I am writing to you on behalf of the Delaware Insurance Guaranty Association. On Thursday, House Bill 566 unanimously passed the House of Representatives. The purpose of this Bill is to entitle Horizon's 6,000 plus insureds to recover all of their unused premium dollars.

At the present time the Delaware Insurance Guaranty Act has a \$100.00 deductible in this regard. The purpose of this deductible, just like the deductible on your car, is to require an individual to participate in a loss. As you are aware from the newspaper articles, this insolvency is attributed to the fact that Horizon's policies were underpriced.

For much the same reason that a policy holder would have been charged for his or her deductible following an accident, it is logical to charge them a deductible in this insolvency. In most cases Horizon was the insurance carrier used because it was in the economic interest of the policy holder. It does no good to complain amount(sic) the rising cost of insurance and at the same time pass bills which increase that cost.

Dear Senator Bane:

Thank you for the opportunity to participate in the planning of S.B. 408. You have asked me if I would outline the thoughts that I shared at the first meeting in March and during our later discussions.

First, as you know, I do support background checks on purchases of firearms. Μv biggest concern involves the question of who should have the major responsibility for saying "YES" or "NO" to a potential customer of a firearm.

What about the customer's privacy when my employee or I <u>must</u> say "NO" in front of other customers? In order to respect his or her privacy, I could take the customer to a back office or room. However, I ask you, if that person is a convicted felon, how dangerous could that be? The refusal to purchase a firearm should come from the authorities who do the background checks, not the retailer. The authorities are trained to handle potentially difficult customers who will not like to hear "NO" to the purchase of a firearm. I assure you, my employees agree!

What about the delay to sales involving a phone background check? Calls on  $1-800\,$  numbers don't always go through the first time. Often lines are busy and the dealer and customers must wait.

Although Shooters Supply does not sell handguns, we do sell long guns, and if there must be a background check on the purchase of firearms it should be conducted by law enforcement agencies. Use of the Certificate to Purchase is the most private way for the customer and the safest way for the dealer.

On May 17, 1990, I received Senate Bill No. 144 as amended by Senate Amendments No. 1 and No. 3 and House Amendments No. 1 and No. 2 and House Amendment No. 1 to House Amendment No. 2 which is entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 10 OF THE DELAMARE CODE BY CREATING A MORKPLACE DRUG TESTING ACT."

This bill seeks to address the significant problems associated with drug and alcohol abuse in the workplace. As originally drafted Senate Bill No. 144 sought to balance private employers' interests in maintaining a healthy, productive, drug-free workforce against their employees' right to be free from the unreasonable, arbitrary or otherwise improper infringement of their privacy interests. For his efforts in addressing this important and difficult issue by introducing this legislation, Senator Neal is to be commended. While I wholeheartedly embrace the notion that legislation is appropriate in order to address the competing issues involved, regrettably, Senate Bill No. 144 as it was ultimately amended does not accomplish this goal. Because it raises serious constitutional questions, would be subject to arbitrary and inequitable application, and otherwise fails to provide the necessary detail to insure that the interests of both employers and employees are protected, I am returning Senate Bill No. 144 as amended by Senate Amendments No. 1 and No. 3, and House Amendment No. 1 and No. 2 and House Amendment No. 1 to House Amendment No. 2 without my signature.

While not mandating workplace drug and alcohol testing programs, unamended Senate Bill No.

While not mandating workplace drug and alcohol testing programs, unamended Senate Bill No. 144 sought to provide clearly articulated uniform guidelines for such programs conducted by private employers. The bill as amended, however, seeks to extend the applicability of its provisions to state, county, municipal and school district employees. By applying its provisions to public employees, the amended bill renders applicable the protections afforded by the Fourth Amendment to the United States Constitution.

The Fourth Amendment guarantees the privacy and security of persons against unreasonable searches and seizures conducted by the government of its agents. In this regard, the courts have consistently held that the taking of urine, blood or breath samples when compelled by the government for purposes of drug or alcohol testing constitutes searches within the meaning of the Fourth Amendment. As a general proposition, a search must be supported by a warrant issued upon probable cause. In the context of government sponsored employee drug and alcohol testing programs, however, it has been recognized that if the testing serves special governmental needs, beyond the normal need for law enforcement, it is necessary to balance the employees' privacy expectations against the governments's interests to determine whether it is impractical to require a warrant or some level of individualized suspicion in the particular context. Applying this standard, the courts have upheld warrantless drug testing of government employees whose duties bear a direct and immediate impact on public health and safety, the protection of life and property, law enforcement or national security. In cases where a government employee's functions do no involve similar special governmental needs, such compelled testing has been held violative of the Fourth Amendment absent, at the very minimum, individualized reasonable suspicion.

