Premiere hiking and biking trail a decade in the making

Local and state dignitaries saluted the newly completed Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail Monday as a premiere hiking and biking destination that will set a recreational standard throughout the region.

Gov. Jack Markell, U.S. Sen. Tom Carper, Newark Mayor Vance A Funk III, dozens of bicycling enthusiasts and even children from a nearby daycare center came out to celebrate the grand opening of the 2-mile walking and biking trail, which extends along the old Pomeroy and Newark Rail Line and

north into White Clay Creek State Park.

Clear-blue skies and a pleasant breeze made the event – held on the south end of the new trail – all the more uplifting.

The \$4.7 million Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail, 80 percent of which was funded through the Federal Highway Administration, has been 10 years in the making, said Newark Parks and Recreation Director Charles Emerson. It has involved acquiring land rights, and clearing and paving the tracks to the former rail line, which was abandoned in the 1920s, he said.

Public can meet city-manager candidates at upcoming forum

A public forum on Wednesday will allow locals to get to know the two candidates for Newark's City Manager position a little better.

During the forum, set for 7 p.m. Sept. 19, each candidate will speak for 10 minutes about his or her background

before audience members will be allowed to ask the candidates questions of their own.

The two candidates for the position left vacant in February, when Kyle Sonnenberg retired, are Carol Houck, Newark's assistant city manager for 14 years and interim city manager since February; and Dr. Tarron Richardson, a Wilmington native currently serving as city manager of DeSoto, Texas.

A third finalist, David Baird, former city manager of Milford,

Del., withdrew himself from the applicant pool last week in an e-mail addressed to the city's mayor and council members, saying he had accepted another position.

On Thursday, Newark City Council members will reconvene in executive session at 5 p.m. to discuss the candidates and then conduct another interview with each candidate before making a final decision about who will be Newark's next city manager.

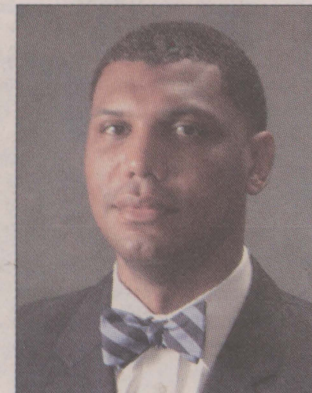

Community Day will bring locals together for fun

Newark's 41st annual Community Day event will come to the University of Delaware Green this Sunday, Sept. 16.

The annual festival, joint-hosted by the The City of Newark's Parks and Recreation Department, the University of Delaware, Christina School District, and the Downtown Newark Partnership, invites locals to come out and learn about different groups and organizations in the region, said Joe Spadafino, recreation superintendent for Newark's Department of Parks and Recreation.

"The event attracts people from all over Newark that come to spend the day at the University of Delaware Green and see what the groups and organizations offer to our community," he said.

Spadafino said the event would include vendors selling food, as well as free performances and children's activities. The shops along Main Street will also be running specials throughout the day, he said.

"There is a scarecrow-making area where

for \$5 you can make a scarecrow and take it home with you," he added.

Stages will be set up for performers including Korean Martial Arts group, Mid-Atlantic Ballet, and The School of Rock from Wilmington, Spadafino said.

About 300 vendors set up at the event each year; and 200 have signed on so far, he said.

"Depending on the weather, the crowd that shows up is anywhere between 10,000 and 15,000 people," he said. "People come and go throughout the day."

This event is unique in that it shares the university's campus and gets the student body involved, Spadafino said.

IF YOU GO: Community Day will be held on The Green at the University of Delaware, just off Delaware Avenue in Newark. Admission is free, and all are welcome. The event runs from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Nuns on the run

5K event will benefit Newark's Little Sisters of the Poor elderly care residence

The sixth-annual Nun Run will be held in Newark this Saturday, and locals are welcome to join in the 5K race to help raise money for the Little Sisters of the Poor Jeanne Jugan Residence in Newark.

The first race was held in 2006 after nuns at the residence, where low-income elderly patients receive residential care, planned it as a way to raise operating funds and community awareness.

Last year's race had more than 300 finishers, said race director Ray Christensen, who added, "We're shooting for 400 people this year."

