Train, tractor-trailor collide on Main Street

A freight train hit a UPS Freight delivery truck on the CSX tracks that cut across West Main Street Nov. 9, shutting down one of the city's busiest intersections for about two and a half hours.

The UPS tractor-trailer's driver, Joseph C. Mounts, 42, of Felton, was taken to Christiana Hospital with serious injuries. As of press time, Mounts was stable and his condition had been

upgraded to good, said Newark Police spokesman Lt. Mark Farrall.

Witnesses on the scene said Mounts had just made a delivery at the Deer Park Tavern, situated next to the railroad tracks, when the crash occurred.

A preliminary investigation into the crash revealed that Mounts had parked his truck near the Deer Park on the sidewalk just east of the railroad crossing, and had begun to move it for-

UD student shot to death

A 20-year-old University of Delaware student was shot in his Newark apartment complex Monday night, and as of press time, police were still looking for the two suspects involved in the killing, police said.

Peter DiSabatino, 20, was fatally shot Monday in Studio Green West Apartments complex on Thorn Lane off Elkton Road, said New Castle County Police Cpl. John Weglarz.

DiSabatino was a student in the University of Delaware's Associate in Arts Program in Wilmington, according to information on the University of Delaware website.

County police, paramedics and ambulance personnel from the Aetna Fire Company responded to the 200 block of Thorn Lane around 9:30 p.m. Monday for a subject who had reportedly been shot, Weglarz said.

When emergency personnel arrived, they found DiSabatino outside with a gunshot wound to his upper body. Paramedics tended to his injuries and then transported him by ambulance

to the Christiana Hospital, where he later died.

Multiple police officers, including a canine team, also responded to the scene, set up a perimeter and began canvassing the area in an attempt to gather information and locate the possible suspects, but were unsuccessful in finding the suspects, Weglarz said.

The suspects are described as two black males, one of which was wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt and the other a black hooded sweatshirt.

Weglarz said he could not comment on what part of

Missing Newark woman possibly found in Toronto

Police believe Linda Hegg, the local woman Newark Police reported as missing Nov. 5, could be the same Linda who showed up at a shelter in Toronto, Canada two months ago, providing no information about herself except her first name.

Det. Chris Burke of the Toronto Police Department said Nov. 9 that his department is working with Newark Police to determine through physical evidence whether the "mystery woman Linda" in Toronto is in fact Linda Hegg of Newark.

Hegg, who lived alone in an apartment on Country Club Drive in Newark, suffers from an undisclosed medical condition.

Newark Police first released information about her disappearance Nov. 6 after a case worker from a local mental-health organization who routinely checks on Hegg at her apartment reported to police that she had not seen or heard from Hegg in more than a month.

"They've made frequent checks at her home over the last month and have not been able to make contact with her," Lt. Mark Farrall, a spokesman for the Newark Police Department, said Nov. 6.

At that point, investigators from the department's

Criminal Division were heading up the search for Hegg, who has no known family in the area, Farrall said.

Then, in an interesting turn of events, the Toronto Star newspaper in Canada ran an article on its website Nov. 7 asking for the public's help in identifying a "mystery woman Linda" who had shown up at a Toronto homeless shelter Sept. 5, "claiming to know nothing except her first name."

The article begins:

"It's been two months since Linda appeared in a Toronto shelter with no idea who she is or where she came from.

Toronto police are again asking people throughout the country to look at Linda's picture to see if they recognize her and can fill in the blanks.

The woman, who police have estimated is between the ages of 55 and 60, walked into a downtown Toronto shelter on Sept. 5, claiming to know nothing other than her first name.

Since then, the only major piece of information Linda has told investigators has to do with Barrington St. and Spring Garden Rd., a busy intersection in Halifax."

Burke said Toronto Police have been trying to find anyone with information about the woman since she showed up at the homeless shelter with nothing but the clothes on her back.

"She ... had been getting around by public transit," Burke said. "She had no belongings on her. Nothing at all."

He said that, since the woman seemed to know so little about herself, a social worker had gotten involved. He said he could not com-

ment on where the woman is currently staying due to the ongoing investigation.

Toronto Police first learned Nov. 8 about the possible connection between the "mystery woman Linda" in Toronto and the missing Linda Hegg from Newark after a caller from Utah who follows missing-persons reports provided Linda Hegg's name to an officer, Burke said.

The officer then commenced his own search and found the Newark Post's

article about Hegg's disappearance, and noticed the physical similarities between the women in the photos, Burke said.