Under Senate Bill No. 144 as amended, state "elected and appointed officials as well as employees, full and part-time" are made subject to drug and alcohol testing guidelines and procedures to be established by the heads of the three branches of state government. Additionally, as mentioned, while not mandated, drug and alcohol testing of county, municipal and school district employees is authorized. Under certain circumstances, the amended bill would permit these governmental entities to obtain urine, blood or breath samples from their employees on a random basis without even requiring individualized suspicion. While random testing of certain public employees in safety sensitive jobs may be legal and appropriate, the Fourth Amendment simply will not permit such searches in every case solely by virtue of the fact that an individual is a public employee. Because this bill as amended would permit the wholesale suspicionless testing of public employees, I have no alternative but to veto it as being unconstitutional.(1)

Even were a constitutional violation not apparent on the face of this legislation, I would still be reluctant to sign it into law because of the fact that another arbitrary and unreasonable provision was incorporated into the bill by amendment.

Specifically, the amended provision excludes from the bill's drug and alcohol testing provisions all employees who are covered by collective bargaining agreements. The amendment expressly provides that in the event that there is conflict between any collective bargaining agreement and the provisions of this legislation the collective bargaining agreement shall prevail. Exempting those employees subject to collective bargaining from the protections of the legislation is inequitable, inappropriate and contrary to the bill's stated purpose of providing "fair and equitable' workplace testing programs. As a matter of policy, the creation of this exception to the bill's provisions in and of itself justifies the rejection of this legislation.

It is my hope that alternative workplace drug and alcohol testing legislation will be introduced which will address the problems described herein. Additionally, in order to insure the fairness of such legislation, I would urge that consideration be given to the introduction of two bills, one to govern the testing of private employees and the other applicable to public employees. These bills should also include additional detail to insure the reliability and confidentiality of the testing. Specifically, such legislation should provide detailed chain-of-custody procedures, insure privacy in the testing process, prohibit in-house testing of samples, provide a rebuttal opportunity to employees who have tested positive, and establish detailed procedures to insure the confidentiality of all test results.

Finally, any alternative legislation that seeks to provide for both drug and alcohol workplace testing should indicate that fact in its title. Senate Bill No. 144, while providing for both drug and alcohol testing made reference only to drug testing in its title thereby, arguably, constituting a violation of Art. II, §16 of the Delaware Constitution which limits the contents of a bill to those matters embraced in its title.

In conclusion, I must reiterate that I strongly endorse the benefits to be derived from a comprehensive, practical, and equitable workplace drug and alcohol testing program. For the reason stated herein, however, I am compelled to return Senate Bill No. 144 as amended to the Senate without my signature.

Dear Senator Martin:

As you are aware, this law firm presently represents the Coalition for Natural Stream Valleys in its formal opposition to the currently planned substantial bridge construction where Hopkins Road Bridge passes over the White Clay Creek. I should say at this point that the Coalition is extremely grateful for the important support you have given to their effort both in the General Assembly and in the public press. Since your letters opposing the current Deldot plan were made part of the record before the Environmental Appeals Board, we strongly hope that the Appeals Board gives your input great weight and "just says no."

Mention of the Environmental Appeals Board brings me to the point of this letter. We thought you would want to know that late in the afternoon on Friday, May 25, 1990, I received correspondence from legal counsel to the Delaware Department of Transportation. Apparently, the letter from Frederick Schranck, Deputy Attorney General, was a belated response to my letter of May 9, 1990. I had sent a letter on May 9 to Secretary Justice immediately upon the conclusion of the hearing before the Environmental Appeals Board. My letter advised Secretary Justice that since the Appeals Board had taken this matter under consideration, no construction should commence at least until the Appeals Board had decided the matter.

Nonetheless, the May 25 letter from Deldot's attorney states in no uncertain terms that the Department sees "nothing improper in acting on a valid permit." In essence, Deldot is specifically choosing not to comply with our request that any construction await an opinion from the Appeals Board.

await an opinion from the Appeals Board.

