To the House of Representatives of the 120th General Assembly of the State of Delaware:

On June 4, 1959, I received House Bill No. 271, as amended, entitled:

AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1960.

I have this day signed House Bill No. 271, as amended, but in so doing I have disapproved and deleted the following portions of this Bill: on pages one and two of the entire appropriations for the Departments of Elections for New Castle, Kent and Sussex Counties in the amount of \$116,452.00, and the entire appropriation for the State Election Commissioner in the amount of \$19,000.00; and on page eighteen the entire appropriation for the State Highway Department Maintenance Division in the amount of \$3,710,500 and the Construction Division in the amount of \$750,000.00.

The authority for this action is found in Section 18 Article III of the Constitution of the State of Delaware.

Including the election and registration items and increasing these highway items in the Budget Bill resulted in sacrificing the urgently needed human services of education, health and assistance to the needy.

My action on this Budget Bill is based on two principles:

We must provide for the basic human needs of our citizens, and we must clear up the financial deficit which has been left by previous General Assemblies.

Serious consideration was given to vetoing the entire Budget Bill. However, since the General Assembly has required almost six months to prepare and enact this Bill, it seemed advisable to accept certain portions of the Bill that are satisfactory or that can be corrected; veto the unsatisfactory items; and, introduce supplemental bills to restore the deep and unwise cuts that have been made in a number of important services for our citizens.

We cannot afford any further delay in providing the bulk of appropriations to operate the Government of Delaware for

the next year.

While some parts of the budget are in line with the requirements of our people, there are several strong reasons why this is a very backward budget to offer the people of our State. These are the reasons for the action which I have taken:

First, it is a backward budget because it has cut almost a half million dollars from the money I recommended to educate our growing number of children. The cuts made by the General Assembly would seriously endanger our present high standards of education and would cause serious damage to our school system which would take years to repair. Originally, the General Assembly cut education by nearly \$2,000,000, but \$1,370,000 has been restored by another Bill.

Second, this is a backward budget because the General Assembly has cut about \$900,000 from my recommendations for mental health, the blind, care of retarded children, tuberculosis patients, help for the aged and disabled, the polio protection program, juvenile delinquency programs, and assistance for destitute people. These are heartless reductions in human services, and it is inconceivable to me how the General Assembly can ignore these problems. I tried to provide adequate programs in these fields in line with our critical financial situation.

Third, it is a backward budget because the General Assembly has boosted the Highway Department appropriations by about \$1,700,000 at the expense of education, health and welfare needs. In our difficult financial situation, we cannot afford extravagance in any area. Good highways, of course, are important to our progress, but we must take first things first, and that means the education and health of our people.

We cannot sacrifice these things for a few miles of highway maintenance and planning, and we must hold down state expenditures everywhere possible to absolutely essential needs.

Fourth, it is a backward budget because it provides more than \$100,000.00 for the State and County Departments of Elections. This is a needless expense at the State level, and these election functions should be paid for at the local level. I recommended that the State Department of Elections be abolished, but no action has been taken by the General Assembly on this proposal.

Fifth, this backward budget has ignored the urgent request by the State Tax Department for adequate funds to do its job. The Tax Department is terribly understaffed. It is important that this office be adequately provided for in order to carry out efficiently and effectively its necessary respon-

sibilities.

Sixth, this backward budget includes a cut of \$40,000 for the Family Court in Wilmington. Such a reduction would make necessary a 14-per cent cut in personnel and elimination of officers who presently collect an estimated \$1,000,000 a year from those men responsible for the support of their wives and children. Elimination of this service will result in more women and children becoming dependent on the State for support.

To correct these glaring deficiencies in our budget, I will approve supplemental appropriation requests restoring approximately the amounts which were cut from the budget I recommended for mental health, polio protection, care for retarded children, the aged and disabled, tuberculosis patients, and other areas of human needs. In addition, I hope the legislature will put back the education money which was cut from my budget.

In addition to specific vetoes of certain items in the budget bill, I am opposed to Sections 8 and 9 of House Bill 271, as amended.

Section 8 would repeal the present law which permits the Budget Commission to recommend a sufficient reserve fund for the hiring of more teachers to keep pace with our increasing school population.

Section 9 would prohibit the transfer of funds within an agency's appropriations, regardless of how justifiable this transfer might be. While this action might appear wise, as a practical matter it will defeat the objectives of sound and efficient administration of the Government. Many state offices and agencies may be faced with unanticipated expenses which cannot be met under this restriction. It will result in the impairment of services and operations. Good administration requires a limited flexibility to meet crises that cannot be anticipated.

Despite my objections to these two sections, I cannot, under law, veto them.

In addition, I have been advised by the Attorney General that there are serious legal questions concerning sections of the budget bill which could affect adversely the teacher tenure act and the teacher salary and wage scale act. It is the Attorney General's opinion that these questions will probably have to be resolved by the courts.

Finally, I want to discuss the overall financial problem which is a vitally important part of any decision on the state budget. The budget is only one area of the total state financial picture.

