

The buses, some of which are double-decker, all have restrooms and free Wi-Fi ser-

Founded in Europe and brought to the United States in 2006, Megabus is one of prominence in recent years. Unlike traditional transportation companies that operate out of a permanent station, curbside companies typically pick up and drop off passengers on a street corner.

The companies lure in cuscharging higher fees for most other tickets. Customers who book a trip well in advance from Newark to Washington, during off-peak hours have D.C. and New York for \$29 the best chance of getting a and \$44, respectively.

A search of the Megabus website shows that most oneway trips from Newark to Washington, D.C. and New York are approximately \$8, Boston, Buffalo, Toronto, though they range from \$1 up to \$19.





Man arrested for string of burglaries in Suburban **Plaza Shopping Center**

Police have arrested a man in connection with the string of burglaries in Suburban Shopping Center in Newark that happened last week.

Following a joint investigation that involved multiple police agencies, police arrested Norman E. Barnes of Elkton early last Thursday at a motel in Elkton.

Upon his release from Cecil County, Newark Police

Department planned to charge Barnes with 28 criminal charges involving the burglaries of eight commercial businesses in the shopping center, according to Newark Police. Those businesses include Joy Garden, Bagelmania, Curves, Fulton Paper, Spa-Lon and Post Net. Barnes will also be charged in the Saturday attempted burglaries of Wireless Zone, the Blue Crab Grill and EZ Loan.

Newark Police started investigating the string of burglaries on Aug. 23 after six businesses in Suburban Plaza Shopping Center businesses were broken into overnight.

Two nights later, the department investigated the overnight burglary of Gallagher Jewelers, also in Suburban Plaza. Newark Police spokesman Lt. Mark Farrall said the front lock was pried off and \$1,500 in jewelry was taken from the store.

Through video from the Aug. 23 burglaries, detectives determined the suspect was same man involved in a May 20 burglary of the Applebee's in Suburban Plaza. In that case, the suspect in the surveillance video is shown removing a safe from the

Assuming that the individual was probably responsible for burglaries in other jurisdictions, Newark police released still images and video of the suspect to surrounding police agencies.

Multiple agencies then contacted Newark Police to say the suspect may also be responsible for burglaries in their jurisdictions. A detective from Elkton Police Department then identified Norman E. Barnes as a pos-

> sible suspect, based on his physical description.

Detectives positively identified Barnes as the suspect captured in surveillance video and obtained warrants for his arrest. They learned that Barnes was home-

less but probably still in the

Officers from the Newark Police Street Crimes Unit began checking area motels for Barnes, and found his vehicle shortly after midnight last Thursday in the parking lot of a motel on Elkton Road in Maryland.

Newark Police contacted Elkton Police for assistance, and together they took Barnes into custody without incident. Barnes was found in possession of items linking him to the burglaries, including burglary tools, police said.

Newark man gets 12 years for bar stabbing

A Newark man who stabbed three men outside an Elkton bar in May 2011 disemboweling one of his victims - received a 12-year prison term on Friday.

Matthew Thomas Slavish, 24, stabbed the men outside the now-closed Drunk Monkey at 989 E. Pulaski Highway about 2:30 a.m. on May 21, 2011 during a heated dispute, which had spilled out from the establishment, prosecutors reported.

Slavish acted as the aggressor inside the bar, threatening a woman, and moments later in the parking lot outside bar when he pull a knife, prosecutors said.

What caused Slavish to attack remains a mystery, prosecutors added.

"Inside the bar, threatening language is used by the defendant ... Outside the bar, there is absolute mayhem and then the next thing you know, (one victim's) intestines are sticking out of his abdomen and two other victims are bleeding pretty badly," Assistant State's Attorney Steven L. Trostle told the judge.

About 20 people witoff-duty bail bondsman who had been patronizing the bar, according to prosecutors.

Addressing the ous stab wounds - one to the judge before sentencing, Slavish expressed disappointment that the man who suffered the most severe stab wound of the three victims wasn't present.

> "I wish the victim had shown up, so I could apologize to his face. Anything that he would have said to me, I deserve," said Slavish, who took full responsibility for his crimes.

"My actions that night stab wound to the abdomen were uncalled for, unforgivable," he said before stressing, "The man you saw that night is not the man I am."

Cecil County Circuit Court Judge Keith A. Baynes imposed a 12-year sentence for one of Slavish's first-degree assault convictions, which relates to stabbing the man in the in the abdomen

The judge imposed a consecutive 10-year sentence, which he suspended, on the second assault conviction, and a concurrent 10-year sentence on the third assault

The 12-year sentence fell short of a recommendation made by Trostle, who had sought 15 years of incarceration for Slavish.

Baynes ordered Slavish to serve five years of supervised probation after his prison release, listing counseling for alcohol, drugs and anger management as conditions.



Welsh Tract Church

May 2007 W. T. McLain photograph of the Welsh Tract Primitive Baptist Church beside the Christina River on the northeast side of

A small log church was erected on this site in 1706 as the first house of worship built by European settlers in the greater Newark area. It was the third of its denomination built in the New World.

