Since House Joint Resolution No. 26 does not mandate the implementation of the recommended rights, it seems reasonable to conclude that the Resolution does not authorize or require expenditures and, therefore 29 Del. C. \$1901(a) would not apply to this Resolution, and the attached fiscal note would not be necessary. Thope there is no problem with deleting the fiscal note to House Joint Resolution No. 26 and rescheduling this resolution on the House agenda.

Of course, were the General Assembly to mandate provision of these services, then the fiscal note would be required.

In response to your telephone call Tuesday, 30 March 1982, regarding this office providing to you a written "estimation of value" of the rear and unimproved or paved portion of Parcel #82, Map Location 39.3, see Exhibit "A" attached, from the State of Delaware to a tax exempt local fire company in consideration of \$1.00 with revisionary rights retained by the State of Delaware.

First, let me thank you for your confidence in Gilpin, Van Trump and Montgomery Inc. and second, qualify the following market value estimation, because of the severe time constraint and the fact that several critical assumptions needed to be made by us without confirmation from your office. ASSUMPTIONS:

1) Subject Parcel #82, Map #39.3 owned by State of Delaware, size 2.04 acres, tax status-exempt, deed recorded in Book 1072, Page 0623, land value recorded at \$50,000, improvement value at \$11,400.

2) Rear portion of above described parcel equals approximtely 1.02 acres.

3) Right of way access in common with State of Delaware; Magistrate Court #10 along westerly border of parcel to provide ingress and egress to portion of parcel being considered donated by state.

4) Entire parcel presently zoned C-2.

5) Rear portion (1/2) of subject parcel loses all commercial value when separated from front portion with road frontage on Kirkwood Highway.

6) Without frontage, the rear portion would revert in value to residential usage.

7) Estimate that approximately 5 each - 60 ft. wide building lots with the right away along westerly portion into the rear half could be subdivided.

8) Proper re-zoning and water, sewer and utilities could be brought into place for rear portion of the subject parcel.

Weighing the limited amount of information we have available, and taking into consideration the assumptions we have made, coupled with the very soft market for unimproved residential lots in this area, we believe that this land could be valued at \$4500 to \$5500 per lot times 5 = \$22,500 to \$27,500 or \$22,000 - \$25,000 per acre.

I am returning without my signature House Bill No. 289, as amended by House Amendment No. 1, which I received on April 20, 1982 and which is entitled as follows:

"AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 6503, CHAPTER 65, TITLE 25, OF THE DELAWARE CODE WITH REFERENCE TO LANDLORD-TENANT RELATIONSHIPS; PROVIDING FOR THE CREATION OF RENTAL UNITS FOR THE EXCLUSIVE USE OF SENIOR CITIZENS."

The bill has a laudable purpose: to provide housing for the State's senior citizens by permitting landlords to reserve units for rental to senior citizens.

Under the bill, the landlord would be permitted to set aside units for senior citizens notwithstanding the provisions of Delaware law prohibiting discrimination in rentals for reasons of race, creed, color, sex, national origin, age or occupation, or because the tenant has a child or children.

The problem with the bill is that it provides a procedure whereby unscrupulous landlords may avoid the non-discrimination provisions of Delaware law simply by designating and registering units as reserved for senior citizens. There is no mechanism to assure that a landlord in fact rents such units to senior citizens; moreover, there is no assurance that such units would be available to senior citizens on a non-discriminatory basis, since these requirements of the Code would no longer apply.

At a time when many segments of our population are having difficulty finding adequate available housing, I believe it would be unwise to retreat from the broad guarantees of present law that housing should be equally available to all.

On April 20, 1982, I received House Bill No. 335, which is entitled:

"AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 93, TITLE 10 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO THE JURISDICTION OF THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE COURT."

Because of a technical flaw in the bill, I am returning it without my signature.

The bill increases the civil jurisdiction of the Justice of the Peace Courts in contract actions from \$1,500 to \$2,500. However, the bill fails to amend two additional sections of the Code which deal with jurisdiction in actions in trespass, replevin and detinue.

