RULES OF THE SENATE

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the 143rd General Assembly that the following Rules of the Senate be and they hereby are adopted as Rules for the governing of the present session, until further action of the Senate:

RULE 1. ORDER OF BUSINESS

- 1. Calling of the Senate to Order.
- 2. Prayer.
- 3. Salute to Flag.
- 4. Roll Call.
- 5. Reading of Journal.
- 6. Presentation of petitions, memorials or communications.
- 7. Reports from Standing and Special Committees.
- Reporting by the Secretary of prior filed bills, resolutions and citations.
- 9. Introductions of all other bills and resolutions by members.
- 10. Agenda for the day.

11. Miscellaneous business.

RULE 2. CONVENING OF SENATE

Unless otherwise ordered by a majority of its members, the Senate will convene Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday at 2:00 p.m. All proceedings of the Senate shall be public.

RULE 3. ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS

(a) Every member shall be in their place at the time to which the Senate stands recessed.

(b) No Senator shall absent themselves from the service of the Senate without notifying the President Pro Tem.

RULE 4. ROLL CALL; READING OF JOURNAL

Each legislative day and before the Senate proceeds to the consideration of any business, the Secretary shall call the names of the members in alphabetical order, and shall then read the Journal of the preceding legislative day, which shall be approved or corrected by order of the Senate.

RULE 5. CONTENTS OF JOURNAL

The proceedings of the Senate shall be briefly and accurately stated on the Journal; messages to the Governor in full; the titles of all bills and resolutions; every motion with the name of the member making the same, except motions for adjournment; the names of the members voting on all roll calls.

RULE 6. <u>PRESENTATION OF PETITIONS, MEMORIAL OR</u> COMMUNICATIONS TO THE SENATE

(a) After the Journal is read, the Presiding Officer shall lay before the Senate communications or messages from the Governor, reports and communications from Departments or State Boards, and other communications addressed to the Senate, and such bills, joint resolutions and other messages from the House of Representatives as may be upon the presiding officer's table, undisposed of.

(b) When petitions, memorials and other papers addressed to the Senate are presented by the President, or a member, the contents thereof shall be briefly stated.

(c) Messages from the Governor or from the House of Representatives may be received at any stage of proceedings with the concurrence of the Presiding Officer, except while the Journal is being read, while a question of order or a motion to adjourn is pending, or while a bill is on the floor.

(d) When a message is brought to the Senate by the Governor or the Governor's messenger, or by a member of the House of Representatives, or any officer thereof, the members of the Senate shall rise upon their feet, if so directed by the Presiding Officer.

RULE 7. <u>DELIVERY OF MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE</u>; <u>DUTIES OF</u> SECRETARY

Messages shall be delivered to the House of Representatives by the Secretary, or by a Senator or other officer of the Senate directed by the Presiding Officer. The Secretary shall certify previous to delivery the determination of the Senate upon all bills, joint resolutions, and other resolutions which may be communicated to the House, or in which its concurrence may be requested; and the Secretary shall also certify and deliver to the Governor all resolutions and other communications which may be directed to the Secretary by the Senate.

RULE 8. PREPARATION OF BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS

(a) No bill or resolution shall be received by the Senate unless it be prefaced by a brief statement of the purpose of the bill or resolution, which shall be known as the title, and shall also contain the text of the bill or resolution in full. The original of all bills and resolutions shall be printed or stenciled on permanent rag content bond paper, be properly backed, contain no erasures or interlineations and shall be produced in such a manner as shall be approved by the State Archivist and Director of Legislative Council. At the end of each bill, Joint Resolution or amendments there shall be placed the name of the author and/or Department who was responsible for writing same and a brief synopsis of the intent of the bill. In the lower left hand corner of page one there shall be the initials of the unit preparing the bill or resolution, the initials of the author and the typist, and, if prepared by automatic equipment, the identification number. Each bill or resolution shall have an appropriate enacting or resolving clause. The first name listed after the word "sponsor" on the first page of a bill or resolution shall be the "prime" sponsor. Once a bill or resolution has been pre-filed or introduced, the addition or deletion of a sponsor shall not cause the bill to be reprinted. The change in sponsorship shall be noted in the calendar, on the jacket of the original bill and on the first page of the original bill.

(b) Every bill or resolution introduced in the Senate which establishes and/or creates a committee, commission, task force or similar body, either for a specified period of time or on a permanent statutory basis shall require that the following functional details be incorporated in the bill and/or resolution, if necessary; provided, however, the requirements of subparagraph (4) in drafting legislation affecting the Delaware Code need not be made a part of the Code.

- (1) The date on which the report is due;
- (2) to whom the report is to be presented;
- (3) the appointing authority or authorities;
- (4) the designation of a temporary chairperson to enable the
- committee to commence its duties.

