Saengerbund's 34th annual fall festival opens in Newark Friday

Delaware's largest German-heritage festival will commence this weekend with German food, beer, music, dancing, amusement rides and games for the whole family.

The Delaware Saengerbund social club's annual Oktoberfest celebration will draw about 20,000 people to Salem Church Road, said Hans Nafzinger, a member of the Oktoberfest planning committee.

The Saengerbund club has about 1,000 members, all focused on pro-

moting German heritage in and around the state.

The club hosts several year-round programs including German-language courses for adults and children; a genealogy group that

UD mascot part of national challenge

Fans can vote online to help YoUDEe win

YoUDEe, the University of Delaware's mascot, is one of 16 mascots chosen to compete in the 2012 Capital One Mascot Challenge.

Blue Hens fans can vote for YoUDEe to become the Capital One National Mascot of the Year on the website <http://www.capitalonebowl.com/>.

The YoUDEe mascot team is made up of nine male and female University of Delaware students, who were selected after auditioning for the role in front of a judging panel this spring. The team members perform as YoUDEe and his younger sibling, Baby Blue, at sporting events and other events around the country.

Byron Daub, Capital One's director of brand

sponsorships, said YoUDEe was selected to participate in the contest based on mascot originality, creativity and enthusiasm.

"This is the second time YoUDEe made the All-America Mascot team and we're excited to see how the fans of the University of Delaware support him," Daub said.

Members of the YoUDEe team traveled to Los Angeles to participate in preparation of promotional materials for the challenge.

"It's an exciting time for us just to get selected for the challenge," said Sharon Harris, director of the University of Delaware Mascot program.

Winning would be the icing on the cake, she said.

"We get \$5,000 automatically for being in the

challenge, and if we win, the mascot team will win \$20,000 and we'll get to perform in the halftime show at the Capital One Bowl," Harris said.

YoUDEe is participating in weekly challenges against a different mascot each week

for 12 weeks, Harris said. The mascot with the most winning weeks at the end of the challenge wins.

As of Wednesday, YoUDEe was in third place, with two wins and no losses.

Delaware will be one of two featured teams during

week five of the challenge, Oct. 1 through Oct. 8.

YoUDEe will go up against University of Nevada's mascot, Wolfie Jr., that week through competitions featured on the challenge website's main page, Harris said.

Judge sentences Cooke to death for killing UD student

Superior Court Judge Charles H. Toliver IV sentenced James Cooke to death Monday for raping and murdering Lindsey Bonistall in her Newark apartment in May 2005.

Cooke was sentenced to death by lethal injection for the rape and murder of Bonistall, a University of Delaware student from White Plains, N.Y.

Newark's fire chief discovered the body of Bonistall, a University of Delaware junior, in the bathtub of her Towne Court apartment on May 1, 2005 while responding to a report of possible arson. Graffiti written on the apartment's walls included racially charged words like "KKK" and "White power." An autopsy revealed that she had been strangled and raped.

Cooke, now 41, who lived about a block away from Bonistall's apartment complex, was also tried and convicted of two nearby burglaries of two young women in the days leading up to Bonistall's killing.

Cooke was first convicted and sentenced to death for the murder in 2007.

der in 2007.

In 2009, Delaware Supreme Court threw out that conviction and sentence, because his public defenders argued that he was guilty but mentally ill, despite the fact that Cooke repeatedly claimed his innocence.

But a New Castle County jury then found Cooke guilty in May of first-degree murder, rape, burglary, and arson in connection with Bonistall's death, and subsequently recommended to the judge by a vote of 11 to 1 that Cooke receive a death sentence.

"Nothing changes the fact that Lindsey will not return home with her mom, dad, and sister to Westchester County today; however, the sentence handed down reflects the brutality of her attack and murder," Delaware's Attorney General Beau Biden said in a statement following the sentencing. "Lindsey's legacy lives on every day in many ways, including through her sister and baby niece and through the foundation her mom and dad established which is dedicated to promoting safe and peaceful living environments in off-campus communities."