Thus, should I sign House Bill No. 335 the result would be that the required jurisdictional amounts would vary, depending on the nature of the action brought, a situation which would create great confusion. Because I believe that the jurisdictional level should be uniform for all actions brought in the Justice of the Peace Courts, I am returning House Bill No. 335 without my signature.

Mr. Speaker, HS 1 for HJR 26 sets in place a series of guidelines for the treatment of crime victims. Since HJR 26 only has a short synopsis, I would like to speak to the House for the record in case there are any future doubts as to the intent.

We hear a great deal these days on the <u>lack</u> of public confidence in the institution and mechanism of government.

There are two ways the so-called criminal justice system part of that institution can reclaim that trust.

The first, of course, is by reducing crime significantly.

The second is by the criminal justice system treating citizens as though they are what they are "decent law abiding people who <u>comprise</u> the majority of the heart of our <u>republic</u>."

The fourteen specific sections of HJR #26 - A to P - spell out the intent of this resolution.

Many of these proposed rights are of a similar nature and follow the American Bar Association's recommendations.

HJR #26 also has the support of the Delaware Council on Crime and Justice.

Mr. Speaker - the sponsors of this resolution believe if passed and carried out by the system it will help the victim and their families cope with the grief and hopefully ease the burdens that victim witnesses face during the investigation and trial stages of a violent crime.

We also have high hopes that it will help with some of the inequities of the present criminal "justice system".

Unfortunately many of our citizens involved in the criminal justice system as a victim today emerge from that experience believing it is heavily weighted toward the rights of the criminal.

<u>HB 555</u> - An Act to Amend Chapter 5 and Chapter 35, Title 11 of the Delaware Code, Relating to the Intimidation of Victims and Witnesses.

Representative Riddagh brought $\underline{HA~1}$ to $\underline{HB~555}$ before the House for consideration. $\underline{HA~1}$ was adopted by voice vote.

Representative Riddagh read the following communication into the record:

HB #555 would add a further chapter to the victims bill of rights by reducing the trauma of harassment and threats to a victim or their family before a trial. This type of legislation was approved by the American Bar Association after a study by the victims committee of the ABA criminal justice section.

Since successful intimidation undermines the public confidence in the legal process and the crime of intimidation is very common although only the unsuccessful ones are reported or discovered.

HB #555 contains two types of intimidation offenses. Under 3532 every person who knowingly and with malice prevents or attempts to prevent a witness or victim from attending or giving testimony at any trial proceeding is guilty of a class E felony. (A class E felony is punishable by 7 years and such fine or other conditions the court may order).

3533 would be the same as 3533 except it would include aggravated acts of intimidation such as expressed or implied threats of force or violence upon the victim - family or property - or if the intimidation is committed by a person previously convicted of intimidation in this state or another is guilty of a class D felony - 10 years - such fines and other conditions as ordered by the court.

Under 3534 every person attempting intimidation of a witness is guilty of the offense without regard to success or failure. Under the provisions in 3535 the court may also order protection for the witness. At the present time 1263 of Title 11 refers to intimidation of a witness as tampering with a witness

At the present time 1263 of Title 11 refers to intimidation of a witness as tampering with a witness under the heading of tampering with a witness and is presently classified as a misdemeanor which is fixed by the court not to exceed two years. The same as issuing a worthless check. With the worthless check charge carrying a mandatory sentence of restitution to the amount of the check.

A violent criminal who is free on bail can, if he chooses to and the stakes are high enough, make certain there will be no problems presented at his trial by the simple device of eliminating any witness who might testify against him.

A perfect example of the terroristic threats used is explained in very simple language by a federal prosecutor in a case in a nearby state where several defendants indicted on charges of racketeering, extortion and labor payoffs.

In that particular case, the witnesses were threatened with serious injury or death if they testified.

The prosecutor testified in court by addressing the presiding judge and informing him that although the witnesses considered themselves law abiding citizens but, because one witness prior to the trial was shot 5 times, two other witnesses knowingly and willingly committed perjury to avoid testifying against the defendants and went to jail.

In an excerpt from the transcript of that trial in a federal court:

Question from prosecutor, Mr. Brookin - Did anyone in your company ever pay any money to the defendant?