(c) Every bill and resolution to which the concurrence of both Houses of the General Assembly may be necessary, shall be introduced with one original and one backed copy. The original shall at all times remain in the custody of the Chairman of the Committee to which it was referred, or of the Secretary of the Senate; and one backed copy shall be delivered to the Legislative Council. In addition, every Senator shall be provided with an unbacked copy of the text of the bill or resolution.

(d) The master used to produce the bill or resolution together with a minimum 160 true copies of the bill or resolution, shall be made available to the Legislative Council immediately after the introduction of a bill.

(e) All bills for the amendment of any statutes contained in the Delaware Code of 1974 shall be made with reference to the statutes or parts of statutes contained in said Code, and shall conform to the arrangement of said Code.

RULE 9. <u>PROCEDURE APPLICABLE TO BILLS AND JOINT</u> <u>RESOLUTIONS</u>

(a) Unless the bill or joint resolution has been placed upon a President Pro Tem's pre-filed list, every bill and joint resolution when introduced shall be read one time by title only, after which it shall be assigned to the proper committee.

(b) No bill or joint resolution shall be considered on the same day it is reported out of committee, or in the absence of the prime sponsor who introduced it, unless by his or her written consent. After any bill has reached its order of preference on the agenda, it may be deferred twice to the end of the agenda. After it has been deferred twice it must be considered when its order of preference is next reached or removed to the ready list by the Secretary of the Senate. In the event of such removal, no bill shall again be placed on the agenda for the same or the next legislative day.

(c) When considered, each bill or resolution shall be given its final reading by title only unless any member requests a reading in full.

(d) An agenda of bills to be considered on the succeeding legislative day shall be kept by the Secretary of the Senate; and announced at the end of each calendar day; and published each day and a copy thereof distributed to each member, and any bill placed upon the agenda by any member of the Senate, without otherwise limiting the right of any member to put a bill upon its passage, stand in the same order of preference for consideration by the Senate unless otherwise ordered by it.

(e) Every bill or resolution shall be introduced by a member or group of members or by order of the Senate or by report of a committee. Introduction may be by either of two methods:

A. Filing of Bills and Resolutions with the Secretary of the Senate.

(1) A bill or resolution may be introduced by being filed with the Secretary of the Senate at any time while the General Assembly is meeting.

(2) A bill or resolution that is presented to the Secretary of the Senate while the Senate stands in recess, in adjournment, or is not otherwise meeting, may be given a number, entered upon a docket kept for that purpose.

(3) As soon as may be practicable following the filing of a bill or resolution with the Secretary, unless the bill or resolution was placed upon a President Pro Tem's pre-filed list, the Reading Clerk shall read the bill or resolution number and title of all bills filed with the Secretary and entered upon the docket prior to the convening of the Senate which have not been previously read.

(4) Such reading of the bill or resolution by the Reading Clerk shall constitute the first reading of such bill or resolution.

(5) Upon such first reading, or upon placement upon the President Pro Tem's pre-filed list, copies of the bill, amendments or resolutions shall be distributed as provided in Rule 8.

B. Other Methods of Introduction.

(1) A bill or resolution may also be introduced from the floor while the Senate is in session.

C. President Pro Tem's pre-filed list.

(1) A bill or resolution filed with the Secretary may, in the discretion of the President Pro Tem, be placed upon the "President Pro Tem's pre-filed list" and the bill or resolution shall at such time be assigned to a Committee by the President Pro Tem. Copies of the President Pro Tem's pre-filed list shall be distributed to members prior to its reading by the Reading Clerk. The President Pro Tem's pre-filed list shall be read as soon as practicable by the Reading Clerk.

(f) No bill that has been tabled, shall be lifted from the table for further consideration until such bill is first placed upon the agenda, unless such bill is lifted for further consideration on the same legislative day the bill was tabled.

(g) No Senate Bill returning from the House shall be acted on by the Senate unless the bill is first placed on the agenda.

RULE 10. MOTIONS

(a) All motions shall be reduced to writing, if desired by the Presiding Officer or by any Senator, and shall be read before the same shall be debated.

(b) Any motion or resolution may be withdrawn or modified by the mover at any time before a decision, amendment or ordering of the yeas and nays.

(c) A motion shall be in order at any time to amend or substitute a title to any bill or resolution only in order to correct typographical errors.

(d) When a question is pending, no motions shall be received but:

To adjourn;

To adjourn to a certain day.

To take a recess;

To proceed to the consideration of executive business;

To lay on the table;

To postpone indefinitely;

To postpone to a certain day;

To commit;

To amend.