I can assure you that the Coalition has acted responsibly and has made, in our view, an extremely effective case before the EAB. The hearing before the Board began at 8:30 a.m. and concluded at 5:00 p.m. We introduced a number of articulate, concerned, and experienced witnesses who presented quality testimony on the likely adverse environmental impact of the Hopkins Road Bridge replacement as it is currently planned. Similarly, a great quantity of documentary evidence was placed into the record before the Appeals Board. When witnesses could not assess the full anticipated environmental impact of the planned bridge construction, we argued that that was all the more reason to delay any construction until a full environmental impact study could be performed.

It causes the Coalition great concern that it has entrusted its case to the Appeals Board while the Secretary of Transportation, on the other hand, appears ready to ignore the fact that the matter is being considered by the Board. When a state official ignores an important hearing structure established by the General Assembly, I believe that the citizens of Delaware are grossly disserved.

It can assure you that the Coalition is considering taking legal steps should construction begin while the very permit permitting that construction is on appeal before the Board. Nonetheless, we assume that you and your colleagues in the General Assembly would want to know of the Secretary's intentions in this matter.

Thank you for inquiring about my views on various campaign finance laws being proposed at the State level.

It is my understanding that the proposals contain different contribution limits for candidates for the offices of County Executive and County Council President. Quite frankly. I have never understood the rationale for such differences. Candidates for both offices must reach the same number of voters in the same "district" (the seventh councilmanic district). My campaigns for the office of County Council President involved all of the same activities and expenses as the campaigns for the office of County Executive.

Some people contend that the campaign contribution differential is based on the relative importance of the positions themselves. That difference, however, is reflected in the salaries assigned to each of the positions.

I wholeheartedly support any efforts to make the contribution limitations identical for both offices.

Dear Myrna:

I have reviewed the proposed legislation known as Senate Bill 427 and I would like to take this opportunity to react to a provision in the Bill which is particularly troublesome for me.

In its current form Senate Bill 427 calls for significant contributions to the campaigns for elected office by the political party. In the case of County Council President (of New Castle County) the amount is the same as for a District Councilman, that is \$5,000. By contrast, the amount allowed for the County Executive is \$25,000.

I believe that the effort to be elected County Council President is no less than the effort to be elected County Executive of New Castle County. My experience in the campaign of '88 and the effort of my opponents in that election show that the cost of such a county-wide campaign are roughly the same. Former Presidents of New Castle County Council, regardless the party, have told me that their experience was the same.

For these reasons I would like to ask that you move to amend SB 427 to increase the amount allowed to be contributed by the political party to the County Council President to be the same as that allowed to the New Castle County Executive.

Thank you for your consideration of this issue.

Given the far reaching power of the Governor to convene an extraordinary session, it is inconsistent to limit this power by restricting the manner in which the Governor convenes the session. these reason, I conclude that the Extraordinary Sessions of the House of Representatives and the Senate called for July 11, 1990 and July 17, 1990, respectively, are constitutional.

On October 17 the Governor signed  $\underline{HB}$  712  $\underline{w}$   $\underline{HA}$  1 (Volume 67, Chapter 452, Laws of Delaware).

The following VETO letters from the Governor were received while the Senate was not in session:

#### STATE of DELAWARE Office of the Governor

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE DELAWARE STATE SENATE 135TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE

On June 21, 1990, I received Senate Bill #417 as amended by House Amendment #1, #2 and #3 entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 19, DELAMARE CODE, RELATING TO CERTAIN PUBLIC WORKS CONTRACTS, AND PAYMENT OF EMPLOYEE WAGES BENEFITS BY PROVIDING FOR POSTING OF BONDS AND PRESCRIBING CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF."

The bill requires that every contractor and subcontractor engaged in or about to engage in work on a public contract with the State of Delaware or one of its agencies must furnish a bond payable to the State to insure payment of the wages and fringe benefits of the contractor's or subcontractor's employees. Excepted from this requirement are "those who have done business in this State actively and actually engaged in construction work within the five years next receiving the posting of the bond required by this section and against whom there are no outstanding complaints with the Department of Labor for failure to pay wages and wage supplements . . .". The bill requires that the amount of bond posted be equal to the total of the employer's gross payroll for four weeks at full capacity or production, plus fifteen percent. The amount of the bond must be increased or decreased as the employer's payroll increases or decreases; however, in the case of a decrease, approval for the decrease must be obtained from the Secretary of the state agency with whom the employer has contracted. The bill also provides that the head of a contracting state agency may waive the bond requirement if he or she determines that an employer is of sufficient financial responsibility to pay wages and fringe benefits. Rules and regulations are to be established which prescribe standards for granting waivers. The bill also prescribes criminal penalties for failing to post a bond or for concealing assets to avoid payment of employee wages and benefits.

