Locals go pink to support breast-cancer awareness

## History unearthed

### Newark man highlights local African-Americans' stories

Two-hundred years ago, Sylvester Woolford's great-great-great grandfather, William Saunders, bought 15 acres of farmland in Pencader on what is now Library Avenue in Newark, and, as Woolford recently most simply put it, "We've been here

ever since."

But, of course, no family's history is that simple.

Woolford's own history involves a great-grandmother (times 10) who, in 1620, received a punishment of 20 lashes for stealing hogs and chickens; a grandmother who grew up in an

UD offers \$10,000 reward for missing former professor

Dr. John Dohms has been missing since Sept. 13

The University of Delaware is offering a \$10,000 reward to anyone with information that can lead police to Dr. John Dohms, the retired university professor from Newark who has been missing for a month.

Dohms, 64, who suffers

from dementia, did not return to his Cleveland Avenue home as expected after heading out for a walk around 3 p.m. Sept. 13. When he left, he was wearing a bright green button-down shirt, green socks, white tennis shoes and khaki shorts.

Dohms is 6 feet 1 inch tall and 165 pounds, with gray hair and blue eyes. He may have a set of binoculars in his possession and wears a Medic Alert bracelet on his left wrist.

Newark Police are still investigating Dohms' disappearance as a missing-person situation and do not suspect foul play, said department spokesman Lt. Mark Farrell.

Police continue to ask residents of northern Newark, Hockessin and southern Chester County, Pa., to check for Dohms in sheds, outbuildings, cars, under decks or other places where people with dementia are known to seek shelter in cases such as Dohms'.

The last substantiated sighting of Dohms was at 7:45 p.m. Sept. 15, when a citizen reported seeing a man matching his description on Little Baltimore Road near North Star Elementary

School. A bloodhound from Baltimore County Police responded to the area and confirmed Dohms' presence in the Little Baltimore Road area, but search teams could not find him, Farrall said.

While at the University of Delaware, Dohms spent three decades researching and teaching about the microbiology of avian disease.

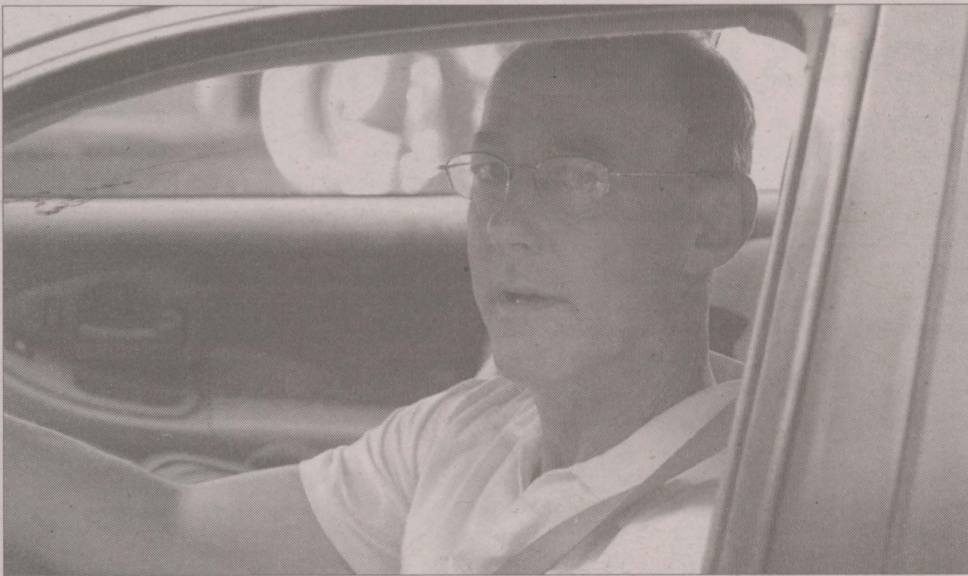
He joined the UD's College of Agriculture and Natural Resources as an assistant professor in 1977, and rose through the ranks to become associate professor and then full professor, said John Brennan, director of public relations for the university.

