STATE of DELAWARE Office of the Governor May 13, 1988

To the Delaware State Senate of the 134th General Assembly of the State of Delaware

I am returning Senate Bill No. 215 which I received on May 3, 1988, and which is entitled: AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 10, SECTION 921, RELATING TO DISPOSITION OF FORMER MARITAL PROPERTY.

This bill transfers jurisdiction from the Court of Chancery to the Family Court for hearings regarding the partition of any marital property where a disposition of that property did not take place pursuant to an agreement by the parties or by virtue of a divorce proceeding in Family Court. In addition, it provides for a rebuttable presumption that marital property should be divided equally and that the disposition of such marital property should not be effected by the provisions of Title 13 Del. C. §1513 which establishes the criteria for the Family Court regarding the disposition of marital property during divorce proceedings.

The bill creates certain legal problems and ambiguities which I feel need to be addressed. The bill provides that any spouse may seek a partition for real or personal property acquired during or in contemplation of marriage where the property was not disposed of by agreement of the parties or by the Family Court during the course of the divorce action. However, 25 Del. C. Chapter 7 specifically states that only real property is subject to such a partition. Since this bill clearly includes other property, it creates an ambiguity in the law as to what property is subject to a partition. In addition, this legislation would change the ongoing practice with regard to property which is inherited during the time of a separation. Under current law, a spouse would not have a claim for property inherited years after separation if the Family Court had failed to retain ancillary jurisdiction over the matter. Also, the ordinary practice of Family Court regarding property inherited during the course of the separation is that the beneficiary would maintain the property free of any claim from the other spouse. This legislation would force the Court to deal with such property in a different fashion than it now does due to the presumption of equal distribution.

Another significant change in the law created by the bill is with regard to how property acquired in contemplation of marriage is treated. Family Court currently has jurisdiction over property acquired during the marriage. Senate Bill No. 215 gives exclusive original jurisdiction in the Family Court to the property acquired in contemplation of marriage as well. This is certainly a major change in the law which requires significant scrutiny.

Therefore, in conjunction with this veto message I would urge the sponsor of the legislation and the Delaware State Bar Association through the Family Law Section to convene in order to prepare a draft of the legislation which would address these problems. The concept of transferring jurisdiction for property partitions from Chancery Court to Family Court is certainly appropriate and I support that concept in general.

For all of the reasons stated above, I feel that a veto of this bill is required and I hereby return Senate Bill No. 215 without my signature.

On behalf of the Governor's Inland Bays Monitoring Committee, I hereby request that this letter be read into Senate floor testimony in support of H.B. No. 537. The Inland Bays Monitoring Committee was charged by Governor Castle to ensure that the recommendations of the Governor's Task Force on the Inland Bays are implemented. Two of those recommendations call for the protection of shellfish and recreational waters. H.B. No. 537 will assist in this goal.

Wastes from overboard dumping of marine sanitation devices have a great potential for introducing bacteria and viruses to the water. Once introduced, people swimming in the water or eating shellfish have a greater chance of contracting intestinal illnesses. The potential for illness is even greater in areas like the Inland Bays which attract great numbers of boaters, shellfishermen, and bathers, yet are shallow and poorly flushed.

The cost to marinas and boat owners in complying with this bill is nominal when compared with the human health benefits and long-term environmental improvement that the bill affords. Thank you for regarding the Committee's concerns.

STATE of DELAWARE Office of the Governor July 20, 1988

To the Delaware State Senate of the 134th General Assembly

On July 8, 1988, I received Senate Bill No. 44 as Amended by Senate Amendment No. 3 which is entitled: AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 29 AND 31 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES; AND PROVIDING FOR A PARAMEDIC SERVICES PROGRAM."

Senate Bill No. 44, as amended, purports to establish a statewide Advanced Life Support ("ALS") system. In truth, however, the bill lacks both the operational plan and the necessary funding to implement such a system. As such, this legislation is merely a hollow shell and does nothing to provide Delaware's citizens with increased emergency medical care.

This Administration has spent considerable time and resources examining various aspects of a statewide system including what should be the proper role of the State and how that role should interface with local governments, hospitals, medical personnel, professional providers of these services and users of these services. An extensive study of the present system and recommendations for the implementation of a statewide system was presented to me and the General Assembly in June of this year. That study recommended a course of action in addressing Advanced Life Support. As a result of that study, my Administration made several recommendations to the Legislature regarding what I felt to be necessary changes to improve Senate Bill No. 44 so that this study could be properly implemented. These recommendations were not adopted.