Farrall said a Canadian woman was the first to report a possible link between the two Lindas to Newark Police on Nov. 7, after she read in a Canadian newspaper about the "mystery woman" and then found an article about Hegg's disappearance on the University of Delaware's website, and made a connection.

Investigators from both departments are now working together to confirm through a DNA connection that the Lindas are the same. The process could take as long as 60 days, Burke said.

"In the meantime we obviously will be exploring other avenues," he said.

The headshot of Hegg that Newark Police released to the public Nov. 6 came from the Department of Motor Vehicle, from an old driver's license of Hegg's, Farrall said. He did not know exactly what year the photo was taken, but he said it was not recent.

That could explain why the woman in the photo on the left looks younger, and has shorter hair than the photo of "Linda" Toronto Police released to the public. That photo was taken after Hegg showed up at the shelter in September.

Burke said Friday that indeed, the resemblance between the photos of the two Lindas is promising.

"It's an absolute likeness," he said. "... The two certainly appear to be one in the same; however, as you are aware, due to mental-health issues, we are going to rely on physical evidence to confirm identification."

ward when an approaching freight train activated the train-crossing signals, and the signal arms lowered onto the trailer, Farrall said.

Mounts tried to drive the truck out of the path of the oncoming train, but was unable to do so before the front of the train struck the passenger side of his cab, Farrall said.

It took firefighters about

eight minutes from the time of the crash to cut the doors off the cab and remove Mounts, said Aetna Hose, Hook and Ladder fire company spokesman John H. Farrell IV.

"Fifteen firefighters and two rescue pumpers used hydraulic tools to extricate him," Farrell said.

Joe Dewson, 27, a first lieutenant in the U.S. Marines who lives in Newark, said he and his friend Mike Davis, 30, a

U.S. Army staff sergeant, were at the bar at Deer Park Tavern when they saw the accident happen and ran outside to the scene.

"Me, him and another lady from the bar responded," Dewson said. "(Davis) and I tried to get the door open to help (the driver), but it was stuck."

Dewson said they noticed fuel leaking from the truck onto the tracks, and started

diverting traffic and pedestrians away from the scene. Fire-company responders got to the scene shortly after that, he said.

Farrell confirmed that the crash slit open one of the tractor-trailer's side-mounted fuel tanks, causing fuel to leak out onto the road.

The fire department called the state's Department of Natural Resources and

Environmental Control, which handled the fuel cleanup, Farrell said.

Both vehicle and pedestrian traffic were banned from the area around the intersection of Elkton Road and West Main Street, causing bumper-to-bumper traffic around the city throughout the day and into rush hour. The crash was cleared around 5:30 p.m.

UPS Freight spokes-

woman Sandy Adkins said this week that Mounts has worked as a driver for the company since 2005.

Do the Turkey Trot this weekend

Locals looking to burn some calories so they can get their gobble on guilt-free this Thanksgiving should head over to Handloff Park Saturday morning.

The park, on Barksdale Road in Newark, will be host to the city's 38th annual Turkey Trot, a 5K and 10K run and walk that usually attracts about 700 participants.

Barksdale Road will be closed briefly while each race gets underway Saturday, and traffic along the road will be stopped intermittently as runners pass, said Joe Spadafino, the city's recreation superintendent.

The race route will head from Barksdale Road to Valley Road, down Church Road to Casho Mill Road and back again.

The city will give trophies to the fastest male and female runners in 10 different age categories, and to the fastest runners overall,

Spadafino said.

The Turkey Trot races will go on no matter what the weather is like, organizers said.

Many of the local businesses that donated prizes for last month's Halloween Parade – which the city canceled due to the impending Hurricane Sandy – allowed the city to roll over those items and give them out as door prizes for the Turkey Trot instead, said Sharon Bruen, the city's recreation supervisor.

Each person who registers for the race will get 10 tickets to enter into drawings for several prizes, including an ice-skating package from the Fred Rust Arena, a night's stay at the Sleep Inn, gift certificates to local restaurants and more, Bruen said.

The first 400 people who register for the race will also receive a long-sleeved t-shirt.

A portion of the proceeds from the race will benefit James F. Hall Scholarship Fund.

Check-in and race-day registration will begin at 8 a.m. for the 10K run, which will start at 9 a.m. Registration for the 5K run and walk will start at 8:45 a.m., and the event will start at 10:15 a.m. Race-day registration is \$25 per person.







Man arrested for peeping, stealing lingerie


Newark Police arrested a 39-year-old Wilmington man Nov. 6 after he entered a home on Choate Street and stole lingerie from a female University of Delaware student's bedroom, police said.

