## Bloom Energy breaks ground at site of former Newark Chrysler plant

Bloom Energy teamed up with local leaders and University of Delaware officials to break ground Monday morning on the company's first East Coast facility, based at Newark's former Chrysler plant.

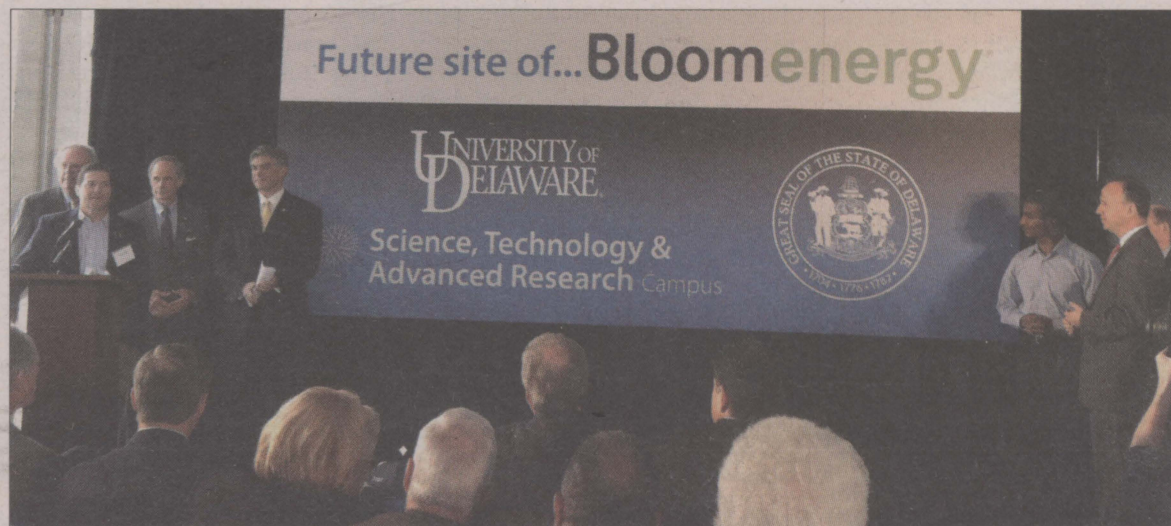
When construction to the site is finished in late-2013, the 200,000-square-foot facility will be a manufacturing hub where fuel cells are used to convert fuel into electricity through an electro-chemical process that does

not require combustion.

The company's West Coast facility based in Sunnyvale, Calif. currently serves several high-profile customers including Google, Coca-Cola, Bank of America, Walmart and Staples.

When it's completed, the East Coast facility will stand on the 272-acre site on South College Avenue that the University of Delaware purchased from Old Carco Company, successor to Chrysler LLC, in 2009 for around \$24 million.

During Monday's groundbreaking event held on the property,

local dignitaries joined Bloom Energy executives and customers in praising the company's plans to develop its first East Coast

facility here, a deal expected to bring at least 900 new jobs to Delaware.

Speakers included Delaware

## Out of the Attic

## Newark's own Baseball Hall of Famer

This week's Out of the Attic item is a 2012 photograph of the Newark History Museum exhibit about Newark's only inductee to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, N.Y.

Victor Gazaway Willis was raised from infancy in Newark, attended Newark Academy where he played baseball, and Delaware College where he played and coached baseball. He also

played for several local community baseball teams.

Willis was playing minor-league ball for Syracuse, N.Y. when he was called up to the majors and played for the Boston Beaneaters. He later played for Pittsburgh and St. Louis before retiring.

As a pitcher, Willis compiled a 249-205 record, posted 50 shutouts and a 2.63 ERA, and completed 388 of

471 starts. His 45 complete games in one season are the most of any 20th-century National League player. His nickname was "The Delaware Peach."