Which several motions shall have precedence as they stand arranged; and the motion to adjourn, to take recess, to proceed to the consideration of executive business, to lay on the table, shall be decided without debate.

RULE 11. VOTING

Every bill, amendment, joint resolution, concurrent resolution, or simple resolution shall be decided by a roll call vote and shall require a majority vote of all members elected to the Senate for adoption. The names of the Senators shall be called alphabetically and each Senator shall without debate answer "Yes" or "No" or "Not Voting"; and no Senator shall be permitted to vote after the roll call shall have been announced by the Secretary, but may change their vote prior to said announcement. No Senator shall be granted privilege of the floor from the time the Secretary has announced the roll call to the time the roll call is declared by the presiding officer of the Senate. Tabling of roll calls is prohibited.

RULE 12. RECONSIDERATION

Any motion for reconsideration must be made by a member of the prevailing side within three (3) legislative days of the original action. When a motion for reconsideration is granted, there can be no further consideration until the sponsor or floor manager rescinds the roll call and takes appropriate action.

RULE 13. <u>PROCEDURE WHEN BILL OR OTHER MATTER SOUGHT TO</u> <u>BE RECONSIDERED HAS BEEN SENT TO THE HOUSE OF</u> <u>REPRESENTATIVES OR TO THE GOVERNOR</u>

When a bill, resolution, report, amendment, order, or message, upon which a vote has been taken, shall have gone out of the possession of the Senate and been communicated to the House of Representatives, or to the Governor, the motion to reconsider shall be accompanied by a motion to request the House or Governor to return the same; which last motion shall be acted upon immediately, and without debate, and if determined in the negative shall be a final disposition of the motion to reconsider.

RULE 14. QUESTION OF ORDER

A question of order may be raised at any stage of the proceedings, and, unless submitted to the Senate, shall be decided by the Presiding Officer without debate, subject to an appeal to the Senate. When an appeal is taken, any subsequent question of order which may arise before the decision of such appeal shall be decided by the Presiding Officer without debate; and any appeal may be laid on the table without prejudice to the pending proposition, and thereupon shall be held as affirming the decision of the Presiding Officer. The Presiding Officer may submit any question of order for the decision of the Senate.

RULE 15. SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS

Any subject may, without objection by any member elected to the Senate, be made a special order; and when the time so fixed for its consideration arrives, the Presiding Officer shall lay it before the Senate.

RULE 16. PETITION OUT OF COMMITTEE

Upon written request signed by the majority of the members elected to the Senate and directed to the Presiding Officer, any bill, joint resolution or other business, which shall have been referred to a committee, shall be reported to the Senate.

RULE 17. CONDUCT

(a) When a Senator desires to speak, the Senator shall rise and address the Presiding Officer, and shall not proceed until recognized, and the Presiding Officer shall recognize the Senator who shall first address him or her.

(b) No Senator shall interrupt another in debate without his or her consent, and to obtain such consent the Senator shall first address the Presiding Officer; and no Senator shall speak more than three times upon any one question in debate on the same day without leave of the Senate which shall be determined without debate.

(c) No Senator in debate shall, directly, or indirectly by any form of words, impute to any Senator or to other Senators any conduct or motive unworthy or unbecoming a Senator.

(d) If any Senator, in speaking or otherwise, transgresses the rules of the Senate, the Presiding Officer shall, or any Senator may, call the Senator to order; and when a Senator shall be called to order, the Senator shall sit down and not proceed without leave of the Senate, which, if granted, shall be upon motion that the Senator be allowed to proceed in order, which motion shall be determined without debate.

(e) If any person who is not a member of the Senate shall be granted the privilege of the floor for the purpose of addressing the Senate, such person and

the Senate members shall then accord each other the same courtesies and respect that is required among members of the Senate.

(f) Any person in the chamber and/or balcony who is not a member of the Senate and who refuses to salute the American flag at the time such ceremony occurs shall leave the chamber and/or balcony.

RULE 18. APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES

The President Pro Tempore shall appoint all committees; however, the President Pro Tempore, on at the Pro Tem's own initiative or upon order of the Senate, may appoint special or select committees.

RULE 19. STANDING COMMITTEE

The following standing committees shall be appointed, to whom business appropriate to them shall be referred:

Administrative Services Adult and Juvenile Corrections Agriculture Banking Bond Bill Children, Youth and Their Families Committee to Combat Drug Abuse Community/County Affairs Education Energy and Transit Ethics Executive Finance Health and Social Services/Aging Highways and Transportation Insurance and Elections Judiciary Labor and Industrial Relations Natural Resources and Environmental Control Permanent Rules Public Safety Revenue and Taxation Small Business Sunset

RULE 20. <u>DELIBERATIVE PROCESS AND PROCEDURES OF STANDING</u> <u>COMMITTEES</u>

(a) Each bill, resolution or other legislative matter assigned to a standing committee shall pass through deliberative process before being brought to the floor of either House, unless it is sooner petitioned out of committee. Such deliberative process shall include pre-announced meetings whereby the committee receives testimony from the general public, including those affected by the proposed legislation; considers an analysis of the proposed legislation; and by notice to the sponsor, makes time available for each formal sponsor to explain the legislation and answer possible committee questions.