Answer - I can't answer that.

Question - Why can't you answer it?

Answer - I cannot answer because I am not ready to die - I have a family to look after.

Mr. Speaker, Delaware's tampering with a witness' statute needs upgrading from its class A misdemeanor statute to stronger model legislation.

I believe HB #555 will do that.

HB 556 - An Act to Amend Chapter 35, Part II, Title 11 of the Delaware Code Relating to Crimes and Criminal Procedure; and Providing for Certain Limitations to the Exclusionary Rule.

Representative Riddagh brought HA 1 to HB 556 before the House for consideration. Representative Riddagh requested that $H\overline{A}$ 1 be stricken.

Representative Riddagh brought $\underline{HA\ 2}$ to HB 556 before the House for consideration. <u>HA\ 2</u> was adopted by voice vote.

Representative Riddagh read the following communication into the record:

Mr. Speaker, HB #556 is an effort to make certain that all criminal proceedings shall be a search for the truth.

Many of us believe at the present time the application of the exclusionary rules are being applied in favor and for the benefit of the criminal and in many instances the <u>truth</u> is being ignored by the state and federal courts.

Many courts at the present time carry the exclusionary rules too far and exclude evidence of truth in which five of our present nine supreme court judges have indicated may be true and believe the court would be willing to take another look at them if some were challenged.

Although four of the members have indicated for a number of years there may be sufficient reasons to reconsider the exclusionary rules, during last year's confirmation hearing of Justice Connor she was asked by a reporter her feelings on the present application of the exclusionary rules she replied that she did not feel a guilty person should go free on technicalities only, thereby indicating she may consider amending the obvious frivolous practice now being used.

But for a state to have an opportunity to challenge any of the present exclusionary rules, that state must have a statute covering state exclusionary rule.

HB #556 would allow evidence acquired to be used at a trial if it has been obtained by an officer acting in good faith and belief that it was in conformity within the guideline of the provisions of the bill and the 4th amendment to our constitution.

Under the guidelines in HB #556 illegally obtained evidence as described under 3532 B 1,2,3 will not be admissible. Admissible evidence is described under 3534 B 1,2,3.

One example under Bl of this section is: Evidence that relied on a statute which was ruled unconstitutional at a later date. Example - San Francisco - a person convicted of murdering his girlfriend's ten month old baby by his own confession of throwing the child down an eleven story trash chute because he thought the woman had another boyfriend and also thought the mother would stay with him if he got rid of the baby. His confession ran through three detailed typed papers. He was convicted of murder and the conviction was upheld by the Maryland Court of special appeals.

But as his attorney was taking care of the long and drawn out appeal processes, another case came through the courts where the judge ruled that the defendant has to be taken before a court commissioner within 24 hours or the state could not use any subsequent confession.

McClain, the defendant in the baby's murder trial, did not complete his confession until 12 minutes after that deadline.

But the ridiculous application of this exclusionary rule was that the McClain case was tried two years before the 24 hour rule was adopted by the Maryland Supreme Court.

In their attempt to devise an even more perfect system for the convicted killer, some balmy judges had developed a brand new exclusionary rule and, in their judicial reasoning, said (in effect) why not apply it to the two year old McClain case, after all there is no way to bring life back into the smashed baby's body.

Mr. Speaker, this is only one example of the mockery of true justice under the present exclusionary rules as used by our courts. Let me proceed with example number two which may well fall within B2. Where a simple error by a typist resulted in a situation where an accused bookie may be freed from a 6-15 year prison term and one million dollars in cash and securities returned to him because, although the search warrant was issued on a certain date and said it would expire 15 days after issuance; the court ruled that the inadvertent ommission of expiration date was reason to invalidate the warrant. This type of an honest mistake would in my opinion be covered under 3534 B2 of this bill.

Example #3 - the 5th Circuit Court of California held that a police officer who sought to retrieve a suspect's jacket for the sole purpose of keeping the suspect warm during an early morning detention was guilty of an illegal seizure and required the suppression of evidence.

