## The BUS stops here

### Megabus to run \$1 trips from UD campus to D.C., N.Y.C.

Newark residents will soon have a new, nearby, inexpensive option for getting to New York City and Washington, D.C.

Megabus, a curbside bus company that has gained popularity with its \$1 promotional fares, announced last week it is adding a stop in Newark.

Service to the new stop, located

on the University of Delaware's Laird Campus, will begin Sept. 19. Currently, the company's closest stops are in Philadelphia and Baltimore.

Richard Rind, director of parking and transportation services at UD, said Megabus officials approached him earlier this year with the idea of adding a stop on campus.

"The thought process is that UD is halfway between New York and Washington, D.C.," Rind said. "I

see them all the time (on Interstate 95), so they might as well stop and pick up a few more passengers."

The university agreed to allow the buses to stop at an existing bus shelter near Clayton Hall and the Christiana Towers, off of New London Road. Rind said the school sees Megabus as a boon for stu-

dents, many of whom do not have cars with them on campus.

"It's just great to have another option to get home or to a city they might want to visit," he said. "It gives them very inexpensive way to get there."

However, the bus is also open to the general public. Parking is avail-

able at a nearby university lot for \$3 per day, Rind said.

Once the Newark stop is operational, buses will run daily to Union Station in Washington, D.C., the corner of 7th Avenue and 28th Street in New York and the White

## Baird drops out of city-manager race

One of three finalists in the pool to become Newark's next city manager withdrew from the race Tuesday in an e-mail addressed to the city's mayor and council members,

city officials said.

City secretary Patricia Fogg said she and Robert Slavin, president of Slavin Management Consultants, both received the e-mail from candidate David Baird Tuesday announcing that he no longer wanted to be con-

sidered for the local city-manager position.

Baird, the former city manager of Milford, Del., could not immediately be reached for comment.

The City of Newark hired Slavin's Georgia-based consulting firm in February to organize the national search for a new city manager when Kyle Sonnenberg retired after serving three years in the role.

The remaining two finalists for the position are: Carol Houck, Newark's assistant city manager for 14 years and interim city manager since Sonnenberg retired; and Dr. Tarron Richardson, a Wilmington native currently serving as city manager of

DeSoto, Texas.

Baird's e-mail said he "sincerely appreciated" that the mayor and council members had considered him, but that he had decided to accept

another position, Fogg said. He did not provide any details about that position, she said.

A public forum already set for 7 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 19, will go on as planned. Each

candidate will be asked to speak for 10 minutes about his or her background, and then audience members will be invited to ask the candidates questions.

At 8:30 p.m., the candidates will leave the council chamber and the council members will ask audience members for their feedback regarding the candidates.

The next day, council members will reconvene in executive session at 5 p.m. to discuss the candidates and then conduct another interview with each candidate before voting on the candidate during an upcoming public meeting.

Funk III told the Post earlier Tuesday – before Baird announced that he would be dropping out of the race – that some key qualities he is looking for in a new city manager are the ability to

manage the city's employees during tough economic times, and experience with managing electric utilities.

"We recently signed a contract with the state to reduce our rates on electricity," Funk said, "so we're going to have to merge

departments and make some adjustments, or raise taxes an awful lot – which according to most city council members is not an option."

He said he would also like someone "who really cares about the community and is willing to be active in the community."

Funk noted during that conversation that there already seemed to be a divide between the council members in regards to their favorite candidate.

"It's going to be an interesting session; it could very well be that each candidate gets three votes. And I hate breaking ties," he said.

After hearing that Baird had dropped out as a candidate, Funk said, "I don't think anybody wanted to end up with just two candidates, but it's going to be interesting."

## Bus service will be open to the public

Marsh Mall near Baltimore. From there, passengers can transfer to dozens of other cities, including Pittsburgh, Boston, Buffalo, Toronto, Memphis and Richmond.