(b) Regular standing committee meetings may be held every Wednesday, while the Senate is in session, between the hours of noon and 3 P.M. The scheduling of the regular meetings shall be coordinated with the Secretary of the Senate. The Chairman of a standing committee may call other meetings as deemed necessary.

(c) At least five calendar days before a meeting each standing committee shall release a Committee Agenda which shall include, among other things, all matters to be considered by the committee at its next meeting and any other announcements from the committee including the times, places and dates of future meetings. Nominations may be exempted from the 5 calendar day notice requirement.

(d) Minutes shall be taken at each formal standing committee meeting, and the results of any committee votes shall be recorded. Committee members who dissent from any committee decision shall be permitted, in the minutes, to state such dissent and the reasons therefore. (e) A quorum does not have to be present to constitute a committee meeting. Committee members unable to attend pre-announced meetings may subsequently affix their signatures to legislation considered at such meetings.

(f) Nothing in this rule shall preclude the option of a committee chairman to cancel a regular or special meeting or call additional meetings when necessary.

(g) All committee meetings shall be scheduled in a space large enough to accommodate everyone reasonably anticipated to attend. If there are more attempting to attend a committee meeting than there is room for, the Chair shall move the meeting to a different space which is large enough to accommodate those wishing to attend.

RULE 21. CONTESTS

Any contest for a seat in this body shall be referred to the Leadership.

RULE 22. UNDER THE LEADERSHIP, SUPERVISION OF ATTACHES

The officers, attaches and employees of the Senate shall be under the supervision of the Leadership in the performance of the duties of their respective offices.

RULE 23. PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

(a) No person who is not a member of the Senate shall be granted the privilege of the floor, or be seated, stand or allowed to proceed in that area in front of the rear line of the last row of members' seats from the rostrum, to the left of the right line of the farthest right row of members' seats, as facing the rostrum and to the right of the left line of the farthest left row of members' seats as facing the rostrum, while the Senate is in session except:

The Governor of the State

The Secretary of the State

Ex-Governors of the State

Ex-Lieutenant Governors of the State

Ex-Members of the General Assembly

Members of the Congress of the United States

Ex-Members of the Congress of the United States

Members of the House of Representatives of the State

Attorneys, Officers and Employees of the Senate

Attorneys, Officers and Employees of the House of Representatives of the

State

The staff of Legislative Council

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained in subsection (a) of this Rule, any other person or persons may be granted the privilege of the floor, or of being seated or to stand in front of the rear line of the last row of member seats aforesaid, by and with the consent of this body.

RULE 24. CHANGE OR SUSPENSION OF RULES

Any rules of the Senate may be changed or suspended by approval of a majority of all members elected to the Senate.

RULE 25. RULES OF ORDER

All questions of parliamentary procedure not covered or provided for by the Rules of the Senate or the Constitution of the State of Delaware shall be decided in accordance with Mason's Manual of Legislative Procedure.

RULE 26. NEWS MEDIA

Members of the press, with permission of the President Pro Tempore, may use personal recording devices in the Senate Chamber during live session of that body.

RULE 27. TRAVEL BY MEMBERS OF THE SENATE

Any member of the State Senate who takes an out-of-state trip on official business at taxpayer expense shall upon the Senator's return and at the request of the Senate, give an oral report to the Senate on the extent of the Senator's travel, the nature of the official business and a summary of the convention, conference, seminar, or other proceedings.

RULE 28. CONSENT CALENDAR

(a) Any member of the Senate may propose any Senate Resolution, Senate Concurrent Resolution or House Concurrent Resolution, which ever the case may be, for inclusion on a Consent Calendar for the purpose of a final reading; provided that no amendment to the resolution is proposed. (b) Any proposal by a member of the Senate for inclusion of a Senate Resolution, Senate Concurrent Resolution, or House Concurrent Resolution on a Consent Calendar shall be made to the Secretary of the Senate.

(c) Upon receipt of a proposal for inclusion the Secretary of the Senate shall prepare the Consent Calendar noting each inclusion thereon and present the Consent Calendar to the membership at an appropriate time during each legislative day.

(d) All resolutions included on the Consent Calendar shall be read and voted on collectively as a single group.