Dohms also served as associate dean for instruction in the college. His research on immunology and microbiology is widely recognized and highly regarded, Brennan said.

Dohms retired from the university in 2009.

University officials are offering the reward to anyone with information that can help police find Dohms, Brennan said.

"Dr. Dohms is a very beloved and respected part of the UD community, and even though he's retired, he still has many friends here,

and we wanted to contribute to the effort to get him back safely to his family," Brennan said.

His older brother, Peter Dohms, who lives in Florida, told the Post last month that John had once been a world traveler who had been trout fishing in New Zealand, hiking in the Andes Mountains and whitewater rafting in Nicaragua.

John's initial diagnosis of dementia came three years ago, Peter said, adding that he suspects his brother might have suffered head trauma from playing var-

sity lacrosse in college.

"It's a very physically demanding game, and he had a lot of concussions," Peter said.

John, who is the middle sibling, and his two brothers grew up in Fairlawn, in northeastern N.J. John came to Newark for a teaching position with the university in the 1980s.

A professional caretaker had been looking after John, who is not married but lives with a female companion, since his diagnosis, Peter said.

Dohms' family has creat-

Anyone with information about his whereabouts should call 911 immediately.

## Walk-in health clinic opens in S. Newark

MedExpress, a company that owns walk-in medical clinics along the East Coast, opened its newest MedExpress Walk-In Care center this week in Newark.

It is the company's 88th center in the country and its first in Delaware.

The Newark center, in Chestnut Hill Plaza off Route 4 near the Shoprite store, began accepting patients Wednesday. Clinic hours are from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., seven days a week.

MedExpress is a full-service, walk-in medical-care center that treats patients of all ages for injury and illness, including the flu, asthma attacks, broken bones, cuts requiring stitches and more.

The clinic also offers digital x-rays, EKGs, physicals, flu shots, IVs and lab work. There is always a physician and medical team on site.

Appointments are not necessary, and most patients are treated at the center within an hour, Steve Delozier, the company's

vice president of operations, said during a grand-opening ceremony at the Newark location Tuesday.

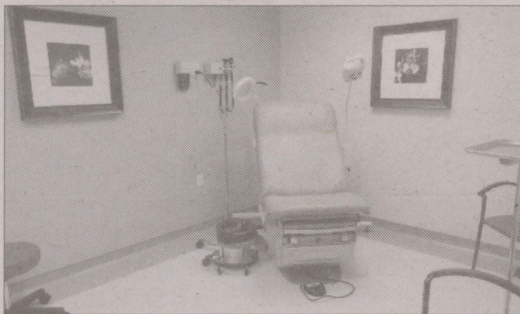
He said his favorite story to tell is about the woman who sliced her finger while cutting cucumbers for a gathering at her home that evening.

"She was treated at the center and was back in time for dessert," Delozier said.

The company is planning to open three more centers in Delaware by the end of the year. The center at 3926 Kirkwood Highway in Marshallton will open Oct. 28; the center at 2722 Concord Pike in Wilmington will open Oct. 31; and the center at 129 N. Dupont Highway in New Castle will open Nov. 7.

MedExpress also operates centers in Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia and Florida.

The Newark location will offer free flu shots this Wednesday through Wednesday, Oct. 24. The flu shots will be given on a walk-in basis.

# Newark man has accumulated a trove of stories

orphanage that trained her to become a local teacher; and possibly two family members who were involved in the Dover Eight, a group of slaves that escaped by means of the Underground Railroad.

But while his own family history is what sparked Woolford's initial interest in historical records, his research over the past five years has extended far beyond his own family tree.

Woolford's study of historical U.S. Census data, land records, death records, deeds, newspapers and other sources has helped him put together a detailed portrait of what life has been like for black Americans in Delaware before, during, and far beyond the Civil War.

Stories of people like Mary Francis Bacchus, a slave in Middletown who, according to death records, died in 1861 at age 4 from "softening of bones," help us remember — and hopefully learn from — some of the more somber truths of our state's history, he said.