He said the post-race party has become a huge draw for the race. It has grown to include a live DJ, pizza, chocolate milk and beer

for all the race participants. Top finishers also receive awards, and all participants receive a t-shirt.

Adding to the allure, the race is the Road Runners Club of America's state-championship race for Delaware, Christensen said; the person who wins the race will be honored as the state's 5K champion.

But the real draw is the chance to see nuns who serve at the residence pounding the pavement as race participants.

"It's not just a fundraiser for the nuns, but there's nuns actually running the race," Christensen said. "Every year, you see the runners getting their pictures taken with the nuns; it's fun to watch."

Tables at the residence will have information about

the facility, on Salem Church Road in Newark, Christensen said.

"They have a top-notch facility for people that would not be able to afford it otherwise," he said.

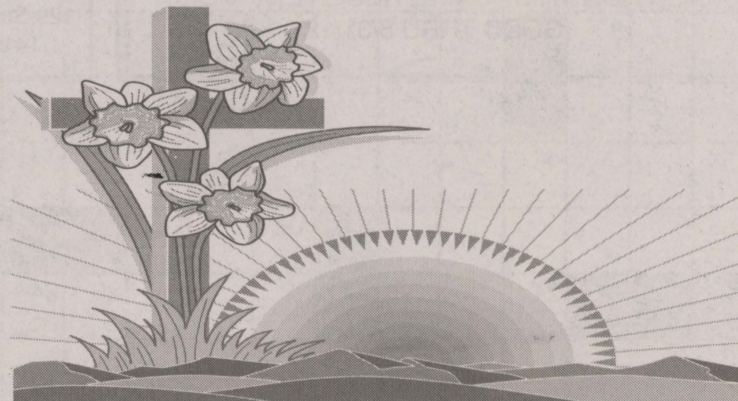

Clerk shot dead during Newark 7-11 robbery

A 48-year-old male clerk at the Four Seasons 7-11 convenience store in Newark was shot dead early Wednesday after two masked men robbed the store, police said.

Police have identified the victim as Mohammed Rafique Ullah of Newark.

Crime-scene tape hung around the parking lot of the store, at 100 Four Seasons Parkway just off Route 896, and brown paper covered the store windows Wednesday morning to shield the inside from onlookers. The store is closed for business while Delaware State Police detectives continue their homicide investigation.

A preliminary investigation

has determined that two black male suspects entered the store around 12:40 a.m. Wednesday morning wearing dark clothing, and masks covering their faces. At least one suspect was armed with a handgun, police said.

The suspects confronted Ullah and demanded money, police said. Ullah complied and turned over an undisclosed amount of cash.

As both suspects were fleeing the store, the suspect armed with the handgun turned and fired at least one round, striking Ullah in the upper body, police said. Both suspects fled on foot in an unknown direction.

Ullah was pronounced dead at the scene, and his body was turned over to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner to determine cause and manner of death.

As word of the shooting spread Wednesday morning, regular customers began stopping by the store to leave flowers and share memories with each other.

Jill Bowlby, a teacher at the

nearby Brader Elementary School, pulled into the parking lot and told reporters that she stops at the 7-11 every morning for a Mountain Dew, and was saddened to hear the news that a clerk had been killed. She spoke highly of all the store's clerks, and the owner.

"Every morning I come here, and they are the nicest people ever," Bowlby said. "They know all their customers by names. They've known my children since they've grown up, and they take time out to ask about their softball games."

Anytime anyone is short a few cents for an item, the owners wave the person on and say, "Just bring the money tomorrow," she said.

"I just want to make sure everyone knows how good these 7-11 employees and owners are. They've gone out of their way to help people."

Ashli Wright described Ullah as a friendly man who always looked out for his regulars.

"He was a good guy," said

Wright, who lives in the same neighborhood as Ullah, just a short distance from the store. "I've known him for years. Every time I see him, he'd say, 'Hey, what's going on?'"

Wright said the man was a hard worker who always took the night shift.

"He'd sleep all day and work all night," she said. "All he does is work."

Other customers said that because the store had been robbed before, the clerk often locked the door at night but would open it for customers he knew.

