On the question, "Shall the Bill pass the Senate?" the yeas and nays were ordered, which being taken, were as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the 116th Session of the General Assembly of the State of Delaware, that it hereby recommends that to future Sessions of the Senate of the State of Delaware that the Senate hold an informal Session sometime during the month of December immediately preceding the convening of each General Assembly for the purpose of determining and fixing all pay allowances and compensation to be paid to the officers and employees of the Senate for that forthcoming Session in order that these amounts may be made known to the respective officers and employees of the Senate upon their selection and thus avoid any future misunderstanding with regard thereto.

On motion of Mr. Longbotham, the Chair appointed Messrs. Steen and Powell as a committee to notify the House that the Senate had completed its work and was ready to adjourn sine die.

The Committee to inform the Governor, escorted His Excellency, Governor Elbert N. Carvel to the Chamber and Rostrum.

The Chair invited the Governor to address the Senate. Invitation accepted.

Dr. Bengier introduced the following Resolution, which on further motion by him was adopted.

SR 65—Presented by Dr. Bengier and Mr. Powell in behalf of the Republican members of the Senate.