### NEWARK NATIVE

Woolford himself was born in 1943 to Sylvester and Grace Saunders Woolford, and grew up with his parents and sister, Lelia, in a house on New London Avenue in downtown Newark.

"At the time, I had a mother and father and five aunts and

uncles who all lived on New London and Corbett Streets," he said.

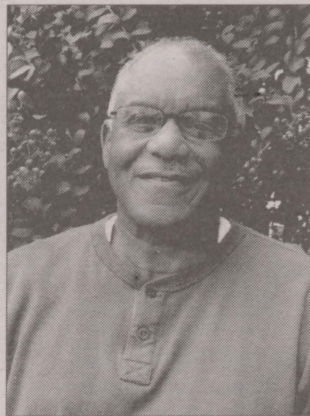
He attended New London School (now the City of Newark-owned George Wilson Community Center) and then Central Elementary School, which has long since closed. He attended Newark High School for two years before transferring to William Penn when his father, a teacher at the Buttonwoods School, moved the family to New Castle in Sylvester's junior year.

He said as a child, he was not allowed to go beyond the New London community because, being black, he would not have been welcome on Main Street or other areas of downtown.

Still, he said, his childhood was quite normal.

His mother was mainly a homemaker, but helped his uncle run Bob and Dot's Snack Bar on the corner of Cleveland Avenue and New London Road.

"My parents used to push you out the door in the morning and say 'Come back when you're hungry,'" Woolford recently recalled. "Within the community, it was a very safe community. We played with each other, football, basketball and baseball all day long. We were so insulated (that) we didn't know they were poor; it was only four blocks. You couldn't go out of the neighborhood (because of the segregation,) so the greatest thrill in life was when the ice-

cream truck came by and rang its bell.

### WRITING HIS OWN HISTORY

Woolford earned a bachelor's degree in business administration and accounting from Delaware State University and then a master's degree in business administration from Rutgers University.

He went on to work many years in accounting and sales with such firms as Campbell Soup, IBM, Pacific Telesis and Sun Information Services. Most recently he worked for, and retired from, AAA MidAtlantic in Wilmington.

Woolford moved back to Newark in 1993 to care for his ill widowed uncle, Art Saunders, who was a barber and owner of Bob and Dot's Snack Bar. Saunders has since passed away, and Woolford now lives in the home, on New London Avenue.

He said he didn't develop an intense interest in history until after he retired, in 2008, when the City of Newark published the book "Histories of Newark: 1758 - 2008," in honor of the city's 250th anniversary.

"They did a fantastic job on it, and left my family out of it," Woolford said.

The book's authors did a tremendous job of recounting the city's history, particularly its industrial evolution, he said.

"But I thought there were some missing people and they left out the schoolteachers," he said. "There was not one African-American schoolteacher mentioned in the book."

The slight stung a little, but it inspired in Woolford a resolve to research his own roots. He started simply searching family members' names on Google, and searching online databases for historical records. He eventually culminated a trove of information about black Delawareans.

He has since poured his research into PowerPoint presentations, and has recently lectured to audiences around the state on topics including U.S. colored troops who fought in the Civil War; Methodism among blacks in the 18th and 19th centuries; advertisements for slaves that ran in Delaware newspapers; the legacy of Howard High School; and black patriots and loyalists during the War of 1812. This Monday at

Kirkwood Highway Library, he will lead a discussion on the genealogy of Newark's Iron Hill Community.

He has also already booked several black-history presentations throughout the state during the month of February.

### TELLING THE TRUTH

Woolford said research like his, which often uses historic documents to tell stories about the inequities that many black citizens suffered throughout our state's history, even after slavery was eradicated, are especially relevant when it comes to establishing institutions like the African-American Heritage Center of Delaware, which is still in the planning stages.

"Why this is so relevant to me is, there's a debate and a million dollars on the

table to establish an African-American heritage center in Wilmington, and the question is, (in the establishment of such centers,) can white folks write black history, or does it get whitewashed?" Woolford said. "In my opinion, it does get whitewashed."

