
Plan:

Delaware Schools

VOTE TO IMPROVE DELAWARE SCHOOLS

Despite Delaware ranking 12th in per capita student spending and many years of politicians promising to fix our schools, only 28% of Delaware high school students demonstrated proficiency in math ¹. Reading proficiency was 50%. Both were down slightly from the previous year. SAT scores are also declining ². These numbers don't make sense. Further, from 1997 to 2017, student enrollment increased by 23%. However, the amount of administration increased by 89% ³. We need to decrease the administrative costs and paperwork on schools and give principals and teachers the freedom to be innovative in their schools and classrooms. Additionally, we must take measures to improve safety in our public schools.

As a physician, I've seen how the high cost of insurance and medication has hurt families. Graduating as a member of the medical honor society, she obtained her medical degree from New York Medical College while working in a substance abuse clinic in Harlem


She completed her residency in Internal Medicine and then became the medical director of two homeless shelters in N.Y.C.



Opposes late-term abortion when the mother's life is not in danger. Supports the pain capable abortion bill, which bars abortions of fetuses that are developed enough to feel pain



ECONOMY

PROTECTING CHILDREN



While a private citizen, worked to stop Regulation 225 and its potentially harmful consequences and remains determined to continue to work for the families and children of Delaware

Voted to eliminate the basic proficiency test for teacher licensure in core subjects such as math and reading (HB 143)



SCHOOLS



Believes teachers should show proficiency in core areas like Math and English; decreasing administrative overhead will help fund additional teachers and more competitive teacher pay

Failed to protect our children by voting for a bill that only allowed about \$20,000 for each Delaware school to use to make safety improvements



SCHOOL SAFETY



Supports proposed school safety bill SB 215, which would use some of the budget surplus dollars to make our schools saferallotting almost 15x more money to school safety than the approved bill-because our children are worth it

Voted to make it illegal for doctors and therapist to give minors with gender dysphoria* any counseling that aligns with the child's or teens biological gender

Supports the rights of parents, patients and doctors to have free communication about all options of care available and the right of people to receive the best advice the doctor can give


