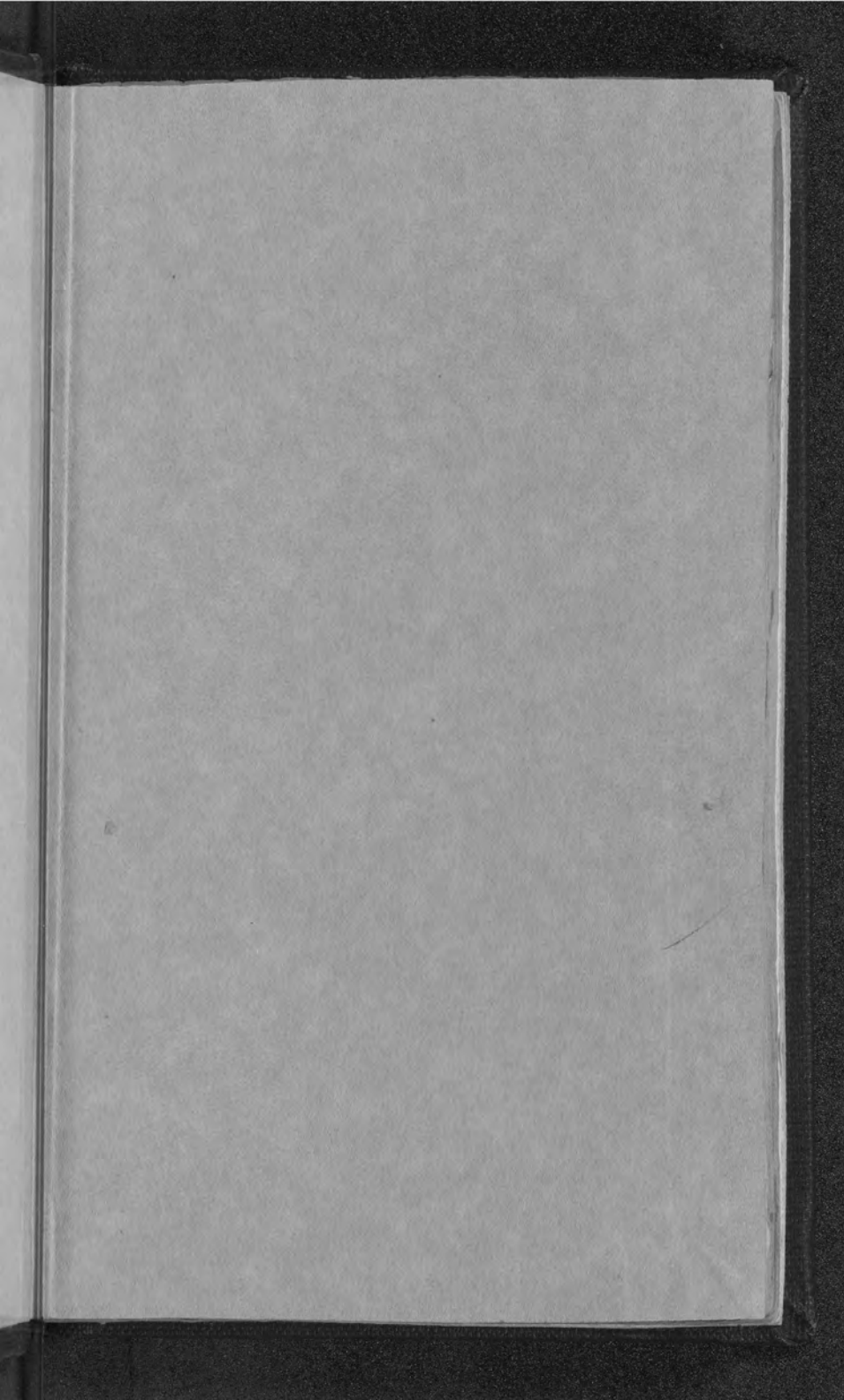

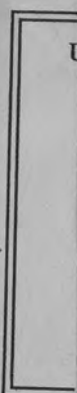


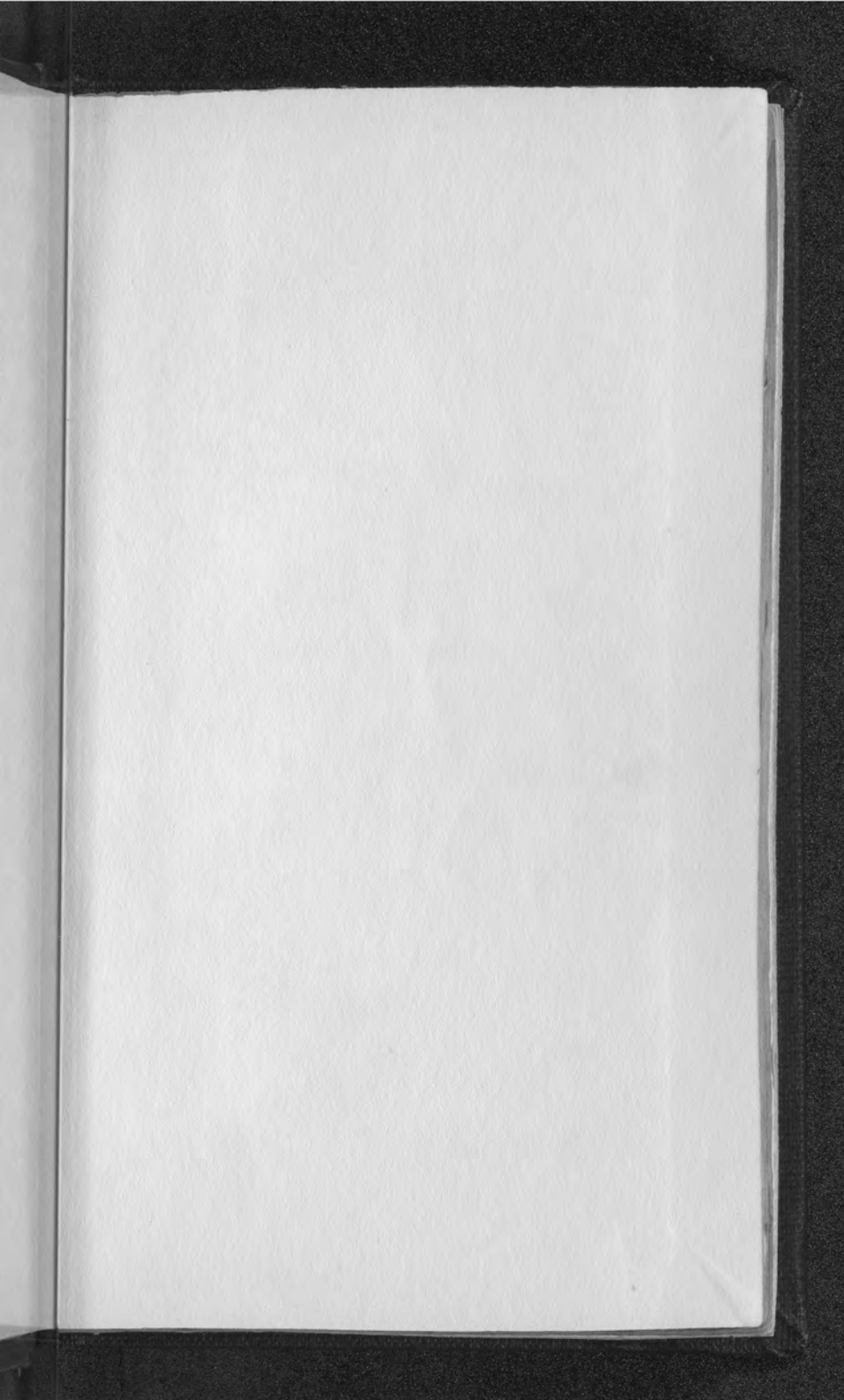

It has been thought that the following sketch of Wilmington, for which, the compiler is mainly indebted to “Davenport’s Gazetteer,” would be interesting to the patrons of this work.

The City of Wilmington is situated between the Brandywine and Christiana Creeks, one mile above their confluence, and two miles west from the Delaware river, 28 miles S. W. from Philadelphia, 72 miles N. E. from Baltimore, and 110 miles from Washington. Longitude 77° 34’ west; latitude 39° 43’ north.

The position of the town is high, airy and pleasant; it is regularly laid out, the streets crossing each other at right angles. It is abundantly supplied with good wholesome water from the Brandywine, by water-works, similar to those of Philadelphia. During the last few years Wilmington has increased very much in size and population, and it is estimated that within the last two years more than three hundred buildings will have been erected.

The Christiana admits vessels drawing 14 feet of water, to the town, and vessels drawing 8 feet can ascend 8 miles further. The Brandywine has 8 feet of water to the mills.

Wilmington owns more than 2500 tons of shipping.—The staple article of export is flour. The celebrated Brandywine flour mills are situated on both sides of the Brandywine creek, on the north side of the city. Within 10 miles of Wilmington there are at least 100 important manufactories, rendering it the largest manufacturing district in the Atlantic States, south of Philadelphia. The principal articles manufactured are flour, cotton, wool, paper, iron castings and powder.

There is a bridge over the Brandywine, and one over the Christiana, connecting Wilmington on each side with the beautiful country by which it is surrounded.

The Brandywine Chalybeate Springs are within five miles of Wilmington, in the midst of a highly romantic country. The public house at these Springs, for the accommodation of visitors will bear comparison with any similar establishment in the United States. It is a place of great resort during the warm season.