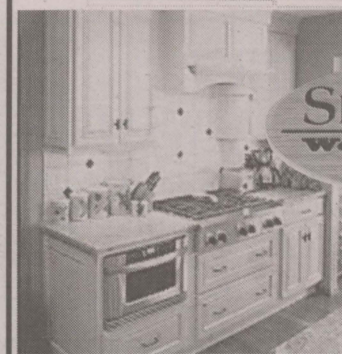
He noted the statue recently erected at Tubman-Garrett Park in Wilmington, co-honoring Harriett Tubman, the noted slave, and Thomas Garrett, the white landowner credited with helping to free scores of slaves in this area.

"Suddenly, the Underground Railroad is about white folks helping black folks escape slavery," Woolford said.

# Newark man charged with killing an animal

Police arrested a 38-year-old Newark man last Thursday after neighbors reported seeing him choke, kick and slam a cat on the

ground, and then throw it in his trash can, police said.

Police responded to the unit block of Top View Court in the community of Edgebrook around 11:08 p.m. Thursday following a report from residents that

David Sisofo, 38, a resident of the street, had acted violently towards a cat, his neighbors, and members of his family, police said.

The officer learned that one of the victims had been trying to find the owner of a stray cat she had found on Wednesday, and was knocking on the door of another resident's house when Sisofo came charging down his driveway and confronted her, said Ofc. First Class Tracey Duffy of New Castle County Police.

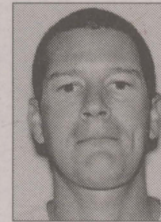
The victim returned home, where she told her parents about the incident. Her par-

ents went to Sisofo's home and tried to explain the reasons for their daughter's actions, but Sisofo became confrontational, police said, threatening to kill the cat and to strike the victim in the face.

The victims left and called the police. When police arrived, they learned that residents had seen Sisofo choke, kick and slam the stray cat on the ground.

While searching a trash can outside Sisofo's home, the officer found a small,

dead, orange-and-white cat inside it.

Around the same time, an officer saw Sisofo leave his home, throw a hanging decoration, and strike a member of his family multiple times, Duffy said.

When officers attempted to take Sisofo into custody, he threatened to kill one of the officers. He also made threats of bodily harm to another officer transporting him to county police headquarters, Duffy said.

Police notified the SPCA,

which took custody of the cat.

Sisofo has been charged with cruelty to animals, a felony; tampering with evidence, also a felony; three counts of terroristic threatening; four counts of endangering the welfare of a child; two counts of resisting arrest; three counts of harassment; offensive touching and two counts of menacing.

He was arraigned and committed to Howard R. Young Correctional Institute in lieu of \$22,500 secured bail and was also issued a no-contact order with the residents of Edgebrook.

## Mom arrested for leaving baby on sidewalk

New Castle County Police arrested a 24-year-old Newark woman last Wednesday after she left her infant son in a car seat on the sidewalk for more than 45 minutes, police said.

Abbie Arms was charged with endangering the welfare of a child, and child-protective services took her 11-month-old son into custody, after police learned she had gotten distracted and walked off, leaving her son, said Ofc. First Class Tracey Duffy of New Castle

County Police.

A resident of Glasgow Court Trailer Park called police last Wednesday to report that a white female wearing shorts and a multi-colored shirt was last seen walk-

ing away from the infant. When police arrived around 2:10 p.m., they found the infant on the sidewalk uninjured and buckled into the car seat, Duffy said.

More officers responded to help

find the baby's mother, and searched the area for 45 minutes before finding Arms in another section of the neighborhood, Duffy said.

After talking to Arms, police determined that she had been sitting under a tree and received a phone call, during which she heard about a fight that was about to occur in the area. Arms told police she then became distracted and left the area without her son, Duffy said. "The way that I understand it was that it wasn't on purpose; she kind of got distracted and left the baby by accident," she said.

The baby was taken to Christiana Medical Center and admitted for observation. The Division of Family Services was contacted and took custody of the baby.

Arms was charged with endangering the welfare of a child and was released on a \$250 unsecured bail.