It is important that all the citizens of Delaware have access to a system that can act effectively in life threatening situations. To sign Senate Bill No. 44 would leave the false impression with the citizens of Delaware that we have, in fact, created such a statewide system. This legislation fails to achieve that objective. I am therefore left with no choice but to veto Senate Bill No. 44 and take the appropriate action to establish a meaningful statewide system. Consistent with this policy and in conjunction with many of the recommendations contained in the consultant's report issued in June, I will recommend, in January, both the specifics for operating and funding a statewide system. As i sate earlier, Senate Bill No. 44 fails to fund a statewide Advanced Life Support system. The course which I will recommend to the Legislature in January, therefore, in fact allows for the funding of such a system at least six months earlier than would have been possible under Senate Bill No. 44.

I have asked members of my Administration and the affected cabinet agencies to present to me the specific plan. To that end, I will present to the legislative leadership, prior to the January session, a specific legislative and funding package that will meet the following objectives:

- The implementation of a statewide ALS system with the goal of meeting national standards for response times which will require an estimated combined expenditure of five to six million dollars. That expenditure should be met through a combination of State and local funds, third-party contracts and user
- 2 The development and implementation of increased emergency medical standards and training through agencies designated by the Office of Emergency Medical Services so that ALS personnel will be trained in accordance with national standards.
- Cooperation with existing county and local systems to either absorb them in 3. the statewide system or provide for continuation of the existing services through a contractual agreement with the State.
- The establishment of a statewide Advanced Life Support Division within the Department of Public Safety that will provide ground units sufficient to meet 4. the goal of providing response time in accordance with nationally recognized standards.
- The restructuring of DEMSAC, which is the professional advisory board to the Office of Emergency Medical Services, so that all parties affected by the ALS 5 system can provide their input in establishing this new division.
- 6. The coordination with existing volunteers who provide life support services to the citizens of the State of Delaware. Those volunteers are indispensible for the provision of an effective and efficient emergency medical service system in Delaware.
- 7. The coordination of Basic Life Support and Advanced Life Support operational issues.
- The standardization of prehospital treatment forms which should include information covering the treatment of patients from initial entry into the system through discharge.
- 9. The continuation of the Trooper-Medic Program as an adjunct to ground-based emergency medical services.

I have directed Scott Dougless, my Budget Director, to work with existing local services to develop an appropriate formula that will reflect local participation and overall State funding support. That formula will be a part of the legislation that I will present in January. In addition, I will direct the appropriate State agencies to work with insurance providers to develop a program of reimbursement where appropriate.

I have contacted the members of the General Assembly who have sponsored Senate Bill No. 44 and outlined for them the steps that I am taking to see that this issue is dealt with as one of the first items on the agenda in January. It should be made clear that in vetoing this legislation I am not condemning the concept of a statewide Advanced Life Support service. To the contrary, my plan is to implement such a system which would benefit all the citizens of Delaware in a more prompt and efficient manner than recommended in Senate Bill No. 44.

For the reasons stated above, I am returning Senate Bill No. 44 as Amended by Senate Amendment No. 3 to the Senate without my signature.

The roll call vote on the Resolution was taken and revealed 18 Senators voting YES and 3 (Connor, Neal, Slatcher) ABSENT; therefore, the Resolution was declared adopted.

At 5:05 p.m. on motion of Senator Sharp, the Special Session called by the Governor adjourned and the Senate returned to the recess to the call of the President pro Tempore as of July 1, 1988.

During the recess, the following veto letters from the Governor were received; also LEGISLATIVE ADVISORIES #58 through #71 from the Office of Counsel to the Governor:

> STATE of DELAWARE Office of the Governor July 11, 1988

To the Delaware State Senate of the 134th General Assembly of the State of Delaware

I am this day returning Senate Bill No. 351 as amended by House Amendments No. 1 & 2, which I received on June 30, 1988, and which is entitled: AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 28, DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS.