(e) Any resolution may be removed from the Consent Calendar for individual action if objection is made to its inclusion by any member. RULE 29. CITATIONS

Every member of the Senate shall be granted the privilege to issue citations, in the categories or classifications available, at anytime during his or her tenure; provided, however, the procedures herein prescribed are adhered to. Citations, unlike resolutions which are highly detailed, invoking the entire Delaware State Senate as a body shall be sequentially numbered by the Secretary of the Senate and made a part of the permanent record of the Senate. Each citation before becoming an official document of the Senate shall be signed by the sponsor and/or sponsors, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Secretary of the Senate. When the Senate is in session pursuant to Article II, Section 4 of the 1897 Constitution, as amended, the President Pro Tempore or their designee shall cause to be read into the permanent record of the Senate, for informational and archival purposes, on one of the three (3) legislative days mentioned in Rule 2, such citations as have been filed with the Secretary of the Senate, by topical notation along with the name of the Chief sponsor thereof. Such citations shall not require an official vote; however, at the time such citations are officially read into the record, any member of the Senate may comment, elaborate or simply expand on the content of the citation. Citations requested and issued by members of the Senate when the Senate stands in recess or adjournment (July 1 - December 31st) shall be administratively managed by the Secretary of the Senate and in the duties of compiling the permanent record of the Senate proceedings (the Senate Journal) shall cause such citations to be made a part of the official proceedings of the Senate.

RULE 30. <u>PROHIBITING SMOKING IN SENATE CHAMBER, CAUCUS</u> <u>ROOMS AND GALLERY</u>

No member of the Senate, staff person, member of the press or visitor shall smoke a cigarette, cigar, pipe or other smoking object or equipment in the Senate chamber, caucus rooms and gallery while the Senate is in session.

The Governor was welcomed by the Lt. Governor and invited to the rostrum. The Governor addressed the assembly as follows:

Lieutenant Governor Carney, President Pro Tem Adams, Speaker Spence, members of the 143rd General Assembly, members of the Delaware judiciary, other elected officials, members of my Cabinet, state employees, distinguished guests, my family and all Delawareans...

A few weeks ago, after taking for my last time the oath of office that all elected officials in Delaware recite, I told you that these next four years for me would be about sowing the seeds of our state's future.

I talked about engaging in endeavors that I would not see fully realized. And I shared a quote from the late Archbishop Oscar Romero: "We plant seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise."

Today, I am proud to share some of the finer details of the broader portrait I painted last week, a picture of a future of Delaware where our schools, our health, our environment, our economy and our government are better than they are now and better than they've ever been and I'm eager to get started.

Education

So let me begin where the future of our state begins: in our schools. The state of our schools is one of emerging excellence, with more and more students meeting our high standards year after year.

This month, Education Week gave Delaware an A-minus for its standards and accountability efforts, among the best in the country. Our rating recognizes the work that governors, legislators, educators and parents have done to put high standards in place for what we want our children to know and fair measures for assuring that they have met those standards.

As I said last week, we must complete the process of education reform. It was begun more than a decade ago. Now that schools and students are being held accountable for their performance, it is time for teachers to be held accountable as well.

I will work with the educators of our state and finally design a system that is fair, but we cannot delay any longer. I plan to have an educator accountability system in place in time for the start of the 2005-2006 school year.

But as we expect more of our educators, we also will do more for them. The Teacher Corps I proposed and that the General Assembly funded on a pilot basis has brought 10 teachers, bright young people committed to teach in our Delaware public schools in exchange for their tuition. With us today is one of those future teachers, Robyn Rubolin, a student at the University of Delaware who hopes to teach special education. Thank you and welcome to the Delaware General Assembly.

In the budget I will propose this week, I will ask that we expand the Delaware Teacher Corps from the current 10 teachers to 50 students in our colleges.

Part of Delaware's accountability system is under scrutiny, the three-tier diploma. Originally a legislative compromise under a previous administration, the three-tier diploma satisfies no one neither those who want an assurance that a diploma holder has mastered certain skills, nor those who worry that the tiers unfairly brand students who they believe work hard.

A panel of national experts assembled by the General Assembly, the educators and me will give us their view in February and I will not prejudge their decision, but I will say this: A Delaware diploma should signify that the person holding it has mastered the knowledge and skills needed in college and in work. Any change we make should move us toward that goal.

Part of improving the knowledge and skills of Delaware students is providing extra help for the students when they need it. That was the idea behind placing reading resource teachers in every elementary school. Now thousands of Delaware students are getting the help they need in the most basic skill, and the positive effect is rippling up through the grades and across other subjects.