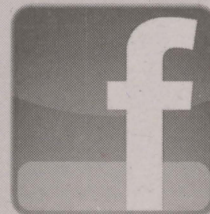

## Masked man robs WSFS bank in Suburban Plaza

A suspect wearing a hockey mask like the villain in the "Friday the 13th" movies entered the WSFS Bank in Suburban Plaza Shopping Center Monday during bank hours and robbed the tellers at gunpoint, said Master Cpl. Gerald Bryda of the Newark Police Department.

## Police: Beware of telephone scammers

Police are warning residents to be wary of anyone claiming to be from a com-

pany and asking for personal or banking information over the phone, after two Newark residents reported getting such calls recently.

The first case happened around 2 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 5, when a 20-year-old female reported getting a call from a man who told her she qualified for a grant, and that to accept it, she needed only to send several-hundred dollars overseas via Western Union. The victim complied, sending the money overseas to India, said Newark Police spokesman Master Cpl. Gerald Bryda. The department is investigating the incident, Bryda said.

"We'd like to warn everyone that, in cases like this, if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is," he said. "If you have someone calling and asking for money upfront for a grant or loan, it's probably a scam."

The second incident happened the same day, when a 21-year-old female reported receiving a call from a person claiming to be from a collections company.

The caller, who knew personal information about the victim, told her she

was in default of a payday loan and that the company would sue her if she didn't send \$500.

When the victim got off the phone, she got online and looked up the purported company, Anderson & Associates. The company was listed under an FBI fraud alert as a fake, phone-scam scheme, Bryda said.

"The victim immediately recognized it as a scam and reported it to police," Bryda said.

## Metro PCS store robbed

A man robbed the Metro PCS store in Newark Shopping Center at gunpoint last Thursday.

Around 1 p.m., the suspect entered the store, at 230 E. Main St., and proceeded to a back room, where he pointed a handgun at an employee of the store and demanded money. The suspect forced the victim to clear out the register and then fled on foot across Main Street towards Delaware Avenue.

The suspect is described as a black male, late teens to early twenties, with a goa-

tee and a thin build, wearing a royal-blue hooded sweat-shirt, jeans and sneakers.

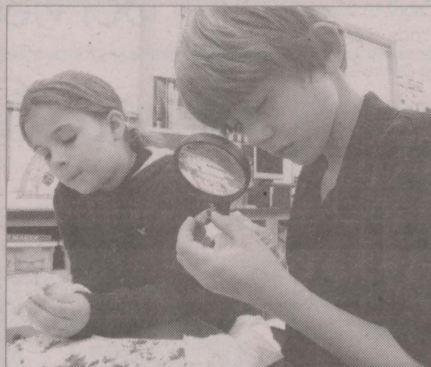
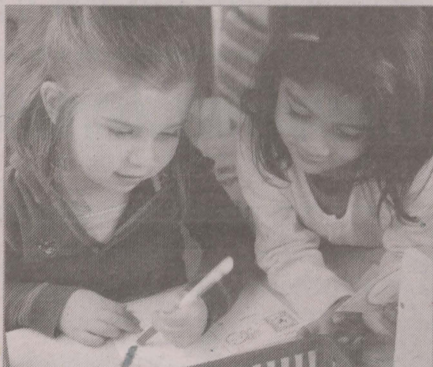
Moments later, the restaurant gave him another address within the complex.