Last week, the Joint Finance Committee of the General Assembly recommended and the Senate approved a revenue estimate of \$72,000,000 for the next fiscal year. Outside tax experts hired by the Joint Revenue Committee came up with a \$73,000,000 estimate for state revenues. Since my original revenue estimate drawn up last fall was made before the booming economic recovery experienced in Delaware and nationally this year, I believe the move up-to-date \$72,000,000 revenue prediction of the Joint Finance Committee should be accepted as the official basis for budget calculations. This is based on the best judgment available.

Using round figures for the sake of clarity, the present budget bill, eliminating the items I have vetoed, would total \$62,000,000. In addition, there are regular supplemental appropriations of \$1,500,000 for fire companies, hospitals, and grants-in-aid to other organizations; and automatic appropriations of \$2,300,000 for tax refunds, welfare grants, and other state activities. There is also a supplemental appropriation of \$1,370,000 for education which has already been passed. These three items bring the budget total to \$67,200,-000.

Providing the \$2,700,000 I originally recommended for highway maintenance and construction planning brings the budget to \$69,900,000. Restoring other cuts made in education, and slashes in health, welfare and other important activities in the amount of \$1,900,000 brings the budget total to \$71,800,000. Legislation needed to improve the state government, and a contingency appropriation to provide for natural disasters or other unforeseen expenses of the State require funds amounting to \$200,000, which gives us a budget of \$72,000,000.

Expected reversions from unused appropriations, amounting to \$2,000,000.00 would mean the final expense of the State for the next fiscal year would be approximately \$70,000,000.

If the anticipated revenues of \$72,000,000 projected by

the General Assembly should materialize, Delaware would have the opportunity to reduce its anticipated deficit of \$56,000,000 by \$2,000,000 next year.

If the expected increase in state revenues is derived from a prospering economy, responsible administration of the government demands that this \$2,000,000 be applied to the deficit facing the State. Even this action will still leave a substantial deficit which must be met by the General Assembly this year.

This deficit was dumped into the lap of this legislature by the previous General Assemblies. It must be paid off as soon as possible. If it is not paid off, Delaware's credit rating will be damaged, and it will cost our citizens more money to borrow funds for schools, highways, and other facilities. Also, the cost of carrying this debt through the next year would be about \$130,000. This would be a real waste of the taxpayers' money. Failure to pay our debts would be unthinkable and the height of irresponsible management of state affairs.

If the General Assembly does not make the changes recommended in this backward budget and persists in boosting the Highway Department appropriations, it will have to accept the responsibility for not cleaning up the State's financial mess or for raising new taxes to pay off the deficit. That is the choice which can only be made by the General Assembly.

The correct course of action is clear. Provide money for essential human needs, hold the line on all expenditures which are not absolutely required this next year, and put our financial house in order. Anything less than that will do serious harm to our citizens and to the government of our State.

There is no need to have a battle of the budget in Delaware. But if there is to be a battle of the budget, I will wage it on the basic principles of providing essential appropriations, and a sound financial and efficient operation of the State government that will give the people of Delaware a fair break.

This is a time for courage and foresight in facing up to our budget problems.

STATE OF DELAWARE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

June 17, 1959

To the House of Representatives of the 120th General Assembly of the State of Delaware:

While I have not yet received the Resolution which was purportedly adopted yesterday with regard to the disposition of House Bill 271, known as the Budget Bill, I should like to advise you that this measure is and has been available to you at all times since the message explaining my line veto was delivered.

I regret that a matter of critical importance to all of the citizens of Delaware has been confused by a resort to legal

gymnastics.

On Monday, June 15th, I advised you that I had line vetoed four specific items in the Budget Bill, in accordance with the Constitutional provisions relating to such matters. Unfortunately, the Constitution is vague on the entire question of the disposition of line vetoed bills. However, as a matter of custom and practice, this Bill was placed in the protective custody of the Governor's Secretary where it will remain until such time as the Secretary of State requests it for processing the approved portions as part of the laws of the State of Delaware or until you request it for further consideration. This is the same procedure followed on the two

previous occasions I line vetoed bills during my tenure as Governor of the State of Delaware.

Since this Bill is available to the members of the House of Representatives on request, a practice which the General Assembly has exercised in previous instances in past years, I believe your Resolution of yesterday makes a mockery of the serious nature of the situation.

The important thing to consider, I believe, is not whether the Bill should be physically located in one place or another but whether the people of this State will be granted the vitally important basic human services of education, health and assistance to the needy they want and demand.

It is discouraging to me that the House of Representatives uses its valuable time to engage in senseless and unnecessary political maneuvering rather than take the necessary action on the Budget Bill to provide the people of Delaware with more health and education services than miles of highway maintenance.

On June 23, 1959, I received House Bill No. 317, entitled: AN ACT TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM ALLOW-ABLE COUNTY TAX RATE IN KENT COUNTY.

I respectfully return herewith this Bill without my approval.

This Bill was intended to provide an allowable county tax rate increase in Kent County from fifty cents to sixty cents on each \$100 of assessed valuation.

