TO THE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 141ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY: Pursuant to Article III, Section 18 of the Delaware Constitution, I am vetoing **House Bill 630** by

returning it to the House of Representatives without my signature for reconsideration.

House Bill 630 would provide no new benefit to the State of Delaware, but would impose substantial new burdens on the State. The sheriff of New Castle County has long had responsibility for the handling of persons who turn themselves in at the courthouse, and the transportation of new prisoners. The sheriff has carried out those responsibilities under the county's existing budget. **H.B. 630** would transfer these responsibilities, along with their costs, to the State. Although **H.B. 630** calls for New Castle County to pay \$600,000 to the State over two years to defray its cost, that payment may not cover the cost of **H.B. 630** to the state during that time period. It would certainly not cover the cost in subsequent years when no payment would be forthcoming from New Castle County. In the long term, **H.B. 630** requires the State to assume a new financial burden with no accompanying benefit to taxpayers.

House **Bill 630** could also jeopardize the safety and security of state facilities at a time when the State is attempting to enhance the security of those facilities. **H.B. 630** would require the Capitol Police to assume the duties of the New Castle County sheriff immediately. However, the Capitol Police cannot recruit new officers, have them trained at the State Police Academy and have them certified as police officers until at least next July. For the next year, then, **H.B. 630** could require the State to compromise the safety of state facilities that are currently protected by the Capitol Police. Given the State's heightened state of alert following the terrorist attacks of September 11th, it would be extremely irresponsible to degrade the quality of protection of state facilities.

Finally, **House Bill 630** would expose the State to potential litigation because it would divert Correctional Officers into prisoner transport duties, and thereby interfere with the State's efforts to use those officers to staff a new housing unit at the Delaware Correctional Center. The State is currently involved in litigation regarding alleged overcrowding at its prisons, and although the State believes that it will prevail in this litigation, interference with the State's plans to expand its number of prison beds would expose the State to new legal risks.

In sum, **H.B. 630** will cost the State money but provide no new services, jeopardize the State's physical structures and employees, and expose the State to potentially costly litigation. For these reasons, I am vetoing **H.B. 630** by returning it to the House of Representatives without my signature for reconsideration.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 141ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY:

Pursuant to Article III, Section 18 of the Delaware Constitution, I am vetoing **House Bill 108** by returning it to the House of Representatives without my signature for reconsideration. I am vetoing this bill because it would provide little or no benefit to teachers and other state employees, but would create the risk of double-dipping in the pension fund.

House Bill 108 involves people who have had "service with" Jobs for Delaware Graduates, an excellent program in our high schools. The bill purports to allow persons who have provided service to JDG

the right to buy into the state's pension program for each year of JDG service up to five years, by paying the actuarial cost of the pension benefits that would later be derived.

It does not appear that an substantial monetary benefit would accrue to former JDG personnel as a result of **House Bill 108**, because the benefits it purports to offer would be prohibitively expensive for retiring employees to purchase. For example, our state pension office has calculated that under **H.B. 108**, a state employee retiring at age 60 with an average salary of \$50,000 would need to make a lump sum payment of \$10, 250 at the time of retirement in order to purchase one additional year of service for his or her pension. That additional year of service would increase the employee's monthly pension by only \$83.33. Charging retiring teachers at age 60 over \$10,000 for an eighty dollar monthly pension augmentation is not providing them with a real benefit.

If the questionable value of the benefit provided were the only problem with **House Bill 108**, I might have signed it into law and allowed its would-be beneficiaries to make their own decisions regarding a buy-in option. However, **H.B. 108** is also unclear as to what "service with" Jobs for Delaware Graduates means, as the JDG program is served by full-time private employees, but also takes advantage of the service of non-employees to serve on its board and assist with other JDG tasks. Current Delaware law requires that persons seeking to buy into the state pension plan based on prior service outside state employment have served as full-time employees in their prior service, but **H.B. 108** omits this important qualification.