At 4:15 a.m. on January 18, 1978, Fresno police officer Julian Perea and his partner were on duty and eating breakfast at a restaurant. Perea noticed the petitioner sweeping behind the counter. Perea recognized the petitioner as being the robbery suspect depicted in a photograph he had been shown three days earlier. Officer Perea then asked the petitioner to step outside. The petitioner complied. It was cold outside. Perea went back into the restaurant and asked waitress Dolland to get the petitioner's jacket. Waitress Dolland reached into the jacket pocket because she was "nosey" and pulled out a bank moneybag. Perea remembered seeing a similar jacket in the photograph he had been shown three days earlier. He put the jacket in his car. The moneybag and jacked were thrown out of court by the court as illegal evidence and the suspect was set free.

This type of case is where the officer acted in good faith and with the belief his conduct comported with existing laws.

Example #4 - Another California decision. The suspect was taken into custody after murdering his mother, father and grandfather while they were watching television. This may well fall under 3534 B-3 of HB #556. He was warned of his Miranda rights but he then asked the police if he could talk off the record. The suspect then implicated himself by indicating he had disposed of a rifle where some children might find it. He was then warned of his rights again and in the ensuing hours made two separate confessions. The state's higher court overturned the confession with the explanation the defendant did not realize what he was doing when he spoke off the record and in 1979 threw out the confession and the federal court refused to reinstate the conviction.

Unusual examples of this case and misuse of our criminal justice system, although the conviction was in 1976 - in 1978 while in prison, in an interview with Mike Wallace on a Sixty Minutes program the prisoner admitted to the multiple murders saying he believed drugs leg him to sneak up behind the victims and fire the rifle while they watched T.V. After the conviction was overturned, in a highly unusual letter, the suspect's attorney, a Mr. Crew, expressed dismay that the court had accepted his argument attacking the confessions as inadmissible. In his letter he wrote - "your recent decision in this case was predictable."

However, it is difficult to understand how a system of laws to protect innocent people can become so twisted to give freedom to a person who deliberately kills three innocent human beings, thereafter confesses four times to these killings, the last on national television and, with all this, somehow finds that freedom awaits him.

Mr. Crew, the defense attorney, continued: "I am a responsible citizen in my community and shutter to think that now my family has been given less protection by the courts."

Mr. Crew's letter to the court also drew praise from the prosecutor of that case by saying - when somebody like Jim Crew who is an excellent and tough defense attorney criticizes a court decision like this, then you realize just how bad the Braesecue decision was.

In effect Mr. Crew was saying to the court - as an attorney I did what I was supposed to do and you bought it - are you crazy.

This California decision was issued on a four to three vote.

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In an interview after the ruling the prosecutor, Mr. Cardoza, said we are losing sight of what the framers of our constitution intended. This decision is a super example of applying the logic of the rule to the point of absurdity.

Mr. Speaker, I agree with Mr. Cardoza and hopefully HB #556 will be an instrument to convince the members of the U.S. Supreme Court to take another look at the present applications of the present exclusionary rules.

We all can appreciate the value of constitutional guarantees for those suspected or indicted for crimes. But the time has arrived when legislators also should recognize the value of a few constitutional guarantees for the 95 plus percent of the honest, hardworking law-abiding citizens of this country such as the right not to be the next victim of a convicted criminal set free by a ridiculous set of rules which has unduly hampered law enforcement.

Representative Riddagh read the following communication into the record:

Some legislative bodies have come to the conclusion that the plea of insanity, as it is being used in today's criminal trials, is a concept that needs rethinking.

The question being asked is: "Is justice being served by the narrow range of the present insanity plea, or has this plea turned into a last resort to beat the system, where the defendant has nothing to lose and everything to gain by the present system?"

Examples - the Hinckley case - the Joey Coyle case - did such mental illness really affect their ability to obey the law? Under the present Delaware law, a defendant can only be found innocent or guilty of the charge or innocent by reason of insanity.

Today many psychiatrists now recognize that there are different degrees of mental illnesses between sane and insane.

An insane person lacks substantial capacity to appreciate the criminality of his conduct or to conform to the requirements of the law. The term mental disease does not include abnormality manifested only by repeated criminal or antisocial conduct.