Newark man with dementia missing

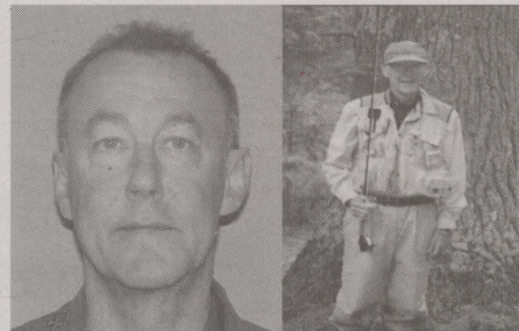

The Newark Police Department has issued a Gold Alert for John E. Dohms. John Dohms is a 64 year old male who is overdue in returning to his residence located in the 100 block of East Cleveland Avenue. Dohms, who suffers from dementia, was last seen on 9/13/12 date at approximately 2:00pm at his residence. Dohms is described as a white male, 6'1", 165 lbs with gray hair and blue eyes. He is believed to be wearing khaki shorts, a bright green button down shirt, green socks with white tennis shoes, may be in possession of binoculars and has a medic alert bracelet on his left wrist. He is known to frequent stores in and around Main Street, the Pomeroy Trail, city and state parkland off of Paper Mill Road and University of Delaware facilities.

A 64-year-old Newark man was still missing as of Wednesday, almost a week after he left his home on Cleveland Avenue to go for a walk and failed to return.

Detectives in recent days have followed up on tips from people who think they have seen John Dohms, but none of the subjects have actually turned out to be Dohms, said Lt. Mark Farrall of the Newark Police Department.

A caretaker for Dohms, who has dementia, reported him missing Thursday, Sept. 13, after he did not return home as expected at 3 p.m.

Detectives have put up flyers along the Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail, in White Clay Creek State Park and in other places Dohms is known to frequent, Farrall said.

Search teams, including K-9 units, spent the weekend canvassing those areas and others nearby, but were unable to locate Dohms.

A person matching Dohms' description was spotted near the Hockessin Post Office on Friday afternoon, Farrall said.

The last substantiated sighting of him was at 7:45 p.m. Saturday, when a person matching his description was spotted on Little Baltimore Road near North Star Elementary School. A bloodhound from Baltimore County Police responded to the area Saturday and confirmed Dohms' presence in the Little Baltimore Road area, but search teams could not find him.

Detectives are still following up on calls that come in from the public concerning Dohms' whereabouts, Farrall said.

"We're still encouraging the public to call 911 right away if they think they see him, because his case is such that he would need immediate medical attention," Farrall said.

Dohms is 6 feet 1 inch tall and 165 pounds, with gray hair and blue eyes. He was last seen wearing khaki shorts, a bright-green, button-down shirt and green socks with white tennis shoes. He has

a medic-alert bracelet on his left wrist, and he may have binoculars.

Police are still urging residents to check their sheds, under decks and other outbuildings, where people with dementia are known to seek shelter when they are lost.

"We're just hoping at this point that someone from the public is going to spot him and call us right away," Farrall said.

THE YANKEE CHEF
A trip to the apple orchard yields homemade pie

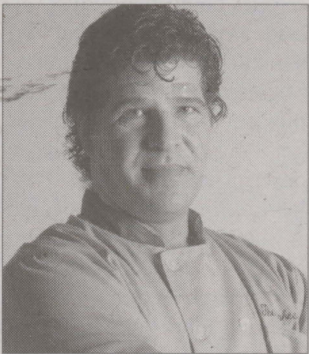
I just got a call from my sister asking to make our annual pilgrimage to the apple orchard.

What a thrill it is to take the kids and run to the nearest orchard to taste the locally grown apples. Now you wouldn't think there is a difference between a Macintosh from the store and one you just picked, but I assure you there is.

What is nice is, if you don't feel up to picking, they are for sale as you drive in, along with the question, "Would you like some hard apples too?"