But, as you know, I am concerned about other areas as well. We all know that many of the skills most in demand in the 21st century economy are in the fields of science and technology. And we know that mathematics is the key to science. But our state test scores show this is an area where we need to continue to work, especially in the middle grades our students are making the transition from math to algebra. They need help.

Therefore, I propose that we begin placing math specialists in middle schools in the upcoming school year. These teachers will provide the extra time and extra attention that some students need to master math skills. I will propose funding 22 math specialists. As in the early stages of the reading resource teachers we will be place those specialists in the 22 schools that scored the lowest on our math scores in our state tests.

I have proposed that we implement full-day kindergarten across our state by 2008, and the budget I present will include significant steps toward that goal.

I have come to the conclusion that full-day Kindergarten should be voluntary when implemented, but I am confident that the vast majority of the state's parents and students will take this expanded opportunity to prepare for a lifetime of learning.

I always believed that both adults and children are most inspired when they have a goal for which they reach. More and more young people each year obtain the goal of going to college, but not all of them do. The knowledge and skills that higher education offer not only produce better people, they produce a better state and nation. It is time for Delaware to help more children achieve that goal.

Building on the concepts that Senator Harris McDowell and Representative Nancy Wagner have advocated as they have in this Hall for a long time, and will propose the creation of a program to guarantee a college education for those who want it and work for it is there. Our promise to our children should be: if you do well in school, we will pay for you to obtain a college degree.

Modeled after programs like Georgia's HOPE Scholarship, I propose to work with our education community and the General Assembly to create the Delaware "Student Excellence Equals Degree" Scholarship.

The Delaware SEED Scholarship will be based on two principles. First, that the level of achievement necessary to access this scholarship will be tied to attaining our standards. And second, that the scholarship be geared toward achieving an associate's degree from our state's most affordable and accessible higher education institution: Delaware Technical and Community College.

I look forward to forging the Delaware SEED Scholarship to provide focus for our children's middle and high school years and a solid step toward their futures.

My belief in the potential for a child's education is a result of my having to obtain my own the hard way. An inspiring education system is the most important seed we can sow for our state's future. Please join with me as we make these efforts move forward.

<u>Health</u>

I spoke last week of making Delawareans healthier, and we are doing that. Our fight against Delaware's high cancer rates will be one of my legacies to the state. Doctors tell me that they see fewer and fewer cases of cancer, lung disease, asthma and heart conditions related to secondhand smoke, thanks to the Clean Indoor Air Act. The unprecedented program we started last year has provided cancer treatment to 23 individuals who otherwise couldn't have afforded it. One of those is here today: Emma Fulton.

A Screening for Life test in September determined that Emma had colon cancer. She underwent surgery in December, paid for through our new state program. Emma today shows no signs of cancer. She credits our new program and the screening nurse, Karen Savin, who Emma says saved her life. Karen is also here today. Thank you Karen and congratulations to Emma, keep up the good health. For Emma and thousands of others, we must continue to follow the blueprint for reducing cancer drawn by the Delaware Advisory Council on Cancer Incidence and Mortality. My proposed budget will include full funding for the Year Three recommendation of the council's report.

As we work to improve our state's cancer rates, we face another area of health care where we struggle to understand what is occurring: that is in the area of infant mortality.

Last June, I created a task force on infant mortality to investigate why, at a time when prenatal care in our state is going up, the death rate of infant mortality has gone up as well. I recently received the task force's interim report, indicating that the problems and the solutions to this challenge are multifaceted.

After receiving input from more than 3,000 Delawareans, the task force, in much the same way the cancer council did, has identified 121 priorities for reducing infant mortality is important in Delaware. Over the next two months, the task force members will provide specific action steps and costs to implement these priorities. I look forward to sharing and implementing them with you.

The cost of health insurance saves every Delaware family and it affects them. Some Delaware families must simply go without. Others can pay for it, but at a great stress to the family's budget. Many businesses are being forced to cut back on hiring because of double-digit increases in healthcare. The cost of health insurance is rapidly becoming a crisis in our state.

There are many ideas on how to deal with this issue. I believe that the best approach we can take is to increase the purchasing power of Delaware health insurance consumers by creating a statewide purchasing pool. That will give individuals and small businesses in Delaware the same bargaining power and risk-spreading that big companies now have. My hope is that this will result in more affordable health insurance premiums across the board for Delawareans.

This is an issue that transcends party lines. A bipartisan group of elected officials, my office and a number of other interested stakeholders is discussing legislation that would create such a statewide purchasing pool. I look forward to seeing this legislation, and I will do everything I can to see that it becomes law this year.

In order to make good decisions in life, it's important to have good information. It applies to health care too. When someone in Delaware must decide what course of medical treatment to take and where to take it, when businesses and government must make decisions about health care policy in light of spiraling costs, they need good information. But right now, that information isn't available.