The buses, some of which are double-decker, all have restrooms and free Wi-Fi service.

Founded in Europe and brought to the United States in 2006, Megabus is one of several inexpensive, curbside bus lines that have risen in prominence in recent years. Unlike traditional transportation companies that operate out of a permanent station, curbside companies typically pick up and drop off passengers on a street corner.

The companies lure in customers by offering a limited amount of \$1 fares, while charging higher fees for most other tickets. Customers who book a trip well in advance during off-peak hours have the best chance of getting a

cheap fare.

A search of the Megabus website shows that most one-way trips from Newark to Washington, D.C. and New York are approximately \$8, though they range from \$1 up to \$19.

However, even at \$19, Megabus is cheaper than or at least on par with most other modes of public transportation.

MARC trains run from Perryville, Md. to Washington, D.C. for \$11, but no regional rail service is available to New York.

Greyhound bus service from Wilmington is available on for \$20 to Washington, D.C., or \$21 to New York.

Amtrak trains are available from Newark to Washington, D.C. and New York for \$29 and \$44, respectively.

## Man arrested for string of burglaries in Suburban Plaza Shopping Center

Police have arrested a man in connection with the string of burglaries in Suburban Shopping Center in Newark that happened last week.

Following a joint investigation that involved multiple police agencies, police arrested Norman E. Barnes of Elkton early last Thursday at a motel in Elkton.

Upon his release from Cecil County, Newark Police Department planned to charge Barnes with 28 criminal charges involving the burglaries of eight commercial businesses in the shopping center, according to Newark Police. Those businesses include Joy Garden, Bagelmania, Curves, Fulton Paper, Spa-Lon and Post Net. Barnes will also be charged in the Saturday attempted burglaries of Wireless Zone, the Blue Crab Grill and EZ Loan.

Newark Police started investigating the string of burglaries on Aug. 23 after six businesses in Suburban Plaza Shopping Center businesses were broken into overnight.

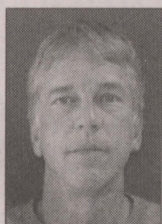
Two nights later, the department investigated the overnight burglary of Gallagher Jewelers, also in Suburban Plaza. Newark Police spokesman Lt. Mark Farrall said the front lock was pried off and \$1,500 in jewelry was taken from the store.

Through video from the Aug. 23 burglaries, detectives determined the suspect was same man involved in a May 20 burglary of the Applebee's in Suburban Plaza. In that case, the suspect in the surveillance video is shown removing a safe from the store.

Assuming that the individual was probably responsible for burglaries in other jurisdictions, Newark police released still images and video of the suspect to surrounding

police agencies.

Multiple agencies then contacted Newark Police to say the suspect may also be responsible for burglaries in their jurisdictions. A detective from Elkton Police Department then identified Norman E. Barnes as a possible suspect, based on his physical description.

Detectives positively identified Barnes as the suspect captured in surveillance video and obtained warrants for his arrest. They learned that Barnes was homeless but probably still in the area.

Officers from the Newark Police Street Crimes Unit began checking area motels for Barnes, and found his vehicle shortly after midnight last Thursday in the parking lot of a motel on Elkton Road in Maryland.

Newark Police contacted Elkton Police for assistance, and together they took Barnes into custody without incident. Barnes was found in possession of items linking him to the burglaries, including burglary tools, police said.

## Newark man gets 12 years for bar stabbing

A Newark man who stabbed three men outside an Elkton bar in May 2011 – disemboweling one of his victims – received a 12-year prison term on Friday.

Matthew Thomas Slavish, 24, stabbed the men outside the now-closed Drunk Monkey at 989 E. Pulaski Highway about 2:30 a.m. on May 21, 2011 during a heated dispute, which had spilled out from the establishment, prosecutors reported.

Slavish acted as the aggressor inside the bar, threatening a woman, and moments later in the parking lot outside bar when he pulled a knife, prosecutors said.

