TO THE MEMBERS OF THE DELAWARE STATE SENATE OF THE 138^{TH} GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

On July 16, 1996, I received <u>Senate Bill 465</u>, entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 29, TITLE 30, DELAWARE CODE, RELATING TO WHOLESALERS."

I am returning S.B. 465 to the Senate without my signature. This bill eliminates the gross receipts tax on the "exchange or barter between or among wholesalers of goods when the goods so received by such wholesaler are received for the purpose of resale by such wholesaler." By its terms, the bill would be effective July 1, 1996.

Senate Bill 465 was brought forth and promoted by a party presently in litigation with the State with regard to its own taxes. In its normal course of business, this party often exchanges fungible commodities with several other businesses. Liability for the State's gross receipts tax on the value of such commodity exchanges in Delaware is part of what is at issue in the litigation.

Believing settlement of this litigation was achievable, the State suggested mediation as a means of resolving the issues, and mediation was planned for June 19 and 20, 1996. However, the mediation was postponed past the close of the legislative session and then legislation came forward in the form of S.B. 465.

Tax settlement negotiations often contemplate the resolution of both past liabilities and the prospective application of tax law to similar transactions in the future. Such negotiations could also conceivably result in an agreement to vary the tax outcome of such transactions through an agreement jointly to pursue remedial legislation. Senate Bill 465, if enacted, would preclude such a result. In my view, further negotiations and the mediation now scheduled for August should continue with a positive and open attitude on the part of both the State and the taxpayer, and should be unfettered by a pre-ordained outcome with regard to future liabilities. It is possible that such negotiations could result in a proposal similar in concept to S.B. 465. If that were to occur, I would not second-guess that outcome. On the other hand, in consideration of resolving the past liability, if any, the resolution as to the tax status of future transactions could
