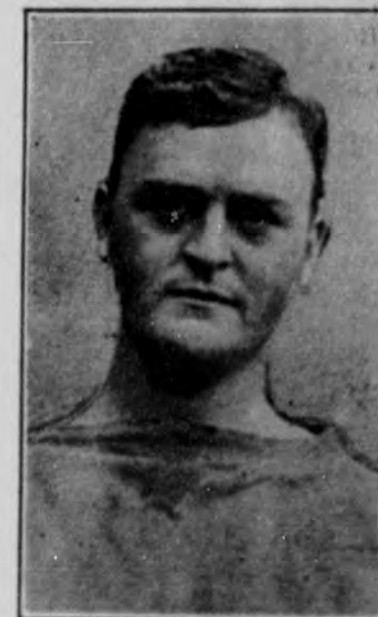
Blue and Gold Win First Home Meet

Delaware Speedsters Prove Better Mudsters and Outclass Stevens

Delaware opened her home track season Saturday, April 23, with an overwhelming victory over Stevens, thus partly avenging that football defeat. With a track of mud and water "Jimmie's" cinderpath warriors romped home with an easy victory. Due to weather conditions only two places counted.

One of the features of the meet was the return to form of "Snapper" Tebo, who defeated the field in the 220-yard dash. Evidently toddling is an excellent training medium. Betzmer was the star of the meet, again breaking the javelin record, this time hurling the spear 170 ft. 9 in. Arrangements have already been made to lengthen the field for him. Besides this, "Tarzan" won the shot and placed second in the broadjump and discus throw. Good times were impossible and rather than risk any accidents Coach Lecato only allowed his stars to run one race.

Dick McMullen won the high hurdles; Harmer the low hurdles. Some of the form displayed by the new men was exceeded

Back on Frazer Field for the first time in two weeks, Delaware easily defeated Rutgers Friday by the score of 5-1. It was the first time since the Dartmouth game, two weeks ago, that the blue and gold team has showed its real ability. All of the men played a clever article of ball and came across with the willow when the hits counted for runs.

"Dorey" Collins twirled the team to a well-earned victory. This is the second time "Dorey" has done this feat this year, for he was the moundsman who made the Big Green team from Dartmouth eat the Frazer Field dust. Whenever he got into a slightest hole, about twice during the two hours of play, he fanned the enemy batters with a nobby twister, that sailed across the home corner, with a curve that made the batters turn inside out.

McDonald, Underwood and Marvel added several points to their batting average. McDonald added two, underwood three, out of four trips to the plate, and "Phil" Marvel drove a pretty three timer to the right field wall. Dantz added two hits to the column. "Skeeter" Wilson had a big time in the field. He played shortstop, because of Underwood's sore arm, and Mike took his place. "Skeeter" handled five chances without a fault. All of the fielders played stellar games. Dantz, Murray and Captain Donoho each pulled off a big-time catch, when men were on the bases, any of which would have counted for at least one run.

Luxuries Compared**With Education**

Under this caption is found the following statement in the March 31 issue of the Market Review, published by Hughes & Dier, New York.

"Another fact which should take a firm hold in the minds of our people, because of its significance in the upbuilding of a strong and loyal citizenry, is that our educational facilities and opportunities not only have been, but are at the present time, greatly neglected.

"It will quite likely be news of a rather shocking character to the average mind to be told that more money was spent in the United States for luxuries during the year 1920 than had been spent for learning during a period of three hundred years. It may also be rather startling to the average person to learn that during the year 1920 about \$50,000,000 was spent in this country for chewing gum, two and one-half times the total expenditures for normal schools and almost exactly the same as all state and city appropriations for higher education. If one is shocked at the comparative amount of money spent for chewing gum as related to educational purposes, it will be a still greater jar to one's sensibilities to read that during the year 1920 around \$800,000,000 was spent for cigarettes, while for face powders, cosmetics, perfume, etc., largely used for the beautifying of the female portion of the population, something like \$750,000,000 was added to the grand total of luxury expenditures. At the same time when the country is laboring under the load of heavy taxation to meet Government expenditures in the way of maintenance and payment of interest on the public debt, it is horrifying to be told that for luxurious service, joy rides, pleasure resorts and races the colossal sum of \$6,000,000,000 was expended during the one year which preceded the current one.

"It is only by proper education of our own children and the enlightenment along such ideas of Americanization as will tend to make good citizens of the foreign element coming to make their home in this country, that we can expect to upbuild a substantial, loyal and progressive people calculated to perpetuate sound principles of democratic Government."

"University Shop"**Now a Reality**

The old knocks of "When is the book store open?" is a thing of the past because Lilly and Harmer are endeavoring to make "The University Shop" a place where the student can get satisfaction and good prices for his money. In less than five months this student co-operative store has branched out so that it is no longer a book store but "an emporium of college men's needs." Although starting with a capital of ten dollars, Treasurer Lilly informs the correspondent of the Review that to date there has been such a growth in the business that there is a possibility of running a full-fledged co-operative store, and the promoters may sell shares of stock in the company beginning next year.
