Main St. The building will include space for a 100-seat restaurant and 10 apartments. About 370 people participate in the second annual, noncompetitive 5k walk/run honoring former city police chief William Nefosky, whose 28year career with the Newark Police Department was cut short by cancer in 2007. The event, sponsored by the Newark Fraternal Order of Police, raises \$8,100 for the American Cancer Society.

The Christina District school board votes unani-mously to explore the sale of the 124-year-old Old Newark Comprehensive School at 83 E. Main St. in an effort to raise funds for capital projects. The building, which had served as a high school, a primary school and the administrative headquarters of two school districts. was shuttered in 2004.

#### May

David Palmer, the senior pastor at Newark United Methodist Church on East Main Street, convinces the Christiana School District's board of education to hold off on accepting the University of Delaware's \$1.6 million offer to purchase the 124-year-old Old Newark Comprehensive School on East Main Street. Palmer says the church's inquires into the property's availability were ignored and asks for more time to make a proper bid.

Newark City Council adopts the so-called "party bill," which changes an existing city law requiring city permits for events attended by 250 people by lowering the attendance threshold to 150 people. The proposal is adopted two days after an annual block party on Chapel Street where police arrested 50 people.

o more excuses. Make the time in 2009 for exercise. The days of two and three hour workouts are over. You can be in and out of the gym in about 45 minutes so make the time.

Perhaps the most often repeated New Year's resolution is the one about getting in better shape and losing weight. With the economy in flux and our stress levels being jarred along with it, taking time this year to take care of yourself is more important than ever. As a personal trainer, it is

my mission to help people reach their goals and become healthier. I have devised a simple workout you can follow to stay in shape. I urge you to make the time at least once a week to do it.

It's a full body workout. Your repetitions should be between 12 and 20, with two to three sets of each. Exercises #1 through #9 should be consecutive with no rest periods in between.

After Exercise #9, take a

Cardiovascular warm-up 5-10 minutes

2 Dumbbell bench press on Swiss ball 3 Dumbbell standing lunges

5 Standing overhead dumbbell press

6 Alternating dumbbell bicep curl 7 Tricep dips on Gravitron

9 Spinal extension on Swiss ball

Cardiovascular cool-down 5-10 minutes

1 Dumbbell Sumo squats

4 Pull-ups on Gravitron

8 Swiss ball crunch

Exercise

three-minute rest period before performing your second set. Perform this two to three times. As always, be sure to warm up for five to ten minutes before exercising and cool down for five to ten minutes afterwards.

Performing a workout like this once or twice a week should help you get into better shape without taking up too much of your time. Remember, these are just suggestions. Everybody has a different genetic make-up and what works for some may not work for others. Always consult a physician before performing an exercise routine.

before the state beverage control commissioner to require the new restaurant to meet the same deck restrictions as previous establishments in the same location.

The University of Delaware announces the incoming freshman class will total 3,562 students. The university also announces that in the fall instate tuition will increase 6 percent to \$7,780 year, while out-of-state tuition will climb 9 percent to \$20,260 a year.

Major crime in Newark appears to be on a slight decline in 2008 based on the first six months of statistics provided by the city police department. Seven of the 23 major criminal categories routinely tracked by the Newark Police Department show a measurable decline in crimes leading to investigations in the first six months of 2008 compared to the first six months of 2007.

Developer Gus Tsionas wins City Council's approval to tear down the rear portion of the Korner Diner on East Main Street to build a three-story building with six apartments, a parking garage and a new kitchen for the restaurant.

Fire, police and emergency responders from three states conduct a full-scale disaster exercise at the University of Delaware's Gilbert Hall A that includes more than 100 volunteers from the university, the Boy Scouts and other local organizations.

The Town & Gown Environmental Cooperative's second annual UDon't Need

It program, which collects discarded items from departing University of Delaware students, diverts 90 tons of trash from the county landfill, saving the city \$6,000 in tipping fees. Most of the discarded items are donated to charity or sold to the public at discount prices.

#### August

Newark Natural Foods completes a six-month, halfmillion-dollar expansion project that doubles the size of the cooperative grocery store, replaces the 23-year-old floor, while adding a new produce cooler and a 20-foot freezer.

The deadline to register as a candidate in the state primary election in September brings only two intra-party showdowns for state legislative states that represent Newark.

