Main Street doctor arrested for unlawful sexual contact

Newark Police Department officials arrested Pierre Leroy, an 82-year-old Newark neurosurgeon, Friday, May 4 for unlawful sexual contact with a 35-year-old female patient.

The state Board of Medical Practice and Discipline has ordered emergency suspension of Leroy's medical license in response to the allegations, which violate the Delaware Medical Practice Act.

Secretary of State Jeffrey Bullock said he needs to "protect the public from any possible future harm" in suspending Leroy's medical license.

According to the consent order, the neurosurgeon, was examining a female patient in his office, at

249 E. Main St. in Newark, on April 12, 2012 when he "inappropriately engaged in sexual misconduct in that he exposed the patient's breast and buttocks, touched her breast, buttocks and thighs, engaged in sexually aggressive behavior, gestures,

expressions, and statements" and made inappropriate comments about the patient's body.

Newark Police say the victim reported the incident on April 16, at

WWE will put the 'SmackDown' in Newark Saturday

In less than two weeks, Daniel Bryan will battle CM Punk for the WWE Championship at the company's "Over the Limit" pay-per-view event in Raleigh, N.C.

On the road to Raleigh, Bryan will stop by University of Delaware's Bob Carpenter Center in Newark at 7:30 p.m. Saturday as part of the "WWE SmackDown World Tour," where he'll headline the main event with reigning World Heavyweight Champion Sheamus.

"Every time me and Sheamus go out there, we hit each other really hard, which is not so fun for us, but it's loads of fun for the fans," Bryan said last week on the phone from Toledo, Ohio just before taping a "Friday Night SmackDown" TV segment. "Me and Sheamus, we don't like each other, but we love fighting each other. We like to go out there, and we're two guys who don't mind taking a little bit of punishment to dish out a little bit of punishment, so it should be a really good match for the World Heavyweight Championship."

Bryan captured that same title Dec. 18, 2011, in Baltimore before Sheamus ended his 105-day reign April 1 in front of 78,363 fans at "WrestleMania XXVIII" in Miami. The controversial opening match at WWE's showcase event lasted just 18 seconds, and as Bryan prepares for another crack at his current archrival this weekend, the contest takes on added significance beyond simply being a chance at revenge with the "SmackDown" brand's top prize on the line.

FIRST STATE WWE DEBUT

It's the first time Bryan will step inside the squared circle in the First State as a member of the WWE. But the Aberdeen, Wash. native possesses a rich history with the area, dating back to his late teenage years.

After training under legendary WWE Hall of Famer Shawn Michaels, Bryan signed a developmental contract with the Vince McMahon-owned company at age 18. He was released two years later,

Newark Nite becoming a daytime festival

After 26 years, Newark Nite is becoming Newark Day.

The annual event, which draws as many as 30,000 people to downtown Newark, will now be a daytime festival held from noon to 5 p.m. Saturday, June 2, officials announced last Friday.

Charlie Emerson, the city's Parks and Recreation director, said he hopes the change makes the event more family friendly and easier for vendors who will no longer have to pack up in the dark.

He said the decision is also partly a result of incidents that occurred following Newark Nite two years ago.

Around 9 p.m., just as the 2010 Newark Nite was ending, a fight broke out among 30 people on Main Street between Dunkin' Donuts and California Tortilla. The fight resulted in an Elkton man being stabbed in the left arm.

Later that night, a man was arrested for shooting into a group of people at Newark Shopping Center, and a teenager was carjacked in a parking lot on Library Avenue.

At the time, those incidents prompted some council members

and city residents to call for changes to the popular event.

Although Emerson emphasized that those crimes happened after Newark Nite ended, he said he hopes ending the event during daylight hours will eliminate future problems.

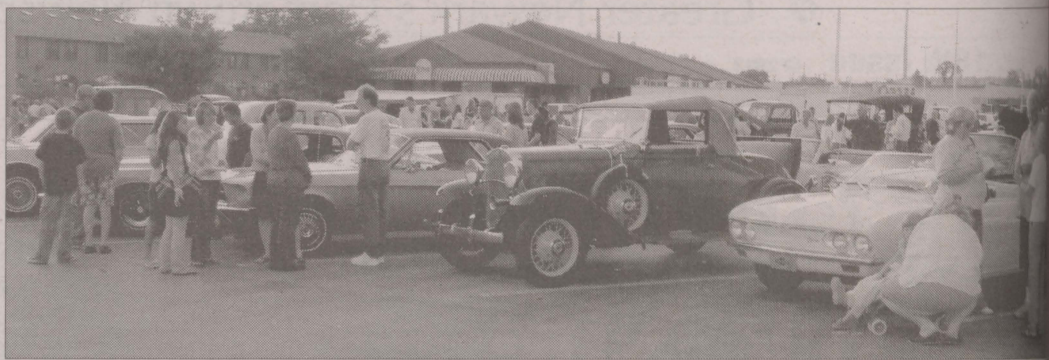
Newark mayor Vance Funk III said Monday he had mixed emotions about the switch from Newark Nite to Newark Day.

