20 years for Women's Expo



Two decades ago, the New Castle County Chamber of Commerce and women business owners offered the very first Women's Business Expo in an effort to bring women business owners and professional women together for fellowship, education, networking and more.

The event has grown steadily each year and 2010 marks the 20th annual "WXPO."

The Women's Business Expo was held Tuesday, November 16 at the University of Delaware's Clayton Hall, marking the third year UD has hosted the event. This year's Business Women's Expo featured keynote speaker Jennifer Groover, inventor of the Butler Bag, described as the world's best selling compartmentalized hand bag. Local business owner Carla Vicario received the chamber's Entrepreneurial Woman of the Year award. Vicario has owned Ben-Dom Printing, near Newark, since 1995.

Holiday fund drive under way

Val's Needy Family Fund and other programs of the Newark Area Welfare Committee are launching their annual holiday fund drive.

Further information on the drive and ways you can help will be published by the Newark Post in coming weeks.

The Needy Family Fund, was started by Newark-area resident Val Nardo, 91, who ran the charity on his own for nearly 40 years. He is now affiliated with the Newark Area Welfare Committee to ensure that his work continues.

The fund, while best known for its holiday baskets for needy families, operates year-around and supplies a food cupboard for those in need.

The work of the Welfare Committee and the Needy Family Fund includes:

- Emergency Assistance fore more than 890 people (458 adults and 434 children) who otherwise would have been without shelter or would have been forced to live in were not unlit or unheated homes or denied other critical needs. Payments of over \$69,000 were made directly to the service provider.

- Food Cupboard - A week's supply of food was provided to 259 families in crisis (comprising 443 children and 372 adults).

- Shoe Program - We provided \$5,407 to purchase shoes for needy school children.

- Christmas Program - Boxes of food and turkeys were distributed to 430 families providing food for over 1449 adults and children during the holiday season.

Supporters of the Newark Area Welfare Committee include Newark area residents, businesses, churches, social and service clubs augmented by funding from the City of Newark, New Castle County, the State of Delaware, the Christmas Shop Foundation, The Newark Charitable and Social Club, and the Wilmington Flower Market.

The committee is comprised entirely of volunteers and all funds go to those in need.

2010 holiday ornament now available

The 2010 annual holiday ornament produced by the

Newark Historical Society is now on sale. This new ornament, the twenty-first in the series, features the Newark Trust Company at 87 East Main Street. Local businessman Samuel Wright founded the bank in 1905 as the Newark Trust and Safe Deposit Company. It was first located at the back of the Opera House facing Academy Street until it moved to the 87 East Main Street location.

The bank remained locally owned until it merged with the Farmers Bank of the State of Delaware. After that bank merged with Girard Trust the business moved to a new building at Center and Main Streets. 87 East Main Street then housed s series of businesses until it was purchased by the University

of Delaware. The building was razed this summer as part of the University's bookstore project.

The beige ornament with blue imprint is priced at \$6.50. It may be purchased at Minster's Jewelers in the Newark Shopping Center and at the Newark History Museum located in the historic 1877 train station on South College A venue beside the bridge on the town side of the tracks. The museum is open Sundays from 1 to 4 now through November 28 and by appointment made by calling 368-9845.

UD, St. Mark's football and a huge game with Villanova

St. Mark's completed its perfect regular season with a 28-14 win over Salesianum Friday night in the 41st game between the rival schools. With the win, the Spartans earned the top seed and a first-round bye in the DIAA Division I Football Tournament and will host the lowest remaining seed, Nov. 26 at 7:30 at Baynard Stadium.

"I'm really happy for our seniors," coach John Wilson said. "They've worked extreme-ly hard this year, and they've been terrific leaders on and off the field."

Now to UD

In a game that would prove to be the one that would catapult the Blue Hens to the top spot in the country in both polls, Delaware defeated the University of Massachusetts, 45-27, Saturday in Amherst.

Top-ranked Delaware (9-1, 6-1 CAA) hosts Villanova (6-4, 4-3) on Saturday at 12 p.m.

My Player of the Game: Senior quarterback Pat Devlin, who was named CAA Offensive Player of the Week for the second time, completed 16 of 22 passes for 240 yards and four touchdowns.

Injury updates: Coach K.C. Keeler said in his weekly press conference that Andrew Pierce (knee) and David Hayes (ankle) could have both gone back in the game and will play against Villanova.

Keeler's guips from his weekly presser:

On the UMass game: "Outstanding win on the road. ... Very gratifying."

On Pat Devlin's performance: "When Pat is playing like Pat can, and he has most of the season, we can score some points. ... I have the best quarterback in the country.'

On special teams: "Horrible kickoff coverage. ... We'll get some starters back in there on special teams."