I would love to hear from anyone out there who can tell me what that means. I am not going to give you any more information, not even the alternative to "hard" apples, because that will give it away! I would like to point out to you new readers of my column just what I mean by 'Yanked.' That's when I grab a mainstream recipe, or one from long ago that no one makes anymore, and tweak it my way.

It may mean simplifying it so more of us will try it or just to re-invent it so we can enjoy what

our forbears did. One such recipe is Apple Cider Pie. Without adding any spices, except sugar and vanilla, to the filling, I think you will find that the cider gives you all the flavor you desire. Our ancestors thought so.

'Yanked' Apple Cider Pie

- 1 single-crust pie shell
For the filling:
1/4 cup butter or margarine
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg
2 tablespoons flour
1 teaspoon vanilla
5 large apples, peeled and sliced (about 5 cups)
For the streusel:
1/2 cup flour



- 1/4 cup sugar
1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1/4 cup cold butter or margarine
Place cookie sheet on oven rack. Heat oven to 350° F. In a one-quart saucepan, cook three cups apple cider or juice with 1/4 cup butter over medium heat until reduced by half, about 12 to 15 minutes. It will be thick and syrupy, and that's great!
In large bowl, beat 1/2 cup sugar and egg with wire whisk until light and fluffy. Beat in two tablespoons of flour and one teaspoon vanilla. Beat in cider/butter mixture. Gently stir in

apples. Pour into pie crust. In a medium bowl, stir together all streusel ingredients except butter. With pastry blender or fork, cut in 1/4 cup butter until mixture looks like coarse crumbs. Sprinkle over apples. Place pie on cookie sheet in oven. Bake 50-60 minutes or until apples are tender and top is golden brown. Cool for two hours.

Three charged with murder of 7-11 clerk

Police charged two men and a woman last Thursday with the murder of Mohammed Rafique Ullah, the 7-11 clerk killed during a robbery of the Newark store last Wednesday morning, police said.

The trio were also charged in the attempted robbery of the I-95 Service Plaza that occurred last Tuesday night, three hours before the murder.

Delaware State Police charged Andre D. Palmer, 25, of Fairburn, Ga.; Vanisha D. Carson, 25, of New Castle; and Vincent Stallings, 21, of Wilmington, with first-degree murder and first-degree robbery, along with other crimes, after connecting them through numerous interviews, surveillance-footage review and evidence collected at the crime scene, police said.

A key piece of information in the case came from a truck driver who, after watching three suspects flee from the service plaza and drive off in

a vehicle, reported the incident and the car's tag number to police, said Delaware State Police spokesman Sgt. Paul G. Shavack.

The investigation began when detectives learned of an armed robbery that had occurred around 9:35 p.m. Tuesday at the I-95 Service Plaza in Newark.

Police learned that two black male suspects wearing dark clothing and masks had threatened an employee and then entered the rear door of the plaza, proceeded to a secured room where a safe is kept, and attempted to force entry into the room by kicking the door, but unsuccessfully.

The suspects fled the building on foot and headed into the parking lot, where the truck driver observed the suspects get into a vehicle, described as a black Ford Taurus, and travel southbound on I-95.

The truck driver was able to provide police with a description of the suspects, as well as the Ford's. Delaware registration num-

ber, Shavack said.

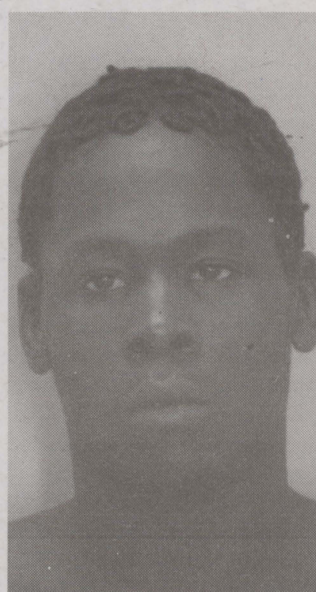
"He could have just not said anything, but that was something he was able to do," Shavack said. "If you see suspicious people or vehicles, get a tag number, get suspect descriptions if you can. It was key information in this case."