The legislation is intended to permit reciprocity between the states regarding the procedures to be adopted regarding the admission to practice of professional engineers. Apparently, the bill is intended to permit an engineer from another state to enter Delaware and register as a professional engineer as long as the newly registered engineer meets the requirements for admission that existed in Delaware at the time of the initial registration. While preliminarily, the bill appears to make sense in that it permits the entry into Delaware of engineers from other states, there appear to be important omissions in the bill as it is drafted which necessitate my returning the bill without my signature.

Under Delaware law as it currently exists, a person seeking to enter this state and practice as a professional engineer must have met at least the standards imposed on Delaware licenses professional engineers. This means that a professional engineer from another state may enter Delaware and seek registration as long as the state from whence he or she came had requirements at least equal to Delaware's.

The legislation now before me departs from the existing registration scheme in at least two crucial ways. First, the existing registration language speaks of the applicant meeting the criteria for admission when he or she applies for a license in Delaware. The proposal now before me appears to open the door for the new registrant to take as long as he or she feels is necessary to meet the Delaware registration criteria. This is so because of the language which is employed in the bill, which states that the applicant must meet the Delaware requirements "either on or subsequent to the date of the original registration". This language opens the door for the entire registration process to go on virtually forever. By permitting the registrant to meet the criteria after the person registers to practice in Delaware with no apparent closing date would have the effect of permitting a person to practice in Delaware for an indefinite period of time with no formal license ever issuing. Clearly this situation would not serve the people of the State of Delaware nor the professional engineers who currently practice in this State.

As a secondary concern, the new legislation appears to alter the applicable standards under which new engineers may be admitted by stating that these engineers must meet the specific criteria existing in Delaware as of the date of their initial registration. This would appear to eliminate all of those states whose regulations are stricter than those in Delaware. Thus, apparently under the new legislation, those persons who migrate from a state which has registration criteria which is more strict than those criteria in Delaware must still meet the requirements of Delaware specifically and not the more stringent criteria of their former state. This provision clearly departs from the existing statutory scheme in that currently, if you meet a more stringent registration requirement you are automatically eligible for admission to Delaware. While this may appear to be a technical argument, it is one possibility which must be considered when evaluating this legislation.

Certainly the alteration of professional licensing regulations is a serious matter. Any revision should be well-researched and carefully drafted to avoid the uncertainties from which this bill suffers. While the intention of the sponsors may have been to clarify and strengthen the registration and licensing regulations applicable to professional engineers in Delaware, this piece of legislation does not accomplish that goal.

For all of the reasons set forth above, I feel that a veto of this bill is required and I am returning Senate Bill No. 351, as amended by House amendment No. 1 and 2, without my signature.

On June 29, 1988, I received Senate Bill No. 99 which is entitled: AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 21, TITLE 29 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO THE SALARY OF THE GOVERNOR.

This bill would amend Title 29 to increase the salary of the Governor of the Sate of Delaware from \$70,000.00 to \$75,000.00 per year, effective on the day of the Governor's inauguration. While I support the intent of the legislation which is to have the Governor's salary be commensurate with the responsibilities of the Chief Executive Officer of the Sate of Delaware, I feel compelled to veto the bill. Nonetheless, I wish to convey my sincere gratitude to the members of the General Assembly who passed this legislation by an overwhelming majority. Clearly, I am less than comfortable with being a part of the process by which my personal salary could be increased. These concerns are heightened by the timing of the current proposal. The normal concerns which accompany the increasing of ones salary are only enhanced by the timing of the instant bill, which appears on my desk during an election period.

I do not wish to appear to be ungrateful. The issue of the salary of the Governor of the Sate of Delaware is an issue which needs to be addressed regularly.

As I previously stated, I support the concept that the salary of the Chief Executive Officer of the State should be commensurate with the responsibilities that come with this office.

However, due to the reasons stated above, I feel compelled to return Senate Bill No. 99 to the Senate without my signature.

To the Delaware State Senate of the 134th General Assembly of the State of Delaware

I am returning Senate Bill No. 456, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1 and House Amendment No. 1, which I received on July 1, 1988 and which is entitled: AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 28 BY ADDING THERETO A NEW CHAPTER 10 RELATING TO THE EXEMPTION OF OWNERS OF SHOOTING RANGES FROM ANY CIVIL OR CRIMINAL ACTIONS RELATING TO NOISE POLLUTION.