The investigation continues. Delaware State Police homicide detectives are conducting inter-

views, reviewing video surveillance, and collecting evidence at the crime scene in an attempt to identify the suspects.

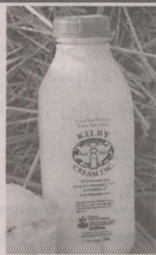

Police make several arrests for public urination

Newark Police have arrested seven people for public urination since Aug. 31, said Master Cpl. Gerald Bryda, who reminded citizens that the illegal act puts a damper on city residents' quality of life while running the risk of being perceived as indecent exposure.

In the first case, on Friday, Aug. 31 around 10:37 p.m., a Newark Police officer observed a 19-year-old male University of Delaware student urinating

in public on university property on South Christiana Drive, Bryda said.

When the officer attempted to make contact, the suspect ran away. Once the officer apprehended the suspect, he determined that the suspect was under age 21 and had consumed alcohol, Bryda said.

The suspect was charged with disorderly conduct, resisting arrest, offensive touching (for a confrontation with the police officer) and underage drinking.

Another incident happened around 12:32 a.m. Saturday,

Sept. 1 when an on-duty officer observed a 19-year-old male University of Delaware student urinating in plain sight,

into the nearby shrubbery next to a building on Scholar Drive, Bryda said.

Upon contact, the officer found that the suspect, a minor, had also allegedly con-

sumed alcohol. The suspect was charged with underage consumption and disorderly conduct, he said.

Less than an hour later, police spotted a 19-year-old male University of Delaware student urinating by on the front lawn of a residence on Continental Avenue, Bryda said.

Police then learned that that suspect had consumed alcohol prior to his 21st birthday. He was charged with disorderly conduct and underage consumption.

On Friday, Sept. 7, officers on patrol observed two 19-year-old female University of Delaware students squatting against a pillar and urinating under the South College Avenue Bridge around 11:30 p.m., Bryda said.

When the officers approached them, the women tried to flee, but were quickly apprehended and arrested for disorderly conduct and underage consumption, Bryda said.

At 11:47 p.m. the same night, police observed an 18-year-old male University of Delaware student urinating on the lawn of a residence on Chapel Street, Bryda said.

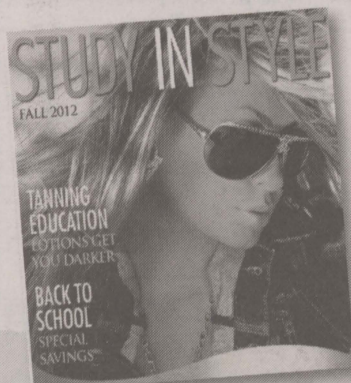
The suspect was 5 feet from the sidewalk and made no attempt to hide what he was doing, he added.

The next night, around 1:48 a.m., police observed a 21-year-old male urinating on the side of New London Road near the Deer Park and arrested him for disorderly conduct, Bryda said.

In all of these cases, the suspects were urinating in plain view of officers and other bystanders, he said.

"It's one of those quality-of-life issues we see in the city, and we'd just like to say (to the urinators), the city is not your bathroom," Bryda said. "(Public urination is) offensive to other people, and it can be seen as a case of indecent exposure, and we don't want to see it progress to that level."

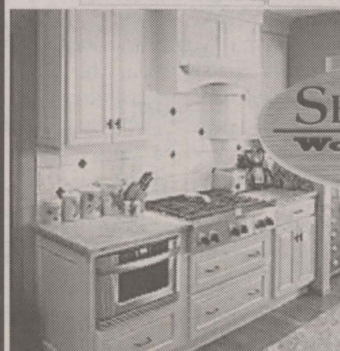

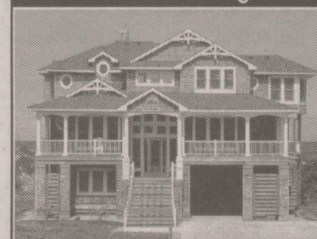

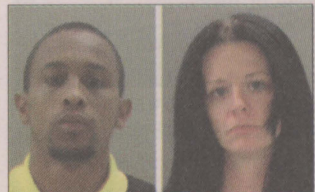

Police: Couple busted with 245 bags of heroin packaged for sale

New Castle County Detectives arrested a Newark husband and wife last week after undercover officers learned that the couple were selling illegal drugs out of their home in Scottfield, police said.



