SUBJECT: Additional Thoughts on Access Management Policy

I want to raise a couple of additional points I didn't fully share with you regarding the proposed Access Management Policy:

1. Cancelling or changing permits already issued: I have real concerns about the matter of allowing DelDot to cancel or alter the terms of an entrance permit which has already been granted, and the related issue of changing the terms of a "grandfathered" entrance permit (one which had been issued prior to the adoption of these regulations). If DelDot is given the power to do this as it is worded in this draft policy, it would play absolute havoc with owners and developers of commercial property because they would never know where they stand. As you know, entrance permits or lack thereof can have a major impact on the value of a parcel of land. Often, mortgage terms, lease provisions and other crucial matters are tied to issues like whether or not the Property has the right kind of entrance permit (such as the case of the Walmart store in the Five Points area).

There probably needs to be some way in which the department can seek to negotiate matters of this sort to adjust for changing conditions and circumstances, but they should not have absolute power to impose their will regardless of the wishes of the property owner and regardless of the provisions of previous approvals or permits issued by county or municipal agencies and DelDot itself. Perhaps there could be some procedure similar to a condemnation process whereby, if a property owner won't cooperate, DelDot could make a case for what it needs to do before some impartial body, compensate the property owner for any lost value, and so on.

Possible Abuse of Power: These regulations would concentrate enormous power in the hands of a very few officials with the Department of Transportation. Past events have shown us that enormous concentrations of power in a few hands opens the door to misuse of that power by unscrupulous persons. I am in no way suggesting that our present governor or our present DelDot officials are the type of people would misuse that power, but I am suggesting very strongly that if the power is there, it is going to be abused by some person or persons at some time. This power could be used by a governor or a corrupt DelDot official either for political purposes or as a way of soliciting improper payments. In view of recent past history with DelDot the General Assembly is more than justified in raising this concern.

As I noted in the original document, one of the big flaws in this policy document which leaps out at me is the lack of effective oversight of DelDot's decision-making process by any outside, unbiased group, short of taking the department to court or enacting specific statutory provisions detailing various policies (legislative micro-managing in other words). That is bad public policy under any circumstances, and when the area covered by the regulations is so directly related to property values. I'm afraid we'd just be asking for possible trouble by placing so much control in so few hands so cut off from effective oversight.

A prayer was offered by Representative David H. Ennis, Sixth Representative District.

The Speaker led those present in a pledge of allegiance to the flag.

The Majority Leader moved to dispense with the posting of the minutes of the previous Legislative Day. The motion was seconded by Representative Welch and adopted by voice vote.

Mr. Speaker Spence & Representative Smith made a presentation to Representative Mack.

Representatives Mack, Oberle, Cathcart, Wagner, Buckworth, D. Ennis & Gilligan made comments.

Mr. Speaker Spence granted the privilege of the floor to Senator Dori Connor.

Representative Reynolds made comments.

Representative Reynolds introduced and brought <u>HR 83</u>, sponsored on Behalf of All Representatives, before the House for consideration.

<u>HR 83</u> - Bidding A Fond Farewell to a Fine State Representative and a Good Friend, the Honorable Jeffrey G. Mack of New Castle.

WHEREAS, as one of New Castle's finest gentlemen, Jeffrey G. (Jeff) Mack was first elected by the residents of the 17th Representative District to the State House of Representatives in 1980 at the age of 28; and

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 139TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY: On June 29, 1998, I received House Bill Number 176 as amended by House Amendment No. 1 entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 21 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO THE

# **REGISTRATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES."**

I am returning House Bill Number 176 as amended by House Amendment No. 1 to the House of Representatives without my signature for the following reasons.

House Bill 176 decreases the annual fee for vanity license plates from \$40.00 to \$30.00. Fees from vanity plates are deposited in the Transportation Trust Fund which helps fund highways projects throughout Delaware.

Currently, 15,476 vanity plates have been issued by the Division of Motor Vehicles ("DMV"), generating annual fees to the Transportation Trust Fund of approximately \$619,040.00. Lowering the fee as proposed by House Bill 176 would decrease those revenues to \$464,280.00, a loss of \$154,760.00.

House Bill 176 purports to be revenue neutral by assuming that the decreased annual fee would generate a corresponding increase in the volume of vanity plates issued, thereby making up for the loss. I see little evidence to support this assumption. A significant increase in volume would be required, over 33 percent, to offset the lost revenue resulting from this legislation. it is hard to believe a \$10 reduction in the annual fee would generate a 33 percent increase in volume.

Any deficit to the Transportation Trust Fund must be made up elsewhere. Vanity tags are luxury items and taxpayers should not have to make up for the lost revenues this legislation may cause.