Police used a Taser to apprehend Sean Maas after he allegedly entered a first-floor window of the home and removed women's clothing and lingerie from the 21-year-old student's bedroom, said Newark Police spokesman Lt. Mark Farrall.

Farrall confirmed Nov. 7 that Dr. Sean Maas works as a chiropractor based on Foulk Road in Wilmington.

Farrall said police do not believe Maas knew the victim. The victim was home at the time of the incident, but was not in the bedroom when Maas allegedly removed the lingerie and other items from the room, Farrall said.

Around 1:30 a.m. Nov. 6, a citizen called police to report a man crouching near a first-floor window of a home on the unit block of

Choate Street, Farrall said.

Several officers converged on the area and found a man that matched the description the caller had given walking in the City of Newark Parking Lot 4 near Choate Street, he said.

As the officers approached the man, later identified as Maas, they noticed women's lingerie hanging from his waistband, Farrall said. When an officer tried to take Maas into custody for ques-

tioning, Maas ran.

The officer ran after him and deployed his Taser device after Maas refused to stop. The Taser prongs struck Maas in the back, causing him to fall onto the asphalt. Police then took Maas into custody without further incident. He sustained abrasions to his face and a broken tooth as a result of the fall. Emergency personnel transported him to Christiana Hospital, where he was treated and then released back into police custody.

An investigation determined that Maas had entered the Choate Street home where he was first observed through an unsecured first-floor window and, once inside, had removed women's clothing and lingerie from the female victim's unoccupied bedroom.

Maas was charged with one count each of second-degree burglary, theft under \$1,500, trespassing with the intent to peep or peer, and resisting arrest. He was released on \$8,000 unsecured bail.

Motorcycle gang busted in major cocaine raid

Eight people were arrested last week during raids that yielded about 4 1/2 pounds of cocaine with a street value of \$100,000, according to Delaware State Police.

More than 100 law enforcement officers from various police agencies in Delaware and Maryland searched 10 homes late last Monday and early Tuesday — the latest development in a three-month-long investigation into a cocaine distribution ring by the Thunderguards Motorcycle Club, reported Sgt. Paul Shavack, a DSP spokesman.

In addition to the homes in Bear, Middletown, Newark, New Castle and Elkton, they also raided the Thunderguards Motorcycle Club Clubhouse in the 2800 block of Northeast Blvd. in Wilmington, he reported.


Investigators confiscated a total of 2,378 grams of cocaine, an amount that exceeds two kilos, and is valued at about \$100,000 on the street, accord-

"I can tell you that, based on the preliminary investigation, we don't believe this was a random act," Weglarz said.

19-year-old charged in fatal Pencader hit-and-run

Delaware State Police arrested a 19-year-old Bear woman Nov. 6 in connection with the Sept. 25 hit-and-run crash that killed a 52-year-old woman in Pencader Corporate Commons.

Police charged Brenda M. Nazario of Bear Tuesday after completing their investigation into the crash, which left Maria Eldreth, 52, of Wilmington dead and injured her friend, Judith Johnson, 67, of Newark, police said.


Eldreth and Johnson, both employees at the nearby UPS warehouse, were walking eastbound on Corporate Boulevard when Nazario, driving a 2002 Honda CRV traveling eastbound, struck them from behind, police said.

Eldreth and Johnson were transported to the Christiana Hospital Trauma Center where Johnson was treated and released with non-life-threatening injuries. Eldreth was admitted and subsequently died as a result of her injuries on Sept. 28.

After the collision, Nazario drove off in the Honda and failed to stop to render aid for either victim, police. At approximately 3 p.m. the same day, Nazario

responded to Delaware State Police Troop 2 and reported that she had struck an unknown object on I-95. After further interview and investigation, CRU detectives were able to connect Nazario and the Honda CRV to the hit-and-run crash that occurred earlier the same day.

After a thorough investigation by the State Police and the Delaware Attorney General's Office, detectives obtained warrants charging Nazario with the above crimes. She was arraigned and released on \$10,000 unsecured bond.





Police took Harrington into custody without incident. During a pat-down search, police found a switchblade in his pants pocket.

Police transported Harrington to Troop 2 and charged him with the above crimes. He was arraigned at JP2 and committed to HRYCI on \$135,000 secured bond.

The victim was slightly injured in the altercation, but refused treatment. Her vehicle was returned to her.



Military Exhibit at the Newark History Museum

This week's Out of the Attic item is a photograph of the military exhibit on display now at the Newark History Museum.

This week, we observed Veterans Day, and this exhibit honors Newark residents who have responded to the call to arms and served in wars throughout our nation's history.