Because certain provisions of the bill are ambiguous and raise potential administrative problems and certain constitutional concerns and because it is in part duplicative of existing law and could raise the costs to the State of public works contracts, I am returning Senate Bill No. 417 as amended by House Amendment Nos. 1, 2, and 3 without my signature.

Initially, as previously stated, the bill provided for the posting of bond in an amount equal to the total of an employer's gross payroll for four weeks at full capacity or production plus fifteen percent. The legislation does not, however, indicate whether the bond amount is required to cover an employer's entire payroll or only that portion of the payroll which is involved in performing work on Delaware public works contracts. The plain wording of the statute would indicate that the bond must cover an employer's entire payroll. The effect of this requirement would be extremely onerous especially in the cases of non-Delaware contractors and subcontractors who conduct a significant portion of their business outside of the state. Such employers would find it extremely difficult to submit competitive bids on public works projects in Delaware since the premiums for the bond required under this bill would have to be included in the contractors' bid proposal. Obviously, as well, there is no rational basis for requiring a contractor to post a bond based on the amount of its entire payroll when only a fraction is involved in a Delaware public works contract.

An additional concern is the provision that the amount of a bond must increase or decrease as an employer's payroll increases or decreases. As a practical matter this would be an extremely burdensome requirement since each bond is issued in a definite principal amount. Therefore, any time the amount of an employer's payroll changes, which obviously occurs with great frequency, a different bond would have to be issued.

Moreover, the provision which allows an exception for firms actively and actually engaged in construction work in Delaware for the specified period of time raises certain concerns relating to the privileges and immunities clause contained in Article 4, Section 2 of the United States Constitution which provides that "citizens of each state shall be entitled to all privileges and immunities of citizens in the several states". It can be argued that this legislation discriminates against individuals who are non-resident contractors and who have not previously engaged in public works contracts in Delaware thereby preventing them from enjoying the same fundamental right of employment as possessed by resident contractors.

Of even greater significance is the fact that 29 <u>Del.C.</u>, §6909 already requires that prime contractors doing business with the State post a bond to cover the wages of their employees. While the current law does not impose the bonding requirement as to fringe benefits, it could easily and properly be amended to provide that payment bonds submitted by public works contractors provide coverage for fringe benefits as well. In my view, this would be a simple, effective and appropriate means of accomplishing the well-intended goals of this legislation.

Finally, I believe that the requirements of this bill will unnecessarily result in increased costs to the State with respect to public works contracts since contractors will have to factor the added costs associated with the bills's requirements into their bid proposals.

For the reasons state herein, I am returning Senate Bill No 417 as amended by House Amendment Nos. 1, 2 and 3 to the Senate without my signature.

The following VETO letter though not dated was received by the Assistant Secretary on July 19, 1990:

STATE of DELAWARE Office of the Governor

To the Members of the Delaware State Senate of the 135th General Assembly

On July 9, 1990, I received Senate Bill No. 425 which is entitled: "AN ACT AWARDING SPECIAL PENSION BENEFITS TO ELSIE EVERETT, TRANSFERRING MONIES INTO THE SPECIAL PENSION FUND CREATED BY VOLUME 61, CHAPTER 455, LAWS OF DELAWARE, AND DIRECTING THE BOARD OF PENSION TRUSTEES TO ADMINISTER PAYMENT OF THE PENSION PROVIDED BY THIS ACT AS IF THE AWARD WERE PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 55, TITLE 29, DELAWARE CODE."

This bill seeks to direct the Board of Pension Trustees to continue to provide Elsie Everett with a service pension based on 18 years of service rather than the 15 years for which she is eligible to receive pension benefits under Delaware law. The bill further directs that \$6,327.94 be appropriated to fund this special pension benefit. Because I believe that the circumstances underlying Ms. Everett's case do not justify provided the extraordinary relief authorized by this legislation, I am returning Senate Bill No. 425 without my signature.