On the multiple personal fouls: "I'll take the blame for one of them. But we're form tackling in the end zone and get a blow to the head call. We tackle a guy five yards in bounds and they call us for a late hit out of bounds. I was upset after the game with our players but then

I saw the films and was more upset with the officials, and it's something I plan to address with the supervisor of officials."

On how this team continues to move forward with no glaring roadblocks: "It's the great lead-ership. We've worked hard trying to keep the kids fresh. That's been my number one thing. ...

Vandals ransack Tobacco Zone

Newark Police officers responded to a criminal mischief call, last Tuesday, at Tobacco Zone, located at 1023 S. College Ave. Owners reported that two windows had been smashed with a piece of concrete and that an unknown suspect had entered through the window and removed the cash register from the store. Both the front and rear doors were intact and locked. A search of the premises showed that several items had also been removed from the front display area.

A trail of broken and removed items led to the southern part of the parking lot, possibly showing the avenue of escape. Officers lifted four fingerprints from a glass countertop. No video footage was able to be recovered from the scene.

The owners estimate that the suspect removed \$200 in cash, \$50 in change rolls, and \$300 in cigarette coupons. The register is estimated at \$2,500 and the window damage is approximately \$1,000.

It was the second incident in recent weeks at Tobacco. Earlier the store was robbed.

Beaver trap removed

Authorities from Newark Parks and Recreation Department reported that a large clamshell style beaver trap had been removed from a location behind the Christina Mill Apartments, along the Christina Valley Stream. The trap had been placed on Nov. 10 was found missing on Nov. 11. The trap was chained to a tree, which had been cut down. The aluminum trap is valued at \$300. A canvass of the area yielded negative results and no suspects have been named.

Wawa robbed

Delaware State Police detectives are investigating the robbery of the Wawa Store at Routes 4 and 72, south of Newark, early Sunday morning.

At approximately 2:15 a.m. a male suspect entered the Wawa and proceeded directly to the sales counter. The suspect displayed a knife and demanded cash from the register. The employee complied and the suspect removed an undisclosed amount of money. He fled in unknown direction.

The suspect is described as a white male, 30-40 years of age, 5'08"-5'10" tall, heavy set,

brown/grayish hair, and goatee. He was last seen wearing gray T-shirt with white long sleeve undershirt, dark colored sweat pants, black shoes, wearing a green baseball cap.




OUT OF THE ATTIC

This week's Out of the Attic item is a contemporary view of the Newark Trust Company building located at 87 East Main Street as it appears on the 2010 holiday ornament issued by the Newark Historical Society. The bank was founded in 1905 as the Newark Trust and Safe Deposit Company. It was first located at the back of the Opera House facing Academy Street until it moved to this Main Street location.

The bank remained locally owned until it merged with the Farmers Bank of the State of Delaware. After that bank merged with Girard Trust the business moved to a new building at Center and Main Streets. 87 East Main Street then housed a series of businesses until the University of Delaware purchased the property. The building was razed this summer as part of the University's bookstore project.

The bank is the 21st in the series of annual ornaments that began in 1990 with the Main Street


ornaments that began in 1990 with the Main Street Clock. "Iwant something striking" was the message that Alexa wanted to be heard when she discussed her master bathroom renovation in the DreamMaker design center for the first time. Cougar sightings nothing new in the Newark area

The sighting of a cougar early Wednesday morning was only the latest chapter of the story of the elusive cat in Delaware that dates back to

Sightings of the cats, also known as mountain lions or pumas, were reported in the 1990s and continued into 2002.

One story in the New York Times claimed the cat had escaped from an owner in Pennsylvania and had fled into Delaware.

The Delaware Division of Fish & Wildlife declared that two or perhaps more cougars were roaming New Castle and perhaps Kent County, according to the website, cougar. net. They were believed to be feeding on deer and Canada geese. Sightings were also reported by State Park rang-ers at White Clay Creek and Lums Pond state parks in New Castle County. Sightings were also reported in the city of



Evidence included video, footprint and droppings. There have been no reports of attacks on pets or livestock.

Sightings have also been reported throughout the Delmarva Peninsula all the way to the Eastern Shore of Virginia.

The reports became so numerous that New Castle County Police assigned an officer in the mid 1990s to track the cat and capture it with a tranquilizer gun. The effort, which included bringing cougar hounds from Colorado,

State wildlife officials have not ruled out the possibility

that all animals that have been sighted either were freed or escaped from private owners.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service reports cougars need a lot of room, while noting that no evidence of a breeding population on the East Coast has been found. Males may occupy a range of more than 25 square miles and females between 5 and 20 square miles.

In the latest report, County Police said a 45 year-old man told them he was out walking his dog when it began acting "strange" and pulled toward a nearby wooded area, where he spied a cougar sitting underneath some trees

The man said he called 911 and watched the cat for about eight minutes. The cougar, which he described as twice the size of his Boxer, then made a high-pitched growl and walked off into the woods, the man said.

Police searched the area. but found no signs of the ani-
