Judge sentences Cooke to death for killing UD student

Post staff report

Superior Court Judge Charles H. Toliver IV sentenced James and sentence, because his public Cooke to death Monday for raping and murdering Lindsey Bonistall in her Newark apartment in May 2005.

Cooke was sentenced to death by lethal injection for the rape and murder of Bonistall, a University of Delaware student from White Plains, N.Y.

Newark's fire chief discovered the body of Bonistall, a recommended to the judge by a University of Delaware junior, in vote of 11 to 1 that Cooke receive a the bathtub of her Towne Court apartment on May 1, 2005 while responding to a report of possible arson. Graffiti written on the apartment's walls included racially charged words like "KKK" and "White power." An autopsy revealed that she had been strangled and raped.

Cooke, now 41, who lived about a block away from Bonistall's apartment complex, was also tried and convicted of two nearby burglaries of two young women in the days leading up to Bonistall's killing.

In 2009, Delaware Supreme Court threw out that conviction defenders argued that he was guilty but mentally ill, despite the fact that

Cooke repeatedly claimed his innocence.

But a New Castle County jury then found Cooke guilty in May of first-degree murder, rape, burglary, and arson in connection with Bonistall's death, and subsequently

Newark man with dementia missing

A 64-year-old Newark man was still missing as of Wednesday, almost a week after he left his home on Cleveland Avenue to go for a walk and failed to return.

Detectives in recent days have followed up on tips from people who think they have seen John Dohms, but none of the subjects have actually turned out to be Dohms, said Lt. Mark Farrall of the Newark Police Department.

A caretaker for Dohms, who has dementia, reported him missing Thursday, Sept. 13, after he did not return home as expected at 3 p.m.

Detectives have put up flyers along the Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail, in White Clay Creek State Park and in other places Dohms is known to frequent, Farrall said.

Search teams, including K-9 units, spent the weekend canvassing those areas and others nearby, but were unable to locate Dohms.

A person matching Dohms' description was spotted near the Hockessin Post Office on Friday afternoon, Farrall said.

The last substantiated sighting of him was at 7:45 p.m. Saturday, when a person matching his description was spotted on Little Baltimore Road near North Star Elementary School. A bloodhound from Baltimore County Police responded to the area Saturday and confirmed Dohms' presence in the Little Baltimore Road area, but search teams could not find him.

Detectives are still following up on calls that come in from the public concerning Dohms' whereabouts, Farrall said.

"We're still encouraging the public to call 911 right away if they think they see him, because his case is such that he would need immediate medical attention," Farrall said.

Dohms is 6 feet 1 inch tall and 165 pounds, with gray hair and blue eyes. He was last seen wearing khaki shorts, a brightgreen, button-down shirt and green socks with white tennis shoes. He has

a medic-alert bracelet on his left wrist, and he may have bin-

Police are still urging residents to check their sheds, under decks and other outbuildings, where people with dementia are known to seek shelter when they are lost.

'We're just hoping at this point that someone from the public is going to spot him and call us right away," Farrall said.

A trip to the apple orchard yields homemade pie

I just got a call from my sister asking to make our annual pilgrimage to the apple orchard.

What a thrill it is to take the kids and run to the nearest orchard to taste the locally grown apples. Now you wouldn't think there is a difference between a Macintosh from the store and one you just picked, but I assure you there is.

What is nice is, if you don't feel up to picking, they are for sale as you drive in, along with the question, "Would you like some hard apples too?"

I would love to hear from anyone out there who can tell me what that means. I am not going to give you more information, not even the alternative to "hard" apples, because that will give it away! I would like to point out to you new readers of my column just what I mean 'Yanked." That's when I grab a mainstream recipe, or one from long ago that no one makes anymore, and tweak it my way.

It may mean simplifying it so more of us will it or just to re-invent so we can enjoy what 1/2 cup flour

our forbears did. One such recipe is Apple Cider Pie. Without adding any spices, except sugar and vanilla, to the filling, I think you will find that the cider gives you all the flavor you desire. Our ancestors thought so.

'Yanked' Apple Cider Pie

1 single-crust pie shell For the filling: 1/4 cup butter or margarine 1/2 cup sugar

2 tablespoons flour

teaspoon vanilla 5 large apples, peeled and sliced (about 5 cups)

margarine Place cookie sheet on oven rack. Heat oven to 350° F. In a one-quart saucepan, cook three cups apple cider or juice with 1/4 cup butter over medium heat until reduced by half, about 12 to 15 minutes. It will be thick and syrupy, and that's great! In large bowl, beat 1/2 cup sugar and egg with wire whisk until light and fluffy. Beat in two tablespoons of flour and one teaspoon vanilla. Beat in cider/butter mixture. Gently stir in

Three charged with murder of 7-11 clerk

Police charged two men and a woman last Thursday with the murder of Mohammed Rafique Ullah, the 7-11 clerk killed during a robbery of the Newark store last Wednesday morning, police said.