"I think it's pretty sad that all these out-of-town troublemakers have chosen this event to come to and cause all these problems," he said.

Members of city council and other city departments have in recent years batted around ideas for how to make Newark Nite less of a draw for trouble, including shorter hours and increased patrols from the city's police and fire officials, Funk said.

An increased police presence at last year's Newark Nite did cut down on problems, but not entirely, he said.

"We still had intoxicated people walking around, several pushing instances," Funk said, adding "It was readily apparent to some of our police officers that there were people walking around with gang tattoos ... so that's how it became Newark Day."

He noted that, historically, few other festivals take place on the first weekend in June, which might be the reason so many people travel from outside Newark to attend Newark Nite. Funk suggested changing the date of Newark's annual festival to a weekend in which more events are also happening around the state, so Newark's event would more likely draw only Newarkers.

"One of my side suggestions is, find out when the Italian Festival is and make Newark Nite on the same weekend," he said.

The biggest positive side to moving the event to the daytime hours is that it will nurture a family friendly environment, Funk said.

"Definitely it's going to be more of a family atmosphere that we strongly believe in," he said. "We probably won't get the large crowds that we're used to, but 30,000 people on Main Street, that's a lot of people to begin with."

In another change, the main stage will be moved from Newark Shopping Center to the University of Delaware's Old College Lawn. Country-music artist Dustin Lynch will headline the entertainment schedule.

As usual, Main Street will be closed to vehicular traffic and instead will be taken over by a variety of food and craft vendors, non-profit exhibitors and activities for children. Main Street busi-

nesses will be open, and there will be booths on the street.

"We want to promote downtown Newark and promote students enjoying downtown Newark without automobile traffic," Emerson said.

As in the past few years, the event will coincide with Alumni Weekend, which is expected to draw thousands of students to campus for three days of festivities including a Night event Friday, a 5K run Saturday morning, reunions Saturday and a brunch on Sunday.

The rain date for Newark Day is June 3, from noon to 5 p.m.

POST'S PALATE

To share or not to share at the Over Easy Café?

It's not just the most important meal of the day; it's my favorite meal of the day. That's why I woke up

my boyfriend, Matt, bright and early on a Saturday morning to grab breakfast with me at the new Over Easy Café on Main Street. I'm a walking contradiction. I love breakfast, but

I'm not a morning person. So when I stumbled into the café, the cozy seating was a sight for my sore eyes. The restaurant offers plush couches and other homey arrangements to make cus-

tomers feel as welcome as they would feel in their own living rooms. It could not have been more perfect. The other diners seemed just as snug as Matt and I felt sipping hot coffee and hot choc-

olate on the rainy morning. My adoration of all things breakfast made choosing an entrée pretty difficult. Lucky for me, Matt was willing to do a little research. We ordered four meals. "Whatever we don't finish, we can just reheat and have later" sounded like music to my ears.

We started with Pop 'Ems, mini pancake bites stuffed with ricotta cheese and blueberries. Here's the twist: they're soaked in Grand Marnier overnight, which gives them a delectable hint of orange flavor. I practically licked the plate clean.

We split the Pop 'Ems 50/50, but when my Waffle Chetta — a crispy-on-the-outside, fluffy-on-the-inside waffle topped with baked ham and a fried egg — arrived, I only offered up a single bite. I practically inhaled the rest, coated in maple syrup.