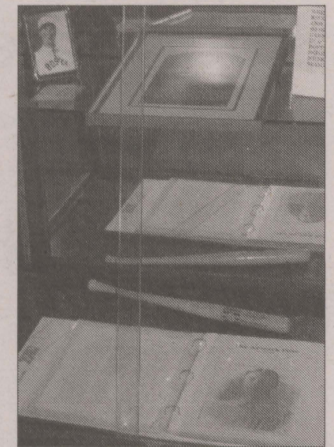
He was voted into the Hall of Fame's Veteran's Committee and was inducted in 1995. Willis played in the majors from 1898 until 1910. After his baseball career, Willis and his wife returned to Newark. They

bought the Washington House Hotel and operated it from 1911 until 1946, fulfilling his life-long dream to be a hotelkeeper. Come and learn more at this exhibit and more about other aspects of Newark area life and history presented in 30 other exhibits.

Newark History Museum is in the historic 1877 passenger-train station on South College Avenue beside the bridge on the town side of the tracks. The museum is open from 2 to 5 p.m. on Sundays, and at other times by appointment. Individuals,

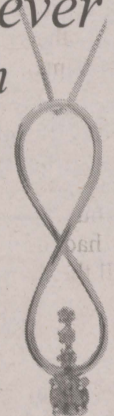

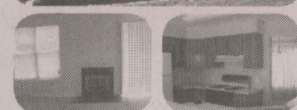

Delaware leaders see state's technological future in Bloom

It was an occasion rich with symbolism, as bulldozers and a press tent sat on the largely vacant property that once bustled as one of the state's top economic centers. But the atmosphere was hopeful, as speakers excitedly talked about how the landmark deal to bring the large-scale-energy supplier to Newark went down.

Coons used the process of catalysis – when an agent causes change to a chemical-reaction process without becoming consumed with the reaction itself – as a metaphor for the various elements that came together to make the Bloom deal happen.

An ideal “triangle of energy” is clean, safe and cheap, he said, but for ages, no company had been able to achieve all three, he said.

Pointing to a fuel-cell converter set up for Monday's groundbreaking, he said, “The catalyst in that humming box has solved the

age-old problem. But KR (Sridhar, Bloom CEO and co-founder) won't tell me what that catalyst is.”

Nonetheless, the company's expansion here is a welcome catalyst for economic change, he said. While riding the train south to D.C. each week, Coons said he remembers watching the Chrysler plant coming down piece by piece.

“It tore at my heart,” he said.

Markell too, recalled growing up off Kirkwood Highway just down the road from the Chrysler plant, and understanding its economic importance, even as a small kid.

When the plant closed in 2009, he said, “People started to ask if (Delaware's) best days were numbered.”

But thanks to visionary planning from university officials, the Bloom execs and the state's general assembly, he said, the company's move here will provide “hundreds of middle-class careers” to Delawareans.

Sridhar, Bloom's CEO, said that after his company achieved success in Sunnyvale, Calif., its management team started looking at potential sites at which to expand operations and

serve more customers on the East Coast.

What eventually lured them to Newark was Delawareans' collective vision for their own technological future, he said.

He applauded Harker's foresight in steering the university's purchase of the property and plans to develop it as a technology hub, which the university has named the Science, Technology and Advanced Research (STAR) Campus.

Sridhar also said he appreciated that local legislators “didn't play games” during the deal-making process.

Bloom Energy COO Gary Convis said in a phone interview Monday morning that the facility would eventually employ about 900 people.

“We have an agreement with the state (regarding the number of jobs) and we fully expect we'll meet and beat that agreement in a step-by-step way,” he said, adding that the facility would

employ assemblers, technicians, engineers, office staff and more.

Once construction is finished, company officials also plan to welcome school groups and other visitors to tour the facility, he said. The front of the plant will include a large display to show community members how energy works.

“School groups and visitors will be able to come and learn and understand what energy's all about,”

Convis said.

He said construction crews have been clearing and leveling property to prepare the site for architectural work, which will begin this spring.

**Newark woman killed crossing the road in a hit-and-run**

A woman crossing Library Avenue on foot was struck and killed by a car just south of Ogletown Road around 8:38 p.m. Monday, April 30. The accident was a hit-and-run, Newark Police said.

The victim has been identified as 76-year-old Helen Yang of the 300 block of E. Main St. in Newark.

