Gilligan, as well as staff members from both Caucuses, in an effort to understand the considerations that have guided and informed the redistricting process. Finally we have also studied the redistricting plan offered by Representatives Hazel Plant and Arthur Scott and have compared it to the House Leadership's plan.

Based on our review of the information available to us concerning the redistricting plan proposed by the House Leadership, it is our opinion that the House Leadership's plan complies with all relevant federal statutory and constitutional requirements.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 141ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY: Pursuant to Article III, Section 18 of the Delaware Constitution, I am vetoing House Bill No.293, entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Town of Gumboro," as received by the Executive Office on June 30, 2001, by returning it to the

House of Representatives without my signature for reconsideration. I do not object to the incorporation of the Town of Gumboro. However, my review of House Bill No.293, as passed by the General Assembly, leads me to conclude that the bill includes a potentially dangerous flaw, in that it would incorporate such Town without promptly convening a town government. Most notably, House Bill No.293 creates an incorporated Town of Gumboro, defines the Town's limits, and vests a Town Council with certain

authorities, including authority over planning and zoning. An apparently unintended effect of the legislation as passed would be to divest the Sussex County government of certain powers it has heretofore exercised in the area to be incorporated, most notably the authority to regulate planning and zoning. Under 9 ~. ~. § 6902, the government of Sussex County is precluded from regulating land use and related issues within an incorporated area, except on the express request of such incorporated city or town. In this case, given that there is no lawfully seated government for the

incorporated Town, there could be no such request, and as a result, there would be no government with authority to

regulate land use, planning and zoning within the newly incorporated area. The technical flaw existing in House Bill No. 293 was discovered shortly after the bill's passage and, in the waning hours before adjournment of session, House Bill No. 352 was introduced to correct the gap inadvertently created by House Bill No. 293. House Bill No. 352 would have left the to-be-incorporated area of Gumboro subject to land use ordinances enacted by Sussex County until such time as the Town duly enacted its own planning and zoning ordinances. Regrettably, House Bill No. 352 was not considered or passed in the Senate prior to its adjournment.

Accordingly, I am returning House Bill No. 293 without signature. Sincerely. Ruth Ann Minner