I will propose legislation requiring that hospitals and similar institutions to maintain and disclose valuable data on treatment and costs. This initiative will ensure that the state and its citizens are better informed consumers, and allow us to find more ways to improve delivery of health care and benefit of all Delawareans.

By fighting cancer and infant mortality, by working to control the cost of healthcare allowing more informed choices to be made about that care, we will move toward the goal I have set for a healthier Delaware.

Environment/Livable Delaware

Benjamin Franklin said there were only two things certain in life: death and taxes. I'd like to add another certainty: trash. And while some in this room might want to discuss reducing taxes, I want to talk about reducing trash.

It is well known now that Delaware lags behind the rest of our region in the amount of material that we recycle. Our low recycling rate is not a meaningless statistic; it directly relates to our quality of life because the more trash we send to landfills, the larger and less manageable our landfills will be.

The recent issues at Cherry Island landfill near Wilmington bring the problem to the forefront: do we continue at a pace that will require a current nuisance to grow bigger and bigger, or do we make a choice that will reduce the impact and extend the life of what we currently have? I believe the wise answer is very clear.

A few days ago, the Recycling Public Advisory Council, after years of study and debate, endorsed a plan for increasing Delaware's residential recycling rate from a meager 4 percent to 30 percent. I wholeheartedly endorse the 30 percent goal.

The council has presented the General Assembly and me with draft legislation to implement their recommendation. Their recommendations provide a strong and thorough starting point. Over the next six weeks, my staff will meet with interested parties with the intention of preparing the legislation for introduction soon after the General Assembly returns from their break in March.

Increasing recycling in Delaware is an idea whose time has come and, if put it off it may not come again. It is the right and it is the responsible thing to do and I ask those with an open mind to help me propose the most responsible way to do it.

In this address four years ago, I announced a new strategy to control growth and sprawl called Livable Delaware. Today, the principle behind Livable Delaware – that we should collectively plan where grow and grow only where we plan – has been widely embraced.

This year I will propose strengthening and expanding Livable Delaware to aggressively protect our water quality and other natural resources that are endangered by sprawling development. We must enforce the states investment strategies we developed those strategies for the counties and municipalities to manage how and where we grow. I will ask you to join me to support legislation that recognizes the safeguards the natural qualities that make Delaware truly unique before those beautiful places are gone forever.

As we all know, the issue of flooding and the damage and potential danger that it causes is one that is especially pressing. I believe that decades of development decisions created the situation that we now face now and we must act quickly to reduce the potential for disastrous flooding and to take steps to prevent residents and governments from facing that in the future.

I have created a Surface Water Management Task Force to recommend changes to any state or local laws and policies that are worsening rather than reducing our flooding issues. It may also propose new policies to comply with state and federal water quality requirements and study the costs of potential sources of funding for a statewide plan to minimize flooding and drainage problems.

This group met for the first time last Friday, but they will report back to me by April 1st so the General Assembly and I can address the flooding issues facing our state by June 30th.

The pressing situations of recycling, growth and flooding are ones that have gone unaddressed for too long, but I intend to deal with them so there is less of a concern for future generations. They are part of my plan to sow the seeds of a better future for Delaware and Delaware's environment and people.

Economy

As I stand before you today, Delaware continues to have one of the strongest economies in the country, with one of the lowest unemployment rates among the 50 states, nearly a point-and-a-half below the national rate.

Last February, I announced my New Economy Initiative, a plan to put \$46 million dollars of state, federal and private money into boosting our state's economy. By the time the General Assembly approved the initiative in June, Citizens Bank had added another \$14 million dollars in matching low-interest loans to the package.

New Economy Initiative investments have recently begun, with grants that are expected to add \$13 million dollars to the gross state product.

But there is more we can do to keep Delaware's economy strong the strongest in the nation is my vision. In order to do that, we must help our business owners control their costs as well.

I want 2005 to be the year that Delaware finally addresses the difficult issue of controlling the cost of workmen's compensation insurance. Lower workmen's compensation rates will reduce the cost of doing business here, and lead to more and higher-paying jobs.

To help increase confidence in our Industrial Accident Board, which makes worker compensation decisions, I will be issuing an executive order creating an Industrial Accident Board Screening Committee.

This committee, modeled on our nationally known Judicial Nominating Commission, will screen the names of applicants to the IAB and send me only a small number of qualified names to consider for nomination. It is my hope that this Committee, over time, will do the same thing for the IAB that it has done for our courts: make the Delaware IAB one of the nation's most respected.