Shortly after that incident, at 12:40 a.m. Wednesday, two black male suspects wearing dark clothing, and masks covering their faces, entered the 7-11 store on Four Seasons Parkway in Newark, and confronted the clerk and demanded money, police said. The clerk, later identified as Ullah, gave them cash from the register.

As both suspects were fleeing the store, the suspect armed with the handgun turned and fired at least one round, striking Ullah in the upper body, police said.

Ullah was pronounced dead at the scene, and his body was turned over to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner to determine the cause and manner of death.

After reviewing surveillance footage, detectives were able to determine the suspects in the I-95 Service Plaza attempted robbery as the same suspects involved in the 7-11 convenience

store robbery and homicide, Shavack said.

Last Wednesday, Delaware State Police executed a search warrant in the unit block of Winterhaven Drive, at the apartment of the registered owner of the Ford Taurus. Police also searched the Taurus, parked in lot of the complex, which is close to the 7-11 convenience store where the murder occurred.

While executing the search warrant, troopers found

clothing and a white face mask worn by Palmer during both robberies. Police took Palmer and Carson into custody inside the apartment, police said.

Through further investigation, detectives determined that Carson had been the driver of the Taurus while Palmer and Stallings had committed both robberies. Palmer had worn the white face mask, and Stallings had worn the black face mask in both robberies, police said.

Police also learned that Stallings was in possession of the handgun during the 7-11 robbery, and that he had fired the shot that killed Ullah, police said.

Around 3 a.m. last Thursday, Delaware State Police Special Operations Response Team members executed a search warrant at an apartment in the unit block of Court Drive in Lancaster Court Apartments complex and found Stallings

inside. Police took him into custody without incident, Shavack said.

Police charged Carson and Palmer last Wednesday evening with murder in the first degree, robbery in the first degree, two counts of possession of a firearm during the commission of a felony, and conspiracy in the second degree.

Palmer was committed to Howard R. Young Correctional Institution.

Carson was committed to Baylor Women's Correctional Institution.

Stallings was charged this morning with murder in the first degree, robbery in the first degree, two counts of possession of a firearm during the commission of a felony, and conspiracy in the second degree and remanded to Howard R. Young Correctional Institution.

There is no bail granted in cases of first-degree-murder, Shavack said.

UD students robbed at gunpoint in apartment complex parking lot

19-year-old male and an 18-year-old female victim were sitting on the curb outside University Courtyard Apartments early Saturday morning when two men attacked and robbed them, police said.

The incident happened around 2:30 a.m. when one suspect approached the two victims, said Master Cpl. Gerald Bryda of Newark Police Department. When the victims, who are both University of Delaware students, noticed that both suspects were armed with silver revolvers, they began to get up from the curb.

The suspect that had approached them from behind struck the female victim in the face, knocking her to the ground, Bryda said.

The male victim placed his hands in the air and sat back down on the curb. One suspect took the female victim's cell phone while the second suspect removed the male victim's wallet and cell phone. After removing the male victim's property, the suspect then kicked the male in the face.

The male victim, a Newark

resident, sustained abrasions to his face. The female victim, from Wilmington, sustained facial swelling, said Lt. Mark Farrall of Newark Police Department.

The two suspects fled on foot towards Newark High School, police said. Newark Police officers responded to the scene and with the assistance from a University of Delaware Police Department K9 team, checked the area for the suspects, but did not find them.

The first suspect is described as a black male with a medium build, 6 feet to 6 feet 2 inches tall, 180 to 200 pounds, 17 to 22 years old. He was wearing a gray or black hooded sweatshirt with the hood up, and dark jeans.

The second suspect is described as a black male with a small build, 5 feet 6 inches to 5 feet 10 inches tall, 130 to 150 pounds, unknown age. He was wearing red and white, basketball-style sneakers.