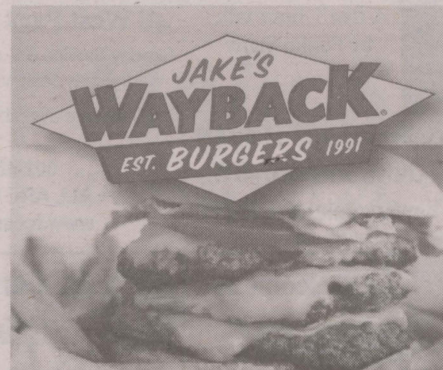

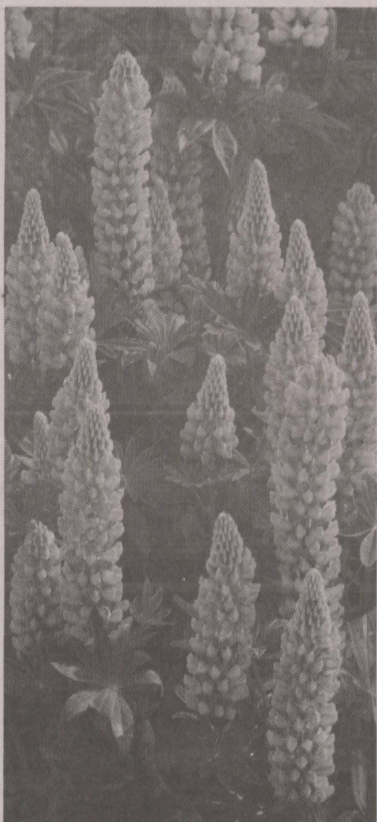

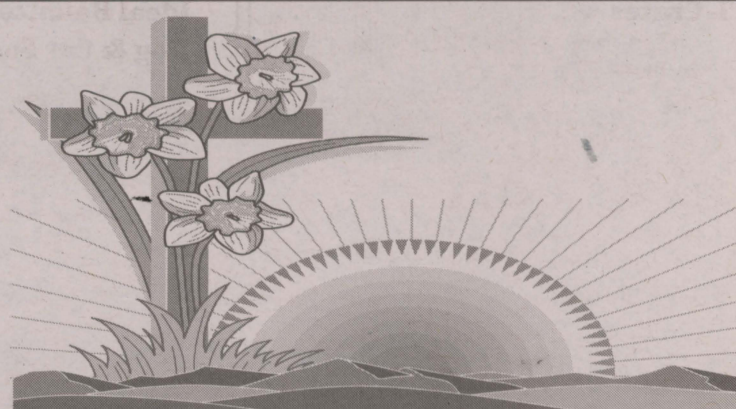

## Wilmington couple claim \$50 million Powerball jackpot

A husband and wife from Wilmington came forward Oct. 5 to claim their \$50 million Powerball jackpot from the Wednesday, Oct. 3 drawing, according to Delaware

Lottery officials.

The couple opted to remain anonymous and selected the cash, single-payment value for the jackpot, which totaled \$33.05 million before federal withholding taxes. Delaware Lottery officials validated the

winning ticket.

"I checked my numbers in the newspaper during a break at work, and when I realized I had won, I had the shakes," the man, who described himself as a laborer, told lottery officials last Friday. "I was

like, I'm done. I'm done for the day!"

While having their winning ticket processed at Lottery headquarters in Dover, the couple recounted their tale, which began with a purchase of the tick-

et at Cutrona's Liquors in Wilmington.

"We chose numbers that mean something to us — and when they were selected on Wednesday, we couldn't believe that they were drawn in the sequence we picked!"

The winning numbers were 17, 23, 36, 55 and 59, with a Powerball of 10.

This is the eighth time a Powerball-jackpot-winning ticket was sold in Delaware and the fifth-largest Powerball jackpot won in Delaware.

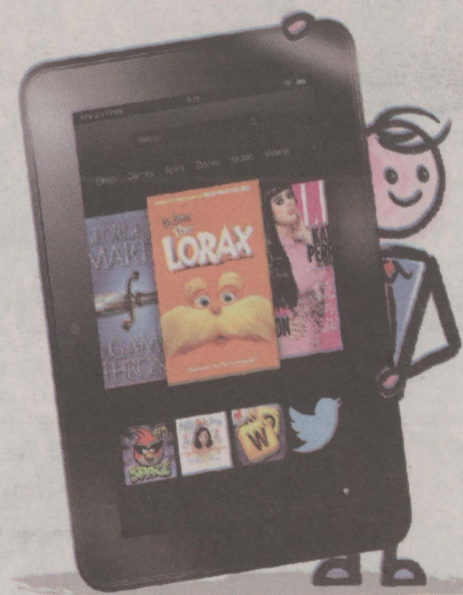

# Feeling *blue*? Try these warm berry muffins

Towards the end of my Dad's life, he wrote meticulous notes, documenting his daily exercise programs and food intake. He also came up with recipes while lying in bed at night or during the day when he wasn't feeling good. Having to watch his diet in so many ways, he wrote down this recipe that I just found a few days ago, so I would like to share it with you.

