## P R E F A C E.

THE publisher in tendering to the citizens of Wilmington the first volume of his Directory would beg leave to state that he has expended upon it a large amount of care and attention, and has endeavored as far as perseverance, industry, and experience in the compilation of works of a similar nature could warrant, to produce one worthy of their patronage, and which would be an accurate key to the city and its citizens.

The business of directory-compiling and publishing is at the best an arduous one, and to those unacquainted with its details the amount of labor required would be astonishing. In this particular work the publisher has labored under peculiar difficulties, the majority of the citizens supposing that one of their townsmen was publishing a full Directory of the place; and the canvassers for this work found great difficulty in many instances to obtain the required information. (*Although the gentleman referred to signified in his advertisement, that his work was of a different nature*).

In view of the peculiar difficulties named, and the many obstacles usually met with in works of this kind, the publisher trusts that the inaccuracies which may occur in the work will be looked upon with leniency, although with the system adopted few need occur; yet it is impossible to produce a work of perfection.

To the many citizens who deem a work of this kind one of value and benefit, and who have liberally aided it by their advertisements and subscriptions, the publisher takes this means of returning his thanks, trusting that the few who have refrained will be convinced of the utility of the present volume. He hopes in the next to make it *still* more worthy of the patronage and support of both.

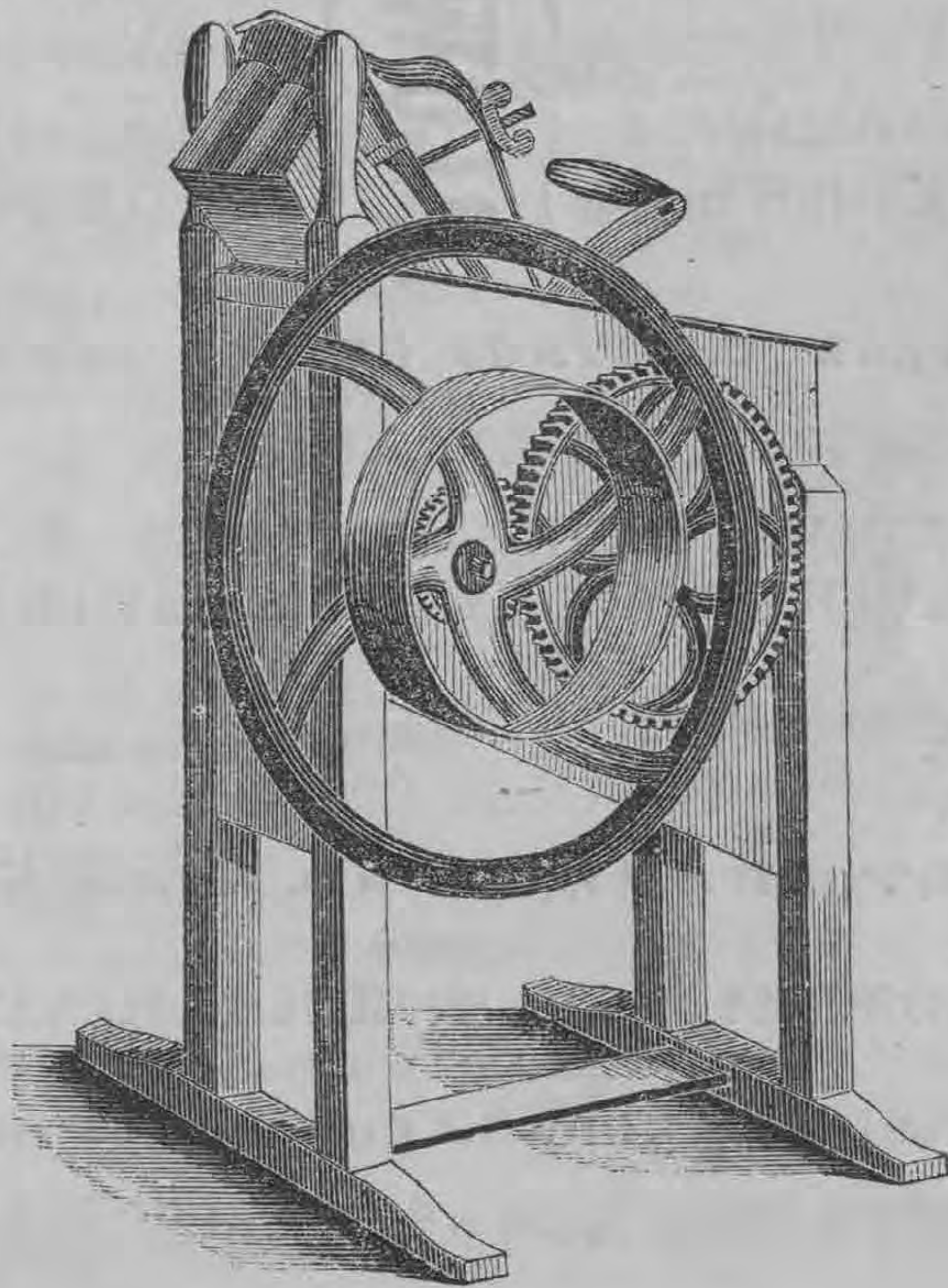
