 2003, 33 people were killed on Delaware roads by drunk drivers. Please join me to save the lives of our families, our friends our fellow Delawareans on our roads – along with restoring \$1.5 million for federal highway construction – by lowering Delaware's legal blood alcohol to .08.

Just yards from where I stand right now, Delaware's original copy of the Bill of Rights is on display, testifying to our state's leadership in securing equal protection and equal rights for all of our citizens. The General Assembly currently has a bill before it that represents the next step in our country and our state's evolution in extending tolerance and understanding.

This legislation does not provide special rights for those it covers, it simply provides equal rights. I ask that you approve House Bill 99, prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation in employment, housing and accommodations, and send it for my signature.

You are all familiar with our 800-megahertz radio system, which provides our state's emergency responders the ability to communicate both in their daily work and, importantly, in the event of a large-scale catastrophe.

For the last few months, representatives of the emergency community have been discussing the steps necessary to take 800-megahertz to the next level, to broaden its coverage and it's effectiveness for our police, our fire fighters, in medical, public health, environmental and other responders.

The FY05 budget I will propose will include \$12 million for the "next generation" of the 800-megahertz system and I ask that you support that proposal.

Let me pause for just a moment take just a moment to introduce some honored guest. First, Col. John Pray, commander of the 436<sup>th</sup> Airlift Wing at Dover Air Force Base. And now two very very special guests, both recently returned from service in Saudi Arabia and Iraq. Please recognize them and, in doing so, recognize the service of our state's military men and women: Army Guard Master Sergeant First Class Timothy Sinko of the 153<sup>rd</sup> Military Police Company and with him today Air Guard Master Sergeant Paul Shavack of the 142<sup>nd</sup> Airlift Squadron. Thank you gentlemen for being with us.

The sacrifice exhibited by the men and women of our Delaware National Guard, and the military reserves and Dover Air Force Base around the globe remind us of the service of veterans in past years. My bond bill proposal will include substantial funding for Delaware to soon eliminate its status as one of only three states without a home for our treasured veterans.

Let's extend a new era of opportunity to those on our roadways in the path of some future drunken driver; to those whose lifestyles may be different then our own; to veterans who have served our state and our country so well; and to those in the fire, police and emergency response community who risk their lives for ours every day.

We should not use the recent economic upturn as an excuse to unleash budget growth. Over the last 30 years, the operating budgets enacted after an economic downturn have shown growth of 8 to 11 percent.

That level of growth is not responsible and that will not be acceptable. The budget I will present will show modest growth and will require more of the money-saving initiatives like those that we've done in the last several years.

As we consider measures that may affect our bottom line, we must be sure to recognize those coming challenges, including the possibility of slot machines in neighboring states; expenses imposed and shifted from the federal government; the escalating costs of health care; and there are others.

As we consider our fiscal future, I ask you to stay true to the principles that have put Delaware in such positive shape, stay the course. Failure to do so might risk our ability to take full advantage of the era of opportunity.

#### Conclusion

In conclusion, my message today is simple. Delaware's endured some tough times and, because of our responsibility and our willingness to work together, we've emerged stronger than almost every other state. We face the future with an advantage: a sound solid foundation, while others are struggling just to regain their footing.

Our challenge is to build wisely on that foundation, to be the architects of a new stirring phase of Delaware design. Let's join together, as Delawareans have at each of the critical moments in our state's history, let's grasp a bright future. Ladies and gentlemen, the state of our state we face a new era of opportunity.

Thank you.

Pursuant to Article III, Section 18 of the Delaware Constitution, I am vetoing Senate Bill No. 27 by returning it to the Delaware State Senate without my signature for reconsideration.

Senate Bill No. 27 is a municipal charter amendment for the Town of South Bethany, Delaware. By and large, its provisions are typical of those found in routine charter amendments considered by the General Assembly. Sections 22 and 23 of the Bill, however, are troublesome, in that they purport to vest South Bethany police authorities with the authority and powers of the Delaware State Police in an area 500 feet beyond the limits of the Town. These provisions concern me for two reasons. First, they appear inconsistent with other law relating to the exercise of police functions. Second, they risk creating unnecessary and potentially dangerous confusion concerning the jurisdictional boundaries of the Town.

Sections 22 and 23 of Senate Bill No. 27 would amend the South Bethany Charter by permitting the South Bethany Police Department to "enforce all criminal laws and motor vehicle laws enacted by the State of Delaware within five hundred feet (500') of the corporate limits of the town of South Bethany." Because of existing language in the South Bethany Charter, the same sections would vest each member of the South Bethany Police Department with all of the power and authority of a Delaware State Police officer when he or she is within 500 feet of South Bethany's corporate limits. The proposed increase of the scope of authority for the South Bethany Police Department would add to existing provisions of the South Bethany Charter that

already permit South Bethany police officers to extend the pursuit of an offender beyond the limits of the Town.

By giving a municipal police department authority beyond town limits, and by vesting South Bethany police officers with the authority to act as Delaware State Police officers in the additional area, Senate Bill No. 27 appears to conflict with other Delaware law concerning the jurisdiction of Delaware police officials. Section 8302(b) of Title 11,

Delaware Code, states that local police officials shall act outside their local jurisdiction and have authority of State Police officers only when acting "in response to a request for assistance from the State Police." The provisions of Senate Bill No. 27 would obviate the need for such a request, and therefore create a conflict with the Delaware Code. Importantly as well, because the existing Town Charter for South Bethany indicates that its officers are to have and exercise "all of the police powers and authority of a Delaware State Police Officer," extending such powers and authority outside the Town expressly contradicts a related provision of Delaware law that gives the State Police *exclusive* jurisdiction with respect to the investigation and prosecution of certain identified crimes, including homicides and kidnapping, 11 *Del. C.* § 8302.(a).

