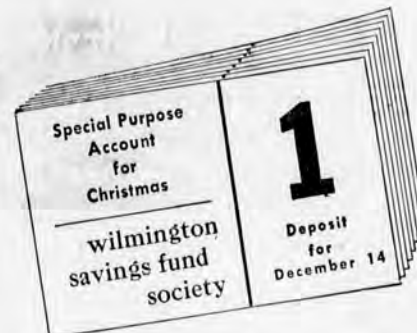

## Nelson's Blue Hens Face Bucknell Here In Saturday Test For MAC Championship

One of the East's dream games is scheduled for this Saturday at 1:30 p.m. in Delaware Stadium as Delaware meets Bucknell for the Middle Atlantic Conference football championship.

Both teams are undefeated in MAC action, and are strong contenders for the Lambert Cup, emblematic of Eastern college football supremacy. Delaware was the unanimous choice this week for first place in the Cup race, and Bucknell was rated third. Overall, both teams have 6-2 records, with both teams' losses coming against major-college opposition.

The game shapes up as a battle between Delaware's relentless ground attack and the incredible passing of Bucknell's Ron Giordano. These strong points of both schools were much in evidence last Saturday in victories over major-college teams.

Delaware piled up 267 yards rushing in a 23-6 win over Rutgers, and Giordano completed 20 of 33 passes for 267 yards and four touchdowns; passed for two conversions; and ran for two others to lead the Bisons to a 32-14 victory over Colgate.

Giordano, 175-pound senior from Collingswood, N.J., set seven school records in the Colgate game. His passing this year has eclipsed the achievements of the Bisons' great Paul Terhes, All-American of a few seasons ago. In eight games, Giordano has completed 99 of 176 passes for 1,216 yards, 14 TDs and 11 conversions.

As an obscure rookie, Giordano ruined Delaware in last year's 22-14 Bison victory at Lewisburg, passing for 223 yards. He looms as the most spectacular individual threat to face the Blue Hens since Terhes in 1959.

His coaches are working overtime this week to stop Giordano and his favorite receiver, 6-1 End Dick Tyrrell.

Although no Delaware player can come close to matching the fantastic statistics of Giordano, the Hens will throw a beautifully-balanced attack against their opponents Saturday.

Seven backs have gained 166 yards or more this season, with Junior Halfback Mike Brown leading the way. The 195-pound Brown is averaging 5.1 yards a carry, based

Delaware's Blue Hens drove to their sixth win in eight games last Saturday, trouncing Rutgers, 23-6 at Delaware Stadium.

In a contest billed as a battle of rushing powers, the Hens gained 267 yards on the ground to Rutgers' 36. Scarlet Knight passing averted a shutout on a 10-yard touchdown toss with 57 seconds remaining in the fourth period.

Consistent running by Delaware Halfbacks Joe Slobojan, Johnny Wallace and Mike Brown and Fullbacks Ron McCoy and Tom Michaelis, plus brilliant performance by the Hens' great Right Tackle Paul Chesmore, sent the visiting Knights down to their fifth defeat in the past eight games with Delaware.

Although the victory does not count in Middle Atlantic Conference standings (Rutgers dropped out of the league after last season) it further assured Delaware of another No. 1 Lambert Cup rating as the Hens face the MAC title showdown with Bucknell this week at Delaware Stadium.

Rutgers never had a chance after a second-quarter drive was stalled at the Hen seven. At that point, the visitors had a first-and-goal situation, but Chesmore, 220-pound junior from Baltimore, recovered a fumble by Knight Quarterback Bob Yackick. The Hens then drove 73 yards in 14 plays for the game's first score, tallied by Michaelis on a seven-yard charge. It was the fifth TD of the season for Michaelis, 177-pound senior from Sayreville, N. J.

Although Chuck Zolack's pass-conversion attempt failed, the Hens got another shot two plays later as Chesmore's vicious tackle forced a fumble by Rich Novak, Rutgers quarterback. McCoy recovered and the Hens capped the series with a 35-yard field goal by John Osborn, junior placekicking specialist.

Osborn had missed the previous two games with a knee injury and was a question mark prior to the contest. Delaware returned to the attack as the second half opened, driving 62 yards in eight plays for the second Hen TD.

Quarterback Ted Kempski, senior from Wilmington, plunged over from the one to make it 15-0 and Osborn added the extra point.

Although there was no other score in the third period, Delaware drove for its third and final TD as the fourth quarter began. Chesmore will receive plenty of help from his defensive brothers, who have allowed opponents only 117 yards-per-game this season in total offense, including a meager 67.6 per-game rushing. Only twice have opponents passed for touchdowns this year.

Although Bucknell has won the past two meetings with the Hens, Delaware still holds a 10-7 lead in the series.
