Dear Mr. Hanenon.

We arrived home about 8 and after
two weeks in Washington I am with my
work getting some real rest. There is
much that I would like to write you
about but I am being really lazy
these days, simply mulling in the
feeling that I can't be forced to do
anything!

I have had a letter from Consul

Just who is in charge at Berlin,
sending me a personal note from
the Consul General at Zurich, telling
me why he can't give a visa
to Costa. This means that Dr.
Costa has evidently been refused
a visa there, & it would be useless
for him to apply elsewhere in
Switzerland.

If Dr. Costa wants to go to
the U.S. I see no reason why

under an present negotiations here, he
 should not have a visit, Mr. Frist, now in
 charge at Berlin feels the same way. The
 procedure would be for Mr. Casato to proceed
 to Berlin, establish residence there in a
 hotel or pension, and then apply for a
 visa at the Consulate General in Berlin,
 asking to see Mr. Frist who is familiar

with all the details. Obviously
Dr. Gato would just as well
not say anything in Switzerland
about his proceeding to Berlin
for a visa. If he can get a
month's leave from the sanatorium
at Arosa it should be ample
time for him to get the visa.
It should not be necessary for
him to give up his position
until he actually has a visa.

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Naturally our vice laws are strict,
and phones &c. are controlled, not only
phones, but must protect itself.
We have been too free. on the
other hand there is a certain type
of person whom we always want to
keep away, & from what you say
Mr. Coats is obviously that type.
Our friends have had a hard task.

which on the whole they have
done very well. Every once in a
while a man takes our reserves -
with attention as Haskell at
Zurich has done in this case.

Would you be coming to this
country before June 30, a telegram
to Fleetwood Penna. will always
reach me quickly. We are
returning to Berlin about

June 30. I do hope you are being
 prudent. One's real usefulness lies in
 conserving one's strength. We are not
 much use to any one, dead or disabled,
 and the world needs some men like
 you these days. That time we are
 in. We found the wind, and are

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reopening the whirlwind!

All good wishes to you &
