Abzug was elected as representative from New York in the 92nd and 93rd Congress. She is the author of Bella! Ms. Abzug Goes to Washington.




#### **BAYARD RUSTIN**


Bayard Rustin participated in the first Freedom Ride in 1947. The Journey of Reconciliation designed to test enforcement of the 1946 Iren Morgan Case outlawing discrimination in interstate travel.

From 1941-1953, Mr. Rustin served as Race Relations Secretary of the Fellowship of Reconciliation, during which he was the first field secretary to the Congress of Racial Equality, aided Japanese-Americans, Chairman of the Free India Committee. In 1953 he was executive secretary of War Resister's League. In 1955 assisted Dr. Martin Luther King in the boycott, and for seven years served as special assistant to Dr. King.

Mr. Rustin has been arrested 24 times in the struggle for civil rights. He is author of *Down The Line*, and *Stratigies For Freedom*: The Changing Patterns Of Black Protest. In 1975 he helped to organize Black Americans to support Isreal Committee. Mr. Bayard Rustin is Currently president of the A. Phillip Randolph Institute.

Sidney Hook

Professor Sidney Hook is currently a Senior Research Fellow at the Hoover Institution on War, Revolution and Peace, Stanford, California. He is also Emeritus Professor of Philosophy at New York University.

Hook received his doctorate in philosophy from Columbia University. He has received three Guggenheim Fellowships for research in German, Russian, and European philosophy. In addition to his extensive research, Professor Hook has produced numerous publications. His most recent books are Education and the Taming of Power, Pragmatism and the Tragic Sense of Life, and Revolutions, Reform and Social Justice.

#### Brian M. Jenkins

Brian Jenkins is currently involved in directing research on international terrorism and is also a consultant on nuclear terrorism to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

Jenkins earned a B.S. in fine arts and a master's degree in history from U.C.L.A. He also obtained a Fulbright Fellowship and studied history of Anti-government conspiracies at the University of San Carlos, Guatemala.


He served in the Armed Forces as a Green Beret in the Dominican Republic and as a Captain in the Fifth Special Forces Group in Vietnam. He left Vietnam to earn his Ph.D in history; he became a Rand consultant and returned to Vietnam as a civilian member of the Long Range Planning Task Group in Saigon.


Jenkins became an employee at Rand in 1972 and has published reports and articles in numerous publications. He is the author of International Terrorism: A New Mode of Conflict and Britain and the War for the Union.





Noam Chomsky Noam Chomsky attended the University of Pennsylvania where he studied linguistics, philosophy and mathematics. He received his Ph.D from the University of Pennsylvania in 1959 and has taught modern languages and linguistics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Chomsky has also lectured in various other universities in several countries. In addition to his extensive knowledge of linguistics, Chomsky is also known for his political views and his writings. His book American Power and the New Mandarins reflects his strong opposition to American involvement in Vietnam.







#### W.W. Rostow

W.W. Rostow received both his BA and Ph.D from Yale University. He also attended Balliol College in England as a Rhodes Scholar.

After serving in the Second World War, Rostow joined the State Department as Associate Chief of the German-Austrian Economic Division. He also taught Economic history at M.I.T.


During the years from 1961 to 1969, Rostow held various government appointed positions: Deputy Special Assistant to the President for National Affairs, Counselor of the Department of State and Chairman of the Policy Planning Council.

Among his recent publications are The United States in the World Arena, A design for Asian Development and The Diffusion of Power.

#### Rollo May

Dr. Rollo May received his doctorate from Columbia University in 1949. He has taught at several universities including Harvard, Yale, Princeton, and the New Social Research. He currently works as a psychoanalyst in New York.

Dr. May has written the following books: Power and Innocence, Love and Will, Psychology and the Human Dilemma, and Man's Search for Himself.




#### Carl Bernstein

Carl Bernstein began his career in journalism at age 16 as a copy boy for the Washington Star. He later became a full time reporter for the Star and worked there for several years until moving to the Daily Journal in New Jersey and then as a staff member of the Washington Post.

It was while working on the *Post* that Bernstein teamed with reporter Bob Woodward and wrote a series of investigating articles which exposed the White House involvement in the Watergate scandal. For these articles, both men won every major journalism award. Although no longer working for the *Post*, Bernstein continues to devote his time to writing. His current project being a book dealing with the McCarthy era.





Thomas S. Szasz

Dr. Thomas Szasz was born in Budapest, Hungary in 1920. The Szasz family moved to the United States prior to the invasion of Austria. He received his B.A. at the University of Cincinnati and his M.D. degree in medicine at the College of Medicine of the University of Cincinnati. Sasz was trained in psychiatry at the University of Chicago Clinics and in psychoanalysis at the Chicago Institute for Psychoanalysis.


In his book, The Myth of Mental Illness: Foundations of a Theory of Personal Conduct, Szasz challenges the use of the term "mental illness" Some of his other books include Law, Liberty, and Psychiatry, Psychiatric Justice, The Ethics of Psychoanalysis and The Theory and Method of Autonomous Psychotherapy.



Senator Howard Baker


After serving in the Navy during World War II, Howard Baker enrolled in the University of Tennessee and graduated from the college of law in 1949. He practiced law in Tennessee until being elected to the Senate in 1966.

In the Senate, Baker cosponsored voting rights and legislation and a constitutional amendment to lower the voting age to 18. He also participated in efforts to replace the draft with an all volunteer army. Senator Baker worked as Vice Chairman in the "Watergate Committee" and is currently a member of the Senate Select Committee investigating the activities of government intelligence and law enforcement agencies. <sup>29</sup>