Don't let the oat flour push you away. After making these myself when I found the recipe, I realized

the texture was unlike any other muffin I had tried. The filling is light, soft and hearty. You may have to visit your local health-food store for the oat flour – or simply grind rolled oats in your blender or food processor.

### 'STUFFED' BLUEBERRY MUFFINS WITH TEA DRIZZLE

This recipe is a little more involved than you would find in my cookbook, but the extra steps result in a flavor-

ful muffin. The addition of the yogurt ensures moistness and a special "bite."

1 1/2 cups flour  
1/2 cup oat flour\*  
1 1/2 tsp. baking powder  
1/2 cup butter or margarine, chilled  
1/2 cup yogurt  
1/2 cup milk  
2 eggs  
1 tsp. vanilla  
3/4 cup sugar  
1 lemon  
1 cup fresh or frozen blueberries  
1 (14-oz.) can blueberry pie filling

Tea Glaze (recipe below)

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. In a large mixing bowl, combine the flours and baking powder. Using a pastry cutter or two knives, cut the chilled butter into the flour mixture until it resembles peas.

In a separate bowl, whisk together the yogurt, milk, eggs, vanilla, sugar, grated zest and juice from the lemon. Add the milk mixture to the dry ingredients, and stir just until the dry ingredients are moistened. Fold in the blueberries.

Grease your muffin tin, or line each cup with a paper liner.

Fill each cup about 1/2 full, spoon in a tablespoon of the blueberry filling (trying to center the filling as much as possible) and top with muffin batter. Bake for about twenty minutes, or until the muffins are lightly browned on top. Allow the muffins to set in the pan for about

five minutes before removing them.

### Tea Glaze

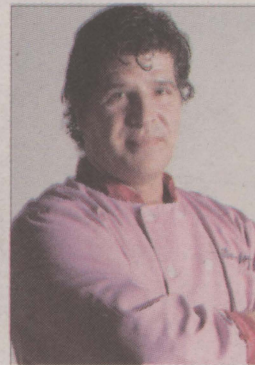
1/2 c. powdered sugar  
2 tea bags

Pour boiling water over two teabags. Steep the tea-

bags in the water until you reach your desired strength. Combine 1 tbsp. of the tea with 1/2 cup powdered sugar and mix with a fork, enjoy drinking the rest of the tea while finishing muffins. Drizzle or spread over the muffins while still warm.

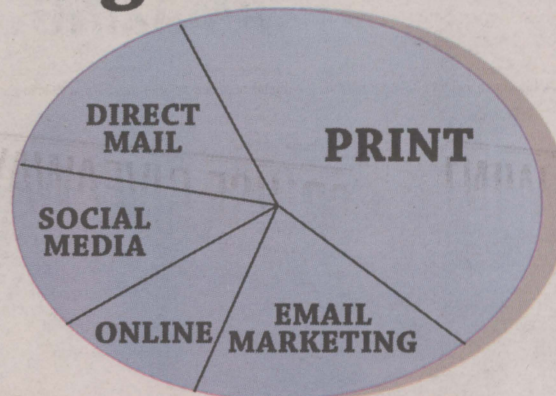

# Ace in the hole — times three

## Newark native beats the odds on the golf course

Ronnie Malkin was going through his normal routine on the eighth tee at Deerfield Golf Club Aug. 8: he pulled out his 3-wood, teed up his ball, took a few practice swings and

then drove the ball 225 yards uphill. He couldn't see it, but Malkin was pretty confident it landed on the elevated green of the challenging par-3 hole.