Yang was crossing Library Avenue westbound from College Square Shopping Center in front of the Newark Free Library when a southbound vehicle struck her. The driver of the vehicle failed to stop at the scene, police said.

Several passing motorists stopped to render aid to Yang, who was found still lying in the southbound lanes. She was pronounced dead at the scene.

Investigators gathered evidence at the scene indicating that the vehi-

cle may have been a black, four-door Honda Accord made between 1998 and 2002.

Police are asking for the public's assistance in locating the vehicle involved in this collision. The vehicle most likely has front-end damage, possibly on the right side.

**Four charged, heroin cache seized at Days Inn Hotel in Newark**

Delaware State Police Governors Task Force has arrest-

ed three men and one woman on multiple drug charges after discovering a cache of heroin in a Days Inn Hotel room in Newark.

The incident began Wednesday, April 25 at approximately 1:25 a.m. as members of the Delaware State Police Governors Task Force were conducting routine patrols at the hotel on Churchmans Road in Newark.

As Task Force members were checking the area, they observed a glassine bag used to package heroin, on the ground in front of the door to room No. 128 and also smelled a moderate odor of burnt marijuana coming from the room. Task Force members knocked on the door and initially did not receive a response from within the room, but could hear activity and furniture being moved inside. Task Force members continued to knock on the door, which was eventually opened by a female occupant later identified as Dahndra Y. Jones, 24, of Newark. After the door was opened, Task

Force members could smell a strong odor of marijuana from within the room, and observed a burnt marijuana cigar on the nightstand. Three other occupants were also in the room and were later identified as Dawane R. Cox, 34, of Chester, Pa., Aaron Jones, 22, of Newark, and Devin L. Chambers, 40, of Woodly, Pa. Task Force members secured the room and obtained a search warrant to continue their investigation.

During the execution of the search warrant, Task Force members located and seized 1,077 bags of heroin totaling 26.9 grams, unpackaged heroin totaling 9.8 grams, and drug paraphernalia utilized to package and distribute heroin. The total street value of heroin seized is \$7,000.

Cox, Jones, Jones, and Chambers were taken into custody without incident and charged with the above listed crimes. All were arraigned and released after posting secured bond.

**UD Police officer arrested on harassment charges**

Newark Police Department officers arrested Demetrius Sharp, a 31-year-old officer with the University of Delaware Police Department, on Wednesday, May 2, following an investigation initiated on Feb. 21, 2012.

The investigation began when a 21-year-old female University of Delaware student reported that Sharp, a resident of Kennett Square, Pa., was harassing her.

The female student, who had ended a relationship with Sharp on Feb. 18, said she began receiving harassing texts, emails and voice messages from Sharp for a three-day period starting Feb.

19. Police say Sharp attempted to contact her in person while on duty as a uniformed police officer, including parking outside her home and shining a spotlight from his patrol vehicle into the victim's windows.

Sharp turned himself in to Newark Police on May 2. He was charged with three counts of harassment and one count of official misconduct and released on \$4,000 unsecured bond.

John Brennan, director of media relations for the University of Delaware, confirmed Wednesday that Sharp is University Police officer and that he has been placed on administrative leave.

**Newark man arrested for alleged hate-crime incident**

Newark police arrested Derek Didonato, 21, of Newark Wednesday, April 25, following an offensive-touching incident that reportedly happened Sunday, April 15 and has been designated as a hate-crime incident.

According to the police report, shortly after midnight April 15, Newark Police officers responded to a house party in the unit block of E. Cleveland Ave. to investigate an offensive-touching incident involving an 18-year-old white male victim.

During the investigation, police learned that Didonato approached the male victim, who had attended the party with several friends, and made derogatory statements to him regarding his sexual orientation. Didonato then knocked the victim to the ground, Police said. The victim's friends then quickly separated the pair and left the house. The victim was not injured during the incident. Didonato was released on \$1,000 unsecured bail.

**Cigarette City robbed**

Newark Police Department is investigating an armed robbery that occurred around 4 p.m. Saturday, April 28 at Cigarette City located in College Square Shopping Center.