The administration suggested to the sponsor that the legislation be amended to give DMV the discretion to set the fees within a \$30.00 - \$40.00 range. This would allow DMV to test the sponsor's premise by lowering the fee to \$30.00 while granting them the flexibility to raise the fee (without the need to pass legislation by a super-majority vote) if the volume increase does not materialize. The Sponsor has agreed to this compromise and my administration will work with her to enact such legislation in the next session.

For all the reasons stated above, I return House Bill Number 176 without my signature.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 139TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY: On July 6, 1998, I received House Bill Number 652 entitled:

"AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 14 OF THE DELAWARE CODE PROVIDING FOR THE JOINDER OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE IN AN INTERSTATE COMPACT AGREEMENT FOR EDUCATION."

Today, I am returning H.B. 652 to the House without my signature for the following reasons.

H.B. 652 would codify in Delaware law the Southern Regional Education Compact and Delaware's assent thereto. However, funding for the State's membership in the Southern Regional Education Board ("SREB") and an amendment to the Delaware Code authorizing the Governor to execute the SREB Compact on behalf of the State were already included in the recently enacted Senate Bill Number 410, the Fiscal Year 1999 Appropriations Act. Therefore, H.B. 652 is unnecessary. If the only problem with H.B. 652 was its redundancy, however, I would not veto it.

Unfortunately, H.B. 652 also contains unacceptable provisions governing Delaware's SREB Board members. The SREB Compact provides for five SREB Board members from Delaware, one of whom shall be the Governor exofficio and the other four who shall be appointed by the Governor. Of these four, the Compact requires that at least one be an educator and at least one be a legislator. House Bill 652 goes further by specifically dictating that the four appointed members shall consist of a State Senator, a State Representative, and an employee from each of the State's public universities. Therefore, under H.B. 652 the Governor's hands are tied and no public members from Delaware may be appointed to the SREB Board. Indeed, under the terms of H.B. 652, the Chairperson of the Higher Education Commission could not be appointed to the SREB Board. House Bill 652 thereby prevents the Governor from selecting a complement of Board members with the breadth and independence of viewpoint to ensure that Delaware students receive the maximum benefit from the State's membership in SREB. I do not believe this is wise or appropriate.

For these reasons, I am returning House Bill 652 to the House without my signature.

"AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 10 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO JURY SERVICE."

House Bill Number 678 would amend the Delaware Code to provide that "[n]o person age 70 or older shall be compelled to perform jury duty."

I am returning H.B. 678 to the House of Representatives without my signature for the following reasons.

Over a decade ago, Delaware law was changed to bring the State's practices with respect to the selection if juries into line with national standards. At that time, Delaware adopted as law the policy that "jurors serving in each county shall be selected at random from a fair cross section of the population of that county and that all qualified persons shall have an opportunity to be considered for jury service and an obligation to serve as jurors when summoned for that purpose." 10 <u>Del. C.</u> § 4501. Moreover, the Superior Court is given the mandate to adopt a jury selection plan implementing this statutory policy, and such plan

must include provisions addressing the "disqualification, excuse and exclusion of prospective jurors". 10 <u>Del.</u>  $\underline{C}$ . § 4507(a)(7). The Superior court is further authorized to "determine that membership in specified groups of persons or occupational classes" constitutes sufficient grounds for a person to be excused from jury service. 10 <u>Del. C</u>. § 4511(b).

These provisions replaced the previous statutory scheme which set forth several specific categories of persons who were automatically exempt from jury service. House Bill 678 represents a return to the previous policy of legislating exemptions from the civic responsibility and right of jury service. I believe that it is unwise to move in this direction for several reasons.

First, it is unnecessary to enact H.B. 678 into law since the Superior Court already excuses any person over 70 years of age from jury duty upon request.

Second, I believe that the judicial branch of government can rightly be trusted to make decisions with respect to exclusions from jury duty with sensitivity and a thoughtful regard for the unduly burdomsom effect jury duty could have on certain citizens because of their personal circumstances. Indeed, the Superior Court's institution of the "one day or one jury" system of jury service in New Castle County is evidence of just such sensitivity.

Third, I believe it is generally administratively inefficient and unfair to lock into statute specific exclusions from jury duty. This is unnecessarily rigid and fails to take into account the evolving conditions of a complex society. The exclusion at issue in this bill is a good example in itself of this phenomenon. As life expectancies increase, our nation finds itself in the situation where more and more "senior citizens" continue to be full-time members of the workforce, and where an increase in the retirement age for social security purposes in under consideration by federal policymakers. Indeed, members of the judicial and legislative branches of our government continue to service with distinction after their seventieth birthdays. Yet, H.B. 678 would, by statute, automatically excuse persons over seventy years of age from fulfilling their civic responsibilities, not on the basis of health, personal circumstances, or occupation, but simply because of their age. While I do not object to the judiciary's implementation of such an exclusion as an administrative matter, I do not want to