Both subjects have been charged with felony drug and weapon offenses, and endangering the welfare of three children that live at the residence.

According to New Castle County Police, Following a month-long investigation, the New Castle County Drug Control Squad obtained and executed a search warrant, with assistance from the Safe Streets Task Force, at a home in the 100 block of Scottfield Drive last Thursday after receiving information that a couple, later identified as Shawn Earl and Theresa Earl, were selling heroin out of the residence.

At that time, detectives made contact with both subjects as well as three children, ages 3, 4 and 14, that were living in the home.

While executing the search warrant, detectives found 18 bundles totaling 6.12 grams of heroin in their bedroom closet. The heroin was packaged for sale in 245 bags, and a 12-gauge shotgun with ammunition and a small amount of marijuana was discovered on a table in the bedroom.

Both suspects were charged with possession with intent to deliver heroin, possession of a deadly weapon during the commission of a felony, possession of marijuana, conspir-

acy in the second degree and three counts of endangering the welfare of a child.

Police: Man exposes himself to woman after asking for directions

A man driving a white minivan stopped a 20-year-old female pedestrian near the corner of Haines Street and Delaware Avenue around 7:11 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 8, and asked her for directions to the Home Depot store, said Newark Police spokesman Master Cpl. Gerald Bryda.

During the course of the conversation, the woman realized the man was exposed from the waist down and was manipulating his genitals, Bryda said.

The suspect is described as a white male, between 45 and 55 years old, with brown hair. He was possibly driving a white Dodge Minivan with Maryland license plates.

The crime is classified as an indecent exposure in the second degree. Detectives are still investigating the incident. There are no suspects at this time.

Bryda said police do not believe the man is the same person who has reportedly exposed himself to females around campus several times since 2011.

Newark man charged with burglary, assault, rape

An 18-year-old Newark man has been arrested for the Sept. 4 burglary of a home in the 100 block of Madison Drive in Newark, police said.

According to Newark Police, Daquan Stevenson, an acquaintance of the 21-year-old male victim, entered the victim's home through an unlocked door.

The victim, Stevenson who was on the home's second floor at the time, heard someone in the home and went downstairs to investigate.

He confronted the suspect and a struggle ensued, and spilled onto the front porch. During the struggle, the suspect displayed what was believed to be a handgun and struck the victim in the head with the gun, briefly knocking him unconscious.

The victim sustained abrasions to his face, back and leg but declined medical treatment. He reported the incident to the police about an hour later. The investigation has confirmed that Stevenson targeted the victim and was searching for illegal drugs in the home.

NPD Detectives obtained warrants for Stevenson, and located him traveling in a vehicle in Suburban Plaza Sept. 5. He was taken into custody without incident and charged with the burglary incident.

Stevenson was already the suspect in an unrelated sexual assault reported in late-July.

During that investigation, police determined that on three occasions, Stevenson, had sexual contact in his home with a 14-year-old female with whom he was involved in a relationship.

Police charged Stevenson with first-degree burglary, possession of a deadly weapon during commission of a

felony, possession of a firearm by a person prohibited, and three counts of rape in the fourth degree.

He was committed to Howard R. Young Correctional in lieu of \$40,000 cash bail for the burglary incident and \$30,000 secured bail for the sexual assault charges.

Officials plan to eventually use the trail to connect local parks, including the former Curtis Paper Mill site, which the city will start redeveloping soon, Emerson said.

“(Newark) is becoming a mountain-biking destination, (due to) the work that we’ve done here in Newark and in the county, and the state, so we’re real excited about that,” Emerson told the public Monday.

The trail will pave Newark’s reputation as a hiking and biking des-

tinuation, said Collin O’Mara, Secretary of the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control.

“It can serve a million people who live within 20 miles of where we are right now,” O’Mara said. “... Whether it’s going to be the student that’s trying to get to a final on time that realizes they can’t make it in time – they can hop on the trail and make it to the class on time – or the family that just wants to go out for the day. They can grab a quick meal and hop back on the trail and go enjoy the park. This

is going to be one of those things that’s an amenity that people talk about and say, ‘I’m going to Newark this weekend,’ or ‘My kid wants to go to college in Newark’ or ‘I want to open a business in Newark.’”