Newark Ĉity Council officially recognizes the bravery and dedicated served of Newark Police Officer Daniel J. State, county and city officials join Delaware Transportation Secretary Carolann Wicks in officially opening the \$1.2 million Newark Transit Hub between East Main Street and Delaware Avenue. The state and federally funded project will serve as a centralized transfer point for six DART buses that previously had stops in city neighborhoods, as well as the Newark

City Council sponsors separate meet-and-greet sessions between city residents and the three finalists for the city manager job. The finalists include Roy Lopata, the city's planning director for 32 years and the interim city manager since March; Richard M. Finn, the former city manager of Takoma Park, Md.; and Kyle R. Sonnenberg, a current assistant city manager for Fayetteville, N.C.

DelDOT officials announce that the intersection of Elkton and Apple roads will be among the first in the state to be outfitted with an auditory crosswalk signal to aide the visually impaired, thanks in part to a suggestion made by Jack Billingsley, a retired DuPont Co. engineer who served as a state representative in Newark during the late 1960s and early 1970s.

Fire officials praise the staff of the Embassy Suites on South College Avenue for their quick action in evacuating 140 rooms in the six-story hotel when a fire at 1:30 a.m. causes damage to five rooms on two floors.

City officials announces that Newark's electricity customers can expect to see a 17.5-percent rate increase reflected in their August bills, as a result of spikes in the wholesale prices paid by the city. The rate increase, which took effect a month earlier, was imposed without pubic hearings or an official vote by City Council.

Three University of Delaware students are robbed at gunpoint while walking on Haines Street at 1:15 a.m. Two female victims are beaten and choked by their muggers who make off with two purses and some cash.

Two men on Winslow Road mug a 26-year-old University of Delaware graduate student at gunpoint.

#### September

Newark native Jack Markell upsets Lt. Gov. John Carney in the state Democratic gubernatorial primary. Democrat John Mackenzie defeats Michael Terranova for the right to face Republican state Sen. Liane Sorenson in November. Meanwhile, Republican James Weldin defeats Andrea Daley for the right to face state Rep. Bethany Hall-Long, a Democrat, for the seat vacated by retiring state Sen. Steven Amick.



More than 150 people participate in the second annual Main Street Mile footrace, which raised in excess of \$5,000 to help the Newark Police Department fund its K-9 officers.

Breakfast cereal will makes the leap from the kitchen table to East Main Street when The Cereal Bowl opens its second franchise outside of Florida at the corner of East Main and North Chapel Streets.

City Council makes new City Manager Kyle A. Sonnenberg its highest-paid employee by unanimously granting him a \$140,000 salary - \$22,000 more than former city manager Carl Luft who retired after 21 years on the job.

Retired Newark police Lt. Susan Poley, the Poley family of Newark, UD College of Health Sciences' Dean Betty Paulanka and the Newark Post are awarded honors by Special Olympics Delaware during a "Night of Heroes" recognition dinner.

Tim Herman, the secondgeneration owner of 41-yearold Herman's Quality Meat Shoppe on Cleveland Avenue dies from prostate cancer just weeks before his 59th birthday. Christine Herman, Tim's wife of 20 years, says she plans keep the business open, while she continues to look for a potential buyer.

Newark resident Pamela Hamill demands an apology from Democratic vice presidential candidate U.S. Sen. Joseph Biden for falsely accusing her father of being drunk during his 1972 accident that took the life of the newly elected senator's first wife and 13month-old daughter.

Daimler-Chrysler announces it will close its Newark manufacturing plant by the end of the year instead of at the start of 2009. Although the company does not release any comment about the status of the property's sale, city officials say they've been told many of the offers dried up as a result of the nation's credit crunch.

#### November

Five local arts and culture organizations team up with seven Newark restaurants for The Mosaic's third annual Masquerade Gala at the University of Delaware's Trabant Center. Democratic vice presidential candidate U.S. Sen. Joseph Biden holds a rally at his alma mater that draws more than 6,000 people to Memorial Hall just four days before he and U.S. Sen. Barack Obama are elected to the White House over Republican presidential candidate U.S. Sen. John McCain and Alaska Gov. Sarah Palin. Newark native Jack Markell is elected Delaware's next governor.

Newark Post columnist, educator, radio host and arts champion Philip (Phil) Toman dies at the age of 77.



#### December

Thousands of people pack East Main Street to watch as Santa Claus lights the city's holiday tree, to race in the Special Olympics of Delaware's 5k and 3k Reindeer Run, or to enjoy any of the other festive activities at this year's Winterfest celebration.

Newark City Council approves a \$35.9 million bud-get for 2009 that includes a much smaller property tax increase than expected, the promise of cheaper electricity next year and three of the five new officers requested by Newark Police Chief Paul Tiernan.