The provisions of 11 *Del. C.* § 8302, and its predecessors, have been construed to complement the recognized common law rule concerning powers of local police jurisdictions. That rule, as stated in *Holman v. Walls*, 648 F. Supp. 947 (D.Del. 1986), is that:

A Public officer appointed as a conservator of the peace for a particular county or municipality generally has no official power to apprehend offenders beyond the boundaries of the county or district for which he is appointed. 5 Am. Jur. 2d *Arrest* § 50 (1962). Delaware has modified this common law rule by statute in the case of a "fresh pursuit" of a suspected offender. 11 *Del. C.* § 1935, *see State v. Cochran*, 372 *A.* 2d 193 (*Del.* 1977). The Court believes that section 8302(b) is nothing more than a further modification of the common law rule in cases where local police respond to a state police request for assistance.

I believe that if the General Assembly genuinely intended to further alter the common law rules concerning authority of local police agencies, it would have considered this issue in greater detail on a comprehensive basis, rather than making an obscure change in a local charter amendment.

In reviewing Senate Bill No. 27,1 have become aware that certain other municipal charters that have been enacted into law in our State include provision for local police to operate in a buffer area around municipal limits. These provisions tend to appear in the characters of some of our State's larger cities, such s Newark and Dover, but are not the norm among the beach municipalities of Sussex County. More importantly, however, those other charters allowing for a buffer area lack one significant characteristic of South Bethany's proposed charter – they do not purport to provide officers with the authority of State Police officers in areas outside of the municipality. More commonly, a charter authorizing municipal police to act outside a town provides local police with the authority of "constables" which, under State law, may keep the peace, but are required to notify full service police agencies of their actions. See 10 Del. C. § 2705.

Aside from Senate Bill No. 27's apparent conflict with statute and common law and the practical uncertainty it may create, I have concluded that vetoing this legislation is the only appropriate action. I would, however, welcome the opportunity to enact a revision of the Town of South Bethany's charter with Sections 22 and 23

To The Members of the Senate of the 142<sup>nd</sup> General Assembly:

Pursuant to Article III, Section 18 of the Delaware Constitution, I am vetoing <u>Senate Bill No.</u> 53 by returning it to the Delaware State Senate without my signature for reconsideration.

Senate Bill No. 53 seeks to repeal action taken by the General Assembly nearly eight years ago to expand the New Castle County Council, from its current seven members to thirteen members (comprised of twelve members representing council manic districts, and a president of Council elected at large). In 1996, the General Assembly determined that a seven-member Council for our State's most populous County had become unworkable, and directed that the Council be expanded from seven to thirteen members during the next election cycle, that is, incident to the 1998 election. Subsequently, the deadline for the expansion of Council has twice been extended, and under current law the Council is to be expanded as part of the upcoming 2004 election. In reliance on the law as it is currently written, New Castle County Council has specially appointed a bi-partisan commission of citizens to consider new councilperson election districts. That commission painstakingly prepared new district maps for the twelve newly drawn council districts. The commission's proposed maps were subject to review and comment by the public, and on September 22, 2003 – just over 4 months ago- these maps were finally adopted.

Two critical factors compel a veto of <u>Senate Bill No. 53</u>. The first factor is procedural: it is simply too late in the day to again deprive the citizens of New Castle County the Council structure that they have been promised for eight years. An immeasurable amount of time, money and effort has been expended to clear the way for this expansion of Council in the coming year. While reasonable people can debate whether the expansion should be to nine, ten, eleven or twelve seats, the time for that debate has passed. County government, and the citizens of New Castle County, have all expended too much effort and energy in preparing for a new structure of government to cavalierly dismiss such efforts.

Second, and more importantly, the grounds supporting an expansion of New Castle County Council are more pressing today than they were when the General Assembly initially approved the expansion due to population growth. Currently, the average ratio of citizens to council members in New Castle County is over 84,000. Allowing the expansion of Council as previously planned reduces that number to about 42,000 residents per Councilperson. Even with that change, it is significant that New Castle County's councilpersons will still represent on average a substantially greater number of citizens than other elected officials in our State. By comparison, each member of the State House of Representatives represents 19,418 citizens; each member of the Delaware State Senate represents 37,912 citizens; each Commissioner of the Kent County Levy Court represents 21,511 citizens, and each member of Sussex County Council represents 32,254 citizens. When reviewed in context, it is clear that the expansion of New Castle County Council merely makes the ration of representation of Council members comparable to the ration

of other elected legislative officials. Conversely, an expanded Council structure helps to assure that each citizen of New Castle County has a better chance of being well-represented, with the opportunity to meet with his or her Councilperson and share views and suggestions, and that important legislative matters will be addressed in a timely and efficient manner. The citizens of New Castle County have waited too long for representation on par with that of other counties and legislative bodies to turn back now.

In light the timing with which <u>Senate Bill No. 53</u> has been adopted and presented, as well as the sound policy reasons that continue to support a substantial expansion of the New Castle County Council, I have concluded that veto of this legislation is appropriate and in the best interests of New Castle County and its citizens.