Newark Police are investigating the incident.

Suspects remove AC unit, break into home, take electronics

Around 1:15 a.m. on Sunday, Sept. 16, two men removed an air-conditioning unit from the first-floor window of a home on N. Chapel Street, entered the home and stole several items, police said.

Two residents of the home

returned to find the two suspects still in the backyard of their property and called police, said Master Cpl. Gerald Bryda of the Newark Police Department.

The suspects made off with several electronic items, including laptops, gaming systems and a television, Bryda said.

The first suspect is described as a white male, 23 to 28 years old, 5 feet 5 inches to 5 feet 7 inches tall and 140 to 150 pounds. He was wearing a gray, thermal, long-sleeved shirt and a beanie with triangular earflaps.

The second suspect is described as a white male, 23 to 28 years old, 5 feet 10 to 5 feet 11 inches tall with a large build, wearing a red, flat-brimmed hat, black t-shirt and blue jeans.

The suspects' vehicle is described as a small, black, two-door car with a spoiler and ground effects.

Newark woman robbed while walking in Prides Crossing

A 57-year-old Newark woman was assaulted while walking in Prides Crossing in Newark on Tuesday night.

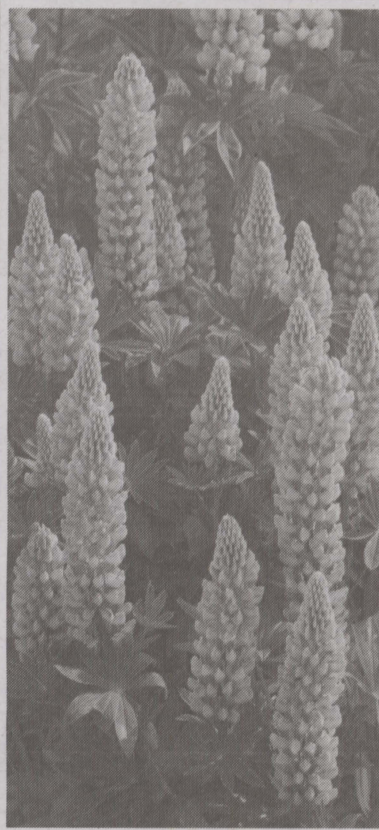

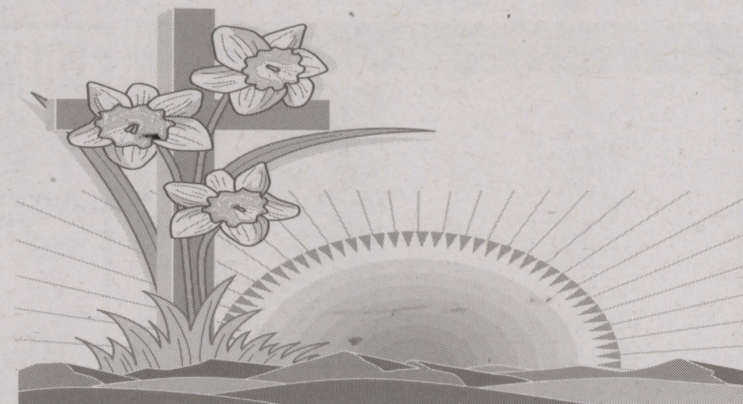

Out of the Attic

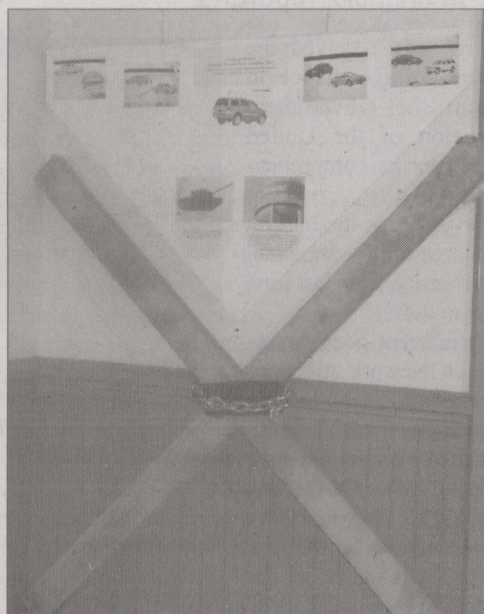
Chrysler Tank Alignment Cross

This week's Out of the Attic item is a 2010 picture of an exhibit under construction at the Newark History Museum.

The exhibit highlights the Chrysler Corporation's assembly plant that produced the Patton medium tank for the U. S. Army in the 1950s and then converted to automobile assembly in the 1960s until the plant was closed in 2009.

The iron cross is a unique artifact: it was mounted on the side of the water tower next to the Mopar Parts Distribution Plant on the Chrysler campus. As each tank came off the assembly line, it was intensively tested on the track behind the plant.

One step in this process was to turn the tank



toward the water tower and check the alignment of the gun sights on this cross.

The pictures above the cross show the automobile products assembled at the Newark plant. A mural showing the cars stretched along a corridor wall in the plant administration building (pictures by A. K. Kissel).

Benjamin Dollar Cowley Sr. of Hockessin, and formerly of Elkton, died on Aug. 24 at age 84.

In 2007, he moved to Cokesbury Village in Hockessin, where he met his great friend of the past four years, Joanne Patterson.

Ben loved to ski, enjoyed archery, and subsequently enjoyed tennis, golf, and bridge, which he played for many years.

Ben and Mary were long-

time active members of Rock Presbyterian Church in Elkton. They also made regular trips to New York City to see plays and enjoy the city with their good friends Mary Ann and Klaus Saegebarth. In his later years, Ben was very active at the Newark Senior Center and the University of Delaware Academy of Lifelong Learning. He was a warm and compassionate man.

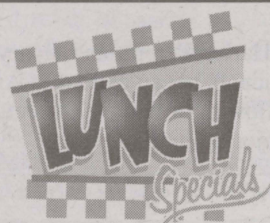

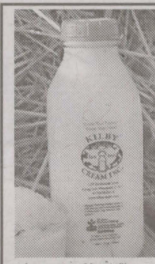

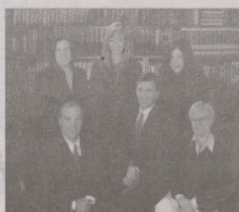

A running start

NHS boys cross-country team already showing promise this season

Newark High School's boys cross-country team has wasted no time sprinting out to a fast start this fall.

With a first-place finish at the White Clay Creek Classic last Friday, a second-place finish at the Lake Forest Invitational the week before, and wins in a tri-meet over Charter School of Wilmington and Concord High in between, the Yellowjackets have busted out of the pack behind seven runners who have all put their names on the Top 25 list established in 1999.

"We could see that this group had the chance to be special," said head coach Mike Mooney. "The kids continue to put up big performances. The wins over Charter and Concord were clutch running versus perennial powers in the Blue Hen Conference."

Ken Fontal, a returning all-state selection who finished second at White Clay Creek Classic with a 5K time of 17:20.13, leads the team. The senior captain leads by example, Mooney was quick to point out.

"Ken has demonstrated the commitment and maturity needed to succeed as a distance runner," Mooney explained. "He is in great shape and poised for a great season. His example has helped guide the younger runners on the team, who have improved steadily and really trained over the summer."

Fontal credits a disappointing spring track season as one of the reasons he's started out so well.

"I came off of a shaky outdoor track season due to injuries with a chip on my shoulder," he admitted. "I really wanted to be a part of something great and make up for all the years that Newark has come up just short. Over the summer we all met up a lot and trained together and got better by working hard. We all work as much as we can at practice every day just to be able to put up the performances that we have shown so far this season. It's not easy and it takes hard work and dedication."

Running almost step-for-step with Fontal is senior Kyle Gerhart — that is, when he's not

playing soccer.