From an examination of this Bill it appears that the Title of the Bill refers only to Kent County, while the body of the Bill also includes a maximum allowable county tax rate in New Castle County also. Since this is not set forth in the Title of the Bill as required by the Constitution of the State of Delaware, Article 2, Section 16, which is as follows:

Sec. 16. "Restriction of bills and resolutions to one subject; expression in title; exception"

Section 16. "No bill or joint resolution, except bills appropriating money for public purposes, shall embrace more than one subject, which shall be expressed in its title."

it would seem that this Bill is not in compliance with the Constitution of the State of Delaware.

In the course of consideration of this Bill, many people have spoken to me about the need for increasing the maximum allowable county tax rate in Kent County and have suggested that before such increased allowable rate were en-

acted that it would seem desirable for the county government to undertake a realistic general reappraisal and reassessment program which might more equitably distribute the tax burden in Kent County and at the same time provide sufficient revenue to meet the expenditure needs of the County—as has been successfully accomplished in both New Castle County and Sussex County.

On August 18, 1959, I received House Bill No. 106, entitled:

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 9, TITLE 10, DELAWARE CODE BY INCREASING THE SALARY OF THE JUDGES OF THE FAMILY COURT IN AND FOR NEW CASTLE COUNTY.

This bill provides a \$5,000 a year salary increase for each of the two Family Court Judges.

I am unable to sign this bill and return it herewith for the following reasons:

- (1) This salary increase amounting to \$10,000 a year for the two judges would necessarily have to come from the \$160,000 appropriation provided by the General Assembly for the operation of the Court. This would mean curtailing the operation of the Court in other areas in order to comply with this salary increase.
- (2) When the General Assembly is able to provide adequate funds for the over-all operation of the Family Court, the salaries of the judges should then be increased.

81ST LEGISLATIVE DAY

The House met pursuant to adjournment at 2:45 P.M. on Thursday, September 17th, 1959.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the previous Session when Mr. King moved that so much be considered the reading of the Journal, and the Journal be approved. Motion prevailed.

Mr. Eskridge on behalf of Miscellaneous Committee reported SJR 10, 5 favorable.

Mr. Eskridge moved that rules be suspended for the purpose of having SJR 10—"Relative to the Eisenhower Presidential Library," read for the third and final time and taking it up for consideration in order that it might pass the House.

On Mr. Eskridge's motion SJR 10, was adopted by a voice vote, and having passed the House was ordered returned to the Senate.

- SB 284—"An Act Making a Supplementary Appropriation to the Lord Baltimore School District No. 28 for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1960," to Appropriations.

The Secretary of the Senate informed the House that the Senate had passed HB 403.

The following bills were introduced, read for the first and second time by title only and referred to committee as follows:

HB 431—"An Act Authorizing the State of Delaware to Borrow Money to be Used for the State Highway Depart-

ment's Capital Improvements Programs and to Issue Notes and Bonds Therefor and Appropriating the Money Borrowed to the State Highway Department," by King, Eskridge, Richardson, Bartleson; to Appropriations.

HB 432—"An Act to Amend Chapter 57, Volume 52, Laws of Delaware," by King; to Revised Statutes.

HB 433—"An Act Authorizing the State Treasurer to Transfer Certain Balances in the Account of Former State Treasurer Howard H. Dickerson to the General Fund of the State of Delaware," by King; to Miscellaneous.

HB 434—"An Act to Amend Section 701, Title 21, Delaware Code Relating to Officers Who May Arrest for Motor Vehicle Violations," by Shockley; to Revised Statutes.

Mr. King presented a Resolution adopted by the State Highway Department which was read and the Speaker ordered that it be spread upon the Journal in its entirety.

RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT ON SEPTEMBER 16, 1959 DETERMINING ITS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, the Chief Engineer of the Department, pursuant to Section 117 of Title 17 of the Delaware Code, has recommended to the Commissioners capital improvements programs covering matters and property which are under the jurisdiction of the Department to be undertaken or commenced by the Department during the biennium beginning July 1, 1959 and has stated that the estimated cost of such programs to the State of Delaware (including the cost of acquiring necessary land and rights-of-way but exclusive of such portions of the cost of any projects included in the programs as might be paid by the Federal Government) is Twenty-eight Million Dollars (\$28,000,000) for the biennium beginning July 1, 1959 and Fourteen Million Dollars (\$14,000,000) for each year of such biennium; and

WHEREAS. the Chief Engineer further reported that on the basis of the Department's experience over many years it is not realistic to predict or assume that all of the projects that may be approved by the Department will be consummated or even undertaken during the biennium because unforeseen difficulties (such as inability to acquire rights-of-way for legal or financial reasons) frequently arise which make it necessary to postpone or abandon a project; and, further, that conditions arise during the biennium which make it necessary to undertake immediately projects which were not listed on the original programs;

NOW, THEREFORE, after consideration of the Chief Engineer's recommendations and report, it is resolved as follows:

- I. The Commissioners of the State Highway Department hereby determine and approve the following as the capital improvements program to be undertaken or commenced by the Department during the biennium beginning July 1, 1959:
