Dear Dr. Lobo:

In response to our phone conversation of May 16, 1984, I have seen a number of cases over the years of intraocular toxocariasis. This is a parasitic involvement of the interior of the eye due to the dog roundworm Toxocara Canus. The mechanism of the human eye problem is ingestion of eggs which are deposited in the excreta of the animal. The problem is a major one for children who play in sandboxes, etc., where dog feces may be deposited.

I am writing you regarding House Bill #417 which deals with the prohibition of dogs on state coastal beaches. I think that this is a very important bill and essential for the health of the people of the State of Delaware as well as individuals who visit our beaches from outside of our state. Contamination of the beaches by dog feces and dog urine poses a serious threat to the health of individuals who visit the beaches and this health risk is particularly high in young children.

Children are particularly prone to crawling in the sand on the beach and risking contamination by the organisms that cause leptospirosis and toxocara (visceral larva migrans). These are the two most serious diseases that can result from animal soiling of the sand because these diseases are potentially fatal.

In addition, human beings are at risk of picking up other types of intestinal parasites and even heart worm infection if they are exposed to these organisms in the sand at beach sites.

I will be happy to cooperate in any way I can to have these laws enacted and enforced.

WHEREAS, the historical work on the part of Senator Martin is best described in the prologue written by Leon deValinger, Jr., former State Archivist and State Historian of Delaware when he said "the volume is a valuable contribution to the historical literature of Delaware and will long stand as the definitive work on the Governors of Delaware"; and

WHEREAS, the great Delaware historian, Dr. John A. Monroe, of the University of Delaware said of the book, "the book is both more detailed and more accurate than the most comprehensive histories of Delaware, the two multivolume works by J. Thomas Scharf and Henry C. Conrad"; and

WHEREAS, the Senator from Windy Hills has through his publication of the history of Delaware's Governors, carved a place in the historical annals of Delaware, a just reward for undertaking such a stupendous task.

STATE OF DELAWARE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR July 20, 1984

To the Delaware State Senate of the 132nd General Assembly of the State of Delaware

On July 10, 1984, I received Senate Bill No. 408, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 2, which is entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND SUBCHAPTER III, CHAPTER 20, TITLE 15, DELAWARE CODE, RELATING TO REGISTRATION BY MAIL."

This bill purports to "simplify" the process by which a qualified elector can register by mail to vote. The key provision in this bill would require the State Elections Commissioner to "prescribe a uniform mail registration form which could be obtained "by in person (sic), telephone or mail request from any department of elections office and from prominently displayed dispensers for such registration forms placed throughout the state."

Under the present law any qualified person can obtain a registration form simply by telephoning or writing to the local department of elections, or by appearing in person at the office of the local department. In response to a telephone or written request, the department within three days must send the registration form to the address given by the requester. The individual then fills out and returns the completed form to the department, which registers the voter after reviewing the form and, if necessary, conducting an inquiry to verify the information provided by the applicant.

Senate Bill No. 408 would dramatically alter this process by making registration forms available in "prominently displayed dispensers ... placed in public places throughout the state." This would result in the wholly-unregulated mass distribution of the actual signature cards which are used at the polls to verify proper registration. The potential for vote fraud in such a system is enormous.

By eliminating any requirement that registration forms be distributed in response to individual requests, Senate Bill No. 408 also negates the protections against vote fraud which currently exist in the mail registration law. Under 15 <u>Del. C.</u> Section 2012(b), for example, a third party may apply for registration by mail for someone other than himself, but to do so he must sign a prescribed form and specify the name and address of the person who wishes to register. This safeguard is eliminated by Senate Bill No. 408, however, since there is no provision for limiting or verifying the proper distribution of the individual registration forms through the "prominently displayed dispensers ... in public places throughout the state."

In the guise of simplifying the mail registration process, this bill removes important procedural safeguards which have been in the mail registration law since it first was enacted. Whether this bill really simplifies the process is debatable, furthermore, since someone wishing to register need only telephone the local department of elections to obtain the form. There is no indication that this legislation is necessary, and there is every indication that it is fraught with risk for our elections system.

For these reasons, I am returning Senate Bill No. 408, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 2, without my signature.