Wilmington has long been deservedly celebrated for the number and excellence of its schools. In addition to a large number of boarding and day schools, there are two District Schools containing three hundred and seventy-two scholars. There are four printing offices in the city from which are issued four periodical papers, three semi-weekly and one weekly. There is likewise a public library containing upwards of two thousand five hundred volumes.

The population in 1810 was 4,416; in 1820, 5,268; in 1830, 6,628; in 1840, 8,452; in 1845, 10,639.

Wilmington and its neighborhood is certainly one of the very best locations for the manufacturer in the United States. Communication with the largest markets is convenient and frequent both by rail road and steamboats. The country around is rich and abundantly productive, consequently the market is at all seasons filled with every variety of produce which is sold at a moderate price.

The advantages presented by the Brandywine creek, to

those who prefer water power, cannot be surpassed, if equalled—by any other situation.

There has recently been established on the eastern side of the town, a rolling mill—which is now in active operation. In the south-west section of the city, there is now in progress of erection, an extensive paper mill. The building of iron vessels—is a business which has been successfully prosecuted by one of our enterprising firms. The “old paper mills” on the Brandywine, which have been closed nearly nine years, are about to be revived as cotton mills and soon will again resound with the hum of industry.—For all these purposes, it is not too much to say, that the locality of Wilmington is unrivalled.

In conclusion, the compiler of the “Wilmington Directory” may be permitted to say, that every exertion has been used to render the work correct and satisfactory, and although some errors may have escaped detection, until too late to be corrected—he trusts that their trifling nature, with the recollection of the many difficulties to be met with in preparing such a work—will secure the indulgence of its patrons. It is contemplated, if the work is sufficiently patronized, to continue the Directory, from time to time, as the growth of our city may require.