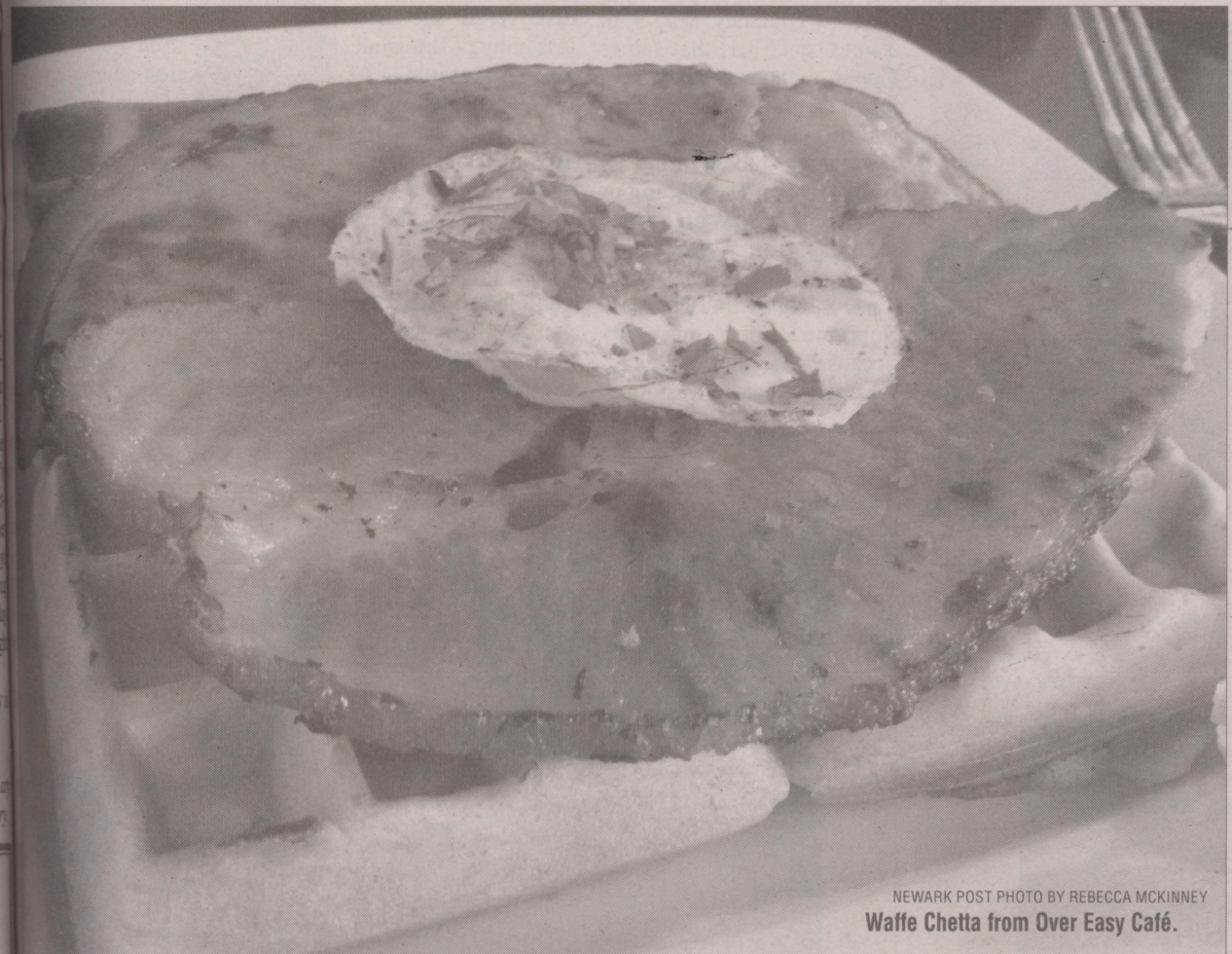
Since I hardly shared my waffle, Matt only allowed me to taste his omelet, called the Bombay. It was the size of his plate and loaded with Serrano peppers, onions and cilantro. One bite was enough to let me know how spicy those peppers are — which was also enough to let me know to order the

Bombay next time. We were both far too full to even taste the fourth item we ordered. But we took it home and "split" it for dinner later that night. The Green Chicken Panini is made with chicken, spinach, pesto, red wine vinaigrette, and goat cheese on Focaccia bread.

