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

Man charged with murder of his wife

The Newark Police have charged Michael J. O'Donoghue, 68, of the 300 block of Lynley Lane, with Murder 1st Degree and weapons offenses in the death of his wife in their home early Monday morning. Lynley Lane is off Paper Mill Road and near the Newark Reservoir. The victim was identified as Nancy L. O'Donoghue, 67. No possible motive has yet been determined.

Police reported the Newark 911 Center received a call from the defendant at 3:51 a.m. During the call, Michael O'Donoghue asked for the police, stating he had shot his wife.

O'Donoghue followed the commands of the 911 operator and surrendered to the responding police officers in the garage of the house.

Police reported the death scene was neat and mainly undisturbed. The victim was found in her bed, under several blankets, with bullet wounds and a severe blunt force injury to her head. A large amount of blood surrounded the body. A search revealed a small hatchet with a metal head and a wooden handle on the floor of the bedroom, which had blood on the handle and metal portions. Blood droplets were seen on the walls and ceiling near the body. An empty bottle of what



appeared to be alcohol was found at the foot of the bed.

A doctor at the Christiana Hospital Emergency Department pronounced Donoghue dead at 4:25 a.m. via communications with paramedics on the scene.

Police obtained a search warrant and found a black revolver in the family room after a search of the residence. The case has been turned over to officers of the Criminal Investigation Department.

Court documents indicate that O'Donoghue said the incident took place on Saturday and that he waited to make the call. Evidence at the scene seemed to indicate that some time had elapsed between the time of death and the call to 911, police said. However, a final determination of the time of death will be made by the State Medical Examiner's Office, which is conducting an autopsy.

Chefs in the "battle" had one hour to complete their dishes and DiGregorio said, "In a word, it was insane. It was the fastest hour of my life."

He said the competitors in the field, drawn largely from restaurants in the community, were outstanding. "My hat goes off to all the other competitors. The margin we won by had to be slim."

DiGregorio gave special thanks to his assistant, Rachel Grubbs, a student in UD's Department of Hotel, Restaurant and Institutional Management who works at Vita Nova. "She did a fantastic job under immense pressure," he said.

DiGregorio's first course consisted of turkey sausage strata with pink grapefruit, baby arugula and pomegranate salad drizzled with a warm Vermont maple vinaigrette. The sausage was filled with cubes of asiago cheese and fresh Italian parsley. The strata was topped

with a fresh herb laminated potato chip.

The second course featured butternut squash and sausage chili with fresh guacamole and goat cheese quesadillas. The chili was served in a mini-pumpkin and topped with Greek vogurt.



Cadet Wing Commander

On August 4, Michael Richard Shaw of Landenberg, PA, became the Cadet Wing Commander of the United States Air Force Academy at the Acceptance Day/Cadet Change of Command Ceremony in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Cadet Shaw is now the highest ranking cadet at the Air Force Academy with the title Cadet Colonel and is in charge of the entire Wing of 4,500 cadets. He is a graduate of Salesianum School where he excelled academically and played football on the 2005 and 2006 state championship teams and captained Salesianum's 2007 lacrosse state championship team. Accidents involve train and house

Newark Police are investigating separate accidents that led to one unoccupied vehicle being struck by a train. In the other mishap, a pickup truck hit another truck and a house on the west end of the city.

The accidents both occurred

on Monday night. The first was at 7:17 p.m. at the West Main Street CSX railroad crossing.

Sajjad Ahmed was driving eastbound on west Main St. At the crossing, he turned left onto the tracks, causing the vehicle to become wedged in. Ahmed exited the vehicle and called for help. A northbound train arrived at the crossing within three minutes of the car becoming stuck, and before train traffic could be stopped by CSX. The train struck the rear of the unoccupied car and pushed it approximately

100 feet before stopping.

The car suffered significant damage to the back half of the vehicle. Sajjad Ahmed, a 60 year-old male from Export in western Pennsylvania, was cited for an Improper Left Turn. The car was a silver 2011 Hyundai Sonata.

The train blocked the crossings at West Main Street, New London Road, and North College Ave for about one hour. After the investigation was completed, the train was able to continue on its

The second accident occurred at 9:50 p.m. when a 1996 GMC Sonoma pick-up being driven eastbound on Rahway Drive struck a parked 2002 Chevrolet S10 pick-up that was legally

parked along the curb near the intersection with Casho Mill Road. The Sonoma pushed the S10 across Casho Mill Road, with the S10 coming to rest along the curb on the east side of the roadway. The Sonoma also struck a stop sign at the intersection of Rahway Drive and Casho Mill Road, continued across Casho Mill Road, and left the east side of the roadway. The Sonoma then crashed through a fence in the rear yard of a house in the 300 block of Vassar Drive. drove through the rear yard, and drove through another portion of the same fence. The vehicle then turned slightly right, struck the garage of a neighboring house, and came to rest. The impact left an approximate three foot by three foot hole in the exterior garage wall.

