"New fund-raising ideas for clubs"

Club officers have been after me to find any new solution to this old problem: how to raise money. Here are a few new ways to raise club funds that I have been able to round up. I'll skip all the old standbys—the raffles, the turkey shoots, the church suppers—you know the list.

But here's one... the men's club of a downtown church in New York City needed funds under crash program conditions. It was a church where very few of the men worked on Saturdays. Therefore, on Monday morning a committee from the church went down to the government employment agency and asked if they could find work for every man in the club for one day next Saturday.