The narrow choice of the present law puts an incredible responsibility on any psychiatrist to decide, by a few examinations in a hospital, if the defendant is insane or only mentally ill.

This has been a haphazard system and over the years has resulted in many persons in these United States being judged innocent by reason of insanity, returning to society within several months or a few years, only to commit the same type of offense over again.

House Bill 567 would offer all the protection, medication and treatment to the truly insane and this bill has been reviewed by the staff of the Delaware State Hospital and Amendment #1 was the only change they requested and that was that the hospital staff be directly responsible for the treatment and the authority for the person's discharge from the hospital.

Under HB 567, a jury, after hearing the facts, could also recognize the defendant as mentally ill but nevertheless hold the defendant responsible for his actions.

An example of how this new concept would work has been demonstrated under the same type of statute passed by the Michigan, Idaho and Kentucky legislatures.

Michigan's law was passed in 1975, although the truly insane are still being cared for in their mental hospitals. The results of the guilty but mentally ill concept in Michigan have shown that where the courts, or the jury, were given a choice of innocent by reason of insanity or guilty but mentally ill, the majority of guilty but mentally ill decisions were rendered against sex offenders and now many of them are not getting off scott-free after a few months in the hospital.

Under 401(a) of HB 567 as amended the truly insame are protected although the basic thrust is to separate the "insufficient will power defense" from the standard "not guilty by reason of insanity plea" and change the method of handling these pleas in the interest of more orderly trials. Under (b) of 401 there is created a standard less than true insanity, but recognizing the possibility that the defendant may be suffering from a mental disorder, and provides for treatment as well as incarceration alone. Also under 407b, a person found guilty but mentally ill shall have a sentence imposed on him that may be lawfully imposed on any other defendant convicted of the same offense, committed to the Correction Department and given the opportunity for medical and hospital treatment as is psychiatrically indicated in unison with the Delaware State Hospital for as long as is necessary to promote a cure, at which time the defendant would be remanded back to the Correction Division.

401(C) defines what is not insanity.

Section 407 provides for the handling of persons who are convicted under the verdict "guilty but mentally ill".

Section 407(a): The defendant may move for a verdict of guilty but mentally ill; however, there shall be no findings of guilty but mentally ill until the trier of fact has examined all reports. (A guilty but mentally ill plea is not automatic.)

407(b) as amended would have the Commissioner of Corrections responsible for the prisoner, but the course of treatment would be determined by the Division of Mental Health or the State Hospital (requested by hospital authorities).

Back on January 31 of this year I had the pleasure of introducing House Resolution 113. All this resolution did was to ask President Reagan to fire Paul Volcker, Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System. The resolution pointed out that one of the reasons for the high interest rates was the policy of the Federal Reserve Board. The resolution said that young married couples could no longer buy homes in the United States because of the interest rates.

For some hidden reason this resolution was buried in the House Administration Committee and the members were not given the chance to vote on it. This is a bad situation in a democracy, Mr. Speaker. We are here to vote for or against. The people will tell us on election day if we are right or wrong.

Anyhow, those of us who support House Resolution 113 have been vindicated beyond question — United States Congressman Henry Reuss, who is chairman of the Joint Economic Committee of the Congress, one of the highest places in our government, said Sunday that a budget resolution will soon be introduced which will require the Federal Reserve Board to change its policies and let the interest rate come down.

Mr. Reuss pointed out that Congress told the Federal Reserve Board to shape up in 1975 and it did so and the interest rate declined and --- most important --- the recession ended. I want you to know, Mr. Speaker, that I was right in January and I am going to keep fighting to lower these interest rates whether you bury my resolutions or not.

My support for H.B. 557 was contingent on these conditions, and I appreciate your work in modifying the original bill to address these important matters.

Obviously, the Act would become effective only following appropriation of funds by the General Assembly for implementing provisions of the Act.

The Reading Clerk read the following communications into the record: June 21, 1982

To the House of Representatives

of the 131st General Assembly

of the State of Delaware

On June 9, 1982 I received House Substitute No. 1 for House Bill No. 247, as amended by House Amendment No. 1, which is entitled:

"AN ACT TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO POST SIGNS NOTIFYING DRIVERS ENTERING DELAWARE THAT LITTERING IS SUBJECT TO FINES UP TO \$250."

