I would suggest that Dr. Csato make his application for an immigration visa at the Consulate General at Zürich in April or not later than May of this year. Once the visa is granted it is valid for four months, that is to say, he would have to leave for the United States some time during the four months' validity of the visa. I suggest his getting the visa in the not too distant future, as Congress is considering various bills which may affect immigration matters and make admission more difficult than it is now. When Dr. Csato goes to the Consulate General at Zürich I would suggest that he ask to see Mr. Haskell himself, as in view of my letter I am sure Mr. Haskell will see him. I think there I think there should be no difficulty about the matter. is no reason for Dr. Csato to communicate with Budapest. My only reason in writing to Mr. Warren at Budapest was to make sure that when he gets a request for a number from Mr. Haskell he will make no difficulties. If there should be any difficulties I should be glad to be advised later, as I can always be reached through the State Department while I am home; but I do not anticipate that there will be any.
