

Brasher Announces New Pepper Variety With Development Of "Delaware Belle"

A new pepper variety, Delaware Belle, which combines high production and resistance to tobaccomosaic has been released by the Delaware Agricultural Experiment Station. According to Professor E. P. Brasher, chairman of the department of horticulture at the University of Delaware, it is an outstanding pepper for the fresh market as well as for processing. It represents 12 years of intensive plant breeding and selection.

The fruits of Delaware Belle are arger, blockier, and have thicker valls than those of California Wonter which has been a favorite varety. They are glossy green, in the mmature stage and ripen to a deep ed throughout.

Delaware Belles have out-yielded all other varieties tested at the University of Delaware, according to Brasher. This season they produced 18.72 tons of marketable green peppers per acre. The plants grow to a height of 18 to 24 inches with adequate foliage to protect the fruit from sunscald. In additiony, they are résistant to tobacco mosaic, a troublesome pepper disease.

Development of the new variety began in 1949, when Professor Brasher started a hybridization and selection program involving a special strain of California Wonder and a number variety, 52-12, developed by Dr. C. M. Haensler at Rutgers University.







"Book Larnin'" Up Library Chairman Reports At U.D.

Use of books at the University of Delaware library has nearly doubled in the last five years, Dr. John A. Munroe, chairman of the university faculty library commit-tee reports.

At a time when nationwide emphasis is being placed on modern techniques such as audio-visual aids, teaching machines and closed circuit television, it is evident that old fashioned "book larnin" still holds an important place on the educational scene.

Reporting recently on library progress to faculty colleagues, Dr. Munroe noted that in 1955-56, the per student use of library books was 14 volumes.

In 1960-61, the annual use per student had risen to 25 volumes, a figure reflecting both faculty emphasis on scholarship and seriousness of purpose on the part of students.

Student requests last year led to an extension of library hours to 11 o'clock in the main reading room. During the regular academic year, the library was open 96 hours each week and in examination periods, additional evening hours were scheduled, extending the work week of the library staff to 102 hours.

In 1960-61 17,794 volumes were added to the library collections, as were 4,131 reels of microfilm and 3,242 microprint titles. The library now has \$28,292 volumes.