This particular piece of legislation is designed to provide civil and criminal immunity to owners of shooting ranges as it relates to violations of the applicable statutes and enactments concerning noise pollution. Further, the bill extends that immunity to protect the owners of such facilities from liability under the common law legal doctrine of nuisance. While I am keenly aware of the necessity of providing persons who engage in the recreational or sport use of firearms with a safe place in which to act, I must also evaluate the competing interests of the society as a whole, and especially those persons who live near such ranges, when assessing the propriety of this legislation.

It is abundantly clear that the bill is intended to provide the owners of shooting ranges with some degree of protection from legal complications which may arise as a result of the operation of their business. However, the bill as it is presented to me has two aspects which cause me to return this bill without my signature.

From a purely legal point of view, blanket extensions of immunity from liability should be rarely granted. Even in situations such as this where the immunity is only from the effect of noise pollution and nuisance claims, some unscrupulous range owner may abuse the immunity so as to cause the neighboring property owners harm. Without sufficient limitations on the operation of these shooting ranges, this immunity would give any operator the ability to be as noisy as they please without any fear of recourse from a neighbor.

The second problem with the legislation is closely associated with the issue raised above. By merely granting a broad form of immunity without imposing any conditions on the owners or operators of these ranges, the door is open for serious abuse of this privilege. For example, without any further regulation, a range owner or operator may apparently open his doors for twenty-four hour operation. Alternatively, the range may open early on weekends or holidays, when neighbors are attempting to rest or vacation. Under either scenario, the neighboring property owner would have no recourse against the range owner, save appealing to a local zoning authority to revoke the ability of the range to operate in the area. Such action by the neighbor would be costly and time-consuming, and may accomplish little. Obviously, some criteria must be established in order to regulate the effect of this immunity.

This legislation presents a clear need to balance the competing interests of the range owners and the surrounding community. The neighbors who were in the area before the shooting range came into existence should not now be precluded from exerting some influence on the operation of that facility. To give the range owner or operator such unfettered discretion without providing the surrounding neighbors with some semblance of protection is clearly unfair to the neighborhood. Perhaps future sessions of the General Assembly could study this issue to reach some type of resolution which would reflect and protect the interest of all those concerned. However, until the rights of all persons involved are addressed, this legislation should not be permitted to become law. As important as the ability to engage in sport or recreational use of a firearm is to some citizens, the interests and rights of those around the range to peacefully enjoy their property must be given equal, if not greater, weight.

While I am vetoing this present legislative initiative, the veto is in no way intended to herald a retreat from the rights and privileges already bestowed on those persons who engage in the sport and recreational use of firearms. This veto is submitted solely on the technical points raised herein.

For the reasons stated above, I feel that a veto of this bill is required and I hereby return Senate Bill No. 456, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1 & House Amendment No. 1, without my signature.

To the Members of the Senate of the 134th General Assembly of the State of Delaware

On June 30, 1988, I received Senate Bill 403 as Amendment by Senate Amendment No. 1 which is entitled: 'AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 19, TITLE 7, DELAWARE CODE, RELATING TO UNLAWFUL TAKING OF SHELLFISH."

This bill amends the statute relating to the taking of shellfish by making it lawful in Delaware to take shellfish for commercial purposes on Sundays. The intent of this bill was to allow crabbing to take place in Delaware on Sunday. While I support the intent of this legislation, an amendment to the bill has created serious environmental concerns.

The bill as introduced related only to the taking of shellfish for commercial purposes in New Castle County, According to the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) the only shellfish located in New Castle County are crabs. However, on June 28, 1988, an amendment to the bill was introduced and passed in the House which broadened the bill to include all parts of the State of Delaware. When the amendment changed the bill to have statewide application, shellfish other than crabs, such as oysters, clams and lobsters could be commercially harvested on Sundays as well.

I have recently received information from DNREC with regard to Delaware's shellfishery resources. With the exception of blue crabs, those resources are presently at historical all-time low levels of abundance. In light of the present low abundance levels for all of Delaware's shellfish other than blue crabs, any governmental action that would increase the harvesting pressure on those resources and further reduce population levels would be irresponsible.

If an additional day of commercial harvesting were permitted, it would also require that enforcement personnel be devoted to commercial fishery waters during a period when peak recreational enforcement efforts are already at extremely high levels. Furthermore, if Sunday commercial shellfishing were permitted in Delaware, it would encourage additional part-time harvesters to enter the fisheries.