The University of Delaware's Board of Trustees instructs its executive committee to pursue a deal for

Daimler-Chrysler's 270-acre property in Newark. The university is reported to be the only serious buyer left although a deal is complicated by the auto manufacturer's request for a bail out from the U.S. government.

The Christiana and Red Clay Consolidated School Districts are officially freed of oversight by Financial Recovery Team created two years ago to monitor the financially struggling districts.

Newark resident Aaron Weber, a staff sergeant in the Delaware Air National Guard, is among the first airmen in the state to receive the Air Force Combat Action Medal for his involvement in a July convoy ambush in Afghanistan.

A man accused of kidnapping his 19-year-old girlfriend from Newark in November is deported before he can stand trial in Maryland where police apprehended him after the girl jumped from his moving car on Interstate 95.

#### May

University of Delaware All-American quarterback Joe Flacco becomes the first player in Delaware football history to be selected in the first round of the National Football League draft Saturday when he is by the Baltimore Ravens with the 18th overall pick.

Newark's high-powered offense was working at full throttle in a 5-0 victory over Dickinson Monday evening in a girl's non-conference soccer match played at the Lady Rams home field.

Although Mark Freidly isn't making any predictions, the Newark High golf coach says he is convinced his Yellowjackets are capable of competing with the best teams in the state.

Newark girls' soccer team's season came to an abrupt end with a 1-0 loss to undefeated Caesar Rodney in the opening round of the 2008 Delaware High School Girls Soccer Tournament. Newark, the tournament's 15th seed, finished the season with an 11-5-1 record.

The Middletown Cavaliers scored two runs in the top of the eighth inning to defeat Newark 6-5 in the quarterfinal round of the 2008 State Baseball Tournament at Frawley Stadium in Wilmington.

#### June

Salesianum win the 2007 high school golf title at Wild Quail Country Club, while St. Mark's takes second and Newark High claims third in the 36-hole tournament.

Keith Handling, a University of Delaware graduate teacher and athletic trainer for 35 years receives the Ted Quedenfeld Award from the Philadelphia Sports Medicine Congress.

University of Delaware football head coach K. C. Keeler, who in just six seasons at the helm has led the Blue Hens to national prominence with an NCAA title in 2003 and a national runner-up finish in the fall, is granted a 10-year contract extension.

#### July

Kevin Mench got a second major league chance in Toronto this spring after beginning the season with Triple A Oklahoma City, but the Newark native and former University of Delaware slugger is back in the minor leagues with the Syracuse Chiefs.

The University of Delaware was among five Colonial Athletic Association teams picked in the national top 10 and four Blue Hen players earned pre-season honors in the Lindy's College Football Preview Magazine.

#### August

Hens set to start practice The University of Delaware program nearly breaks its record for season tickets sales including nearly 2,500 tickets sold for the Blue Hens' season opener at the University of Maryland.

Along with 14 returning starters, University of Delaware football coach K.C. Keeler has seven transfers from six different major colleges to help lay the 2008 groundwork for another outstanding season.

The Bear Babe Ruth 12and-under baseball team wins a national championship at the Cal Ripken World Series in Martin, Tennessee by defeating Kennewick (Wash.) 3-2 in the championship game.

Newark High School boasts 10 state championships, nine of them under head coach Butch Simpson, who is entering his 32nd season at the helm of the Yellowjacket football program. Delaware's all-time winningest coach (244) has 31 seniors returning for the 2008 season.

#### September

Newark High School's football team opens its season in nightmarish fashion when Salesianum junior Ferrante Giovanni returns the opening kickoff 82 yards for a touchdown before most fans were settled into their seats at Hoffman Stadium.

After beginning the season with a loss at Maryland, a team that just thumped nationally ranked California last Saturday, the Blue Hen football team is back on the road at Furman.

It doesn't matter during what part of the schedule this annual rivalry is played. It doesn't matter what the team records are or who won last year. And it doesn't matter whether the game is played at Hoffman or Baynard Stadium. The annual St. Mark's – Newark game is big no matter what.

#### October

In the University of Delaware's first four games, the Blue Hens defeated West Chester and Albany. They could have beaten Maryland with a little luck and Coach K.C. Keller believes his Blue Hens should have defeated Furman. But Saturday in Amherst, Massachusetts, the Blue Hens almost have to beat the Minutemen to avoid being pushed to the brink in their quest for a place in the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision playoffs. With less than five miles

St. Mark's senior Greg Morrin travels to another state park last Friday eager to run away with another Delaware title during a crosscountry running season in which he has dominated.




The 16th annual Beast of the East gets underway with a record 89 teams and seven defending champions competing. In all, 11 of the top 30 teams in the country come