STATE OF DELAWARE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT July 20, 1984

TO THE DELAWARE STATE SENATE OF THE 132ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE

On July 10, 1984, I received Senate Bill No. 301, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 2 and by House Amendments Nos. 1, 3 and 4, which is entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 20, TITLE 15, DELAWARE CODE, RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF VOTERS."

This bill would require the New Castle County Department of Elections to appoint at least two registration officers to sit at each motor vehicle inspection station in the county, for the purpose of being available to accept applications to register to vote, to change party affiliation, or to change name, address or other information essential to comply with voter registration procedures. In short, this bill would require the establishment of year-round, full-time registrars at the Division of Motor Vehicles inspection lanes in New Castle County.

The fiscal note attached to this bill projects an FY'85 cost of \$88,443. If this legislation promised a significant increase in number of registered voters, then such a cost might be justifiable. But such a benefit cannot reasonably be expected as a result of this legislation.

Registration offices exist in each county. Mobile registration is mandated in Delaware in each senatorial district within 30 days of the last date for registration before a general election. A simple registration by mail exists which can easily be activated by a phone call to the Department of Elections. With all of these alternatives available, the assignment of additional personnel to yet another remote location seems unwarranted.

For these and other reasons, I am returning Senate Bill No. 301, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 2 and by House Amendments Nos. 1, 3 and 4, without my signature.

To the Senate of the 132nd General Assembly of the State of Delaware

I am returning without my signature Senate Bill No. 356, as amended by Senate Amendment No. 1, received June 28, 1984 and which is entitled: AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 29, TITLE 24 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO REAL ESTATE BROKERS AND SALESMEN.

This bill would prohibit condominium associations and time-sharing developers from selling condominium units unless they first retained a licensed real estate agent to represent them, or unless the developer or all of the members of the condominum association first obtained a license themselves.

Presumably, the rationale behind this bill is that the public needs the protection of a licensed real estate agent when leasing, time-sharing or buying condominiums. But the bill does not ensure that the buyer will be represented by a licensed agent, rather it requires that the seller - the condominium association or time-sharing developer - must hire an agent. That agent's duty will be to protect the seller's interests, not the buyer's, and thus the bill promises no protection to the public.

Enactment of this legislation also would result in the anomalous situation of preventing condominium owners from associating for the purpose of leasing or selling their units while permitting homeowners to do so. Homeowners can do so under 24 <u>Del.</u> C. Section 2902 (b)(2), but the amendment to this bill expressly prevents the application of that provision to a condominium association.

There has been no showing of a compelling need for this legislation and, in the absence of such a showing, I am returning Senate Bill No. 356 without my signature.

To the Delaware State Senate of the 132nd General Assembly of the State of Delaware

I am returning without my signature Senate Bill No. 44 which I received on July 10, 1984, and which is entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND SUBCHAPTER I, CHAPTER 5, TITLE 7 DELAWARE CODE, RELATING TO LICENSE FEES FOR NONRESIDENTS."

Senate Bill No. 44 would institute a reciprocal pricing mechanism for non-resident hunting licenses in Delaware, requiring non-residents to pay a license fee equal to that charged by their native state when such a fee is greater than Delaware's fee. However, the presence of several flaws in the bill convince me that it should not be signed at this time.

There are more than one hundred private licensing agents in the State, each of whom would be required under this legislation to confirm the licensing fces for practically every state in the Union. In 1983, hunting licenses would sold to individuals from more than forty five different states. To require small, individual licensing agents to check the fces of numerous and often distant states will be an enormously time-consuming, costly and burdensome task, especially since hunting license fces change frequently in some of the larger states. In addition, the individual outlets would be forced to decide on a case by-case basis whether a particular state's licensing fce should include the cost of various hunting stamps, special registration charges and other particularized costs associated with each state's licensing scheme. I also note that the bill would become effective immediately, even though Delaware's license year commenced July 1. The absence of a delayed implementation date would mean that thousands of licenses printed and distributed to local agents, many of which have already been sold, would have to be recalled and reprinted in order to comply with Senate Hill No. 44's mandate.

Because of the expense and burden to which local licensing agents would be put and the significant administrative problems which would be caused by its immediate implementation, I am returning Senate Bill No. 44 to the Senate without my signature.
