The College building has been refitted, and enlarged. New apparatus for Surveying and Physics have been added. Has an excellent Library of several thousand volumes, and possesses every facility for the higher education of young men.

The College is situated in a beautiful and healthful country; the community is intelligent and moral, and the town is convenient to the cities of Wilmington, Philadelphia and Baltimore, and to all points of the Peninsula.

There are ten State Scholarships available to every county of Delaware, for which application should be made to the several members of the Legislature.