What caused Slavish to attack remains a mystery, prosecutors added.

"Inside the bar, threatening language is used by the defendant ... Outside the bar, there is absolute mayhem and then the next thing you know, (one victim's) intestines are sticking out of his abdomen and two other victims are bleeding pretty badly," Assistant State's Attorney Steven L. Trostle told the judge.

About 20 people witnessed Slavish stab the man in the abdomen, including an off-duty bail bondsman who had been patronizing the bar, according to prosecutors.

Prosecutors credited that "private citizen" for jumping on Slavish and then, with the help of others in the crowd, for disarming him.

The bail bondsmen then used his own handcuffs to restrain Slavish until police arrived.

Trostle applauded the bail bondsmen and the others for "acting as law enforcement" to forcibly and courageously take Slavish's knife – even after seeing him "disembowel a man over nothing."

The other two victims, identified only as Elkton residents, suffered their relatively less serious stab wounds – one to the thigh, the other to the arm – during the group effort to subdue and disarm Slavish.

The man who suffered the stab wound to the abdomen wound up in a trauma unit at Christiana Hospital, where he required surgery.

None of the victims appeared in court to give victim-impact statements last Friday.

The man who suffered the stab wound to the abdomen – he also was identified only as an Elkton resident – is still dealing with the lingering psychological and physical effects of the incident and his injury, according to Trostle.

"He has been in counseling ever since he got out of the hospital. He's a big man, a guy's guy, someone who is not easily intimidated. He still can't believe he got stabbed," Trostle said.

The victim had told Trostle he doubted he would appear in court to detail the impact that the incident had on his life, fearing he would experience a "cathartic moment" in public.

"He said, 'Steve, I don't know if I can do this,'" Trostle said, adding, "This was not a small cut from a small knife; this was life changing."

Addressing the judge before sentencing, Slavish expressed disappointment that the man who suffered the most severe stab wound of the three victims wasn't present.

"I wish the victim had shown up, so I could apologize to his face. Anything that he would have said to me, I deserve," said Slavish, who took full responsibility for his crimes.

"My actions that night were uncalled for, unforgivable," he said before stressing, "The man you saw that night is not the man I am."

At the time of his arrest, police confiscated marijuana from Slavish and two pre-

scription medications – one to relieve pain, the other to battle depression, prosecutors said. He also had been drinking, they added.

Cecil County Circuit Court Judge Keith A. Baynes imposed a 12-year sentence for one of Slavish's first-degree assault convictions, which relates to stabbing the man in the abdomen.

The judge imposed a consecutive 10-year sentence, which he suspended, on the second assault conviction, and a concurrent 10-year sentence on the third assault conviction.

The 12-year sentence fell short of a recommendation made by Trostle, who had sought 15 years of incarceration for Slavish.

Baynes ordered Slavish to serve five years of supervised probation after his prison release, listing counseling for alcohol, drugs and anger management as conditions.