During this incident, police say, a white male suspect armed with a shotgun and wearing a ski mask entered the store and pointed the gun at the two female clerks and demanded money. After receiving an undisclosed amount of currency, the suspect fled the store to an awaiting vehicle occupied by an unknown suspect in the passenger seat. The vehicle then fled the parking lot towards Marrows Road.

Neither clerk was injured during the incident.

The suspect is described as a white male, 5 feet 8 inches to 6 feet 3 inches tall. He was described as wearing blue jeans, a red hooded sweatshirt, black gloves and a grey ski mask with black stripes covering his face.

The suspect vehicle is described as a dark-colored pickup truck, possibly a Dodge Dakota.

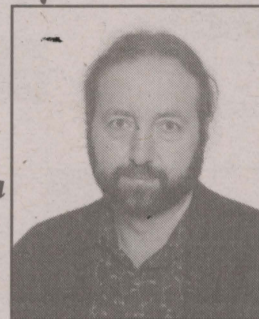

# Buying local – at the farmers' market or the supermarket

What does buying local mean? Believe it or not, there are several definitions of "buying local" from "buying only what is in season and grown locally" to "buying a product that is produced within a geographic area of perhaps a day's truck drive away."

It may mean buying only fresh produce, but could include buying canned, locally grown products, or chicken grown in Delaware. It could mean knowing your farmers and the methods they use to grow and distribute the products.

There are many reasons why people choose to buy local produce and products: freshness, food quality, support of local farmers, developing the local economy, knowing about your food, expanding product choices, improving the environment, building community spirit, improving health and sustaining agriculture.

Certainly, your local farmers' market is the most obvious place to buy local produce and products. Delaware's farmers'-market season will kick off this month. Over the last few years, the number of markets recognized by the Delaware Department of Agriculture for selling farm-fresh produce around the state has increased to 27. They are often organized and managed by local groups. A list of these farmers' markets can be found at:

You can also buy locally grown produce at supermarkets and superstores, many of which work with local growers and distributors to buy what is in season and within our local growing area. Sometimes they do a good job of advertising what is local, but if you're unsure, ask the produce or market manager.

It's not all produce, either. Remember, we raise a lot of

chickens in this state and it may be labeled by a national brand name like Purdue or Allen, but the likelihood of the product being grown in Delaware is high. Don't forget canned and frozen food, too. Delaware farmers grow lot of lima beans (The state is the second-largest producer in the U.S.) and other produce in Delaware.

Locally made ice cream, sauces and marinades, beer, wine, and scrapple are made here, too. Some of these items get processed right here in Delaware, while other gets sent to processing plants in the region. Reading the label may not tell you it is a Delaware-grown product, but if you purchase from regional processors, it's a good bet you're supporting Delaware and regional growers.

Getting to know local producers and knowing your local market manager are first steps to knowing your food sources. Paying attention to how food is displayed and packaged is another important step in keeping food safe. Does the food need to be kept cold? Is it packaged in a way that reduces



the chances of cross contamination? Is the area clean?