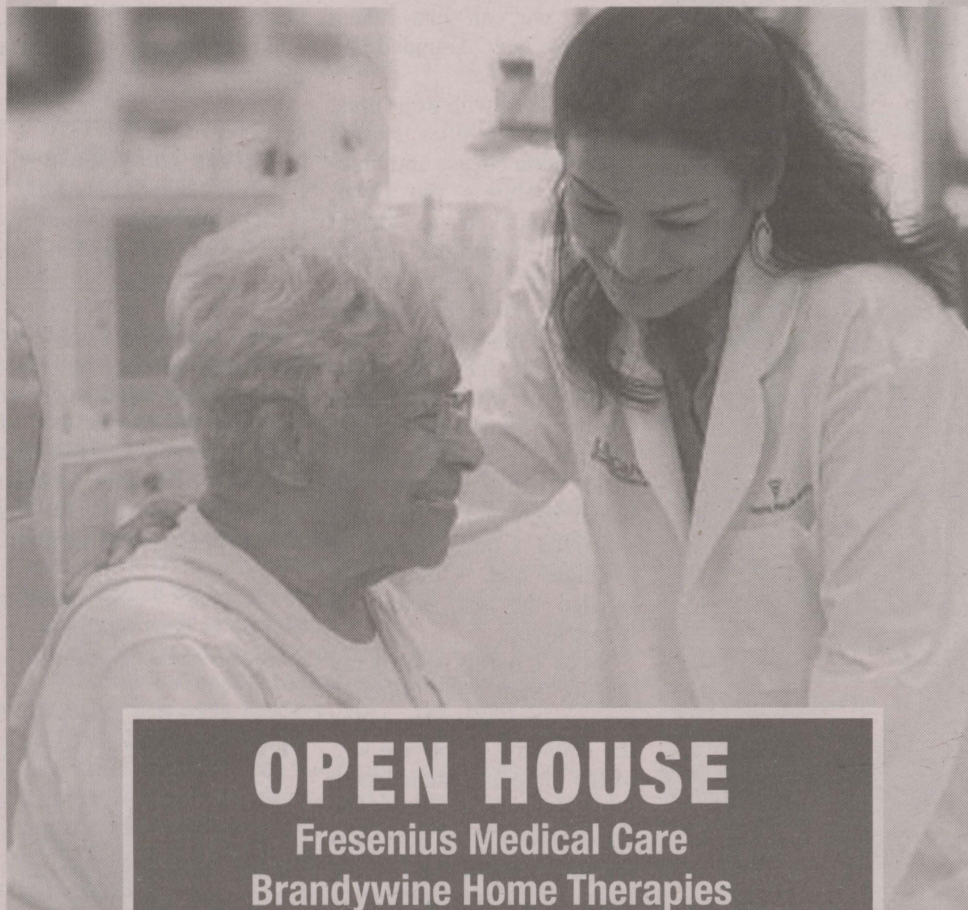

Jury recommends death penalty for Cooke

A New Castle County Superior Court jury recommended Thursday, May 3, in a vote of 11 - 1, that James Cooke receive a death sentence for the May 2005 rape and murder of University of Delaware student Lindsay Bonistall in her off-campus apartment in Newark.

Cooke's first conviction and sentence, in 2007, were thrown out by the Delaware Supreme Court in 2009 because his public defenders argued that he was guilty

but mentally ill, despite the fact that Cooke repeatedly claimed his innocence.

Newark's fire chief discovered the lifeless body of Bonistall, a University of Delaware junior, in the bathtub of her Towne Court apartment on May 1, 2005 while responding to a report of possible arson. Graffiti written on the apartment's walls included racially charged words like "KKK" and "White power." An autopsy revealed that Bonistall had

been strangled and Cooke, now 41, was about a block away from Bonistall's apartment complex, was tried and convicted of two young women in the days leading to Bonistall's killing.

Judge Charles T. Will make the final ruling on whether Cooke receive life or death. The case has been set for that trial. Delaware law requires a jury to give "great weight" to the jury's recommendation.

Burglary victim apprehends suspect, turns him in to police

Newark Police Department officials arrested 24-year-old Richard Flemming of York Haven, Pa. after a 47-year-old male homeowner apprehended him during a residential burglary Sunday, May 6, and 3:30 a.m. that morn-

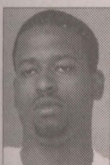
ing officers from Newark Police Department responded to a home in the 40 block of Woodlawn Avenue in Newark, where the victim was detaining Flemming in the roadway.

Police say that during the incident, the victim awoke to dogs barking and, upon investigating, discovered Flemming inside his home. Flemming, who had forced his way in through a window, fled upon being discovered. The victim chased Flemming and took possession of his car until the police arrived and took Flemming into custody. The victim did not know Flemming personally.

Police arrested Flemming on charges of burglary in the second degree, attempted theft and criminal mischief. Flemming was released on \$5,600 unse-

cured bail and ordered to have no contact with the victim.

Shortly after release, an unknown associate of Flemming approached the victim at his residence and advised the victim that Flemming wanted to apologize for the incident. After asking this subject to leave, Flemming was observed picking up the unknown subject. This was a violation of Flemming's release from the earlier charges, and therefore, an additional warrant is on file for Flemming for breach of release.