Finally, I believe it is unwise for Delaware to return to a statutory scheme whereby large segments of our society are exempt from jury service. A civil society depends on an active and engaged citizenry. The effectiveness and fairness of the jury system -- a system which is an important safeguard of our liberty -- depends on the availability of juries comprised of a fair and representative cross section of our community. I do not believe we should encourage citizens to seek to exempt themselves by statute from this critical civic right and duty. House Bill 678, if enacted, would encourage members of particular occupations and other groups to lobby the General Assembly for a statutory exclusion from jury service. If successful, this could place Delaware back where it was before the Delaware Code was reformed to make juries more representative of our citizenry.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning H.B. 678 to you without my signature.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 139TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY: On July 8, 1998, I received a copy of House Bill 357 entitled:

"AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 30 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO TAXATION OF CONSTRUCTION TRANSPORTATION CONTRACTORS."

This bill expands the definition of "contractor currently found in Title 30 of the Delaware Code to include "construction transportation contractors." Such individuals would include persons contracting for the transportation of tangible property to be used for construction purposes. Under the bill, any sums received for transporting construction materials, less any sums paid to "draypersons" would constitute gross receipts for tax purposes. The contractor tax rate (0.624%) would apply to construction transportation contractors. Under current law, the draypersons rate (0.384%) applies, but no deduction is allowed for sums paid to subcontractors, except in the case of truck brokers, where the tax is applied only to commissions.

The bill is crafted to assist a very small number of taxpayers, firms who bear prime responsibility for providing truck services to construction sites and which elect to do so through contracts with other truckers. One of these firms was informed by the Department of Finance about its tax liability under current law several years ago. House Bill 357 has a retroactive effective date and is intended to benefit this taxpayer by excusing its past tax liability. It is not intended to induce positive economic behavior (e.g., increased investment in a Delaware facility) or to make our state's business climate more competitive. Rather, at best, its purpose is to provide at most a small number of firms with a retroactive tax break.

Despite its ostensibly narrow focus, the bill could have unintended effects. Because construction transportation contractors engage in competitive bidding, a retroactive tax reduction creates the potential to benefit firms that have unfairly gained business advantage by submitting low bids intending not to pay taxes required by the law in effect at the time.

The same logic could extend further. The theory behind this bill seems to entail that, for example, firms transporting raw materials for manufacturers, bringing them to the manufacturer's site, be taxed at the low gross receipts rate applicable to manufacturers. My objective has been to provide broad-based tax relief, such as is reflected in the gross receipts tax cut package which I have already signed, and not to favor special interest tax breaks, especially retroactive ones. In this regard, it is noteworthy that the broad-based tax relief enacted this session applies prospectively only.

For the reasons stated above, I am returned House Bill 357 without my signature.

"AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 21 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES."

I am returning House Bill 529 to the House of Representatives without my signature for the following reasons.

House Bill 529 decreases the penalty for drivers caught speeding 10-19 miles per hour ("mph") over the speed limit by reducing the points assessed against their licenses. The decrease makes the point assessment for driving 10-19 mph over the speed limit the same as for traveling 1-9 mph over the speed limit. Whereas all drivers traveling over the speed limit are breaking the law, those who recklessly disregard the speed limit pose a greater risk to the public and deserve a higher penalty. In short, House Bill 529 sends the wrong message to reckless and aggressive drivers.

The sponsor's stated intent is to resolve more speeding cases in the Justice of the Peace Courts as opposed to the Court of Common Pleas. Currently, many defendants request a trial, thus resulting in cases being transferred from the Justice of the Peace Court to the Court of Common Pleas. The sponsor suggests this is done because prosecutors in the Court of common Pleas are more likely to plea bargain the offenses due to the relative seriousness of their case loads in that court. According to the sponsor, defendants are motivated by the desire to have the point assessment reduced. Thus, by lowering the points, the sponsor believes that defendants will have less incentive to litigate these cases in the Court of Common Pleas. While I agree that it is inefficient for these cases to be heard in the Court of Common Pleas, decreasing the point assessment for speeders is not the solution.

Point assessments are important disincentives to speeding. Accumulating too many points can lead to the suspension of a driver's license and an increase in insurance premiums. In fact, the current burden on the courts, as articulated by the sponsor, shows how important the assessment of points is to drivers. Defendants are willing to litigate their violation in the Court of Common Pleas to get a reduction in their point assessments. Clearly, point assessments provide an important disincentive, discouraging drivers from speeding in the first place.

The Department of Public Safety, the Office of Highway Safety, the State Police and several insurance companies oppose House Bill 529 because it abrogates this important deterrent. Speeding is a factor in 31 percent of all fatal accidents, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. In Delaware, the number of accidents attributable to speeding, improper overtaking, and following too closely (two attributes commonly associated with speeding) rose from 3,377 in 1996 to 3.558 in 1997. The number of deaths in Delaware attributable to speeding rose 50 percent from 1996 to 1997.