The congregation was formed in Wales in 1701 and moved to Pennsylvania that same year. In 1703, they bought a 30,000-acre land grant near Iron Hill from William Penn, from New Castle on mule-back. Above Lower Counties. About 20 families formed the "Welsh Tract Meeting."

The present brick building was erected on the site in 1746. All of the early Baptist churches in Delaware developed out of this church. They belonged to the "Primitive" group, and opposed any formal administrative organization beyond its pastors and

Today most of the Baptist churches have split off to join other associations. Welsh Tract is one of the few "Primitive" churches

"It is of brick laid in Flemish bond from England, and to have been brought Newark, DE 19715-0711.



n the first day of pre-season football practice. Newark High coach Butch Simpson stepped out of the locker room, better known as the "Hive," and walked onto the field knowing the new season was going to be full of changes.

Gone are three division-one players (Taylor Reynolds, Xavier Griffin and David Grinnage), one of the best kickers in school history (Mike Powers) and a running back (Jordan Imeokparia) who would have been the star had he played for most other Delaware high schools. Fifteen other starters who helped lead the Yellowjackets to an 11-1 season and the state championship game are also gone.

Simpson admitted at the end of last season, "Next year's roster won't be full of household names.'

And he wasn't kidding. The only two returning starters are center Corey Donovan and two-way tackle Dutch VanDerhout.

The rebuilding situation at Newark is one that might coax any other 36-year veteran into retirement. But the winningest coach in Delaware high-school football history never once gave it a thought.

"That was never an intention and still isn't," said Simpson, who has 269 career wins. "When I retired from baseball, I knew at the beginning of the season that it was my last year. I had come to peace with that. In my mind, I'm not going through my normal pre-season routine thinking, 'Well this is the last time I have to do all these things.

He added, "I'm retired, and so I can devote full attention to coaching and enjoy it for

what it is. I'm still surrounded by guys I enjoy working with. I'm fortunate enough today to be healthy enough to say, 'Why not do it again?"


Simpson knew at the beginning of last season that it wouldn't be his final one, so he started preparing for this season by installing a brand new offense during junior varsity games.

"It's the first time I've ever done anything like that, and it took me 35 years to figure that strategy out," Simpson said with a laugh.

The new "pistol" offense the University of Nevada is best known for using it, Simpson said - places the quarterback closer to the line of scrimmage than the traditional shotgun, but not directly under center. The offense is centered on a running game, which Simpson felt was necessary for this group of varsity players.

"Everything I've always done is based on personnel and the utilization of their skill sets," Simpson explained. "The coaches just felt at that point of time [last year] we didn't have a group of people returning who could run the offense we did for the past two years. We just felt we couldn't keep the same system.

"My first introduction to the pistol was watching A.I. du Pont and I found it interesting and intriguing. I've been talking to coach Kempski (former long-time UD offensive coordinator Ted Kempski) and he's intrigued by the pis-

tol and has given me a lot of the majority of the carries. information.

Stubbs hopes to put that information to good use when he makes his first varsity start Friday night in the Yellowjackets' opener against Caesar Rodney.

"He's our guy," Simpson shared. "He's a nice-size guy at 6-foot, 197 lbs., and is physically tough running the football. He has a strong arm and he always threw the ball deep well. And he's actually come [into preseason] really advancing his passing game. He's a big plus. We feel we can do even more than we thought we could."

Austin Running back Lockett will most likely get

"He's going to be our main Junior quarterback Keith guy," Simpson said of the 5-foot-9, 180-pound junior. "He's worked extremely hard in the weight room."

Also sharing time in the backfield will be Terry Brown, Eric Wright and Ronnie Boskett. They'll rely on Donovan to create holes to run through.

"Corey understands the game like most centers in most programs," Simpson said of the 6-foot-3, 297-pounder. "He gets us into the right blocking schemes. His experience level has really solidified that. He's bigger and stronger than last year.'

VanDerhout, a junior who will play both ways, has the potential to be one of the state's top linemen, according to Simpson.

"The football gods have blessed both him ... and me," Simpson said of the two-year starter. "He's com-

Newark touts 10 football state championships, with nine of them coming during Simpson's tenure as head coach (he was an assistant coach when Newark won its first state title). And while the coach isn't ruling out an appearance in another state title game, he's been around long enough to know there are other goals to be obtained.

"Realistically, my feeling is [potential] is based on a team's record last year and what players they have back," he reasoned. "We had the record but don't have the experienced players. So automatically you have to think you slip back to the middle of the pack.

"We're just hoping to compete. Hoping we don't get

> Friday night Simpson will step out of the "Hive" and walk onto the field to commence his 37th consecutive season as a head coach.

> "I still get a thrill going out there," he reflected with emotion in his voice. "I tell people, 'When I walk out here on a beautiful Friday night and the lights are on and the bands are playing ... you just feel that. And when you feel that, you're just happy to be in a position to do what you do.

"It makes me realize I like doing it."