ON THE MOVE

Carper said community-recreation projects like this one are critical at a time when obesity, and the threat of obesity, looms large.

“In too many cases, where we need to go, somebody drives us,” Carper said. “This is a great opportunity to get out of our cars ... get out of our trucks, get out of our vans, and put on our walking shoes, put on our running shoes, and just do it.”

Markell said a special thank you to the local bicycling advocates who have made great strides to rally in support of infrastructure for local bicycling trails.

“The fact is, the only reason that we are in a position to make significant improvements to the trails is because of your advocacy,” he said.

Jerry Clifton said last week that as a city councilman, the trail has been the single most-asked-about project on the public’s radar.

“It’s the one infrastructure improvement that people have been waiting for,” he said. “Out of all the issues in the city of Newark, I get more questions about when the trail is going to open, so clearly there is an immense amount of interest in it.”

Officials broke ground on the project last Aug. 29, and due to the mild weather this winter, it was finished early, Emerson said last week.

“Since the weather was so great this winter, we hardly skipped a beat,” he said.

He added that he’s walked the trail so many times during its development that he wishes he’d logged his steps with a pedometer.

Each section of the trail has its own interesting aspect, he said.

“I really enjoy the more natural areas, so I enjoy the north section a lot. It’s one of those urban trails that turns into a more natural setting once you get into that north area, which is a neat feature. Also it will connect to White Clay Creek State Park, which is miles and miles of trails.”

City officials have big hopes for the trail as a means to encourage physical fitness, relieve traffic congestion and possibly even draw some large-scale public events to the city.

“This will really make

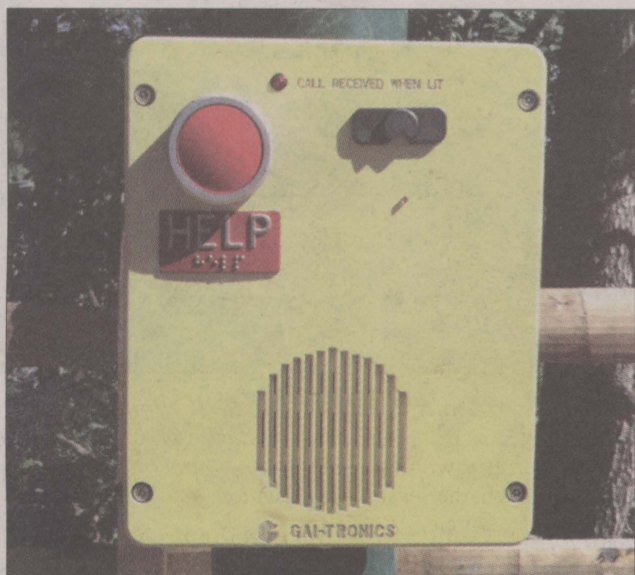

New season, new coach: How to deal

Fall is here, and for hundreds, if not thousands, of kids and parents in the Newark area, it means a new youth sports season is upon us.

It can take time for a player to adapt to a new coach and team, just like it takes time for a student to adapt to a new teacher and classmates. Some parents also need time for adjustment.

Regardless of what level your child is playing, you may already be questioning if the coach is the right person to lead the team, or more importantly to you, is capable of effectively coaching your child. And, of course, the player might already be questioning why his or her new coach isn't running the

same drills or implementing the same game strategies as last year's coach.

Some parents coach for that exact reason — then there is no question, at least in the parent's mind, whether the coach is getting the job done. And a child never questions mom or dad as the coach, right? (As a parent-coach I say that in complete jest.)

But for parents who don't coach, and for kids who don't call the coach mom or dad, getting used to a new coach can be frustrating.

Try to remember that a coach is a volunteer doing the very best he or she can. Every decision made might not be the most popular one, or in the players' or parents' opinion, the best one, but it is the coach's decision and therefore should be respected as long as safety is not an issue. Similar to that new teacher.