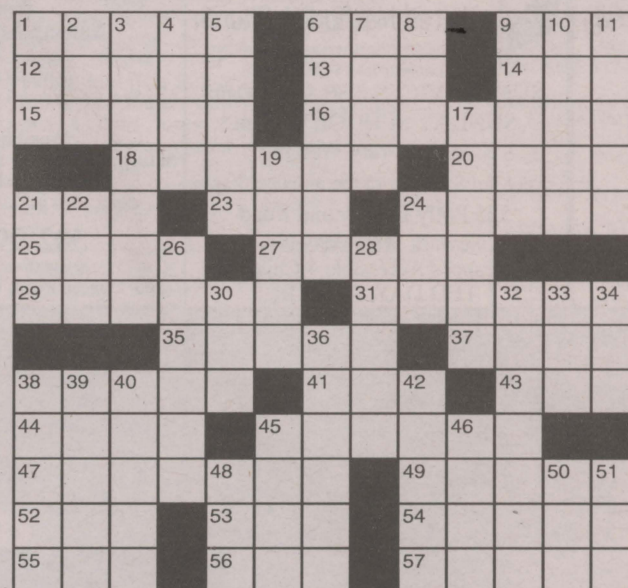

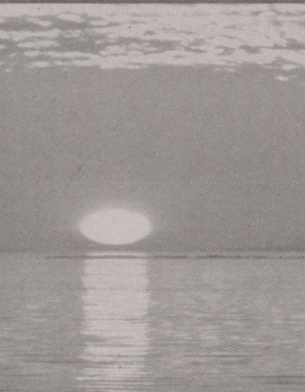

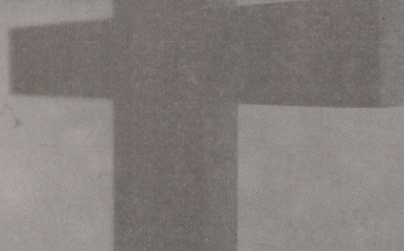

## Out of the Attic

## Welsh Tract Church

This week's Out of the Attic item is a May 2007 W. T. McLain photograph of the Welsh Tract Primitive Baptist Church beside the Christina River on the northeast side of Iron Hill.

A small log church was erected on this site in 1706 as the first house of worship built by European settlers in the greater Newark area. It was the third of its denomination built in the New World.

The congregation was formed in Wales in 1701 and moved to Pennsylvania that same year. In 1703, they bought a 30,000-acre land grant near Iron Hill from William Penn, the Proprietor of Pennsylvania and the Three Lower Counties. About 20 families formed the "Welsh Tract Meeting."

The present brick building was erected on the site in 1746. All of the early Baptist churches in Delaware developed out of this church. They belonged to the "Primitive" group, and opposed any formal administrative organization beyond its pastors and deacons.

Today most of the Baptist churches have split off to join other associations. Welsh Tract is one of the few "Primitive" churches left.

In the Wilmington Journal Every Evening of Jan. 23, 1954, Betty Harrington McDonald writes of Welsh Tract church:

"It is of brick laid in Flemish bond — these bricks are also said to have come from England, and to have been brought



from New Castle on mule-back. Above the doors is a stone bearing the date (1746). The inside is very simple. The pews are not original. There is a pewter communion service of two cups and saucers, which was in use about 1830. A mellow whitewashed stone wall encloses the yard. The tops of the irregular old grave-stones show above it. Some are rough hewn from brown stone with marks of chipping tools, and have crudely lettered Celtic words on them."

A Memorial service was held Tuesday at R.T. Foard and Jones, Inc., 122 West Main St., Newark, where friends may call one hour prior.

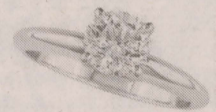

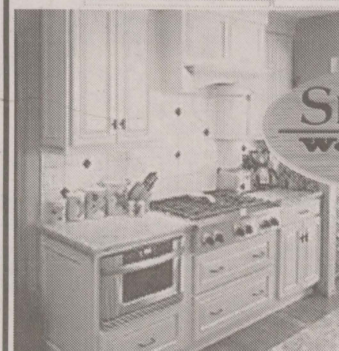

## REBUILDING THE HIVE

On the first day of pre-season football practice, Newark High coach Butch Simpson stepped out of the locker room, better known as the "Hive," and walked onto the field knowing the new season was going to be full of changes.

Gone are three division-one players (Taylor Reynolds, Xavier Griffin and David Grinnage), one of the best kickers in school history (Mike Powers) and a running back (Jordan Imeokparia) who would have been the star had he played for most other Delaware high schools. Fifteen other starters who helped lead the Yellowjackets to an 11-1 season and the state championship game are also gone.

Simpson admitted at the end of last season, "Next year's roster won't be full of household names."

And he wasn't kidding. The only two returning starters are center Corey Donovan and two-way tackle Dutch VanDerhout.