It is believed that the operator, Samuel Singleton, 86, from Elkton, Md. suffered some type of medical event that preceded the collision. Additionally, he suffered a laceration to his face as a result of the collision and was transported by ambulance to Christiana Hospital. No charges had been filed at the time of this

The Sonoma had disabling damage and was towed from the scene. The S10 had less severe damage and did not need to be towed. The house was inspected by a representative of the Newark Building department, There was no structural damage and the residents were able to stay inside the house.

Graffiti mars two downtown busi-

A local business owner noti-

fied police that an unknown suspect had spray painted graffiti, in black paint, on Planned Parenthood, located at 140 E. Delaware Ave., and KAM LLC, located at 26 Haines St. The owner stated that very similar graffiti "tags" were placed on the walls of both of the establishments. A search by officers showed that the tag was the same for both instances. Police took photographic evidence and entered it into a central database to determine a suspect. Video imagery is also being reviewed. No witnesses or suspects have been named so far.

Fuel bandit strikes again

Employees at American Van and Storage Corp. have again reported the theft of 300 gal-lons of diesel fuel from their trucks. The company made a similar report earlier this year. Interviews with personnel from

American and several adjacent businesses provided no additional details or descriptions of any unusual events or people in the area.

A manager told officers that he had inspected the trucks on a Friday and that one of the drivers reported his truck had no fuel in it. Several other trucks were also found to have no fuel in them, when inspected. An investigation of the trucks themselves showed no tampering or forced entry. The only sign that any of the vehicles had been tampered with was an open gas cap on one truck.

The total value of the removed fuel is approximately \$1,200.

He was identified as John Wittmer, 22, who resides in the 100 block of Fantasia Drive in the community of Harmony Woods, east of Newark.

victim was seven.

The 14 year-old female victim recently disclosed a sexual assault that occurred seven years ago while she was staying with a babysitter in Newark. Detectives linked Wittmer, who was living at the home at the time, to the crime after the victim was interviewed by a forensic expert at the Children's Advocacy Center and disclosed the assault.

Wittmer was arrested Monday and charged with the above offenses. He has been arraigned and released after he posted a \$4,000 secured bail.

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Yellowjackets top '09 record

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The Newark High School football team has won two more games this year than at the same point last season after coming away with an easy 45-8 win over Delcastle (0-4) Saturday.

Junior quarterback Taylor Reynolds has been dominating the offensive headlines for Newark through its first three games, but last Saturday the Yellowjackets showed off their ground game as Jordan Imeokparia rushed for 211 yards on 13 carries and scored four touchdowns to lead Newark (2-2, 1-0 Flight A).

I caught up with coach Butch Simpson to discuss the state of his team as it heads toward the midpoint of the season.

On his team: "It is clear by the scores there are times we are scoring a lot and times we are giving up a lot. We're really trying to get the defensive side of the ball together. We're also not running the ball as well as well as we need to against quality opponents."



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

This week's Out of the Attic item is a December 2006 W. T. McLain photograph of St. John African Methodist Church at the intersection of New London Road and Hillside Road. The church was recognized in 2006 as a Delaware Historical Site. The dedication marker reads, "This congregation was organized circa 1848. Early meetings were held in a log cabin at this location on land that was conveyed to trustees of the 'Protestant Methodist Church' in 1850. In 1866 the members of the First Colored Methodist Protestant denomination merged with the African Union Church, which had been founded in Wilmington in 1813 and was the first incorporated religious body controlled entirely by African Americans. The new denomination became known as the African Union Methodist Protestant Church. On December 6, 1890, this congregation was formally incorporated as 'St. John's A.U.M.P. Church.' The first house of worship was replaced by the present structure in 1867. It was extensively remodeled in 1960. Renamed St. John African Methodist Church in 1996, this church continues to serve the spiritual needs of the Newark community

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Retired UD prof. shares Nobel Prize

Richard F. Heck, the Willis F. Harrington Professor Emeritus at the University of Delaware, has been awarded the Nobel Prize in Chemistry. Heck, 79, was honored alongside fellow researchers Akira Suzuki, 80, of Hokkaido University in Sapporo, Japan, and Ei-Ichi Negishi, 75, of Purdue University, "for palladium-catalyzed cross couplings in organic synthesis." They will share a \$1.5 million award.