The uniform pictured here is from the Korean War era. The personal equipment in this and the adjacent case is from the Vietnam Conflict.

The large frame on the wall to the left of the uniformed figure shows pictures of the

29 Newark-area men who lost their lives while serving in World War II.

The featured soldier on the board above the case is Gen. John Wilson O'Daniel, who was born, raised, and educated in Newark. He first saw action on the Mexican border, and rose in rank and responsibility as his career took him to numerous assignments.

By World War II, he was a ranking officer in campaigns in North Africa, Sicily, France and Germany. And as Commanding General of the Third Infantry Division, he led his men through enemy defens-

es and pushed deep into the heart of Germany, thus hastening the German surrender.

He arrived back in Newark to a hero's welcome. His military career continued even further, with assignments related to the Korean and Vietnam conflicts and diplomatic service.

At the 11th hour on the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918, the armistice was signed ending the "war to end all wars." Little did the world suspect that in less than a quarter-century, a far greater war would engulf much of the world.

In the photo to the right end of the display case is a 1/5

scale model of the Liberty Bell commissioned by a Newark resident for the Bicentennial and cast at the same English foundry as the original Liberty Bell. Beside it is a card that reads, "Why We Fight."





THE YANKEE CHEF

Let's talk turkey

Legend has it, the phrase "Let's talk turkey" was coined in New Hampshire long ago when a Native American and a white man that had been hunting together came to divide the spoils, which consisted of only a crow and a

turkey. The white man, wanting the turkey but hoping to appear to make a fair division, said, "You take the crow and I'll take the turkey, or I'll take the turkey and you take the crow." His hunting partner grunted and replied, "Why you no talk turkey to me?" Many of these stories, and the recipes that go with them, have fallen by the wayside over the past generation or two.


It was a custom many generations ago that large community bonfires be lit in observance of Thanksgiving.

I still remember the age-old custom of all the children being seated at their own table while the adults were carrying on a few feet away, with one of the aunts coming over at infrequent interludes to make sure we weren't flinging food at one another. It is with a warm remembrance that I give you one of my favorite dishes from "back in the day" for all of us to enjoy now.

SHORE CORN
PUDDING

The combination of lobster and corn pairs two naturally sweet items so well together, I think you will find yourself making this again within a week of Thanksgiving. Just remember, serve this as a side dish along with soup, bread or the main course.

4 cup cooked lobster meat, chopped
4 ears of corn*, silk and husk removed.
2 c. half-and-half
4 strips bacon, chopped
1/2 red bell pepper, minced
4 scallions or green onions, sliced thinly
6 eggs
1/4 c. flour
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. sugar
1 cup shredded Monterey jack cheese
Preheat oven to 350-degrees.
Coat eight 8-oz. ramekins



or one shallow 2-quart casserole dish with nonstick cooking spray. Remove corn kernels from each ear using a sharp knife. Holding ear of corn with the stem up (it is easier if you cut off the tip of the ear so that it stands up more securely), run the knife from top to bottom over a plate. In the bowl of a food processor or blender, puree half the corn with 1/2 cup of the half-and-half.

In a large skillet, cook

bacon over medium-high heat until almost crisp; drain fat. Add remaining corn kernels, sweet pepper and scallion; sauté for five minutes. In bowl, whisk remaining half-and-half, eggs, flour, salt and sugar. Stir in lobster, pureed corn, sautéed vegetables and 1/2 cup cheese. Divide among ramekins or pour into large casserole. Top with remaining cheese.

Set individual casseroles or large casserole in baking

pan and place in oven; pour hot water into baking pan to 1 inch. Bake for 35-40 minutes, or five to 10 minutes longer for large casserole dish, or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Let stand for 15 minutes before serving.

**Take the easy route if you wish. Use one (15 oz.) can of whole kernel corn-drained or the equivalent in frozen corn.*

XC record-breakers

Newark boys team scores best finish in 22 years

Heading into Saturday's Division I cross-country boys state championship, Newark High School had already completed one of the best seasons in the school's recent history by sweeping all of its dual- and tri-meets and snapping Charter of Wilmington's 10-year reign as Blue Hen Flight A champions.

Newark also won the overall Blue Hen Conference championship and competed successfully at four invitational meets in Delaware and one each in New York and Virginia.

Things only got better on Saturday. By the end of the day, the Yellowjackets had secured the school's best season in 22 years with a second-place finish at Brandywine Creek State

Park. The Yellowjackets' 51 points were second-best to Salesianum, which captured its fifth-consecutive Division I title with 26 points.