Couple robbed in Glasgow Court Trailer Park

New Castle County Police are investigating an armed robbery involving a couple accosted by several unknown male subjects, two of which were armed with guns.

At 10 p.m. Sunday, May 6, County Police officials responded to Glasgow Court Trailer Park for a reported robbery. Victims told the officers that while they were walking in the area of Albert Street and Glasgow Drive, four subjects, two of which were armed with guns, approached them and began rifling through their pockets. The suspects removed property from the victims and then fled the area

on foot. Responding officers canvassed the area and a canine team performed a track, but they were unsuccessful in their efforts of locating the suspects.

One of the suspects was described as a black male, 5 feet 7 inches tall with a thin build, weighing 150-160 pounds, with a shaved head and wearing a black shirt and blue jeans. A second suspect is described as a black male, 5 feet 7 inches tall with large build, weighing about 170 pounds and wearing a dark sweater.

Canine helps arrest burglary suspect

New Castle County Police arrested John Deldeo, 48, of Foxwood Apartments in Newark Tuesday morning, May 7, on charges of burglary in the third degree, possession of a deadly weapon during the commission of a felony and resisting arrest.

Deldeo was apprehended

by a police canine while hiding in the bedroom of an apartment in the Silver Springs apartment complex, and was in possession of two 8-inch butcher knives at the time of his apprehension, police said.

At 12:54 a.m. Tuesday, county police responded to the unit block of Mary Ella Drive for a report of several disorderly subjects in the area. When officers arrived, they entered the building and observed that a lower-level apartment door was ajar and damaged.

Cpl. Mousley immediately responded to his patrol vehicle and retrieved his canine partner "Quattro" and then returned to the apartment to conduct a search of the residence. Mousley proceeded to make several canine announcements, and after receiving no response, he and the canine began clearing the home. A short time later, Quattro detected an odor of human scent as they headed into the master bedroom. Quattro located Deldeo, hiding in the corner of the room behind the bed. The canine engaged Deldeo and he was taken into custody. Deldeo sustained puncture wounds to his arm and upper back and was transported to Christiana Hospital by ambulance personnel and was treated for his injuries and released into police custody.

which time the police department began a joint investigation with the Attorney General's Office and the Division of Professional Regulations.

Leroy was arrested on five counts of unlawful sexual contact. He was released after posting \$2,500 secured bond.

Newark Police spokesman Lt. Mark Farrall said Tuesday that, since Leroy's arrest, more people have come forward with additional information that may lead to more charges against Leroy.

"We're looking into the possibility that there may be additional victims," Farrall said. "We encourage anyone with information regarding Dr. Leroy to contact Detective Sansone of the Newark Police Department."

The alleged crimes that led to Leroy's most recent arrest also violated terms of a 1994 agreement with the state, said Delaware Department of State spokesman Christopher Portante.

In 1992, a complaint of sexual misconduct resulted in Leroy's arrest and a suspension of his medical license for six months. He was placed on probation for two and a half years, and as part of an agreement with the state, he was ordered not to treat female patients without the presence of a female chaperone for as long as he practiced medicine, Portante said.

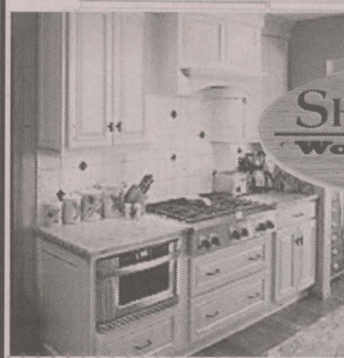

in 2001 — but during his tenure, Bryan competed at an event in Wilmington that helped pave the way for his current worldwide success.

"Actually, the show that really made my name was there in Delaware and was called the Super 8, which was a huge show on the independent level," Bryan recalled. "These guys put me in this tournament and I got to the finals, and that really helped make my name. That's really what got my name out there on the independents."

Bryan also developed an affinity for the people of

Delaware, both those within the business and the loyal fans cheering on from ringside.

"Just the kindness of everybody around, especially the people who worked for that promotion," Bryan explained. "It was like a team. Everybody was trying to build each other up to put on the best show possible, and that's what I remember most about that time period."

These days, Bryan showcases his talents for the WWE Universe, the most high-profile organization of its kind anywhere in the world. Yet, he realizes and fully embraces how important of a link his past has

proven to be with his present and future.