"Kyle is one of our best middle-distance runners in track, but has been a soccer player first," Mooney said. "His commitment to train this summer and the ability to handle the demands of two sports has been impressive."

Gerhart, who finished fifth at White Clay with a time of 17:37.69, made sure he came into the season mentally and physically prepared for the rigors of participating in two sports.

"I trained over the summer knowing this fall would be a hard period of time on my body, competing in two sports," Gerhart said. "I showed up with some doubts in the back of my head, but I knew I had to put them aside and go at it. I've found that I'm well fit for cross country and can contribute to our team's success. We have a great group of guys and I look forward to what the season has to come." The season has started in

impressive fashion for the Yellowjackets. They finished just two points behind Gonzaga (Washington, D.C.) and ahead of all other Delaware teams — including perennial conference powerhouses Charter and Concord — in the large-school division at the Lake Forest Invitational. At the White Clay Creek Classic, Newark outran 12 other teams.

"They know that as a team, they can accomplish a lot, and are determined to make the most of this opportunity," Mooney said. "The strength of our team, and any good cross country team, is our pack."

Running in that pack behind Fontal and Gerhart are juniors Andrew Milham (captain) and Chris Kifson, who both qualified for the state track meet in individual events last spring.

"I knew that this team would be good this year and that the key to our success would be our ability to work with each other," Milham said. "That is what makes us so good: a lot of

competitive guys trying to be the best and push each other. The pack we have is very solid and I'm glad to contribute to such a well-rounded team. I can't wait to see what else we can do throughout this season." Sophomores Brandon Holveck, Jarod Wilson and Andrew Collier are contributing with promising futures, Mooney said. But perhaps the biggest surprise on the team is freshman Daniel Mwaniki, who finished second in the ninth-grade division at White Clay and was Newark's third best runner at Lake Forest.

"Daniel showed up claiming to be more of a sprinter," Mooney said. "He will take a little time to adapt to the training that he is doing and to adopt a distance runner's mentality, but he could be really good."

Mooney said the team will travel to Richmond, Va., and New York to participate in meets that are at the "next level" compared to those here

in Delaware.

"They continue to put up big performances," Mooney said after the win at the White Clay Classic. "It is my hope that we will continue to shift our perspective towards bigger and better performances."

Fontal is confident that the team will live up to Mooney's

expectations.

"We're looking to shock a lot of people this year throughout the season," he said confidently.

helps members use print and online materials to trace their German roots; and a chorus of about 50 club members. The club also sponsors a few soccer teams in the region, he said.

But its largest event is certainly this weekend's festival, which attracts about 20,000 people each year, Nafzinger said.

"It started as a small celebration with a tent out back with beverages and food,

and it's grown every year," he said.

This year's entertainment lineup will include dancing from the Enzian Volkstanz Gruppe, named after a flower native to Germany; and music from a Florida-based German-themed band called Europa.

The \$8 per-person general-festival admission price includes entrance on all the amusement rides, Nafzinger said.

But the main draw is most definitely the cuisine.

"Food is obviously a big

part of our event," Nafzinger said. "We offer a variety of German specialties, the most popular being bratwurst."

There will also be pretzels, marinated herring, potato salad and sauerkraut, which he said is "made at the club by the ladies, fresh every day."

years, Nafzinger said. This year, parking will be available at the nearby Our Lady of Grace residence at 487 E. Chestnut Hill Road. Shuttle service will be available to and from the home, and parking will cost \$10 per car, with proceeds benefitting the home, he said. Parking at the lot will be free on Sunday.

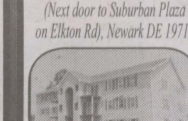

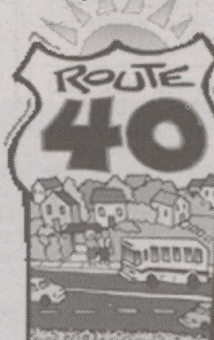