As an example of how our current speeding laws can save lives, the Delaware State Police recently stepped up their Aggressive Driving Campaign this past July 4th holiday weekend. The State Police are proud to report that the 1998 July 4th weekend was fatality free, last year was not. The increased police presence greatly discouraged speeding on Delaware's roads. Almost twice as many speeding arrests were made this l year than last year and there were fewer accidents. The Department of Public Safety feels the increased police presence and fear of arrest and penalties encouraged many drivers to obey the speed limit - thereby saving lives.

The issue of overburdening the Court of Common Pleas with these cases is a concern I share. As my Administration has suggested, a more appropriate and direct solution is to alter the jurisdiction of the Court of Common Pleas so that defendants are not afforded a trial in that court for these cases and must resolve the matter in the Justice of the Peace Court. In the alternative, law enforcement and the Attorney General's Office could agree as a matter of policy that such cases will not receive a plea offer in the Court of Common Pleas thereby eliminating the incentive to transfer these cases there. In closing, while we need to resolve this important issue, we must not do so at the cost of endangering the safety of those who travel on Delaware's roads.

For all the reasons stated above, I return House Bill 529 without my signature.

On July 8, 1998, I received House Bill Number 464, entitled:

"AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 6 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO SALES OF GOODS."

House Bill 464 would modify the Uniform Commercial Code so that a consumer could sue a manufacturer for beach of warranty within four years after any personal injury is caused by the product. This proposed change is a significant departure from current Delaware public policy. I do not support this change and am therefore returning H.B. 464 to its house of origin without my signature.

Under current law, a consumer may ordinarily sue a manufacturer for breach of warranty within four years after the delivery of the product. 6 <u>Del. C</u>. § 2-725(1),(2). this rule provides a sound balance between the need for consumers to have an adequate time within which to file a branch of warranty claim and the need for manufacturers to have some certainty about when their legal exposure to warranty claims has ceased. Moreover, the Uniform Commercial Code provides for a longer period within which to sue for a consumer who buys a product where the "warranty explicitly extends to the [product's] future performance." In such cases, the consumer may sue for breach of warranty within four years from the time when the consumer should have discovered the product defect. 6 <u>Del. C</u>. § 2-725(2). These provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code are common among the states and reflect the uniformity of laws Delaware has sought to achieve by being among those states most supportive of the efforts of the nation's Uniform Law Commissioners.

Under House Bill 464, this balance would be upset and manufacturers could be exposed to breach of warranty claims arising a decade after they sold products to consumers, since the relevant date for filing purposes would be the date a personal injury occurred, not the date of sale or any date tied to the manufacturer's warranty.

Although I recognize that the proponents of H.B. 464 are motivated by a sincere concern for consumers and wish to ensure that injured consumers have a fair opportunity to receive compensation for injuries caused by defective products, I believe that the provisions of H.B. 464 are both unnecessary and counterproductive for Delaware.

In my view, House Bill 464 is unnecessary because Delaware law already allows a consumer injured by a product to sue a manufacturer within two years of the date of injury, regardless of when the product was sold. Such a suit can be brought under tort law, not for breach of warranty which is a contractual remedy. In such a tort suit, a consumer can recover if he or she can demonstrate that the manufacturer's negligence caused the consumer injury. Thus, if a child is injured six years after her parents purchased a negligently manufactured toy and the negligence proximately caused the injury to the child, the child may bring suit within two years after the injury --- or eight years after purchase. What the child cannot do is bring a breach of warranty claim, unless the warranty itself extended that far beyond the purchase date or the future performance provisions of 6 Del. C. § 2-725(2) were satisfied. The current distinctions rationally reflect the distinction between obligations owed by manufacturers arising from their contractual agreements with consumers and the independent duties manufacturers owe consumer under tort law.

The change H.B. 464 proposes is also counterproductive for Delaware because it creates a playing field unfairly tilted against manufacturers. The manufacturing industry employs Delawareans in well-paying jobs at wage and benefit levels which exceed those of most other industries. During the past six years, the State of Delaware enacted several tax law changes, created a strategic fund within the Delaware Economic Development Office, and launched a manufacturing alliance with the goal of retaining our existing manufacturing base and expanding that base. With state laws in place which already provide a fair opportunity for consumers of products to obtain redress for injuries caused by breaches of contract and tortious acts, I believe it is inappropriate to amend Delaware law to expose manufacturers to breach of warranty claims potentially over a decade after they sell products. Such an amendment would be contrary to our policy of fostering a climate favorable to the manufacturing industry. For these reasons, I am returning H.B. 464 to the House of Representatives without my signature.