From his earliest go-round with the WWE some 13 years ago to his latest stint, which began in August of 2010, Bryan believes his extensive travels have helped him truly develop his mat skills and the persona with which today's viewers have grown accustomed.

"It's strange because I'm way more outgoing now than I was," he said with a laugh. "I think you grow into your personality, especially in your 20s when you're traveling the world and doing all that kind of stuff. You really find out who you are, that sort of thing. But then, from a professional standpoint, I've just honed my craft so much more, going to all those different countries, wrestling all

those different top names from all over the world and people within the WWE."

INTO THE LIMELIGHT

A little over a month after his return to the WWE in 2010, Bryan won the United States Championship, his first singles title with the company. He finally reached the pinnacle this past winter with his World Heavyweight Championship victory, but it actually wasn't until the title reign ended that current Las Vegas resident's career truly reached a full-on frenzy.

On "Monday Night RAW" the day after "WrestleMania," the fans completely latched on to Bryan's infamous chant of "YES! YES! YES!" and they've turned it into a

bonafide global trend ever since, an experience the WWE Superstar described simply as amazing. Bryan said he started yelling the most notorious word in WWE circles as part of his World Heavyweight Championship victory celebration. Inspired by UFC fighter Diego Sanchez, Bryan then began exclaiming it on the way to the ring before his matches.

In seemingly an instant, WWE fans found ways to incorporate "YES! YES! YES!" into every segment at live events, the company released a T-shirt with the three-letter word plastered all over the front and Bryan appeared in Esquire magazine to discuss the catchphrase's merits.

However, as he prepares to make his triumphant return to Delaware on Saturday, Bryan

attributes his rise to mainstream status to another word, one perhaps way more prevalent in his vocabulary than "YES."

"I think a lot of it is opportunity," Bryan explained. "Sometimes you don't really get the opportunity to show your personality or your skill set and that sort of thing. Until December that I was able to show what I can do, so it's just, a lot of it is opportunity, and there's a lot of it on the WWE roster who, if you give them the same opportunity, they can really go out there and do something amazing, but all about getting those opportunities, which is hard."