This must also be a year when we deal with the issue of high medical costs in workmen's compensation cases. There are many people who have a stake in this issue: employers, organized labor, all workers, physicians, attorneys, and man more. To get it resolved will require some serious discussions, but I want the discussions to end and to produce legislation that can be passed this legislative session.

I will propose legislation designed to deal with the issue of medical costs in workers compensation in the coming weeks but I have no pride of ownership; the General Assembly can pass my legislation, or come up with a better solution. But the issue must be addressed, and it must be addressed now.

Getting the most bang for our buck in government is one of the keys to my philosophy of governing. While I have changed many areas of state government for the better, it seems there is always more we can do. This year, I want to focus on the many incentives that we provide to employers in our state.

From the Blue Collar tax credit program right on down, many of our employment and training incentives are fractured, confusing, in amounts too small to make a difference and, as a result, are unused. I will propose this year that many of our employment and training incentives be combined and streamlined to make them more useful for our corporate citizens and more of a boost to our state's economy.

Continued wise investment in our private sector by state government and wiser investment of our employment incentives will sow the seeds for a brighter economic future for Delaware.

Legislative and Budget Preview

In addition to the agenda I have laid out for schools, health, the environment and the economy, there are other issues I wish to touch on today. Some of these will be part of my budget proposal. Others will be part of my legislative agenda, which I will unveil, as I have each year, when the General Assembly returns in March.

The safety of our citizens and the emergency responders who serve them continues to be one of my highest priorities. In my first term, we worked together to fix the 800-megahertz radio system, making it one of the most comprehensive in the nation. But our commitment to the firefighters, law enforcement officers and emergency medical workers was that we would not stop there. The bond bill I will present Thursday includes \$19 million dollars for what we have termed the "next generation" of 800-megahertz, a multi-year effort to expand in-street and in-building coverage and to upgrade the now decade old 800-megahertz system that we have.

Once again, I call upon the General Assembly to pass legislation banning discrimination based on sexual orientation. I ask that the measure be given the chance for a debate and a vote, and that the debate be based on the content and purpose of the bill itself, not on rumors or theories about what might come next.

I will present to the legislature bills aimed at reducing the anonymous political attacks that we now see in every election, attacks funded by special interest hiding behind innocuous sounding names. I ask that you help reform our campaign finance system by requiring that any organization running advertisements that are substantially funded by just one or two special interest groups list those groups in its ads.

Once again, I will ask the legislature to ban open containers of alcohol from the passenger compartments of vehicles. In addition to making our roads safer, this measure will prevent the loss of nearly \$3 million dollars for highway construction.

We, of course, owe a continuing debt to those serving our nation overseas and two Delaware National Guard members are with us today. Master Sergeant Robert Stone of the 166th Airlift Wing is a Chaplain's Assistant. Stationed in Iraq for more than a year, he provided moral support for our troops in a combat zone, many times under fire.

First Sergeant Larry Pelkey was the Detachment Sergeant for the Delaware Army National Guard's 249th Engineer Detachment and also served in Baghdad for a year. Larry a state employee with the Division of Facilities Management helped to build infrastructure and to restore water and power to numerous homes, schools and businesses. For their efforts and actions, Master Sergeant Stone and First Sergeant Pelkey each were awarded the Bronze Star for meritorious service. Please join me in saluting and thanking them. My legislative agenda this year will include items that will continue to ensure that

those who serve our National Guard and as citizen-soldiers overseas and their families do not have to worry about losing their livelihoods or anything else.

Last week, I proposed to you a reorganization of state government, centralizing many of the administrative and support functions in one agency. It's an effort to both save money and make government more efficient. I ask that the General Assembly pass legislation making this change on an interim basis as soon as possible and that the members support the permanent change as part of the budget that we will be passed in June.

Finally, my proposed budget will contain the next steps in our continuing effort to address the issue of staffing in our state's correctional system. It will include funding to increase security and to increase pay for correctional officers. I know these issues will be carefully considered.

Conclusion

Last week in my inaugural address, I spoke of sowing seeds for Delaware's future. The items I have discussed today are progress toward the vision I presented to the people of Delaware.

I ask you to consider each of these initiatives on their merits and, hopefully, favorably. But some of the goals I have will take all four years of my term to fulfill. I intend to work on them right up until January 20, 2009.

The inaugural prayer service last week included a story from the Jewish Talmud about a man planting carob trees. A passerby asked the man why he would plant such trees, since they take 70 years to bear fruit. The man said, "When I was born into this world, I found many carob trees planted by my father and grandfather. Just as they planted trees for me, I am planting trees for my children and grandchildren so they will be able to eat the fruit of these trees."

My goal this year and for the next four years is to sow seeds that will bear fruit long after all of us are gone. I believe the initiatives I have announced today further that goal, and I look forward to working with each one of you as we move them forward.