The rebuilding situation at Newark is one that might coax any other 36-year veteran into retirement. But the winningest coach in Delaware high-school football history never once gave it a thought.

"That was never an intention and still isn't," said Simpson, who has 269 career wins. "When I retired from baseball, I knew at the beginning of the season that it was my last year. I had come to peace with that. In my mind, I'm not going through my normal pre-season routine thinking, 'Well this is the last time I have to do all these things.'"

He added, "I'm retired, and so I can devote full attention to coaching and enjoy it for

what it is. I'm still surrounded by guys I enjoy working with. I'm fortunate enough today to be healthy enough to say, 'Why not do it again?'"

Simpson knew at the beginning of last season that it wouldn't be his final one, so he started preparing for this season by installing a brand new offense during junior varsity games.

"It's the first time I've ever done anything like that, and it took me 35 years to figure that strategy out," Simpson said with a laugh.

The new "pistol" offense – the University of Nevada is best known for using it, Simpson said – places the quarterback closer to the line of scrimmage than the traditional shotgun, but not directly under center. The offense is centered on a running game, which Simpson felt was necessary for this group of varsity players.

"Everything I've always done is based on personnel and the utilization of their skill sets," Simpson explained. "The coaches just felt at that point of time [last year] we didn't have a group of people returning who could run the offense we did for the past two years. We just felt we couldn't keep the same system."

"My first introduction to the pistol was watching A.I. du Pont and I found it interesting and intriguing. I've been talking to coach Kempfski (former long-time UD offensive coordinator Ted Kempfski) and he's intrigued by the pis-

tol and has given me a lot of information."

Junior quarterback Keith Stubbs hopes to put that information to good use when he makes his first varsity start Friday night in the Yellowjackets' opener against Caesar Rodney.

"He's our guy," Simpson shared. "He's a nice-size guy at 6-foot, 197 lbs., and is physically tough running the football. He has a strong arm and he always threw the ball deep well. And he's actually come [into preseason] really advancing his passing game. He's a big plus. We feel we can do even more than we thought we could."

Running back Austin Lockett will most likely get

the majority of the carries.

"He's going to be our main guy," Simpson said of the 5-foot-9, 180-pound junior. "He's worked extremely hard in the weight room."

Also sharing time in the backfield will be Terry Brown, Eric Wright and Ronnie Boskett. They'll rely on Donovan to create holes to run through.

"Corey understands the game like most centers in most programs," Simpson said of the 6-foot-3, 297-pounder. "He gets us into the right blocking schemes. His experience level has really solidified that. He's bigger and stronger than last year."

VanDerhout, a junior who will play both ways, has the potential to be one of the state's top linemen, according to Simpson.

"The football gods have blessed both him ... and me," Simpson said of the two-year starter. "He's com-

peted at the highest level for us. He's one of our more passionate players. He has a great motor and I love when linemen have motors."

Newark touts 10 football state championships, with nine of them coming during Simpson's tenure as head coach (he was an assistant coach when Newark won its first state title). And while the coach isn't ruling out an appearance in another state title game, he's been around long enough to know there are other goals to be obtained.

"Realistically, my feeling is [potential] is based on a team's record last year and what players they have back," he reasoned. "We had the record but don't have the experienced players. So automatically you have to think you slip back to the middle of the pack."

"We're just hoping to compete. Hoping we don't get

slapped around. We want to be in the games and if the breaks go our way and we can find a way to make some plays, hopefully we win some."

Friday night Simpson will step out of the "Hive" and walk onto the field to commence his 37th consecutive season as a head coach.

"I still get a thrill going out there," he reflected with emotion in his voice. "I tell people, 'When I walk out here on a beautiful Friday night and the lights are on and the bands are playing ... you just feel that. And when you feel that, you're just happy to be in a position to do what you do.'"

"It makes me realize I like doing it."