The laudable purpose of this bill is to publicize Delaware's anti-littering law by requiring signs to be posted at each major highway entrance to the State advising of the maximum fine for littering. I certainly concur that every effort should be made to reduce littering of Delaware's highways and adjacent properties and that travelers coming into Delaware should be prominently notified that such littering is subject to fine.

However, I am returning House Substitute No. 1 for House Bill No. 247, as amended by House Amendment No. 1 because it may have affected maximum fines that are now imposed under State law for various litter violations. For instance, although the penalty set in Title 21 for placing glass, cans and litter on a highway is set at a maximum of \$250., the Litter Control Law, in Title 16 establishes a \$50. maximum for such an offense. Moreover, the penalty prescribed in Section 6025 of Title 7 sets a maximum fine of \$500. for discarding garbage, refuse or rubbage in the State, and the penalty for disposing of more than 5 pounds of trash along a highway may range from \$400. to \$600. for a first offense, with substantial increases in the fine for a second violation.

Therefore, the posting of signs stating that the maximum fine for littering is \$250. would at the least be misleading and add to the confusion already existing in the several laws relating to litter. And it is possible that the bill may have reduced these various legislatively prescribed penalties - especially since the Title of the bill fails to indicate the precise Title and Section of the Code which is being amended.

Accordingly, I am returning House Substitute No. 1 for House Bill No. 247, as amended by House Amendment No. 1, without my signature, with the hope that new legislation can be developed by the sponsor which will clarify the confusion which exists in the several Delaware laws relating to litter.

You have asked the opinion of this Office as to whether Article VIII, Section 11 of the Constitution of the State of Delaware was applicable to the vote taken by the House of Representatives on House Bill 200 during the 131st General Assembly. It is our opinion that Article VIII, \$11 was applicable and House Bill 200 must be adopted by a three-fifths concurrence of both the House of Representatives and the Senate.

House Bill 200 was adopted to repeal the existing Worker's Compensation Act and establish a new system for the compensation for work related injuries and deaths occurring subsequent to February 1, 1982. A repealing act such as H.B. 200 constitutes a new act and if it adopts provisions in place of the repealed statute, those provisions are new legislation for purposes of enactment, even though they may be similar or identical in substance to the prior statute. <u>Morford v. Emerson</u>, Del. Super., 10A.2d 515 (1939). Accordingly, H.B. 200 must comply with applicable requirements of Art. VIII, \$11 since it was enacted subsequent to Art. VIII.

Article VIII, \$11(a) provides: No tax or license fee may be imposed or levied except pursuant to an act of the General Assembly adopted with the concurrence of three-fifths of all members of each House.

The issue presented is whether H.B. 200 imposes or levies a "tax" or a "license fee". The terms "tax" and "license fee" share many characteristics and are often used interchangeably. Both concepts involve a mandatory exaction or charge reasonably assessed by a governmental entity upon persons or property within its jurisdiction for a public or governmental purpose. 51 Am. Jur. 2d, <u>Licenses and Permits</u>, \$1; 71 Am. Jur. 2d, <u>State and Local Taxation</u> \$\$1-4, 16. The distinction between the two is that a tax is a levy authorized under the police power of a government as a means of regulating or restricting a particular activity. <u>Conard v. State</u>, Del. Super., 16 A.2d 121 (1940).

activity. <u>Conard v. State</u>, <u>Del</u>. Super., <u>16</u> A.2d 121 (1940). In H.B. 200, Sections 2272, 2277 and 2278 can be interpreted as imposing a tax or license fee. Section 2272 requires insurance carriers and self-insurers to pay to the Industrial Accident Board percentages of premiums or payrolls for the establishment of a Second Injury Fund. Section 2277 imposes a "tax" upon carrier premiums and self-insurers' payrolls for the privilege of carrying on the business of Worker's Compensation Insurance in this State. Section 2278 imposes an "assessment" upon Worker's Compensation Insurance carriers to pay the administrative expenses of the act.