The Nobel Prize in Chemistry was announced by the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences during a press conference held in Stockholm.

According to the Nobel statement, the scientists were honored for discovering "more efficient ways of linking carbon atoms together to build the complex molecules that are improving our everyday lives."

Speaking from the Philippines just an hour after learning of the award, Heck said that he was surprised, although not completely surprised, as their work had been suggested for the high honor. However, he said it is "a very nice conclusion."

"The University of Delaware is exceptionally proud of Prof. Richard F. Heck and his ground-breaking research in the field of chemistry, which

has resulted in the award of the Nobel Prize in Chemistry this morning," UD President Patrick Harker said.

"This is a tremendous accomplishment for Prof. Heck and his colleagues, acknowledging the development of a tremendously sophisticated tool that will aid scientists to make potential cancer drugs and medicines," UD Provost Tom Apple said.

Apple was a graduate student in chemistry when Heck was on the faculty at the University of Delaware. Heck retired in 1989 from the UD faculty.

Douglas Taber, professor in the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry who has known Heck as a colleague since 1982, explained the importance of his work, saying, "All of pharmaceutical chemistry and photolithography, the making of computer chips, depends on carbon bond formation. His [Heck's] contribution was to make that bond catalytic in the expensive metal, making large-scale industrial production affordable. When DNA sequencing became important, Heck chemistry made the cou-pling of organic dyes to the DNA bases possible.

This is the second Nobel Prize winner with ties to the University's Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry. The late Daniel Nathans, who graduated from UD in 1950 with a bachelor of science degree in chemistry, won the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine in 1978.

Heck was born in Springfield, Mass., on Aug. 15, 1931. He completed both his bachelor of science degree (1952) and his doctorate (1954) at the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA).

After postdoctoral work, he took a position with Hercules in Wilmington, Del., in 1957. His research career at Hercules led to his move to the University of Delaware in 1971.

Teaching homework strategies for success

Now that school is back in session, parents and students begin the daily routine of tackling homework assignments. As a parent you may wonder, "What is the purpose of homework? Shouldn't the classroom teacher be able to complete the learning process during the regular classroom Research suggests the positive learning benefits of homework include better retention and understanding of concepts through practice, and increased critical thinking. Some secondary longterm effects are better study habits and improved attitudes about school when supported by parental encouragement. Plus, the organizational skills and independent problemsolving needed to complete homework contribute to greater self-direction and life-long discipline in study habits.

Another common parent concern is, "When does my child have time to unwind, participate in sports, or socialize with friends?" Creating a balance of these healthy habits may require a conversation with your child's classroom teacher if you feel they are assigned too much work. How much homework

is reasonable? The National Parent Teacher Association recommends: kindergarten to 3rd grade: up to 20 minutes each day; 4th -6th grade: 20-40 minutes each day; 7th-12th grade: generally up to 2 hours, but recommendations vary according to the type and number of subjects a student is taking.

Communication with your child's classroom teacher at the beginning of the school year is a good first step in establishing a regular homework routine. Some steps you can take to develop good homework habits are:

• Set up a study space: Your child will be most successful if you have a well-lit, well-stocked place to work, away from the distractions of TV or other media. Organize the study space with a place for the book bag, resource books, pencil sharpener, extra paper and pencils. Consider making a homework tool kit with extra items such as ruler. calculator, tape, scissors, glue, and markers for special assignments or projects.

· Set a structured time. Set up and maintain a specific time slot in your daily family schedule. Most children need some unwind time immediately after school, but work with your child to schedule homework with time for outdoor play, physical activities, and socializing with friends. If specific homework is not assigned, use the designated time for working on special projects or reading for plea-

· Organize homework assignments. Before beginning a homework session, encourage your child to number assignments in the order in which they should be done. Decide how much time is needed for each assignment and break up tasks into segments or block off a section of pages for assigned reading. Your child could start with the easiest subject first, but avoid saving the longest or hardest assignments for last. Crossing completed items off the list will give your child a sense of accomplishment. If there is a tendency to procrastinate, consider setting a time limit to complete each task using a kitchen timer.

· Conduct a weekly cleanup. Encourage your child to sort through book bags and notebooks on a weekly basis. Old tests and papers should be organized and kept in a separate file at home.

Teaching your child to be organized with a homework plan and a scheduled time to do it sets them up for a lifetime of successful school





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