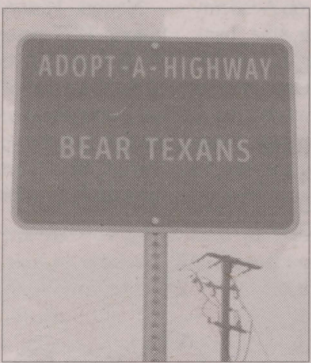

Bear Texans tackle more than football

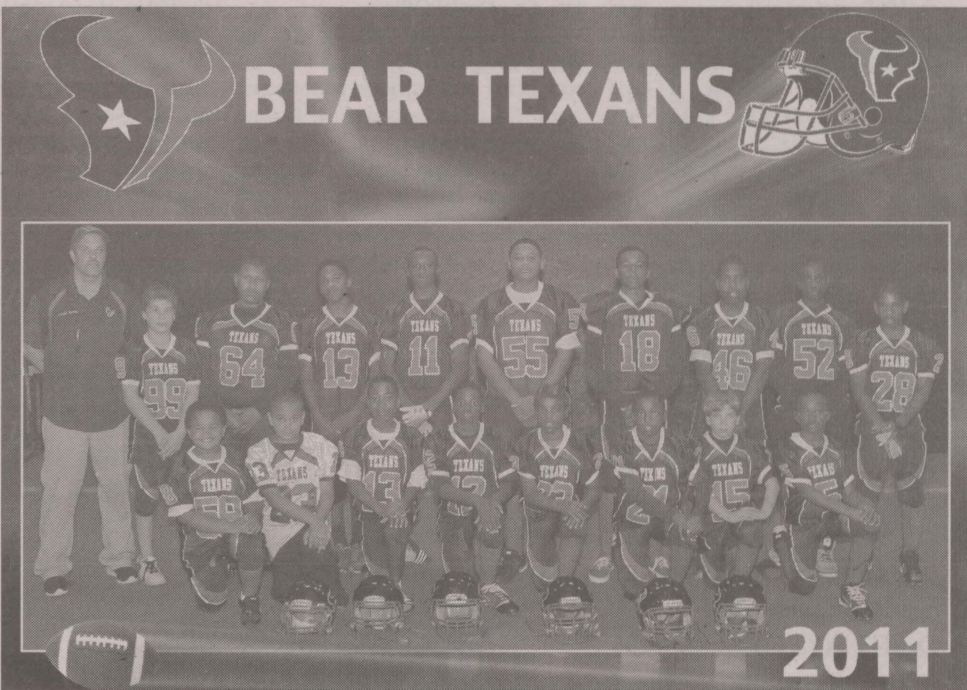

Tackle football is a hard-hitting, smash-mouth, punting game on just about every level it's played. On the field, that is. Off the field, the Bear Texans stress much more on the number of touchdowns scored or tackles made. And this philosophy is the backbone of the club and the reason that, after just one season, it has left its original league (Soldiers First State Preparatory League) to become an independent club. "I had a bigger vision for the team and decided to make the team independent," said Kevin Coy, club president and head coach. "Part of that vision is a football cheer program that is part of the community and part of our young people's lives." The Texans offer a team of four age groups — 8, 9 to 10, 11 to 12 and 13 to 15 — and compete in the First State Preparatory American Youth Football League. Coy said the league would double in size this fall, from five to 10 clubs with teams in each age division. The Texans also want to develop at least two cheerleaders that will support all

four age groups. The club is sanctioned by American Youth Football, which has teams all across the country and hosts a national championship in Florida. But before any of the Texan teams can think about what to pack for a trip south, they must first win the league's championship here in the First State. "Our 'Super Bowl' is played right here in Newark at Delaware Stadium," Coy said proudly. "The winner of each of the four age groups will have the chance to play for the national title in Florida." While national titles would be nice, Coy stressed that they are not the club's ultimate goal. "We want to be an organization that the Bear community can get behind," said Coy, whose football career ended after juniors because his Pennsylvania high school didn't have a team. "We want the community to be a part of us and us to be a part of them. I want all of our kids to be successful in whatever they do, and be there to help them along the way, not just in football, but in life." That help includes coaches sometimes securing small donations to sponsor a child



who otherwise could not afford to play, or a volunteer tutor assigned to a player whose school average falls below a "C" level. And on Sunday afternoons, the club offers a free clinic from 2 to 4 p.m. at Glasgow Park. The clinics are open to anyone interested. There is no equipment necessary and no obligation to join the club. Unrelated to football, the Texans have adopted the highway along Salem Church Road between Route 40 and Baltimore Pike. Coy said they chose that road because it's near the club's sponsor, Jake's Wayback Burgers, in the Salem Center. Coy said that for the club to reach its goals, it's going to take hard work from not only the coaches and players, but another important group of people.

"No organization can be successful without the help of the parents," he stressed. Although in its infancy, clearly the Bear Texans have organized a strong club that is proud of what they have to offer. It's a theme that blends perfectly with its nickname and logo. "We chose the Texans because their NFL logo is bold, proud and strong," said Coy, an avid Eagles fan. "And, because nobody hates the Texans." 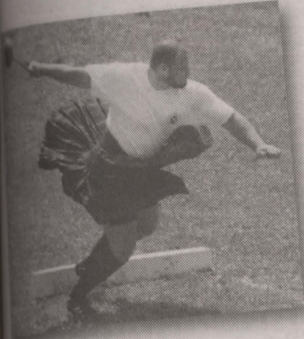

Former bank building now has a lot of teeth

This week's Out of the Attic item is an early 1900s picture of the Newark Trust and Safe Deposit Box office, first located on Academy Street in the back corner of the Caskey Hall Building. David Caskey built this building in 1895 and gave it his name. His home was directly across Main Street behind the row of trees in this picture. Today it is known

as the Green Mansion and houses the Drs. Cox Dental Offices.

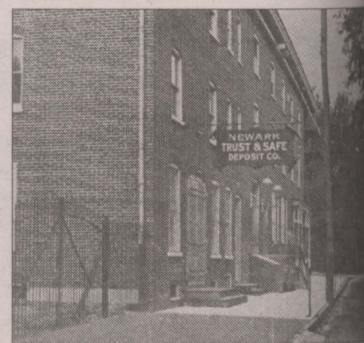
The partnership of Wright and Dayett bought Caskey Hall in 1902 and remodeled it to include performance space for theater, vaudeville, lectures and other gatherings.

Samuel Wright of the partnership founded the bank in 1905. The bank

used space at the southeast corner of the Opera House opening on Academy Street. Some years later, the bank moved to a new building at 87 East Main Street between the Opera House and the Newark Public School building. The Bank has been through a succession of mergers during the last 50 years and currently operates in Newark

under the name Citizen's Bank.

Newark History Museum is in the historic 1877 passenger train station on South College Avenue beside the bridge on the town side of the tracks. The museum is open Sundays from 2 to 5 p.m. now through November. The museum will be open at other times all year by appointment made by calling 368-9845.