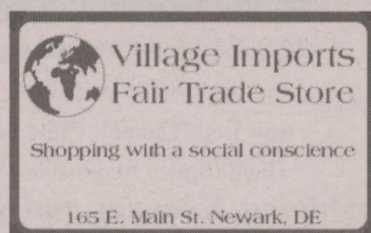

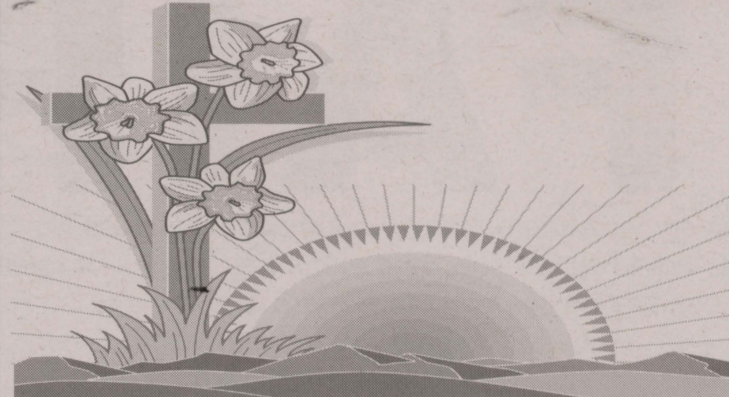

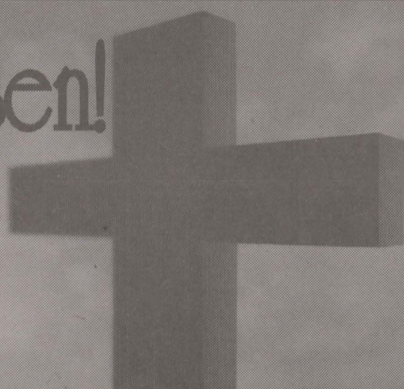

## Newark Charter School adds softball to its lineup

When Newark Charter School first started offering sports teams at the middle-school level, they were not considered precursors to future varsity sports. But since the school gained approval last month to add a high school, construction plans are already underway for facilities to house the sports that will be offered to ninth graders starting in the fall of 2013.

"Certainly, the primary focus of Newark Charter School is academics," said school director Gregory Meece. "But participation in sports, performing arts, co-curricular teams and clubs compliments and enriches learning."

Meece said the high-school campus will include a full-sized gym and three outdoor athletic fields to

support teams in soccer, field hockey, volleyball and cross country (fall sports); boys and girls basketball and track (winter); and baseball, softball and boys and girls lacrosse (spring). Meece said off-campus programs such as tennis, golf and swimming are also possibilities.

"Of course, this plan is contingent upon student demand," Meece said. "Since we will be starting with just a ninth grade (made up of 162 students), we may need to phase in our plans until we have a sufficient enrollment. But, since the new facility will also house our junior high, there may be opportunities to include eighth-grade students on the freshman teams."

Prior to this year, Newark Charter School fielded teams in boys and girls basketball, baseball, volleyball and cross country. With the popularity of softball in the

Newark area, it seemed sensible to also add a softball team. And based on the number of girls that tried out, the decision was the right one.

"We had 42 girls try out," said head coach Kris O'Connor, a guidance counselor in her 10th year at the school. "It was hard to make cuts with that large of a group, but we wanted to keep younger players to

build the team. We have a lot of talent to work with."

The final roster is made up of 16 girls in grades six through eight, who come from various softball backgrounds — some are veteran travel-ball players and local league stars, while others are beginners, like Bridget McLaughlin, who starts in

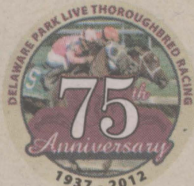

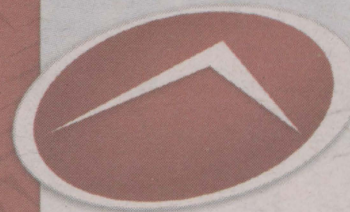

left field despite having never played the game because she grew up playing baseball.

McLaughlin, along with Sarah Kautz, Helen Lynch and Julia Waters, are all eighth-graders who will never have a chance to play for Newark Charter at the varsity level because the new high school's enrollment will always be one grade behind theirs.

"It's really a shame," O'Connor said. "But unfortunately that's just part of the process of opening a new

school. I try to look at it as, it's been great I got to coach them at all."

O'Connor said watching 16 personalities from diverse backgrounds across three different grade levels blend into one cohesive team has been one of the most rewarding things this first year.

"You always hope to see a bond formed when you are around a group of kids," O'Connor said. "We went from a group that didn't know each other well to that sisterhood that happens in sports. We see friendships forming. There is a camaraderie and commitment to the team. The girls are supportive and encouraging of each other. It's always nice to see."

That teamwork got the Patriots started off on the right foot, defeating Wilmington Christian 18-0 in the program's debut, followed by wins over P.S. du Pont (12-8) and Brandywine Springs (12-7). Despite the early success, O'Connor pointed to a significant challenge of facing teams for the first time ever.

