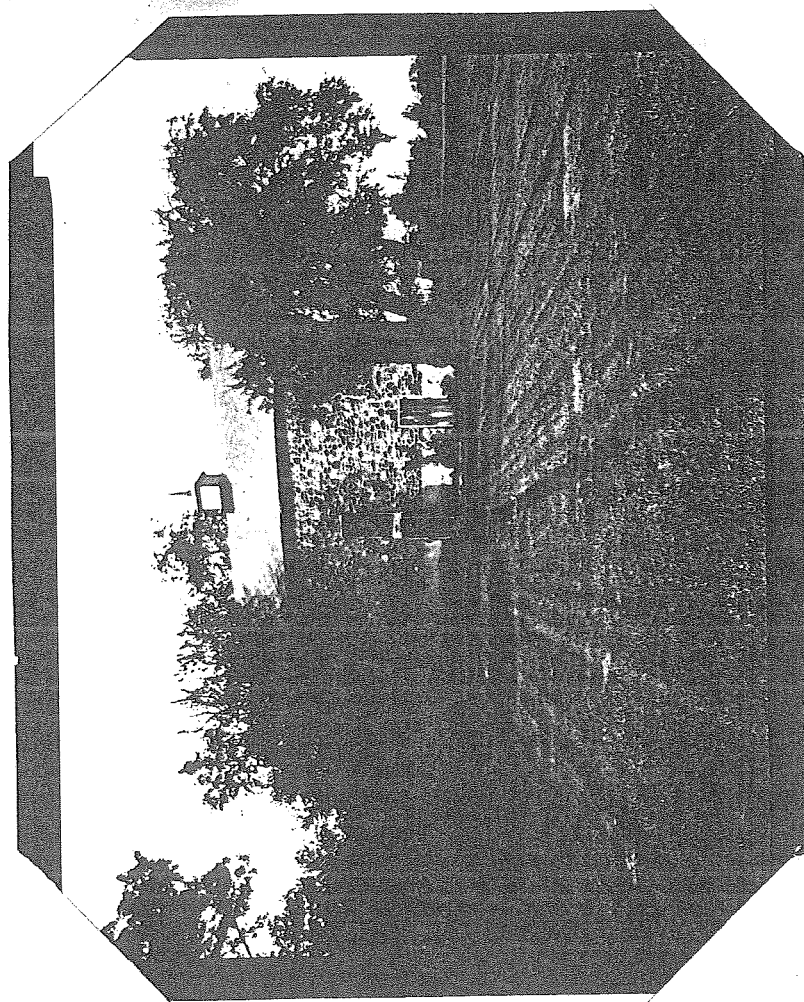

FIRST FLOOR PLAN

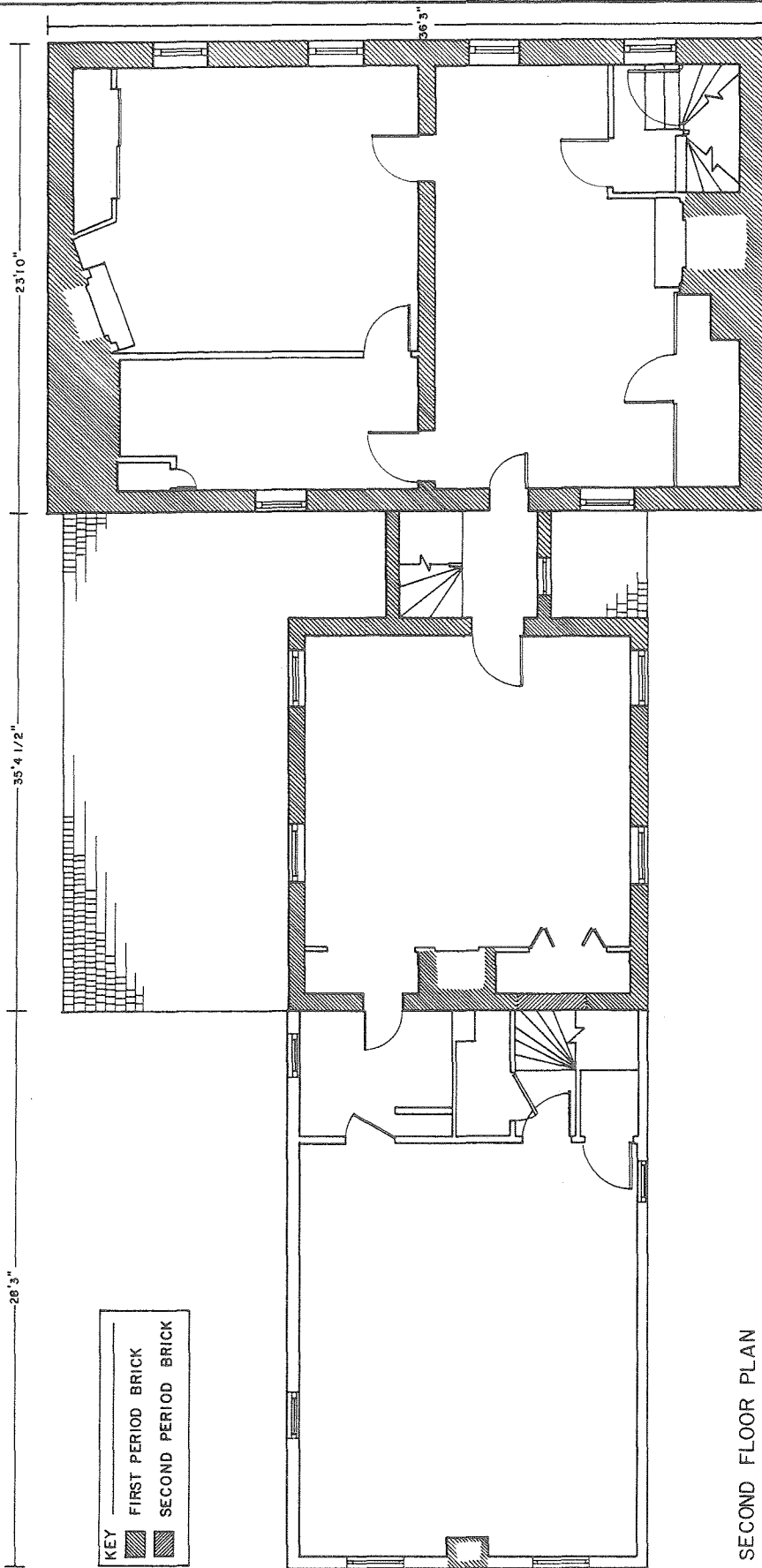

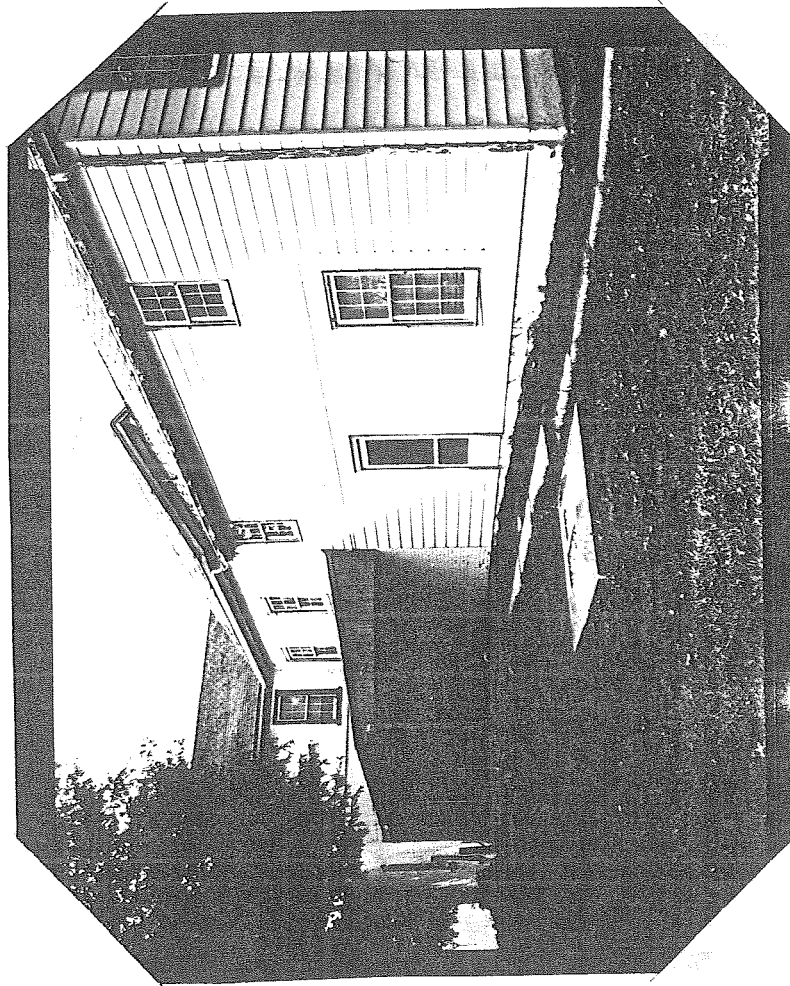

SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL, INCLUDE ORIGINAL USE OF STRUCTURE) The Montgomery House is an important example of mid-eighteenth-century elite farm housing and is most notable for the second floor fielded paneled wall and its eighteenth-century repairs to the roof framing.		
STYLE (IF APPROPRIATE) Georgian		
MATERIAL OF CONSTRUCTION (INCLUDE STRUCTURAL SYSTEMS) Brick with rubble stone foundation. Brick bond on facade of main block is Flemish bond; common bond brickwork on other elevations.		
SHAPE AND DIMENSIONS OF STRUCTURE (SKETCHED FLOOR PLANS ON SEPARATE PAGES ARE ACCEPTABLE) Main block (period I): 36'3" by 23'10"; Hyphen (period II): 5'7 1/2" by 2'1"; Kitchen (period II): 35'4 1/2" by 18'4"; Frame addition (period III): 28'3" by 18'4".		
EXTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE Main block features brick dripcourse (for pent roof) between first and second floors on all elevations; brick dripcourse is also located at cornice level on gable-end walls of main block.		
INTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE (DESCRIBE FLOOR PLANS, IF NOT SKETCHED) Original fielded-panel fireplace wall, southeast wall, southeast room, second floor, main block. Eighteenth-century repairs to common rafters of main block. Also significant is the hyphen between the main block and kitchen which features a staircase.		
MAJOR ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS WITH DATES Service wing and hyphen added ca. 1830. Frame addition to service wing possibly dates to the twentieth century. Some interior alterations on the first floor, main block date to the late twentieth century.		
PRESENT CONDITION AND USE Presently in good condition; the house is used as office space.