Under existing law, state employees who have had five years of any "service with this state" are already entitled to buy into the state's pension program in the same manner allowed by **House Bill 108**. 29 <u>Del.C. § 5501(8)</u>. However, existing law allows persons who provided prior service to the state to buy into the pension plan only if that service would not result in pension credit in another Delaware state pension plan. **H.B. 108** has no such caveat. Therefore, persons who provided JDG service at the same time as they were state or public school employees would be permitted by **H.B. 108** to double-dip in the pension fund, whereas persons who provided other services to the state would (properly) be prohibited from doing so. Before I could consider signing a bill similar to **H.B. 108**, the language of the bill would need to be clarified to clearly delineate those who would be entitled to claim its benefits and to prohibit those persons from receiving two state pension statute because of judicial rules that require that the pension statute be construed liberally in favor of recipients. Jobs for Delaware Graduates is a worthwhile program, and I hope that the 142nd General Assembly will enact legislation that does not have the technical deficiencies of **House Bill 108**. Because of the limited monetary value of the benefits provided by **H. B. 108**, I am satisfied that no economic hardship will accrue to any former JDG employee by my insistence upon a technically adequate bill.

As Governor of Wisconsin, and now in his current role, Secretary Thompson has been a steady supporter of Taiwan's efforts to participate appropriately in international organizations. He strongly believes that the people of Taiwan should be able to contribute to, and benefit from, the work of the World Health Organization (WHO). Furthermore, the world community should benefit from Taiwan's increased participation and partnership in addressing global public health challenges. Taiwan has some of the best minds in public health, biomedical research, and related fields. The United States will continue to work with Taiwan and the WHO on practical participation for Taiwan in the work of the organization.

The Administration has worked closely with Taiwan on our shred goal of Taiwan's participation as an observer at the World Health Assembly. Although the WHO Constitution precludes Taiwan from becoming a member of the organization, we support the World Health Assembly's inviting Taiwan to participate as an observer in its proceedings. Nevertheless, as we expected, observer status was not achievable this year. During my tenure as Speaker of the House, communications and cooperation between the Governor's Office and the House of Representatives have always been excellent. It is my wish to continue that fine tradition. To that end, there is a problem we must address.

On Friday, July 12, 2002, our Chief Clerk was out of the office to attend the funeral service for Representative Buckworth's Dad. The service was held in Elkton. Since she lives in Newark, the Clerk elected not to drive to the office in Dover on a Friday afternoon. However, she was available by phone all day.

Article III, §18 of the Delaware Constitution of 1897 states in part "...the Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate shall be deemed proper recipients of such returned bills during recess...". We take that responsibility very seriously. The Chief Clerk provided members of your staff with multiple phone numbers where she may be reached when she is out of the office.

On the day in question, she was totally unaware that a veto may be necessary. In fact, it was not necessary on that day, as July 12 was the ninth day following delivery of **HB 108** to your office. It appears that attempts to reach the Clerk fell short of using all the phone numbers she had previously provided.

House Leadership rather that the Speaker of the House was contacted when your staff thought the Clerk to be unavailable. Being unaware of the proper procedure, a House staff member was directed to accept the bill and sign the receipt "on behalf of the Chief Clerk of the House" and the staff member acted accordingly.

In addition to the improper delivery and acceptance of the bill, there is another problem with the veto of **HB 108** and it is that your signature on the veto message is not an original signature.

I have consulted with one of our House attorneys and it is our belief that **HB 108** is improperly vetoed. Please let me know how you wish to proceed. I can state unequivocally that our Chief Clerk has always been very conscientious about notifying administration officials when she is not going to be available. In the past, she has sent memoranda to the Governor's legal counsel to inform him where she will be, when she will return and who is authorized to accept any communications in her absence.

In addition, during previous administrations, when the ten-day deadline was fast approaching, JoAnn has been known to accommodate the schedules of executive staff members. Situations such as meeting someone halfway between Newark and Dover to receive a veto, interrupting a family dinner at a restaurant, inviting the liaison to her daughter's home, et cetera, are testimony to the fact that she is more than willing to assure the timely delivery and acceptance of a veto.

We need to work together to resolve the current issue and to make sure that there are no future problems with delivery and receipt of vetoed legislation.