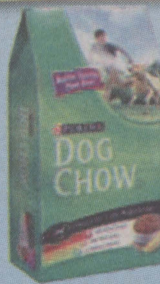

Out of the race — but still in the game

Group gives retired racing greyhounds a fresh start off the track

Jim Flynn and his wife, Paula, didn't expect their first dog from Greyhound Rescue of America's Delaware chapter to race so quickly into their hearts.

They'd just lost their elderly black Lab a few months earlier, and thought fostering would be a good way to have dogs in their lives without the long-term commitment of owner-

ship. But in the end, it was too hard to resist the brindle greyhound's soft doe eyes and calm, affectionate personality.

"We fell in love with the first dog we fostered, and we ended up adopting that dog," Flynn said. "We didn't realize we would be that vulnerable to a nice dog."

Gracie still lives with the Flynn's at their Fairfield home in Newark, along with Desi, another greyhound that also started out as a foster.

The Flynn's aren't the only Newark residents who have fallen in love with retired racing greyhounds. Since it was founded in 2005, GPA Delaware has placed about 170 greyhounds in loving homes; many of them are now spending their retirement years in Newark.

Delaware was one of the last states in the U.S. without a retired greyhound rescue group.

"We formed because there was a need to let the public know how many greyhounds are available once they are retired from racing; there are thousands," said Camille Kozlowski, GPA Delaware president. "There was a need to promote greyhound awareness and adoption."

Greyhound racing is a dying industry as fewer people fre-

quent the few remaining race-tracks in the country. Most recently, several tracks closed in the northeast. Florida is still the hub of greyhound racing, and is where GPA Delaware concentrates its adoption efforts.

Greyhound advocates from Florida regularly drive a customized trailer up the East Coast to deliver newly retired dogs to various rescue groups. GPA Delaware usually accepts about four new dogs into its foster system each month.

"The greyhounds are retired for various reasons. Most either failed as racers or became too old to race. (Successful racing greyhounds are usually retired around 4 years old.)

More than a decade ago, it was estimated that more than 20,000 racing greyhounds were euthanized each year. Those numbers have been dramatically reduced, due to the efforts of rescue groups across the country, but the annual euthanization numbers are still reportedly in the thousands.

"It's the lucky ones who end up in groups like ours," Kozlowski said. "There are a lot of adoption groups, but not nearly enough to rescue all of them."

GPA Delaware doesn't have a kennel, so the group depends on its foster network to save as

many dogs as possible.

"Foster families are the key to our organization," said Gail Rys, vice president and foster coordinator. "I can only bring in the number of dogs I have foster families for. We always need more foster families."

The group has about 12 regular foster homes, including the Flynn's. The couple has fostered about three or four dogs since joining GPA Delaware in 2009.

"If someone isn't ready to have a dog on a full-time basis, fostering is a very rich experience," Flynn said. "What's great about fostering is, you get to work with a dog and see the dog blossom and you get to see the dog go into a good home. If someone wanted to have a very positive, but part-time continuing relationship with animals, then fostering is the way to go."

GPA Delaware's foster families care for the newly retired greyhounds until they are placed in permanent homes. That includes acclimating the dogs to life inside a house and teaching them basic manners. Since racing greyhounds live in kennels their entire lives, they have to be introduced to household items like stairs,

hardwood floors and noisy appliances.

Because of their life at the track, most greyhounds are already house-trained and leash-trained.

GPA Delaware covers all fostering costs, except food. The average commitment to foster is about four to eight weeks.

To increase the greyhounds' exposure and boost adoptions, members of the group host "meet and greets" and attend community events around the region (see box).

These are perfect opportunities to educate the public about the breed. Many people assume greyhounds are hyper because they were racers. Those who know the breed well often describe them as gentle, calm, quiet and affectionate.

Greyhounds are sometimes called the world's largest couch potatoes because of their love for lounging and long naps. Their personalities can be more feline than canine.

Another misconception is that greyhounds need a lot of exercise. They do enjoy walks outside or taking an impromptu lap around the dog park, but they don't require lengthy or

strenuous exercise. Greyhounds do need to be kept in either a fenced-in area or on a leash at all times.

"They are sight hounds," Kozlowski said. "A greyhound's tendency is to chase if it sees a squirrel or rabbit outside, and they're extremely fast. They can hit 35 mph in three strides. We tell people they can't give the dog an opportunity to escape."