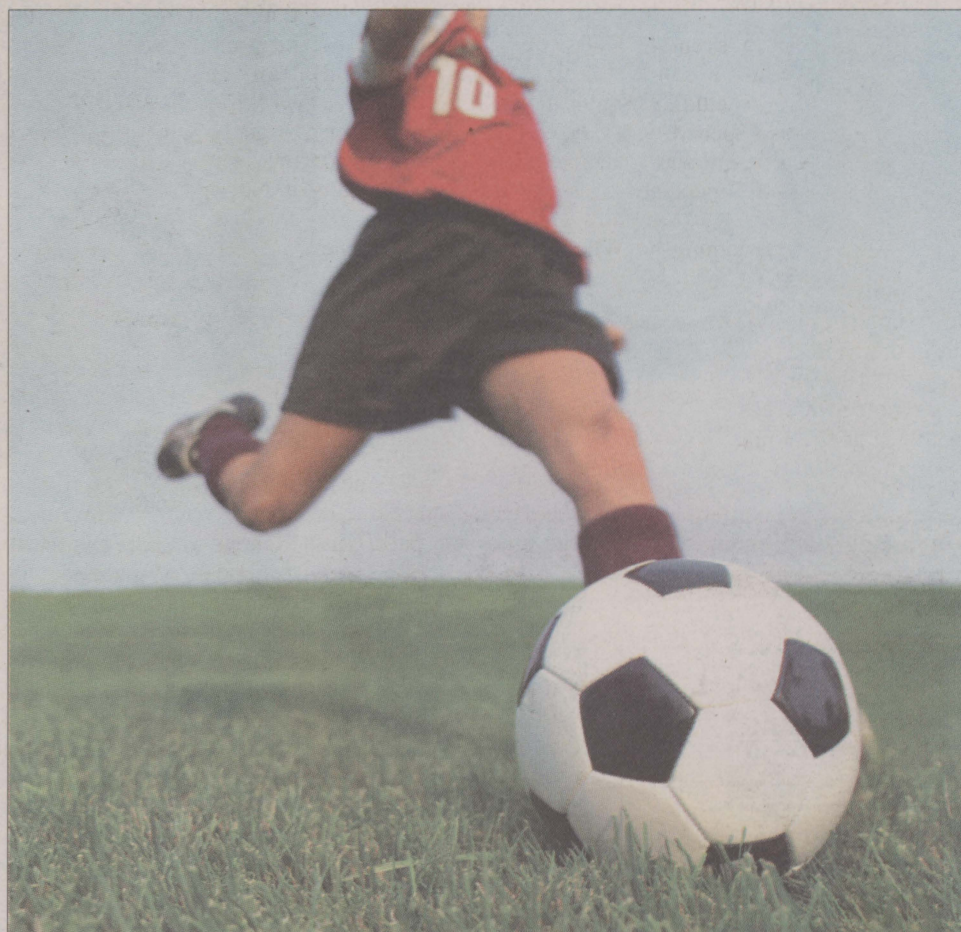
Let the little things go.

Most of the little things parents get frustrated about usually aren't that big a deal in the grand scheme of things. Parents usually debate over particulars such as how drills are run, if they are effective, and players' positions on the field. My rule of thumb in a parent-only role (remember, my

guess is, there was a box on the registration form you could have checked to be a coach) is, if it's not jeopardizing the safety of my child, I keep my opinions to myself.

Any time my son asks me questions about how his coach is handling a situation, I tell him that it's a good experience to play for different coaches with varying personalities and coaching philosophies, just like I strongly believe it's good for kids to have teachers with different teaching styles. I remind him that part of being a good athlete is being adaptable to a variety of situations on and off the field. It's no different than at the varsity, college or professional level.

However, if you think there's an issue that needs to be discussed, don't be afraid to meet with the coach and ask why things are done a certain way. But don't catch the coach by surprise. Send an email or give him or her a call and ask if you can chat after the next practice or game. And be sure to approach it this way: "Coach, I've never seen such-and-such handled that way, and am just wondering why you do it that way."



You still might not like the answer, but at least you'll have one.

The best mindset to have when heading into a new

season is to remember that not every coach is going to be perfect. But with the correct approach, the season can still be a great one.