The present status of shellfish stocks other than blue crabs does not justify any additional harvesting effort at this time. This is especially true due to the fact that weekend days are peak recreational harvesting periods and any efforts to increase commercial harvesting during this period could result in a further reduction of already threatened shellfish populations.

Further, the Division of Fish and Wildlife has recommended that, with the exception of blue crabs, no additional harvesting effort should be applied to the shellfishery resources of this State due to the historically low abundance levels of other shellfish.

I want to make it clear that I do not oppose the bill in its original form inasmuch as its practical effect would be on blue crabs only. Nor do I object to the commercial taking of crabs on Sunday on a statewide basis. I would recommend that legislation be introduced in January to effectuate this purpose.

For the reasons stated above, I am returning Senate Bill No. 403 As Amendment by House Amendment No. 1 to the Senate without my signature.

On July 5, 1988, I received Senate Bill No. 70, which is entitled: AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 9, TITLE 12 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO THE ELECTIVE SHARE OF A SURVIVING SPOUSE.

According to the synopsis of the bill, it is intended to prevent a surviving spouse from defeating a deceased spouse's estate plan by renouncing specific property bequeathed or devised to them by the decedent and claiming an outright statutory elective share of the estate. The bill is designed to permit a spouse to receive the property devised only after the spouse deducts from that elective share the value of the specific property. This is a goal which is currently embodied in the elective share statute. However, the authors of the bill apparently believed that the statute should be strengthened by the amendments currently proposed. But in carefully reviewing the legislation, I have discovered potential ramifications which would have serious and devastating effects on the probate of wills in Delaware.

The existing statutory scheme regarding the rights of surviving spouses to receive an elective share requires that spouse to accept the property devised to them and deduct its value from the total elective share portion or to renounce the devise and accept the full elective share. This bill is aimed at preventing the surviving spouse from exercising the right of renunciation and automatically deducting the value of any properties transferred to the survivor whenever the will makes provision for the spouse to receive an estate equal in value to the portion which would be received via an elective share. While this may or may not be an ideal situation, the bill as it is currently drafted raises several questions which must be addressed before this type of legislation may be enacted.

Careful reading of the bill indicates that the desired goal of preventing the spouse from renouncing a devise and receiving the full elective share will not be accomplished. In fact, the bill removes specific references to the renunciation concept in the existing statute. Thus, while attempting the remove doubt about the issue of renunciation, the bill merely serves to further cloud the issue. Additionally, the bill may have the unintended consequence of prohibiting all renunciations, not merely those which apply in elective share situation. This prohibition may actually diminish the estate to be received by a spouse by eliminating a renunciation when the exercise of such a procedure may actually be beneficial to the estate (as, for example, when the will is old and a renunciation would assist in clarifying and probating the will).

The issue of support for a surviving spouse is one which should be examined carefully before any action is taken to alter the controlling principles. Clearly, the issues raised herein demonstrate that the attempted simplification was not accomplished. As such, the bill should be returned for further consideration by the members of the General Assembly. To alter the underlying support received by surviving spouses in the name of preserving the interests of a decedent in his or her estate plan is something which should be carefully reviewed and implemented only after such close evaluation.

For all of the foregoing reasons, I feel that a veto of this bill is required and I hereby return Senate Bill No. 70 without my signature.

RULES of the SENATE



SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 4

IN REFERENCE TO RULES OF THE DELAWARE STATE SENATE.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the 133rd General Assembly that the following Rules of the Senate be and they hereby are adopted as Temporary Rules for the governing of the present session, until further action of the Senate:

Rule 1. ORDER OF BUSINESS

- Calling of the Senate to Order. Prayer by Chaplain.
- 2.
- 3. Salute to Flag
- 4. Roll Call.
- 5. Reading of Journal.
- Presentation of petitions, memorials or communications. Reports from Standing and Special Committees. 6.
- 8. Reporting by the Secretary of prior filed bills and resolutions.
- Introductions of all other bills and resolutions by members.
- Introductions of al
 Agenda for the day.
- 11. Miscellaneous business.

Rule 2. CONVENING OF SENATE

Unless otherwise ordered by a majority of its members, the Senate will convene every day, except Monday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday, at 1:30 p.m. All proceedings of the Senate shall be public. Executive sessions by the Senate are expressly prohibited.