Each of the above sections imposes a mandatory levy upon carriers and self-insurers in order to raise revenues for the operation and maintenance of the Worker's Compensation system created by H.B. 200. The public purpose of Worker's Compensation legislation in general and the Second Injury Fund in particular has long been recognized. The system is designed to assure an economically adequate level of compensation to injured workers and shift the cost of such employment related injuries to the consumer as part of the costs of production. <u>Hill v. Moskin Stores</u>, Inc., Del. Supr., 165 A.2d 447 (1960); <u>Price v.</u> <u>All American Engineering Co.</u>, Del. Supr., 320 A.2d 336 (1947).

The <u>Price</u> decision specifically notes that the Fund's payments are made to a limited category of recipients. Moreover, an exaction imposed by statute does not lose its character because it is applied to a certain class and there is no requirement that the class be the primary recipient of the tax's benefits, provided that a public purpose is served. Houck v. Little River Drainage District, 239 U.S. 254 (1915); Board of Assessment Review for New Castle County v. Stewart, Del. Supr., 378 A.2d 113 (1977). The Legislature has wide discretion in the classification of tax payers so long as the classification adopted is reasonable and not arbitrary. In <u>Aetna Casualty and Surety Co. v. Smith</u>, Del. Supr., 131 A.2d 168 (1957), the Supreme Court determined that a tax on fire isurance premiums assessed against fire insurance carriers for the purpose of increasing funds for firefighter pension funds was reasonable and valid. As such, the above cited sections of H.B. 200 meet the general definitions of tax and license fee.

This conclusion is supported by the few cases which have addressed the issue of whether mandatory premium and payroll percentage payments and contributions constitute taxes or license fees. The case of <u>State v. Vinther</u>, Wash. Supr., 29 P.2d 694 (1934), held that an employer's mandatory payroll percentage contributions to the state Workmen's Compensation Accident Fund were license fees or taxes imposed in furtherance of the public policy of caring for workmen injured in industry. This rationale was followed in the case of <u>State Industrial Accident Commission v. Aebi</u>, Ore. Supr., 162 P.2d 513 (1945), in which the Supreme Court of Oregon held that an employer's mandatory contributions under Oregon's Workmen's Compensation Act were taxes within the meaning of the Federal Bankruptcy Act. Finally, in the case of <u>Harper v. New Jersey Manufacturers Casualty Insurance Co.</u>, 58 A. 2d 792, <u>aff</u> d 62 A.2d 135 (1949) a New Jersey court held that the State's Workmen's Compensation Act, which required Workmen's Compensation carriers and self-insurers to make premium and payroll percentage contributions to the State Compensation Funds, was a tax measure. No authority contrary to this position has been disclosed by research.

In addition to the above cases, further support is available for the conclusion that Section 2277 of H.B. 200 imposes a tax. This section states that it imposes a "tax" upon carrier premiums and self-insurer payrolls for the "privilege of carrying on the business of Worker's Compensation Insurance in this State". It has uniformly been held that a fee exacted as a prerequisite to the carrying on of a particular occupation or business is either a license fee or a tax. 51 Am. Jur. 2d, License and Permits, \$14; 25 Words and Phrases, License Fee. However, where a fee is enacted solely for revenue purposes and its payment grants the privilege to carry on business without further conditions or restrictions, then the payment is a tax. Conard v. State, supra. Since its accompanying provisions in H.B. 200 do not evidence an intent to otherwise regulate or restrict the activities of Worker Compensation carriers and self-insurers, Section 2277 should be considered a tax.