The trio were also charged in the attempted robbery of the I-95 Service Plaza that occurred last Tuesday night, three hours before the murder.

Delaware State Police charged Andre D. Palmer, 25, of Fairburn, Ga.; Vanisha D. Carson, 25, of New Castle; and Vincent Stallings, 21, of Wilmington, with firstdegree murder and firstdegree robbery, along with other crimes, after connecting them through numerous interviews, surveillancefootage review and evidence collected at the crime scene, police said.

A key piece of information in the case came from a truck driver who, after watching three suspects flee from the

a vehicle, reported the inci- ber, Shavack said. dent and the car's tag number to police, said Delaware State Police spokesman Sgt. Paul G. Shavack.

The investigation began when detectives learned of an armed robbery that had occurred around 9:35 p.m. Tuesday at the I-95 Service Plaza in Newark.

black male suspects wearing dark clothing and masks had threatened an employee and then entered the rear door of the plaza, proceeded to a secured room where a safe is kept, and attempted to force entry into the room by kicking the door, but unsuccessfully.

The suspects fled the building on foot and headed into the parking lot, where the truck driver observed the suspects get into a vehicle, described as a black Ford Taurus, and travel southbound on I-95.

The truck driver was able to provide police with a description of the suspects, as well as the Ford's. service plaza and drive off in Delaware registration num-

"He could have just not said anything, but that was something he was able to do," Shavack said. "If you see suspicious people or vehicles, get a tag number, get suspect descriptions if you can. It was key information in this case."

Shortly after that incident, at 12:40 a.m. Wednesday, Police learned that two two black male suspects wearing dark clothing, and masks covering their faces, entered the 7-11 store on Four Seasons Parkway in Newark, and confronted the clerk and demanded money, police said. The clerk, later identified as Ullah, gave them cash from the register.

> fleeing the store, the suspect armed with the handgun turned and fired at least one round, striking Ullah in the upper body, police said.

> Ullah was pronounced dead at the scene, and his body was turned over to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner to determine the cause and manner of death.

After reviewing surveillance footage, detectives were able to determine the Plaza attempted robbery as the same suspects involved



UD students robbed at gunpoint in apartment complex parking lot

18-year-old female victim were sitting on the curb outside University Courtyard Apartments early Saturday morning when two men attacked and robbed them, police said.

Man reportedly pulls over woman on I-495, pretends to be police officer

Troopers are investigating an incident in which a male suspect impersonated a police officer after conducting a vehicle stop on I-495 in Claymont.

Troopers initiated an investigation on Friday, Sept. 14 after receiving a report of a police-impersonation incident that occurred the previous day, according to a police report.

The incident occurred around p.m. Thursday, Sept. 13, as a woman was driving I-495 southbound near Philadelphia Pike in Claymont when the suspect vehicle began to follow close behind and continue to follow her on I-495, police said.

The suspect activated an emergency police-style light on the sun visor of the suspect vehicle, and the victim pulled over to the shoulder.

The suspect approached the female victim wearing a gold badge hanging from a chain around his neck, and requested the female victim's identification, and she complied.

The victim became suspicious of the suspect's mannerisms and questioning which led her to believe that he was not a police officer, police said. The suspect gave the victim back her identification and returned to his vehicle, and fled southbound at a high rate of speed.

Troopers continue to investigate this incident.







Out of the Attic

Chrysler Tank Alignment Cross

This week's Out of the Attic item is a 2010 picture of an exhibit under construction at the Newark History Museum.

The exhibit highlights the Chrysler Corporation's assembly plant that produced the Patton medium tank for the U.S. Army in the 1950s and then converted to automobile assembly in the 1960s until the plant was closed in 2009.

The iron cross is a unique artifact: it was mounted on the side of the water tower next to the Mopar Parts Distribution Plant on the Chrysler campus. As each tank came off the

assembly line, it was intensively tested on the track calling 302-224-2408, e-mailing newarkdehistorical-

One step in this process was to turn the tank Newark, DE 19715-0711

toward the water tower and check the alignment of the gun sights on this cross


Newark Senior Center and the University of Delaware Academy of Lifelong Learning. He was a warm and compassionate man.



worked diligently to bring the City's financial reporting to the highest level."






