I write to voice the support of the Superior Court Criminal Rules Committee in the above legislation now before the Senate. This bill also has the support of the Attorney General and the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner. Under this bill, in most cases there would be no need for the toxicologists and chemists in the Medical Examiner's Office to come to court to testify as to their analyses of controlled substances. Their time is better spent analyzing the drug samples delivered to their office for analysis. Further, police officers who participated in the chain of custody of the drugs would also be spared in most cases from having to give actual trial testimony.

House Bill No. 305 was taken in large part from Maryland law (Maryland Courts and Judicial Proceeding Code Ann. §§ 10-1001 to 10-1003). As with its Maryland counterpart, House Bill No. 305 is intended to greatly reduce the number of police witnesses and State chemists from testifying at criminal trials involving violations of Delaware's drug laws. It streamlines the process for introducing evidence of drug testing at trial without undermining the integrity of this evidence.