The question whether Section 2278 is a tax or license fee is less susceptible to resolution. Section 2278 imposes an "assessment" upon insurance carriers to pay the Act's administrative expenses. A minority of jurisdictions have held that assessments of any form which are deposited into a specially designated fund and not into a state's general revenue fund are not taxes but special assessments. Natural Gas Co. V. McCanless, Tenn. Supr., 194 S.W.2d 476 (1946). While the issue has not been directly addressed in Delaware, the Supreme Court decision in <u>Aetna Casualty And Surety Company v. Smith, supra strongly suggests that a distinction similar to that made in McCanless would not be adopted. In the <u>Aetna decision</u>, statutes which imposed payments upon insurance carrier premiums for the purpose of augmenting police and fire pension funds were held to be unconstitutional since they appropriated public money to municipal corporations without the three-fifths vote of each House of the General Assembly as required by Article VIII, Section 4 of the State Constitution. These payments were made into the specially earnarked funds and the State Insurance Commissioner maintained that these earinarked funds removed subsequent appropriations from the restrictions of Article VIII, Section 4. The Court disagreed, concluding that the constitutional provisions governed all appropriations and suggested that the General Assembly could not avoid constitutional provisions merely by creating individual funds. The Court stated, "the fact that it is paid into a special fund...is unimportant". Id. at 175.</u>

The <u>McCanless</u> distinction has been abandoned by most jurisdictions except with regard to assessments made exclusively for the payment of administrative costs, when such payments are not mingled with any other funds. Port Authority of Allegheny County v. smith, Pa. Cmwlth., 382 A.2d 153 (1978); <u>Duhesher Farms</u>, Inc. v. Ball, Mich. Supr., 273 N.W. 2d 877 (1979); <u>Efros v. Russo</u>, N.J. Super., 177 A.2d 565 (1962). Since Section 2278 meets the requirements set forth in the above cases and the General Assembly describes the levy imposed as an "assessment", Section 2278 should be considered a special assessment rather than a tax or license fee for purposes of Art. VIII, \$11.

The final question presented is whether Sections 2272 and 2277 are severable from the remaining provisions of H.B. 200. The Delaware Supreme Court addressed the question of severability in <u>State v.</u> Schorr, Del. Supr., 65 A.2d 810 (1948), holding that:

It is also well settled, that where part of a statute found to be unconstitutional is so connected with other parts as to make them mutually dependent upon each other as conditions, considerations or compensations for the other, in such a manner as to justify the belief that the Legislature intended them as a whole, they stand or fall together.

Id. at 822.

Sections 2272 and 2277 provide the basis funding mechanism for H.B. 200. If these provisions were excised from the Bill, its essential purposes of providing adequate benefits to injured workers and shifting the cost of such injuries would be defeated. The Bill as a whole is dependent upon the valid enactment of these sections and, as such, they are not severable from it.

In conclusion, it is the opinion of this Office that Sections 2272 and 2278 of H.B. 200 impose new taxes or license fees and are not severable from the Bill as a whole. Accordingly, Art. VIII, \$11 of the State Constitution requires that H.B. 200 be adopted by a three-fifths concurrence of each House in order to be valid. Since Art. VIII, \$11 was in effect when H.B. 200 was passed by a less than three-fifths majority of the House of Representatives, that vote was insufficient.

I am returning without my signature House Bill No. 237 which I received on June 15, 1982 and which is entitled:

"AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 15, DELAWARE CODE, CHAPTER 55, RELATING TO PROVISIONS FOR

ABSENTEE VOTING."

The bill eliminates the long standing requirement of Delaware law that an application for an absentee ballot be accompanied by an affidavit, subscribed and sworn before a notary. Instead, the application would be accompanied by an unnotarized and unwitnessed certificate of the applicant to the effect that he or she cannot be at the polls on election day and furnishing additional information required by law.

Because I believe this bill increases the possibility of fraud in the electoral process, I am returning it without my signature.

The present procedure minimizes risk of fraud by requiring a witness to the signature of an applicant for an absentee ballot. This requirement helps assure that the individual who files the application is the individual who actually seeks to vote. Under House Bill No. 237, on the other hand, anyone could easily complete a request for an absentee ballot and sign the name of an individual who appears on a list of registered voters.

Moreover, requiring notarization of an application helps assure that, should fraud occur, prosecution would be successful. The Attorney General advises that under House Bill No. 237 prosecution for executing a false certificate would be virtually impossible because there would be no witnesses to the signature.

For these reasons, I see no need to alter the existing procedure which has worked well to assure the integrity of elections in the State. Accordingly, I return House Bill No. 237 without my signature.
