City Annexes 115-Acre Tract, Okays Housing Authority Pact

Arbour Park Housing Development Included in Newark Boundaries; Council Approves Cooperation Agreement With Local Authority To Obtain Federal Housing Funds

The City of Newark acquired an additional 115 acres with the annexation of the new Arbour Park tract north of West Chestnut Hill Road, and another step was taken to obtain federal funds for the provision of low cost housing with the passage of a resolution accepting a formal cooperation agreement with the Newark Housing Authority, by action of Newark City Council at its regular meeting last Tuesday night.

Annexation of the 115-acre tract contiguous to the city's southwest boundary, includes the Arbour Park housing development, along with five smaller parcels of land surrounded by the new home project.

John W. Meyers of the Newark Housing Authority, presented the co-operation agreement with his assurance that 1,500 communities had adopted this document and that it is "nothing the city has to worry about."

Required by Law
Attorney Divito, representing the National Housing Authority, explained the agreement as a "requirement of law . . . no different from any other agreement presented" and stated that Congress requires acceptance of the document before federal funds may be loaned.

Application has been made for 125 housing units in Newark, and to Councilman William Coverdale's query as to the amount of rental to be derived from these units, Divito stated that the national average was between \$30 and \$35 per month. The cooperation agreement was approved by a 4-2 vote, with Councilmen LeRoy C. Hill, Jr., and Coverdale dissenting.

Coverdale opposed the measure because he said City Solicitor Alton Tybous was unprepared to give an opinion on the document, and Hill said that he was not completely familiar with the agreement which had been delivered to him Friday, and urged that matters of such

A proposed ordinance to provide appointment of one member of the City Planning Commission from each of six districts, with present commissioners to complete their terms in office, was approved at the first of two required readings.

Councilman George Wilson proposed that a special municipal clerk be employed to transfer voting registration data from the current three-district books to cards for tabulation under the new plan.

Council approved the proposal with Tybout's opinion that complete re-registration is not required.

Plans are being considered for continuing registration during office hours by a municipal clerk, in addition to the three registration days with hours coinciding with election day as required by law.

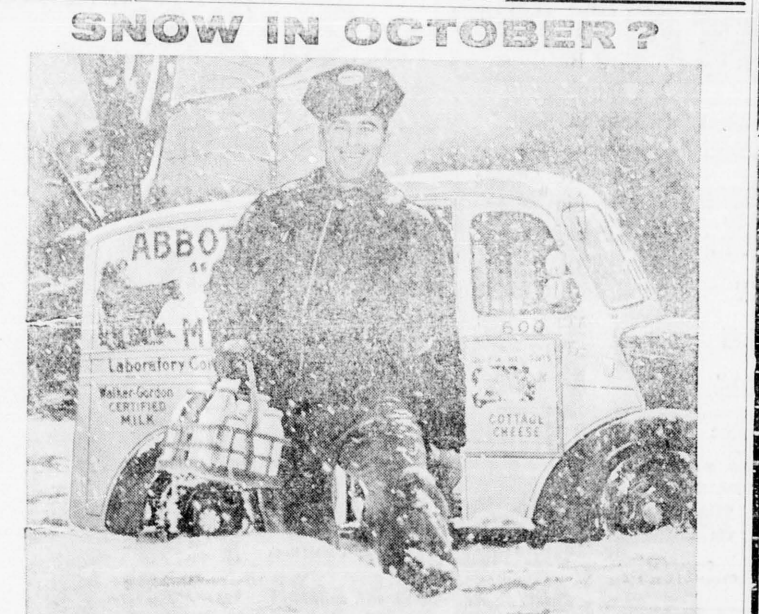

George Sargisson Cites Hard Plastic As Football Hazard

George Sargisson, retired this year after 30 years of service as a national football official, urged modification of the "iron hard plastic" headgear, steel face guards, and shoulder pads that have become weapons instead of protective devices, as guest speaker for the Newark Touchdown Club luncheon meeting last Monday at the Newark Country Club.

Sargisson, director of Recreation Promotion and Service, Inc., Wilmington, said that the national association of football officials had formally protested manufacture and use of hard plastic protective equipment, and cited the recent Navy fatality with a total of 20 deaths in football during the current year, compared with a yearly average of 17.38 since 1956.

Another factor cited by Big George Sargisson in football's fatal toll, was the questionable quality of some high school coaching. In his "observations of a retired football official," the former New York Violets star cited the "great weakness of calling every play" as demonstrated by the Syracuse coach against Penn State last week.

Sargisson also advocated five-man officiating, and said the Ivy League was receptive to such plans.