Rule 3. ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS

(a) Every member shall be in his place at the time to which the Senate stands adjourned.

No Senator shall absent himself from the service of the Senate without (b) leave.

Rule 4. ROLL CALL; READING OF JOURNAL

Each legislative day and before the Senate proceeds to the consideration of any business, the Secretary shall call the names of the members in alphabetical order, and shall then read the Journal of the preceding legislative day, which shall be approved or corrected by order of the Senate.

Rule 5. CONTENTS OF JOURNAL

The proceedings of the Senate shall be briefly and accurately stated on the Journal; messages to the Governor in full; the titles of all bills and resolutions; every motion with the name of the member making the same, except motions for adjournment; the names of the members voting on all roll calls.

Rule 6. PRESENTATION OF PETITIONS, MEMORIALS OR COMMUNICATIONS TO THE SENATE

- (a) After the Journal is read, the Presiding Officer shall lay before the Senate communications or messages from the Governor, reports and communications from Departments or State Boards, and other communications addressed to the Senate, and such bills, joint resolutions and other messages from the House of Representatives as may be upon his table, undisposed of.
- (b) When petitions, memorials and other papers addressed to the Senate are presented by the President, or a member, the contents thereof shall be briefly stated.
- (c) The Presiding Officer may at any time lay, and it shall be in order at any time for a Senator to move to lay, before the Senate, any bill or other matter sent to the Senate by the Governor or the House of Representatives and any question pending at the time shall be suspended for this purpose. Any motion so made shall be determined without debate.
- (d) Messages from the Governor or from the House of Representatives may be received at any stage or proceedings, except while the Journal is being read, or while a question of order or a motion to adjourn is pending.
- (e) When a message is brought to the Senate by the Governor or his messenger, or by a member of the House of Representatives, or any officer thereof, the members of the Senate shall rise upon their feet, if so directed ${\bf b}_{\rm c}$ the Presiding Officer.

Rule 7. DELIVERY OF MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE; DUTIES OF SECRETARY

Messages shall be delivered to the House of Representatives by the Secretary, or by a Senator or other officer of the Senate directed by the Presiding Officer. The Secretary shall certify previous to delivery the determination of the Senate upon all bills, joint resolutions, and other resolutions which may be communicated to the House, or in which its concurrence may be requested; and the Secretary shall also certify and deliver to the Governor all resolutions and other communications which may be directed to him by the Senate.

RULE 8. PREPARATION OF BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS

(a) No bill or joint resolution shall be received by the Senate unless it be prefaced by a brief statement of the purpose of the bill or resolution, which shall be known as the title, and shall also contain the text of the bill or resolution in full. The original of all bills and resolutions shall be printed or stenciled on permanent rag content bond paper, be properly backed, contain no erasures or interlineations and shall be produced in such a manner as shall be approved by the State Archivist and Director of the Legislative Council. At the end of each bill, Joint Resolution or amendment the author or drafter shall include a brief synopsis of the intent of the bill, Joint Resolution or amendment, the name and/or Department who was responsible for writing same. In the lower left hand corner of page one shall be the initials of the unit preparing the bill or resolution, the initials of the author and the typist, and, if prepared by automatic equipment, the identification number. Each bill or resolution shall have an appropriate enacting or resolving clause. The first name listed after the shall have an appropriate enacting or resolving clause. The first name listed after the word "sponsor" on the first page of a bill or resolution shall be the "prime" sponsor. Once a bill or resolution has been pre-filed or introduced, the addition or deletion of a sponsor shall not cause the bill to be reprinted. The change in sponsorship shall be noted in the calendar, on the jacket of the original bill and on the first page of the original bill.

(b) Every bill and resolution to which the concurrence of both Houses of the General Assembly may be necessary, shall be introduced with one original and one backed copy. The original shall at all times remain in the custody of the Chairman of the Committee to which it was referred, or of the Secretary of the Senate; and one backed copy shall be delivered to the Legislative Council. In addition, every Senator shall be

provided with an unbacked copy of the text of the bill or resolution.
(c) The master used to produce the bill or resolution together with 160 true copies of the bill or resolution, shall be made available to the Legislative Council immediately after the introduction of a bill.

(d) All bills for the amendment of any statutes contained in the Delaware Code of 1974 shall be made with reference to the statutes or parts of statutes contained in said Code, and shall conform to the arrangement of said Code.