Ms. Everett was employed full-time in the state public schools for a period of 15 years. Additionally, she worked as a substitute teacher for 3 years. Under Delaware law, Ms. Everett is not entitled to receive credit for pension purposes for the 3 year period that she worked as a substitute teacher. In July, 1988, Ms. Everett retired from state service and began receiving her pension, the amount of which erroneously included her time of service as a substitute teacher. The mistake was recently discovered and the amount of Ms. Everett's pension is to be reduced accordingly.

While it is unfortunate that a mistake was made, there is no dispute that Ms. Everett was not legally entitled to receive benefits for the period of time during which she worked as a substitute teacher. Likewise, there is no basis which would justify the expenditure of additional taxpayers' money to perpetuate the original mistake which this legislation seeks to do. As a result, I am returning Senate Bill No. 425 without my signature.

I thought you might be interested to know that I am a co-sponsor of H.J.Res. 493, legislation supporting Baltic Freedom Day. While President Bush has not been as forceful as many would have liked in pressing the Soviets to accept independence for Lithuania, as well as Latvia and Estonia, there are now indications that the stalement in the Baltics may be over.

On June 13, Lithuanian Prime Minister Kazimiera Prunskiene announced that the Kremlin has agreed to relax economic sanctions against her Baltic republic, and indicated that the economic blockade may be lifted soon. In addition, President Gorbachev apparently had a successful meeting with the Presidents of the Lithuania, Latvia, and Estonia at which time the leaders appeared to have found a formula to begin negotiations that will result in sovereignty for the Baltic Republics. Events since that time indicate that the economic blockade has ended. In return, the republics have temporarily suspended their declarations of independence.

Recently you forwarded to me an official sealed copy of Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 89 "Creating a flexible benefit plan study commission to examine the feasibility of making flexible benefit plans available to State employees." State Insurance Commissioners and Personnel Directors have traditionally played a major role in development of such plans. According to our reading of Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 89, the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Delaware was not included as a member of the Commission. The phrase used in designating members was "Director of Insurance". While the Insurance Commissioner of some other States carries the title "Director of Insurance", in Delaware that title is carried by a state employee who reports to the State's Insurance Committee and the State's Health Insurance Committee, upon both of which Committees I serve.

In a phone conversation with the State Treasurer, who is designated Chairman of the Commission, I was informed that she was certain that the prime sponsor of the Resolution, Senator John Still, had as his intent the exclusion of the State's Insurance Commissioner from this Commission. I do no know, of course, whether all of the other members of the General Assembly were fully aware of Senator Still's intent or its effect. However, since this resolution provides neither authority nor responsibility to the State Insurance Commissioner to participate as a member of the Commission, I wish to confirm this as a matter of public record so that there is no misunderstanding in the future.

Thank you for forwarding to me a copy of Delaware State Senate Resolution 142 regarding Lithuanian independence. Please excuse the delay in my response to you.

As you know, free elections held in Lithuania resulted in an overwhelming victory for the pro-independence opposition movement, and the Lithuanian parliament declared independence from the Soviet Union on March 11. While the Soviet Union has not used military force in Lithuania, it responded to the declaration of independence with tactics apparently intended to intimidate the pro-independence Lithuanian government, including the movement of Soviet forces through the capital, and economic sanctions against the republic.

The Soviet government argues that the Lithuanians should use Soviet legal procedures in moving toward succession. The Lithuanian government argues, rightly, that Soviet laws are inapplicable because Lithuania did not voluntarily join the Soviet Union in the first place. The United States has never recognized the incorporation of Lithuania into the Soviet Union either, nor the neighboring Republics of Latvia and Estonia.

On April 3, the House overwhelmingly passed a resolution urging the Soviet government to enter into immediate negotiations with the government of Lithuania and to refrain from acts of political, military, or economic intimidation. The resolution also stated that the use of force by the Soviets against Lithuania would have severe repercussions for U.S.-Soviet relations, and urged the Bush Administration to strengthen its commitment to an independent Lithuania by planning for and taking the necessary steps to normalize diplomatic relations with Lithuania.

President Bush has not been as forceful as many would have liked in pressing the Soviets to accept independence for Lithuania, as well as Latvia and Estonia.