"It's tough not being aware of what other middle-school sports programs are like," O'Connor said. "We don't know what we are going to see until they show up to

the field. There can be such a vast difference in pitching speeds and so our hitters have to make a big adjustment at the plate."

Newark Charter has seven games scheduled, but hopes to add at least three more games — they have calls in to Caravel, Red Lion and Christ the Teacher — to get closer to the 11 allowed.

"That's the only disappointment," O'Connor said. "To practice as often as we do and be ready to play, and then not be able to play as often as we'd like."

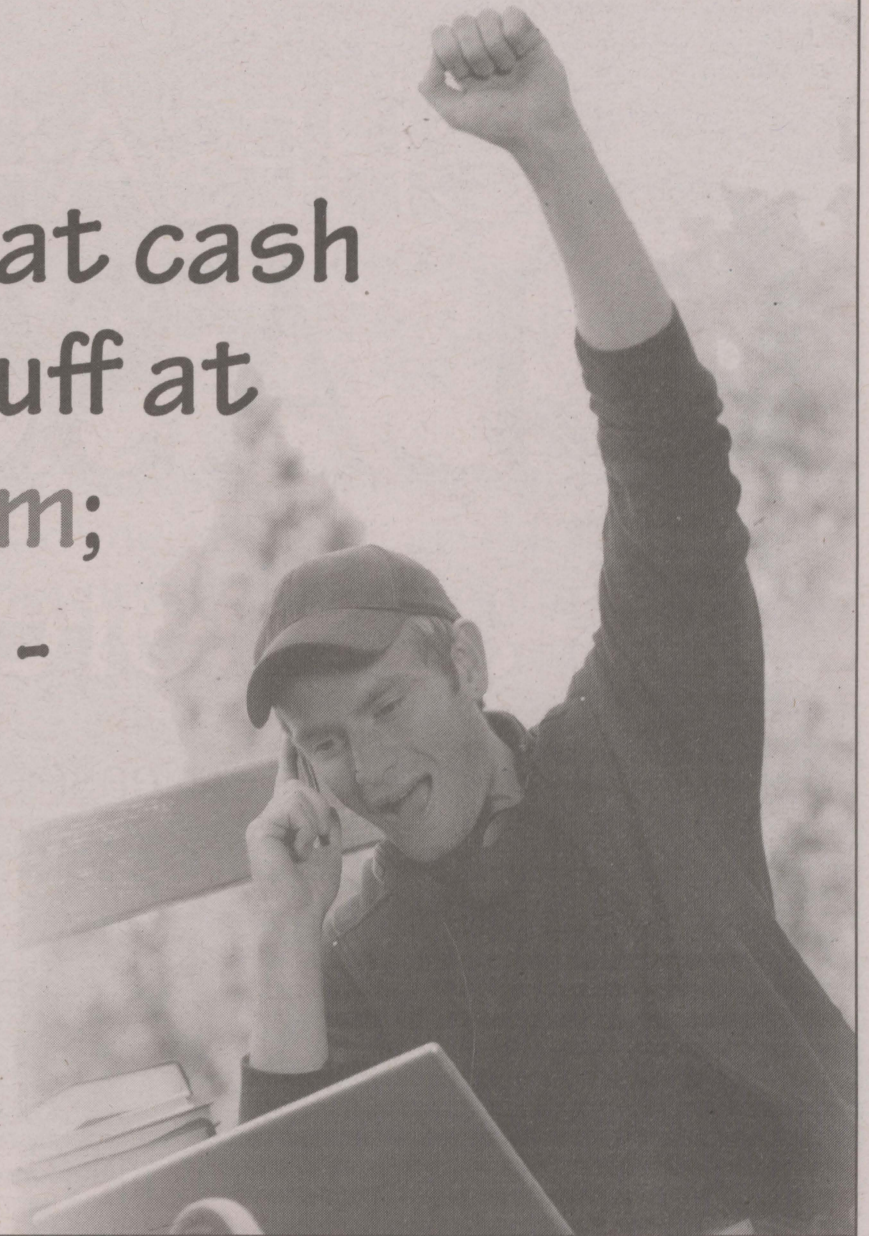