RULE 9. PROCEDURE APPLICABLE TO BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

(a) Every bill and joint resolution when introduced shall be read one time by

title only, after which it shall be assigned to the proper committee.

(b) No bill or joint resolution shall be put upon its passage on the same day it is reported out of committee, nor in the absence of the prime sponsor who introduced it, unless by his written consent. After any bill has reached its order of preference on the agenda, it may be deferred once to the end of the agenda. After it has once been deferred, it must be considered when its order of preference is next reached or removed to the ready list. In the event of such removal, no bill shall again be placed on the agenda for the same or the next legislative day

(c) When put upon its passage, each bill or joint resolution shall be given its

final reading by title only unless any member requests a reading in full.

(d) An agenda of bills to be put upon their passage on the succeeding day shall be kept by the Secretary of the Senate and published each day and a copy thereof distributed to each member, and any bill placed upon the agenda by any member of the Senate prior to adjournment of the preceding day shall, without otherwise limiting the right of any member to put a bill upon its passage, stand in the same order of preference for consideration by the Senate unless otherwise ordered by it.

(e) Every bill or resolution shall be introduced by a member or group of members or by order of the Senate or by report of a committee. Introduction may be by

either of two methods:

A. Filing of Bills and Resolutions with the Secretary of the Senate.

A bill or resolution may be introduced by being filed with the Secretary of the Senate at any time while the General Assembly is meeting.

(2) A bill or resolution that is filed with the Secretary of the Senate while the Senate stands in recess, in adjournment, or is not otherwise meeting, shall be given a number, entered upon a docket kept for the purpose.

At the beginning of the succeeding day's session of the Senate following the filing of a bill with the Secretary, the Reading Clerk shall read the bill or resolution number and title of all bills filed with the Secretary and entered upon the docket prior to the convening of the Senate for the day's

session and not previously read.

(4) Such reading of the bill or resolution by the Reading Clerk shall

constitute the first reading of such bill or resolution.

(5) Upon such first reading, copies of the bill or resolution shall be distributed as is provided in Rule 8.

B. Other Methods of Introduction

(1) A bill or resolution may also be introduced from the floor while the Senate is in session.

RULE 10. MOTIONS

(a) All motions shall be reduced to writing, if desired by the Presiding Officer or by any Senator, and shall be read before the same shall be debated.

(b) Any motion or resolution may be withdrawn or modified by the mover at any time before a decision, amendment or ordering of the yeas and nays.

(c) A motion shall be in order at any time to amend or substitute a title to any bill or resolution only in order to correct typographical errors.

(d) When a guestion is pending, no motion shall be received but:

To adjourn;

To adjourn to a certain day, or that when the Senate adjourns it shall

be to a certain day;

To take a recess;

To proceed to the consideration of executive business;

To lay on the table;

To postpone indefinitely;

To postpone to a certain day;

To commit:

To amend.

Which several motions shall have precedence as they stand arranged; and the motion to adjourn, to take recess, to proceed to the consideration of executive business, to lay on the table, shall be decided without debate.

VOTING

Every bill, amendment, joint resolution, concurrent resolution, or simple resolution shall be decided by a roll call vote and shall require not less than a majority vote of all members elected to the Senate for adoption. The names of the Senators shall be called alphabetically and each Senator shall without debate answer "Yes" or "No" or "Not Voting"; and no Senator shall be permitted to vote after the roll call shall have been announced by the Secretary, but may change his vote prior to said announcement.

RULE 12. RECONSIDERATION

When a question has been decided by the Senate, any Senator may on the same day or on either of the next two days of actual session thereafter, move a reconsideration. Every motion to reconsider shall be decided by a majority of all members elected to the Senate, and may be laid on the table without affecting the question in reference to which the same is made, which shall be a final disposition of the motion.

PROCEDURE WHEN BILL OR OTHER MATTER SOUGHT TO BE RECONSIDERED HAS BEEN SENT TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OR TO THE GOVERNOR_

When a bill, resolution, report, amendment, order, or message, upon which a vote has been taken, shall have gone out of the possession of the Senate and been communicated to the House of Representatives, or to the Governor, the motion to reconsider shall be accompanied by a motion to request the House or Governor to return the same; which last motion shall be acted upon immediately, and without debate, and if determined in the negative shall be a final disposition of the motion to reconsider.