"The team had a number of tests this season: winning all of our dual meets; traveling to out-of-state competitions; a very tough win at the conference championship," said coach Michael Mooney. "Through all of that, the guys on the team became a band of brothers. They did it for each other. Running as well as we did at the state meet and being runner-up in Division I, it was sweet icing on the cake."

Running in the front of the pack for the Yellowjackets Saturday, as he has all season, was senior Ken Fontal, who raced to a fourth-place finish in a time of 17:15.86 despite not feel-

ing 100 percent.

"I had to run with a pretty bad cold," said Fontal, an all-state selection last year. "But almost everyone was feeling some type of soreness or pain going into the race. Despite that, we believed in each other and held onto the bond we built this season as we took on our last challenge."

Junior Andrew Milham, who placed 13th with a time of 17:43.83, was quick to praise his teammates.

"This team's success was based around a group of guys who each wanted to win as much as the next, all striving for success," Milham said. "Having a returning all-state runner like Ken and then adding Kyle (senior Kyle Gerhart, a varsity soccer player running cross-country for the first time) was just the tip

of the iceberg as you could see from the power of our pack."

The power of the pack Milham referred to was the fact that three of Newark's seven runners finished in the Top 10, five in the Top 16, and all seven crossed the finish line in the Top 25. Junior Chris Kitson (17:38.87) and Gerhart (17:40.97) finished eighth and 10th, respectively.

"I planned to conserve energy for the second half of the race because it was going to be a battle for whoever wanted it the most," Gerhart explained. "I'm happy with my performance and it was a great way to end my senior season. It

was a very successful season going undefeated and winning the conference championship."

Sophomore Jarod Wilson (17:59.65) finished 16th, while freshman Daniel Mwaniki (18:04.05) placed 21st and sophomore Brandon Holveck (18:17.70) crossed the finish line in 25th place to secure the Yellowjackets' second-place finish, capping a remarkable season.

"The state meet was the realization of something that had been building all season," said Mooney, who has been at the helm of the Newark program since 1997.

Of the seven harriers, five

return next season, meaning the future is bright for Newark.

"We should be just as competitive as this year," Milham said confidently about next season.

There will be no next season for Fontal and Gerhart. Instead, they will take solace in knowing they were part of one of the most successful cross-country seasons in school history.

"I'll always remember this team," Fontal said. "It felt amazing to end as well as we did."

City adds 5 new parking spaces to Main Street



Could add up to 25 more spaces if the pilot program goes well

The City of Newark recently added five new metered-parking spaces in front of the Galleria, at 45 East Main St., as part of a new pilot program.

The program will allow drivers to park within a designated loading zone outside of normal delivery hours of 1 a.m. to 4 p.m. Delivery trucks will still need to use the spaces between 1 a.m. and 4 p.m. daily.

Parking meters in the loading zone are painted green to easily differentiate them from the rest

of the parking meters on Main Street, said Dana Johnston, community affairs officer for the city.

The meter "sleeps" between 1 a.m. and 4 p.m., so if someone parks in the spot before 4 p.m. the meter will not register their payment, she said.

Signs are posted on either side of the loading zone, on the meter, and inside the meter.

The pilot program is in effect from now until the end of the year, when city officials will evaluate it and decide if other

loading zones could be used as parking spaces outside of normal delivery hours.

The project could potentially add 22 to 25 parking spaces to Main Street, Johnston said.

More than 100 local law-enforcement officers participated

ing to Shavack. A kilo translates to 2.2 pounds.

Officers also seized a total of 167 grams of marijuana, about a third of a pound, and nearly \$42,000 in cash, police reported.

In addition, the raids

yielded a cocaine press, digital scales and "paraphernalia related to the packaging and distribution of illegal drugs," Shavack listed.

Officers also confiscated five handguns and 11 long guns, including an assault-style rifle and shotguns, and nine vehicles, accord-

ing to police.

The seizure list includes "Thunderguards Motorcycle Club insignia type clothing," Shavack noted.

"(We) have completed a successful unrelenting fight against drug-related activities conducted by members and associates of the Thunderguards Motorcycle Club in Delaware," Shavack reported.


More than 100 law enforcement officers from various agencies assisted DSP during the investiga-

tion and raids, according to Shavack.

"Operation Thunder Clap consisted of a three-month-long investigation which targeted a cocaine distribution network in New Castle County by the Thunderguards Motorcycle Club. The Delaware State Police were able to identify and arrest key figures who distributed illegal drugs throughout New Castle County and Delaware," Shavack explained.