"The shot was beautiful, long and high with just a bit of draw on it," said Malkin, a Wilmington resident who

grew up in Newark and graduated from Christiana High School. "The hole is long and uphill, so you can't see the green, but I knew it was close and had a chance of being in the cup."

One of Malkin's partners that day, Roger Johnson, was

more than confident it was on the green.

"Ron has a very good swing, and so when he hit it, I said, 'Wow, that's right at the flag. That has a chance to go in,'" Johnson said. "Ron went to the back of the green to make sure he didn't hit it over. While he did that, I walked up and looked in the hole and sure enough, yelled out, 'Oh boy, it's in the hole.' We all got excited for him."

Malkin, who carries a 3 handicap, said, "I really didn't feel like it was happening to me so much as it was just fun for all of us."

Malkin, 53, took up the sport 25 years ago, playing sporadically until after he retired in 2009 and joined Deerfield. Since then, he's played five or six rounds a week, but until that memorable August day, he had never scored a hole-in-one.

It didn't take him long to get his second.

Thirty-five days after his "once-in-a-lifetime" accomplishment, Malkin did it again

— this time, using a 6-iron to ace the 165-yard 16th hole.

"The second one was just as good a shot, but on a shorter hole," Malkin said. "But the pin was in the back so I couldn't see that one go in the hole either."

Malkin had done the improbable, some would say the impossible: two holes-in-one in a span of 35 days. And he wasn't even finished yet.

Just 47 days after acing the eighth hole for his first-ever hole-in-one, Malkin teed his

ball up there again. Using the same club, the same smooth swing, and the same high-arching shot with a slight draw, he got the same result.

"Again, because the eighth green is uphill, I didn't see the third one either," Malkin laughed. "All I did was shake my head after the last one."

One of Malkin's regular playing partners is Jack Walker, who is no stranger to hole-in-ones, having four of his own. Walker was away on vacation during Malkin's first ace, but was playing with Malkin during the second and third ones. He pointed out that there was something special about both.

"The thing that struck me about these shots was that they were hit so pure you just had the feeling they were going in the hole," Walker explained. "I mean, sometimes [hole-in-ones] are lucky shots, but Ronnie's two I saw were right at the flag. Ronnie is such a natural athlete, it seems like the game comes easy to him."

Making a hole-in-one is not easy. According to Golf Digest, the odds of Malkin making a hole-in-one on a 200-plus yard hole are 150,000:1. The odds of acing a hole with a distance of less than 200 yards are 12,000:1. The odds of an amateur making two hole-in-ones in the same round are 67 million:1.

"You don't expect to have a hole-in-one," Malkin said. "Then, after the first one goes in, you definitely aren't looking to repeat it. But to have three in less than seven weeks at the same course, that is the most incredible part of it."

## Aetna Hose, Hook, and Ladder Volunteer Fire Co. No.1 Firehouse



Home of the Aetna Hose, Hook and Ladder Company, Newark, Delaware

This week's Out of the Attic item is a postcard showing the Aetna Hose, Hook, and Ladder Volunteer Fire Co. No.1 firehouse on the northeast corner of Academy Street and East Delaware Avenue.

The card is postmarked Oct. 15, 1929. This is the second firehouse in Aetna's history since its founding in 1888.

Since then, another bay has been added to the right side, and later, three more bays have been built onto the back of the building, opening onto Delaware Avenue.

The first firehouse was a single bay building across the street that housed a hand-drawn hose

reel. That building became town offices after the pictured structure was built.

The population of people and structures in Aetna's 29-square-mile service area has grown over the years. So has Aetna's fleet of fire and rescue trucks and ambulances.

To counteract increased road congestion and to keep response time short, three new firehouses have been built in the Aetna Fire District, on Ogletown Road east of Newark, Thorne Lane on the west side, and Church Road at the south end.

The original one-bay station on Academy Street has also been returned to fire service.

October is Fire Prevention Month. Be sure to change the batteries in your smoke detectors, clear your house of fire hazards, and make a donation to the Aetna H.H. & L. Co., P. O. Box 148, Newark, DE 19715-0148.
